Organ is a cherished tradition at church

The sound of a large church organ filling the sanctuary is a cherished tradition among many churches in the United States. Emmanuel Lutheran Church in New Philadelphia, housing a large organ with pipes spread across the entire front wall of the worship space, will host its third annual concert series performance on Sunday, Oct. 22 at 3 p.m.

The concert, titled the Charles "Win" Dozer Memorial Concert Series, is offered with a freewill offering and refreshments served just after the music winds down.

Dozer was a local musician and music teacher who passed away in 2021. Emmanuel Pastor Robert M. Eller said the concerts help raise money for needed repairs and restoration to the pipe organ, now more than 50 years old. The organ's

pipes are housed behind wooden structures making up the wall of the sanctuary and are an integral part of the building.

"It was installed when the current church was built, so that's 1971," Eller said. "There are parts that need repaired or replaced, and that's an extensive project.

Our hope is to do it in stages. It's less cost-effective that way, but you wouldn't have the entire organ shut down for an extended period. We could still enjoy the music while the repairs are ongoing. Otherwise, we'd have to decommission the instrument for an unknown amount of time. It's more economical to do it all at once, but that scenario would also mean loss of the music in the meantime."

project, estimated at \$250,000, also will dictate how quickly it moves along.

The concert will feature classical and sacred music played by local musicians. Luke Tegtmeier is from Schantz Organ Company. In addition to playing, he will offer a brief history of his company and the organ at Emmanuel Lutheran.

Music has been a key element in worship since the founding of the Lutheran Church, Eller said.

"Martin Luther himself was a hymn writer. Most famously he composed 'A Mighty Fortress Is Our God.' Music has been ingrained in the culture of the Lutheran Church from the very beginning. It's another way for us to give thanks to God, to praise God through music rather than just prayer," Eller said. "It's vital in my opinion. I feel you really can't do church without some form of music. And the big pipe organ just adds a whole other dimension to the experience. To lose it through disrepair would be The cost of the entire devastating, I think.

"The cost of renovation is actually quite small compared to that of replacing the whole thing. There are electronic organs that can deliver a truly great sound, but nothing like the experience of a full pipe organ in a large space like this.

Eller said the Emmanuel organ is a bit smaller than some out there. "Others might have more expensive instrumentation. Some have what are called trumpet stops, which create the effect of having an entire brass section."

Emmanuel Lutheran frequently teams its organ performances with other musicians playing along with cello, guitar or piano.

'The pipe organ sound adds depth to the music that you really can't get in any other way," Eller said, speaking behind the walls of the sanctuary where the mechanism is housed. "That big rumbling sound adds so much to our worship service."



Building a fence through unity

The fence surrounding the grounds of Froman Hill Boys Ranch near Dover became a reality on Saturday, Oct. 7.

With many different fencing companies spanning several counties, the project became manageable as businesses that would normally compete for jobs united because they felt called to do so for the sake of the mission of discipleship for young men.

Each company provided a display of the type of accomplishment that can come from people dedicated to working together for the common good.

"There's 11 crews here today, another that came in yesterday and another that will come in tomorrow, and all of them were willing to donate the labor and materials to the project," said Ivan Raber of Maple Valley Fence, which helped spearhead the event. "It's been neat to see everyone giving so generously to a project that is well worth doing."

In what was believed to be one of the largest gatherings of fence

builders anywhere, the 11 crews got to work in the morning and attacked each of their assigned sections of what was estimated to be around 11,000 feet of fencing, close to 2 miles.

The project included pounding in hundreds of posts and stringing

the wire fencing. The crews set posts, placed corner braces, sawed the fence, hung gates and placed the wiring, a job that would have taken a single company many days to complete.

However, because of the commitment to lend a hand to Froman Hills Boys Ranch and its ministry, the work was done quickly.

While many of the crews were around the Holmes and Tuscara-

was area, others came from farther away, one from Butler, Ohio and two from Geauga County.

While most days see the companies competing for projects, this day saw them united in their

There was a morning presentation on the day of the event where leaders spoke briefly about the process and which company would take which portion of the fence. There also was another important factor to the discussion.

"All of the competition was laid down today, and the focus was on working together as one to have a great day and to support each other for the good of the project," Raber said.

