## Cast members are experiencing déjà vu

A number of cast members in this year's holiday production at The Little Theatre of Tuscarawas County are experiencing déjà vu as they look back on their first experiences in "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever." In 2018 they all worked with this year's director, Lisa Sommers, but in very different roles.

Taylor Brogan, 17, daughter of Dawn Brogan and a junior at Dover High School, was in sixth grade. It was the first show she had ever been in, and she was playing Claudet, one of the "horrible Herdmans." This year she is playing the leading character, Immogene, the most troublesome of the Herdmans who eventually does a complete turn-around by the end of the play.

"Even though this is the same show, it's not," Brogan said. "I see everything from a different perspective now, and I get to bring a new light to the story. When I was younger, I learned the lines and said them, but I didn't really know what they meant."

Along with participating in The Little Theatre, Brogan keeps busy in theater, percussion, symphonic band and the bass section of

"I hope to go on in theater after high school," she said, "but I will probably major in something sensible like chemistry or a medical field. Even so, music will always be first in my heart."

Sophie Hammerstrom, daughter of Kimberly and Bill Hammerstrom, is playing Gladys this year instead of one of the baby angels. The 10-year-old who attends Dover Avenue Elementary School said she also now understands the story much better since she is older.

'There isn't any drama program at my school, so I am lucky to be able to be in The Little Theatre production," she said.

Hammerstrom is in soccer, dance and band. She makes bracelets as a hobby

when not on stage.

Carly Dumermuth, 14, daughter of Tiffany and Rodney Dumermuth, attends Central Catholic High School, where she plays tennis and participates in Power of the Pen. In seventh grade her writing took her to the regionals.

"It is really fun to see how differently people express themselves," she said. "Five years ago, all I knew how to do was learn my lines. Now I listen and hear what the story is all about."

After playing a baby angel in the first production, Dumermuth is playing Claude Herdman this year.

Anna Wherley, 14. daughter of Suzanne and Jim Wherley of New Philadelphia, made a big change in character this year, from playing Ollie Herdman to the part of narrator Beth Bradley.

"I'm not mean this time," she said. "It's a whole different character."

Wherley plays tennis at school and participates in the plays and musicals.

## **Lessons and Carols will be** presented at St. Joseph's

Advent Vespers, a service of Lessons and Carols, will be presented at St. Joseph Catholic Church on Sunday, Dec. 10 at 6 p.m. A musical prelude by the Reeves Handbells of Dover First Moravian Church and a brass ensemble will begin at 5:30 p.m. The service includes readings and congregational singing, along with choral responses by area choirs.

Lessons and Carols consists of scripture reading, beginning with the Old Testament and ending with the birth of Christ. It tells the story of the fall of humanity, the promise of the Messiah and the birth of Jesus.

The format for the service is based on an order by Edward White Benson, later archbishop of Canterbury, for Christmas Eve 1880 in Truro Cornwall. It has since been adapted and used by other churches all over the world. The program will include traditional carols sung by the choirs and the congregation.

Directors for the event include Kristi Prucha, Delphian Chorale; Brian Botdorf, brass ensemble; Joan Wenzel, percussion;

Ron Barkett, First United with the exception of two Methodist Church; Franklin Miller, Legacy Christian School; G. Randall Gibbs, Reeves Handbells/ Moravian Chancel Choir; Jeanne Baker, St. John's United Church of Christ; Kateri Renicker, TCCS; and Beth Houze, Kathy Philips, Carlos Solis and Jeremiah Jones, directors of St. Joseph choirs.

Host Pastor Jones said, "The ecumenical service was brought into existence in 2010 by Kevin Kutz, who was director of music at St. Joseph Catholic Church at the time. It has continued to be an annual community event every year since then,

years during the pandemic.

"I am happy to carry on this special tradition. It brings to mind Psalm 133, which states, 'How good and pleasant it is when God's people dwell together in unity.' It is a unique time when Christian brothers and sisters of different denominations of Christianity come together to celebrate that one most important thing that we all need — the salvation of God offered to us through our Savior Jesus Christ."

The service is free to the public. St. Joseph's Church is located at 613 N. Tuscarawas Ave. in Dover.

# Help for the holiday

Fire department is collecting toys

For the third year, the New Philadelphia Fire Department will collect toys for children who are separated from their families this Christmas. The drive-thru for toy donations is set for Sunday, Dec. 3 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the fire station downtown.

Fire department community care coordinator Paula Lancaster said her work supporting the department's paramedics led to community outreach when she began at her position three years ago.

