History will come to life during reenactment

"Revolution on the Tuscarawas," a Revolutionary War reenactment, will be held July 14 and 15 at Fort Laurens in Bolivar. The annual event gives visitors a glimpse into the lives of Revolutionary War soldiers, from the weapons they used to the hardships they endured fighting for independence from England.

British and Continental soldiers will be portrayed by members of the Brigade of the American Revolution Northwest Department's 8th Pennsylvania Regiment and the 13th Virginia Regiment, from which soldiers were stationed at Fort Laurens.

Bob Cairns has been the commander of the Northwest Department for longer than he can remember. "We are an international nonprofit organization dedicated to portraying the life and times of the common soldier during the American Revolution," he said. "You're not going to see a bunch of guys dressed like generals or other high-ranking individuals hanging around. You will see the regular soldier."

Cairns said visitors can expect to see demonstrations of muskets and cannons, 18th century clothing, and tools and other military subjects.

"We're going to have a fellow that's presenting as an 18th century surgeon. He's got lots of tools in his surgeon's kit to show, and he will talk about different

illnesses and treatments for everything from an upset stomach to removing a limb," Cairns said.

Cairns said historic geographers also will be on hand demonstrating 18th century surveying equipment, map-making methods, cooking, music and other skills of the time.

"If you walk away and didn't learn something, it's because you didn't want to," he said.

There also will be reenactments of skirmishes, which are smaller than battles. How much the groups can reenact will depend on how many reenactors can attend because they are all volunteers.

"We're hoping we will have crafts and activities.

enough there to do a big artillery demonstration with five or six cannons," Cairns said. "We'll show people how the cannons were loaded, how they were used and what their different purposes were."

A living history

Tanner Immel, site manager at Fort Laurens, said the soldiers and camp followers will be camped out on the grounds for the weekend. "Everything will be full public discourse," he said. "We encourage the public to come up to them, ask questions, look at their camps and see their setups."

Immel said there will be a food truck for refreshments and kids crafts and activities.

"I think seeing living historians at the site is a great reason to come out for this event," Immel said. "It really brings history to life for our local community, and I think it's better to see history and be involved in history — to be able to live it and see the conditions the Fort Laurens soldiers lived under — than to just read some words on a wall."

A ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Patriot on the fort grounds also is planned for Saturday and Sunday to honor the sacrifice of all Revolutionary soldiers.

An important historical site

Fort Laurens is the location of Ohio's only Revolutionary War fort, built as a staging site for a possible attack on the British at Fort Detroit. The outline of the original fort is visible on the grounds.

Fundraising and plans are currently underway by the Friends of Fort Laurens Foundation to eventually rebuild the fort. Along with Historic Zoar Village, Fort Laurens is managed by the Zoar Community Association.

Admission

Tickets for the event are \$10 for adults and include admission to the Fort Laurens Museum. Children under 12 are free.

Loving Lucie

Bolivar girl with leukemia receives special gift

There is a brand-new play set in a yard outside Bolivar that is so much more than a play set. It is a symbol of the hopes, faith and dreams of a 7-year-old girl with leukemia, Lucie Dillon, and her family.

On Sunday, June 25, a multitude of volunteers came together at the Dillon home to assemble a play set the family received from the Roc Solid Foundation, a national organization that provides play sets free to families fighting pediatric cancer.

The signs

Maria Dillon, Lucie's mother, said Lucie became sick right around Christmas last year. "We didn't really know what was wrong. She was running a low-grade fever off and on but acting OK and still playing outside. But by mid-January, she wasn't eating much and she was really tired."

After taking her daughter in for some blood tests, Maria Dillon said

she looked at the results and then consulted Google. "I knew it was going to be leukemia because it was the only result that explained everything she was experiencing," she said.

After a flurry of tests, the diagnosis came. It was leukemia. Specifically, it was acute lymphoblastic leukemia.

Fortunately for Lucie Dillon,

the diagnosis came early in the onset of the disease, and treatment at Akron Children's Hospital started immediately.

"She is in remission now, but leukemia likes to adapt," she said.

To avoid relapsing, Lucie Dillon will undergo an arduous treatment protocol. By the time this article is published, she will be on day 157 of treatment at Akron Children's Hospital. She will have 755 more to go.