Daniel Miller, owner of Mohican Valley Fence in Butler, said when he approached his crew about volunteering for the effort, there was no resistance.

"We had a real urge to be here helping on this worthwhile project," Miller said. "They have a tremendous mission here, and we are honored to be part of it. This type of thing gives you a great feeling of satisfaction, even though we

traveled a long way to get here."

Each of the crews shared that sentiment.

As a reward they were treated to a lunch from Byler's BBQ, and only when the work was done were they able to relax and share the day's activities with one another.

Watching the beehive of activity around the grounds were three of the Froman Hill Boys Ranch directors: Jonas Beachy, Tim Kline and Robert Shetler. Melvin Yoder and Ray Yoder, the two other directors, were not present at the time, but all shared their gratitude to the crews and companies that donated and participated in the project.

"This is such an important step for us," Beachy said.

The directors made some connections with Raber, who in turn accepted the challenge of overseeing the project. He in turn contacted the various other fencing companies, and one by one, they all committed.

"When we walked in here this morning, we were humbled by all of these people who gave their time to do the work," Beachy said.

Kline said the directors began talking about fencing in the acreage some time ago, but the cost of such an undertaking would be quite expensive. Then they watched as each company decided to join the cause.

"For one person to supply all of this isn't practical, but all of these guys coming together helps spread the cost around," Kline said.

Shetler said watching these men come together with one purpose in mind was proof there are still plenty of good people in the world today who will go out of their way to help others.

"Tomorrow they'll all be out competing for the same jobs, but today they put aside everything to help us," Shetler said. "That's inspiring and heartwarming."



Everybody rides

Mountain bike races held

The Ohio Mountain Bike League of the National Interscholastic Cycling Association held its final race of the season at Camp Tuscazoar on Oct. 8 with racers from all over the state of Ohio attending. The event was the last of five races that began in August. Other events, held every two weeks, were at Freer Park, John Bryan State Park, Hueston Woods State Park and Chestnut Ridge Metropark.

The sport is one dedicated to the athletes and their families. A motto on a NICA trailer read, "Everybody rides! No tryouts, no cuts, no benches.'

"It's one of the most family-friendly and just fun events you could go to on a weekend. There's camping. Racing's a small part of it, but it's really just hanging out with friends and enjoying being outside," said Jen Malik, league and race director for the Ohio Mountain Bike League. "I love seeing the kids running around with other kids after the race and then cheering for their teammates."

The OMBL is for students in sixth grade through 12th grade. The team's first practices usually start around July 1, and usually, teams practice two to three times a week. The league likes to keep the season short because students are involved in so many other things.

"Then the goal is they can ride their bikes whenever they want, but they don't feel obligated to really have to focus on one thing being so young," Malik said.

Malik is a fan of Camp

Tuscazoar's 5-mile mountain bike course.

"This is my favorite course, and it's our last one of the season," Malik said.
"So they traditionally get harder with each race. This one has a decent amount of climbing. You have some rocks; you have some roots. And then there's this really fun, long descent where

everyone lines up and cheers for the riders. We get a lot of positive feedback on them loving that part."

Many hardy fans of mountain biking made the about ¼ mile trek from the main course area to the spectator zone, which takes them down a steep hill to a series of switchbacks on the race trail.

The OMBL hopes that by getting youth involved in biking, they'll be lifelong athletes who love the sport, but there are other opportunities too.

"There are some high schools and colleges who have biking teams, and there is also the USA Cycling Mountain Bike races that happen year round," Malik

All that is needed to participate is a mountain bike and a helmet, but the OMBL is there to help.

"We try and decrease the barrier to entry. So we have an Everybody Rides Scholarship, which we have \$10,000 each season we set aside to help cover equipment costs for student-athletes," Malik said. "We also work really closely with Trek, and next year we're going to get a loaner bike fleet so kids who might not have a bike can check one out and see if they like it."

Events begin on Saturdays with a preride day.

"Coaches ride the course with their teams to get the feel of it, and they also teach them how to ride certain sections that they might have trouble with," said Chris Lallier, a coach with the Grandview Bobcats.

The league makes sure

there are no riders left behind at events.