"In 2020 we did a compassion station where we gathered laundry soaps and dish soaps. When the pandemic hit, families who used their EBT cards were unable to buy household items with that,

so we helped out with that. After that, we asked ourselves what else we might be able to do as a fire station to help our community," Lancaster said.

In 2021 a partnership with Tuscarawas County Job & Family Services began the next phase of the department's efforts.

"We partnered with their child protection department," Lancaster said. "A lot of times, kids are placed outside their normal environment on an emergency basis, and their hosts may not have been expecting to have children around for the holidays. That year's toy drive for those kids was very successful. We don't pick the families; we just collect the toys and deliver them to Job & Family Services, and they see that everything gets to where it's needed."

many may not have realized existed. "The children may have been pulled from their homes for whatever reason, and grandparents or another relative may have them or they may be placed with a temporary foster care family. That may be a situation where no one was expecting to have children around at Christmas," Lancaster said.

With just a two-hour window for dropping off toys, Lancaster said the focus is on toys for children of all ages. "We have received donations of things like clothes or socks, but there is funding in place to make sure those needs are covered for the kids in that situation. What's not covered is Christmas toys."

The department is looking for new, unwrapped toys and fun gifts that can then be passed on to the children. The size of the donation doesn't matter.

"Some people bring a trunk load of toys, and others bring just one. It's all very much appreciated, no matter how much is donated," Lancaster said.

The department bay and trucks will be decorated for the toy drive, and a special visitor will be on hand.

"Santa Claus will be here that day, so you can visit with Santa and talk with him also," Lancaster said.

The drive-thru is pretty busy, Lancaster said. "We have people enter from the alley at the rear of the building and drive on through."

She then takes the donated toys to Job & Family Services the next day after the drive.

"We have a lot of generous people in the area, and there are many agencies that gather toys each year," Lancaster said. "We looked for something that might have been missed, and when we found out there was a need for this, it touched our hearts and we knew we wanted to help."

Having found a successful formula, the department plans to keep doing the toy drive in the future.





## New Philadelphia was at the epicenter of fan production

When people think about New Philadelphia and Tuscarawas County, few know about the importance of the area in the development and production of the vane axial flow fan — also known as a vane axial fan.

In fact, at one time New Philadelphia was at the epicenter of vane axial fan production and its use in major air ventilation systems including mines, tunnels and other industry-related

According to Surplus Sales' "The History of the Vane Axial Fan," Lee Barrett, the chief electrical engineer of Pittsburgh Coal, learned Dr. Theodore Troller of the Guggheim Lighter-Than-Air Institute in Akron had developed a fan for a wind tunnel that produced an airflow volume of nearly 200,000 cubic feet per minute. Subsequently, Barrett visited Troller and signed an agreement whereby Troller would design what would be a 6-foot-diameter fan and Pittsburgh Coal would build

the fan in its Pittsburghbased research library, led by Dr. Young. The prototype was built with wooden blades.

When Bethlehem Steel heard about the vane axial design — a series of vanes that are mounted on a rotating shaft (the vanes create a fluid flow that helps to move air or liquid through the fan) — they wanted it for use in their iron ore mining operations. A fan similar to the prototype was built with bronze blades in place of wooden ones and installed at Bethlehem's mining operations in Ellsworth, Pennsylvania.

Joy Manufacturing, with operations in Franklin, Pennsylvania, was approached to mass produce the vane axial fan design. The company declined, as did the leading mining fan manufacture in the U.S. at the time, Jeffrey Manufacturing, based in Columbus and founded in 1876 as Lechner Mining Manufacturing by Joseph Jeffrey and Francis Lechner.

Undaunted in their

efforts to find a company to build the revolutionary fan, Barrett and Trotter signed an agreement with the La-Del Conveyor and Manufacturing Company of New Philadelphia to build vane axial fans in the 5-footdiameter range. The first fan was delivered in December

From 1937-41 La-Del built surface mine fans for major customers such as U.S. Steel and others. When World War II broke out, La-Del worked with Navy engineers to design and build vane axial fan systems for all Navy warships and heavy cruisers including the CB-1 and CB-2 models. All production at New Philadelphia was war production beginning in 1942. During this time La-Del also worked with Goodyear Aircraft in Akron to design and install blowers for all of the war blimps; the blowers were identified as Ballanet Blowers.

Another World War II production project had La-Del partner with Chicago-based Stewart-Warner Company to develop a 400-CFM aircraft heating fan built to military specifications.

