Keeping the memory alive

Festival organizers petition state for Cy Young Day

The organizers of the Cy Young Days Festival, held each year in June in Newcomerstown, could use some help. They believe keeping alive the memory of professional baseball pitcher Cy Young, who was from Newcomerstown, is important.

Even though the Cy Young Award for Major League Baseball pitchers is given each year, there are people who don't know the pitcher.

"The younger generation has no idea who Cy Young was," said Ed Gibson, president of the Cy Young Days Festival. "There's a lot of the older people who don't know too. I will get people calling us and say, 'What's the C.Y. Young Festival?"

The exception to that is the dedicated Cy Young Days Festival royalty who travel each year to talk about Cy Young at other festivals.

They're amazing. They put their hearts and souls into what they're doing, and they seem to really enjoy it," Gibson said.

Gibson and others began a campaign several years ago to get the fourth Satur-

day in June designated as Cy Young Day in the state of Ohio, but they haven't yet been successful.

"There's two awards given out every year in the American League and the National League, and he was the first professional baseball player to have an award named after him," Gibson said. "There should be a day set aside for him."

A possible Cy Young Day would be celebrated during the Cy Young Days Festival as it is always held the fourth weekend of June. Saturday during the festival is the luncheon, which honors their special guest, who is a Cy Young Award winner.

The festival committee hasn't heard back on their efforts yet.

"Hopefully, the legislators will take time to sit down, look at this and see if they will do it for us," Gibson said.

The committee asks the public contact politicians to let them know they think a designated day for Cy Young is a good idea because of what he has accomplished. A list of representatives and their contact information is posted on the Cy Young Days Festival Facebook page.

He has baseball records that have never been broken and never will be," Gibson

enjoyed being involved in the festival. Through it he has met elderly people who remember Cy Young from when they were children.

"It's just great to listen to the stories that people have to tell," Gibson said.

It was the late Jane Benedum Meuhlen who convinced Gibson to bring back the community festival named after the pitcher. She was once the caretaker for Cy Young.

Professional baseball was not as lucrative then as it is today.

"When he got out of Gibson said he has Major League Baseball, he was broke. And he went to live with the Benedums. Jane was maybe 4 years old when he moved in," Gibson said. "After she got a little older, at 14 years of age, the state gave her a special driver's license so she could drive Cy Young around."

> Gibson said he feels honored he got the opportunity to meet Benedum Meuhlen, who flew in one year for the festival.

> The committee members want to ensure the festival continues and welcome others who would like to be involved. You do not have to live in Newcomerstown to help.

"We've got people from Dover, Coshocton and Columbus that come to our

festival meetings," Gibson said. "We want everyone in the state to know about Cy Young.

Currently, this year's festival committee is working on securing a Cy Young Award winner to attend the 2024 festival.

"We've got a list of about three or four that we would like to have. It's not an easy thing to do because, No. 1, the player has to go along with it and their agents have to go along with it," Gibson said. "We try to bring a former Cy Young Award winner in every year. One of the things we do, we take them out to the grave site and let them put a wreath on the grave of Cy Young. I think they're just amazed.'

Keeping the festival going forever is a priority.

"We're glad we're doing this, and we would love to have younger people getting more involved with it. There's quite a few of us that are in their 70s," Gibson said. "I really enjoy being involved, and we've got a lot of good people here involved in it."

Gibson hopes others will contact the representatives to make a designated Cy Young Day in Ohio a reality.

"Bottom line, one person's not going to get anything done by themselves. You have to have other people involved," Gibson said.

ATUSKY Tribute

Community comes together to help those affected by recent accident

E verywhere you turn it seems you'll find signs of love and support for all those who were impacted by the Nov. 14 Tusky Valley bus accident. And the signs stretch from Ohio all the way to Florida and California.

The accident on I-70 in Licking County stole the lives of three students, a teacher and two chaperones. Another 18 students were injured, with one student and the charter bus driver requiring hospitalization and surgeries.

Whenever events like this occur, human beings come together to share the grief and make the burden a little easier to bear. To acknowledge all those who came together to support the families and the school would require

reams of paper. There are simply too many, but here are just a few.