"The organization has done a good job of making safety and fun a priority even though it's a competition," Lallier said.

Marshals ride the trail with the racers, and sweeps follow behind and make sure the course is clear for the next race. Volunteers also are stationed at certain points along the trail to help if needed. All use radios to keep in contact.

Depending on their group level, riders will ride 5-20 miles at a race. Some of the older boys can complete the 5-mile course in 20-22 minutes.

The competition is tight in all the groups. In one previous girls race, the winner won by less than a second, and the third girl was less

than 20 seconds back. "It's awesome when you see that kind of competition," volunteer Doug Fish-

er of Columbus said. The league would like to see more girls get involved in the sport.

"We really want to get more girls on our team because right now we only have four, and two of them are seniors," said Denny Simon, coach of the Tuscazoar Composite team. "If there's any girls interested, we would love to have them ioin the team.'

Fees to race were a little more than \$100 this year, but the Tuscazoar team was able to secure sponsors that paid for all the race fees this year. They hope to do this again next year.







It's finally soup weather

The text came without hesitation in answer to my question to my wife: "What's for supper?"

"Soup!" she answered.
"It's finally soup weather."
And happily, she's right.
It's cool enough to start
pulling out sweaters and
warmer throws for chilly
evenings.

Soups and broths must surely be some of the oldest forms of cooking. Someone somewhere struck on the obvious plan of adding things to steaming water to create a meal, stretching resources while also giving a full tummy.

If all there is to cook are some root vegetables and a little marrow bone, you can add enough to make a potion to serve a family, if not a few boarders as well. If you need any further convincing, look to the 1947 children's book, "Stone Soup," by Marcia Brown.

Soldiers come to the village, where the inhabitants have hidden their food, knowing the men would be hungry. So the soldiers set out to make a big kettle of stone soup using just three little rocks. Soon peasants are coming out of their homes with a carrot or two or a bit of meat — things to make the soup more palatable. You can make soups out of darn near anything.

Store shelves are well stocked with little quart boxes of broth to get you going, but making your own is always best. There's a trick to getting a truly rich, unclouded meat stock.



Stocks are simmered for hours or even days, with several strainings along the way. The key word here is "simmer."

You don't want the liquid to go beyond the merest bubble. If your stock gets to a rolling boil, it causes the ingredients to disintegrate to such a degree as to release a cloudiness into the broth that is well nigh impossible to correct. Give it very low heat and a lot of time.

Soups also are a wonderful means of world culinary exploration. Every nation has its soups, from the bird's nest soup of China to the tortilla version found in Mexico. There's Vietnamese Pho, easily one of the richest and most awakening soups in the world, so much so that it's common breakfast fare there. Most European traditions have soups with dumplings or egg noodles, and the chicken soup made by Israeli mothers has come to be known as "Jewish penicillin" for its ability to cure whatever ailment you have.

Russians have their cold beet borscht, which they probably deserve. Greeks and Italians have more soups than you can count, and of course, the French have made humble broth and vegetables into another art form they can claim. Tonight at my house, it's tortellini soup, one of our favorites and the one we usually reserve for changes in weather just such as this. It's quick and simple to make and packs plenty of flavor. You can adjust the herbs to your licking.

CREAMY SPINACH TOR-TELLINI SOUP

3 tablespoons butter

1 medium onion, small dice
3 large garlic cloves, minced
2 carrots, diced
1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
1/2 teaspoon dried basil
1/2 teaspoon dried rosemary
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/4 cup all-purpose flour
6 cups chicken stock
1 package (12 ounces) fro-

zen cheese stuffed tortellini

1 cup heavy cream

roughly chopped

1 handful fresh spinach,

Heat a pan or Dutch oven over medium-low heat. When hot, add the butter, then the onions, garlic, carrots, herbs, and salt and pepper. Cook carefully for 5-6 minutes, watching that the butter doesn't brown. Add the flour and thick until crumbles form.

Slowly add the stock, whisking it in to avoid lumps. Bring the soup up to the slow boil and add the tortellini. Cook a further 6 minutes until the pasta is cooked through. Stir in the cream, add the spinach, and cook for another 5 minutes until creamy and a bit thickened. Check for salt and serve.