In 1946 Joy Manufacturing finally took an interest in the success of the vane axial design and purchased the plant from La-Del. Trotter became VP of engineers and worked with Charles L. Tinker to design and build a model block construction one-piece fan casting vane axial fan that was used in nearly all commercial and military aircraft from 1946 to the early 1960s. Tinker was the lead designer for all special projects and had contributed to some of Trotter's work with the original mining fan designs. Later, Tinker joined the Chicago Blower Company and Irvine, California-based Bonanza Fans, where he rose to become VP of engineering.

Joy continued to provide vane axial fan solutions for major ventilation including the Bay Area Rapid Transit System, where construction began on June 19, 1964, and was completed in 1971.

## Lockport Square display returns to the south side

Passing through the south side of New Philadelphia, drivers may notice the return of a large Christmas display to Lockport Square that had previously gone missing for several years. The effort to restore the many holiday silhouettes was spearheaded this year by Jonalee Limbacher Fernatt, who works in the New Philadelphia Service Director's Office.

"The key people involved in setting the display up every year passed away," Fernatt said. "Then I think it went unnoticed that they just weren't there anymore. I wanted to find out what happened to them."

It turned out that though the many snowmen and other characters were put in place privately, the city supplied storage space and electricity each year.

"They were right there, stored inside the old Lock-

port Town Hall building, which was slated for demolition," Fernatt said. "We talked about trying to get them put out again last year, but there were too many uncertainties about the storage space and other things. And the electricity for that corner is actually tied to the town hall building. There was a lot to get sorted out. Once that was done this year, it was time to really get the ball rolling on the project."

A social media page was created to get the word out, and an Amazon wish list brought in donations of light bulbs, cords, plugs and other necessities.

"Within 10 days we had enough money and donations to get going," Fernatt said. "We didn't worry about painting the silhouettes this year but focused on getting everything repaired and functioning."

An electrician replaced plugs and reconfigured wiring to allow all of the pieces to be lit while replacing all the old bulbs with new LED versions. The whole business was made safe and brought up to code. Oct. 23 was designated volunteer day, and plenty of south side neighbors came out to help get everything in place.

Fernatt said the display began about 30 years ago when south siders got together to use the land, which is owned by ODOT, for a little Christmas cheer. One of the displays is now marked in the memory of founders Larry and David

"It has always been privately done, but the city has always helped out," Fernatt said, adding there used to be several such neighborhood Christmas displays around town. "They're mainly gone now, and I'm not sure what became of them. We wanted to make sure this one was put out again and will be in

To that end, an account for south side neighbors has been set up at Huntington Bank to revive future donations. "That way donors are writing checks to a fund rather than to anyone personally. We really want to address the silhouettes in the future. They were out for many winters and are in need of some repairs and

restoration," Fernatt said.

Fernatt, a longtime south side resident, said it's all about community and coming together for the holi-

"Christmas is about the memories you create rather than the presents and food. It's small things like this that you can do to make a difference that matter.

This is how you change the world for the better. You do what you can do, address what you are able to

change," she said.

Lockport Square is on South Broadway, south of New Towne Mall and just beyond the Route 250 overpass. The display will be lit each evening through the end of the year.

go to funds created for the pus, get people to come out and just have fun. We do different things for the students and try to raise money for our community, which is great," Barker said.

Upcoming events include a hot chocolate bar during finals week in December. They also are in the process of planning a bingo night in the spring.

"We are thankful for our students, faculty and staff that always come out and participate. And we're super thankful for the community that we have here at Kent State University at Tuscarawas," Dyer said.

The group also teamed up with the admissions office in October for trunk

"We had about 250 people come to our trunk or treat. We had the police department; they decorated a vehicle. And we had a whole bunch of different things over in the performing arts center," Dyer said.

All USG activities are held in the fall and spring semesters. Full-time students at the campus are eligible to join the group.





## **House Bill 333 would prohibit** ticket and arrest quotas

er (R-Newark) and Bride Rose Sweeney (D-Westlake) recently introduced legislation that will prohibit ticket and arrest quotas.

House Bill 333 defines a quota as a mandate of a certain number of arrests made or citations issued for any offense that a local or state police officer must meet in a specified time period. It also clarifies what is not considered a quota, such as community contacts or analyzing data on arrests or citations.

"As a retired state trooper, my goal was always to keep motorists safe and change unwanted behav-

State Reps. Kevin Mill- ior," Miller said. "Sometimes this was accomplished with a citation while many times a friendly warning would suffice. Our lawenforcement officers need discretion versus an arbitrary quota system used to generate local revenue."

Legislation banning quotas has been passed in 25 other states including Arkansas, Florida, Iowa, Louisiana, South Carolina, Texas, Tennessee, Michigan and Pennsylvania.