"Our first month in the hospital, Lucie was just beside herself," Maria Dillon said. "But now she loves riding in the elevators, and they have a Princess Room she loves staying in with castles and fairy tale murals painted on the walls"

Making lemonade out of lemons

On the same day as the build, Silas Dillon was determined to help out with a fundraising roadside lemonade stand. The 9-year-old also created a virtual lemonade stand online where people could make donations.

From 6 gallons of lemonade and out of the cyberspace, he made around \$3,000.

"When I first heard about (the leukemia), I thought it would last maybe a few weeks," he said. "But then I learned it was going to be two years, and I was like, 'Oh this is bad. It will be a lot of pain for her'"

Giving back

Maria Dillon said when she learned they were going to receive one of three play sets being donated to Akron Children's Hospital patients, she and her husband Doug decided they were going to donate the cost of their play set right back to the Roc Solid Foundation.

"The fact is we can buy our own play set," she said. "We don't want any other kids to miss out because we took one of the sets available."

After tallying up the lemonade money, the family was actually able to donate enough money to provide two play sets to ACH families.

Maria Dillon said it still seems surreal that her daughter is one of the children like those you see in television commercials for places like St. Jude's. She is keeping a daily log of her daughter's journey on Facebook, where she said in a recent post, "Cancer isn't judgmental. It doesn't play favorites. It doesn't care if you have lots of money or not a dime to your name. It just doesn't care."

Not only does cancer not discriminate, but also it affects the entire family. For Lucie Dillon, that

family includes her mom, her dad, Silas and Joey, and brothers Gavin, 15, and Toby, who turned 5 on July 3. Extended family and friends also ride the emotional roller coaster that accompanies cancer in a child.

Still, family and friends remain positive. "Every time I turn around, someone is helping," Maria Dillon said. "Holy Trinity is or our parish, and they gave us about \$1,200. Gavin attends Tuscarawas Central Catholic High School, so they held a fundraiser. People I'm friends with on Facebook that our kids played ball once together or whatever have helped. Doug's boss set up a GoFundMe account. Lucy's school in Mineral City did a Light Up for Lucie event, and it was organized by someone I hadn't even met who just said, 'Hey, I'm doing this."

Maria Dillon said it has been a separate journey just learning to accept help. In addition to the organizations already mentioned, the family wants to express their gratitude to Immaculate Conception School, Tusky Valley Schools, CrossFit, Chris T's Dance Emporium, Ferris Chevrolet and others who have shared their money, their prayers, their hope and their love.

Coming home

Lucie Dillon was able to enjoy a week at home, starting the day after the play set went up.

Maria Dillon said on Facebook, "This girl is just so happy about having this play set. She is less pleased with Canada's fires that are preventing her from being outside and enjoying it much."

Now Lucie Dillon is back in the Princess Room at Akron Children's Hospital, hopefully for her last extended stay.



Rockets shine at Special Olympics Summer Games

For the first time, the Tuscarawas County Rockets took 65 athletes and coaches from five sports to Special Olympics Ohio's Summer Games at the Ohio State University.

Over 2,200 athletes from across Ohio competed June

Museum receives designation as historic landmark

By Scott Daniels

Ernest Warther Museum and Gardens in Dover has been a favorite destination for tours for close to 90 years. The museum has just received designation as a historic landmark by the National Register of Historic Places, recognizing its importance to the nation on a state and national level by the National Park Service. The recognition arrived just as the museum marked 50 years since Ernest "Mooney" Warther passed away.

"We actually started the application process two years ago," Warther Museum Director Kristen Moreland Harmon said. "The application process was hefty. We submitted more than 80 written pages. Everything we submitted regarding the history of the museum is recorded by the National Park Service. It's much harder to prove the historic significance of a person such as an artist like Mooney Warther. Sites like Zoar or Ft. Laurens are a little easier."

Harmon said the designation is important in that it will help preserve the museum's holdings in the future.



The museum will be able to protect the important structures on the grounds including the small shop where Warther carved many of his creations.

'For example, the roof on the family home is slate, and we have some cement original tiles on the museum building. Things like that which can be tricky to preserve, we want to keep as original as possible. So if need arises in the future, being designated a national historic place enables us to apply

for grants to help with that. It will help us keep things as historically accurate as possible," Harmon

The family home dates to 1910 while the first museum structure came about in 1936.

Though the museum has been notified of its inclusion on the list

of historic places, the plaque has that contribution, both for him and not yet arrived. "We expect to get that soon," Harmon said.