"Requiring officers to meet arbitrary quotas distracts from the primary objective of law enforcement, which must always be to preserve public safety. Quotas not only add unnecessary pressure to an already difficult job, but they also harm police-community relations," Sweeney said.
"Banning this practice will shore up the public trust in law enforcement that is so essential for civil society, and it will ensure that officers have the professional discretion to make arrests or write tickets in the interest of public safety.'

House Bill 333 is supported by the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association and the Fraternal Order of Police.

"The Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association commends Reps. Miller and Sweeney for working to prohibit ticket and arrest quotas and avoid unnecessary conflict between law enforcement and the people we proudly serve. When agencies arbitrarily dictate a certain number of arrests or citations that an officer must issue to keep their job, the trust between the public and law enforcement, as well as the very nature of constitutional policing, is needlessly tested," said George Sakellakis, OPBA director of organization. 'Ohioans must be assured that any citation or arrest is valid, legitimate and necessary.

"Police officers, sheriff's deputies and troopers are true professionals who risk their lives to serve our communities, not revenue generators. They got into this business to protect our neighborhoods, not occupy them. We are thankful that the legislature is tackling this important issue and urge them to pass this bill and end the practice of quotas in Ohio.'

House Bill 333 awaits committee assignment.








## Now's the right time to quit

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, cigarette smoke contains over 7,000 chemicals and toxins, with roughly 70 of these chemicals causing cancer. When nonsmokers are exposed to cigarette smoke, they are unintentionally breathing in these chemicals.

Brief exposure to secondhand smoke from time to time may not seem like a huge concern, but there is no safe level of exposure when it comes to secondhand smoke. Secondhand smoke has immediate impacts on the heart and blood vessels. It increases the risk of stroke, coronary heart disease and lung cancer in nonsmoking adults.

Babies exposed to secondhand smoke are at increased risk of sudden infant death syndrome, and children with exposure to secondhand smoke experience more respiratory infections, ear infections and may have more severe asthma. Each year in the United States, 41,000 adults die from lung cancer and heart disease caused by secondhand smoke exposure.

In 2006 the Ohio Smoke Free Workplace Act was enacted to protect individuals from exposure to cigarette smoke inside public places and places of work. This ensured employees

and other community members experienced less exposure to secondhand smoke. In the years since this went into effect, e-cigarettes have risen in popularity, once again increasing the rates of potential exposure.

In Ohio approximately 6% of adults, 12% of middle school students and 29% of high school students use e-cigarettes. An e-cigarette's aerosol is not a harmless water vapor, as it holds many of the same cancercausing chemicals cigarette smoke has, as well as other heavy metals and toxins. Like cigarette smoke, exposure to e-cigarette aerosol may increase your risk of health harms.

In 2021 the Ohio Smoke Free Workplace Act was expanded to include e-cigarettes, requiring current e-cigarette users to also go outside to smoke. While the act was expanded with

the intention of fully protecting the community from the harms of smoking and vaping, smoke-free policies also often result in reduced tobacco use, increased smoking cessation and decreased youth initiation.

If you smoke cigarettes or vape, you are exposing yourself and potentially others to health risks. Quitting is the best way to protect not only yourself, but also those around you. It's never too late to quit smoking. Your Medicare plan may cover up to two cessation attempts per year up to eight visits with your primary care provider at no cost to you. Call your provider today for information on cessation services.

## Smart home devices to help seniors age in place

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

I've been talking to my mobility-challenged mother, who lives alone, about automating her house with some smart home products to make it more convenient. She's very interested, but we'd like to get your opinion as to which types of smart devices are most helpful for seniors aging in place.

#### **Searching Daughter** Dear Searching,

If your mother is game, smart home products such as smart lights, video doorbells and voice-activated speakers can be very useful for aging in place. These devices can add safety and convenience to a home by providing voice and appcontrolled operation, which is extremely helpful for seniors who have mobility issues or reduced vision.

Smart home technology also can provide family members peace of mind by giving them the ability to electronically keep tabs on their elder loved one when they can't be there.

If you're interested in adding some smart home products to your mom's house, she'll need home Wi-Fi installed, and she'll need either a smartphone, tablet or smart speaker to operate them. To help you get started, here are some different types of devices to consider that are very helpful to older adults.

#### Smart speakers

A smart speaker, like the Amazon Echo, Google Nest or Apple HomePod, can serve as the brains of a smart home, controlling the devices with voice commands or automating them.

These devices also can play your mom's favorite music, read audiobooks, make calls, set timers and



alarms, check traffic and weather, answer questions, call for help in emergency situations, and provide reminders for medications, appointments and other things — all done by voice commands.

#### **Smart light bulbs**

To help prevent home falls — which are often caused by fumbling around a dark room looking for a light switch — smart light bulbs will let your mom turn on and off the lights by voice command, smartphone or tablet. These bulbs also can change brightness and color and be programmed to come on and off whenever she wants.

#### Smart plugs

These small units plug into a standard outlet and connect to the internet. That means your mom can control whatever she plugs into them — from a space heater to a coffee maker — using her voice or phone.

#### Video doorbell

Safety also is a concern for older adults, especially those who live alone. A video doorbell would let your mom see and speak to visitors at the door without having to walk over and open it.

#### **Smart locks**

For convenience and safety, smart locks would give your mom keyless entry to her home; provide customized access to family, friends and caregivers; and let you monitor who comes and goes from your mom's house.

#### **Smart thermostat**

This lets your mom preprogram or manually control the temperature in her home with voice command or via phone and lets you monitor it too.

#### Smart smoke alarms

These will alert your mom when smoke or carbon monoxide is detected and also will send alerts to your phone if a problem is detected.

#### Stovetop shut-off

To prevent home cooking fires, smart stovetop shut-off devices, like the IGuardStove, will turn off electric and gas stovetops when left unattended and will alert you via text.

#### Medical alert system

These devices provide wearable wrist and/or necklace emergency buttons that would allow your mom to call for help if she were to fall or need assistance. Many systems today also provide voice-activation and fall-detection features and caregiver tracking apps that will let you keep tabs on her.

#### Cameras and smart sen-

If your mom needs more in-depth monitoring, there are indoor cameras you can install so you can see, hear and talk to her from your phone. Or if that's too intrusive, you can install smart contact sensors on her doors so you can know when she comes and goes or on her refrigerator door so you can know if she's eating.

Black Friday, Cyber the post-Thanksgiving holi- no hope of getting gifts for Monday and all those sweet day weekend? Are all the people on the cheap until the after-Christmas sales?

My email inbox says otherwise, with burgeoning piles of junk mail arriving round the clock promising all manner of savings, though none of the big kind I like to see. I don't think you can get people excited about 10% off anything. I want half off; I'm not interested in saving 5% on remaining 2023 calendars. Something else I've seen being batted around the internet: We have all pretty much grabbed the cheap big-screen televisions. Please lower grocery prices if you really want to

The cooks on your Christmas list must be among the easiest to buy for. If you have any kind of knowledge of what their special area of interest is, you're all set. Someone who likes to make pizza at home would probably like a pizza stone, a good cookbook



with tasty dough recipes or even a pizza cutting wheel.

Someone who jumped on the sourdough baking bandwagon during the dark shut-in days of 2020 may be ready to really take their game to the next level. There are some excellent books out there to help, but I would add a list of You-Tube instruction videos to the wrapping. You can learn a great deal from watching people step through the mysterious kneading and folding and fermenting. It has certainly helped me.

If you're feeling quite generous and you have serious meat lovers on your list, perhaps keep an eye out at handhewnfarm.com. It's a farm in Fresno, Ohio that offers workshops in learning to make cured meats in the European manner. This would be a fun adventure and a heck of a gift to receive.

I always urge good knives as gifts, as they'll be used for decades and then passed to a new generation. We have Warther Knives nearby, and there are many artisan knife makers scattered around the country. There also are blade-sharpening tools and systems that are infinitely useful. In the same line, no cook will be unhappy with a heavy-duty, well-crafted, large-size cutting board.

If you're thinking of gifting cookware, I would avoid pieces by off-brand makers that are thin and cheap feeling. "Nonstick" is a term thrown around by a lot of manufacturers, and much of it is garbage. The coatings are paper thin, and those I've had no choice but to use burned everything and were by no means

nonstick. Whatever stuck to them created a permanent black burn in the coating. Just about any pan can be used without food sticking if you're doing things correctly. Go instead for heavy-bottomed pieces with sturdy handles and tightfitting lids.

If you want to buy something for a cook but that cook is not someone you plan to spend a lot on, let me recommend a big package of kitchen towels like those used in restaurant kitchens. You can buy them by the dozens for cheap, and cooks tend to go through them at a fast clip, tossing them in the wash one after another.

Aprons with funny sayings on them are fun, but I think most of us have a closet full of them.

Cooks are easy to buy for, if you know your cook fairly well. If you don't, you can always buy some oven mitts, known at my house as "grabby hots."