'It's a common misconception that designation with the National Register means you're not able to do anything to the property," Harmon said. "That's not the case. You're encouraged to maintain historic integrity and accuracy and keep things up. You just wouldn't get any grant funding to make any modernizing updates. If you keep everything historic, you can get help with that."

Though Harmon isn't aware of any visits to the museum at the federal level, representatives of the Ohio preservation organization did visit and expressed surprise the museum had not been recognized before.

The recognition helps to solidify the contributions of Harmon's great-grandfather as an artist and important figure in the commu-

for his wife Freida.'

Harmon said the museum is welcoming more and more visitors, recovering from the effects of the pandemic shutdown. "We are doing well. People of all ages come to visit, just as always. People travel differently and split their work and personal lives a little differently now, but it is definitely rebounding from where we were in 2020," she said.

Ernest Warther began carving his creations as a 5-year-old boy using a rusted, old pocketknife. In time his skills in carving some of the world's rarest woods and animal ivory became recognized the world over.

Warther toured with his carvings before opening a museum to welcome the public to view his creations. He was featured on television several times and corresponded with the greatest leaders and figures of his time.







Clients need to bring copies of the following documents to their appoint-

—Copies of their most recent energy bills.

—A list of all household members and proof of income for the last 30 days or 12 months for each member.

-Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.

-Proof of disability if applicable.

-Physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health if there isn't a household member over the age of 60.

Last year more than 423 families in Harrison, Carroll and Tuscarawas counties were assisted through the Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program.

The Summer Crisis Program assists low-income households with an older household member who can provide physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for their health, have a disconnect notice, have been shut off, are trying to establish new service on their electric bill or require air-conditioning and fans. Medical conditions can include such things as lung disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease or asthma.

Eligible households can receive up to \$500 if they are a customer of a regulated utility or \$800 if they are a customer of unregulated utilities such as electric cooperatives and municipal utilities.

The assistance is applied to their utility bill, to purchase an air-conditioning unit or fan, or to pay for central air-conditioning repairs.

Ohioans must have a gross income at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines to qualify for assistance. For a family of four, the annual income must be at or below \$52,500.

Also, Ohioans enrolled in the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Plus program who meet the above criteria may be eligible for assistance toward their default PIPP payment, first PIPP payment, central air-conditioning repairs, or may receive an air-conditioning unit and/or fan.

Tusc SWCD holds legislative tour

The Tuscarawas Soil & Water Conservation District hosted a conservation tour for legislatures on Thursday, June 22.

Agriculture is the No. 1 industry in Tuscarawas County, and we wanted to in agriculture production showcase the importance of it to our legislatures. We were joined by Tuscarawas County commissioners Chris Abbuhl and Kristen Zemis, State Sen. Al Landis, USDA-NRCS staff, and Tuscarawas SWCD board members.

Our goal was to get them out in the field to see firsthand some agriculture production and conservation practices happening around the county. We made five stops throughout the day looking at five different aspects of agriculture.

The first stop was in Newcomerstown to see a 186-acre agricultural easement. Ag easements protect the agriculture interests of the land for future generations. In other words the land will always remain



and will not be able to be developed.

Next, we toured a tree farm enrolled in the American Tree Farm System, which promotes wood production, wildlife habitat, water quality and recreation. This farm is a prime example of forestry production and management. Many forestry practices such as invasive species removal, timber stand improvement and tree plantings have taken place over the years to improve the land, native species and wildlife habitat.

Our third and fourth stops were both near Stone Creek. At the beef cattle and crop farm, we talked about grazing conservation practices, dry manure storage and crop production for feeding cattle. Tuscarawas County is ranked 12th in the state for beef production.

At the dairy farm, we talked about crop and hay forage production for dairy cows, liquid manure storage, and manure management. Tuscarawas County is ranked fifth in the state for milk production.

Our last stop brought us to the village of Baltic, where we were joined by Mayor Keith Ely. We enjoyed a local lunch and talked more about the programs and assistance we offer to Tuscarawas County landowners. We looked at a stream bank restoration grant project we are working on at the village park. Stream bank erosion and degradation is a major issue for water quality, fish and aquatic habitat. This project will take care of those issues and improve the recreation and aesthetic aspects as well.

We want to thank our wonderful producers who allowed us to stop at their farms to help show our legislators a little more about agriculture around Tuscarawas County.