Pray for Tusky Valley

One of the first companies to reach out to the community was Lightning Signs in New Philadelphia. By afternoon on the day of the accident, the company's mobile sign could be seen winding its way through the streets of Tusky Valley country.

After that, owner Cris Call decided to create yard signs bearing the phrase and offer them to the public by donation only. Any funds raised would go to the families.

"I thought it would be really cool if we could collect \$5,000 over a few weeks," he said. "We did that the first day, and the second day we did over \$16,000."

Employees at Lightning Signs in New Philadelphia stayed late and gave up lunch hours to produce and distribute "Pray for Tusky Valley" signs, raising more than \$50,000 for families affected by the bus accident.

At the end of one week, more than 4,000 signs had been distributed and more than \$50,000 raised.

"I want to thank all my employees for what they did," Call said. "The way they stepped up, staying late and never complaining, and the way the community came together, I get choked up talking about it."

Call said he has seen the signs, not just in Tusky Valley territory, but also in other places. "I've seen them in places like Carrollton and Bowerston. We've even shipped some to California and Florida. I never dreamed it would get this big, but I'm so glad it did."

Big-hearted businesses

A number of local businesses have found ways to chip in as well. In Bolivar the owner of Haven Shala Yoga Studio started a GoFundMe account almost immediately, which has now been merged with the TVStrong fund.

The Towpath Tavern raised more than \$5,000 through sales of 300 hand-painted Christmas ornaments, and the Bolivar Army-Navy, Bolivar Pizza, Bolivar Subway and Sublime Smoke all pitched in to raise funds.

One person can make a difference

When Mike Gross heard what happened, he sprang into action. The Bolivar resident and sportsman decided to hold a gun raffle to benefit injured student Brynn Goedel and her family as they face mounting medical bills.

Ticket sales were so successful the first day that Vaughn Sears, a friend of Gross, purchased a second gun so they could pull two winners out of the hat. "I never met Brynn or her family, but we've got to start taking care of people we don't know," Gross said.

Plans are in place to deliver a gift basket to the Goedels containing raffle proceeds of \$21,585, some girlie items and all of the raffle tickets. "I want her to see the names of all the people who bought tickets," Gross said. "I want people to know there are still good folks out there."

Stephen Strawn, a former Bolivar resident and Air Force veteran, and Josh Keane, Strawn's friend and an Army veteran, organized a memorial run/walk held on the Tusky Valley track.

"The idea was to have people run or walk either six laps or 6 miles, one to honor each of the six victims," Strawn said.

Strawn chose to start the event at 8:52 a.m., the time the accident occurred, and end it six hours later. Approximately 100 people participated in the event, which also served as a blood drive.

More than 20 units of blood were donated along with \$1,050 in cash, which will be given to the TVStrong fund and earmarked for

the Goedel family.

On Dec. 11 Mike Penso and Jody Engstrom, who helped with the event, presented a Tusky Valley flag to the board of education bearing the signatures of those who participated in the event.

Multitudes of others have found individual ways to help raise funds by selling everything from handmade car air fresheners and T-shirts to hand-painted duffel bags and fashion headbands.

TV colors shine everywhere

In the days and weeks since the accident, people around the state and across the nation have felt moved to honor Tusky Valley in some way. Numerous schools and colleges donned the red and black Tusky Valley colors and posted photos on social media.

The Amherst Marching Comets learned the TV Fight Song, and all 400 members of the Band Directors Marching Band in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade wore black ribbons attached to pins they had made in honor of a New York high school band involved in a charter bus accident in September.

"The outpouring of love and support is overwhelming," said Dr. Derek Varansky, superintendent of Tusky Valley Schools. "Whether near or far, schools, organizations, businesses and individuals have sent cards and supplies, shared recordings of our alma mater, dressed in red and black, and participated in fundraisers. We will be forever thankful for them uplifting and sustaining us on some of our darkest days."

Assistance available to help with home energy bills this winter

The Ohio Department of Development and HARCATUS Tri-County Community Action Organization Inc. want to remind Ohioans assistance is available to help with their home energy bills.

The Home Energy Assistance Program helps Ohioans at or below 175% of the federal poverty guidelines pay their heating bills. Ohioans who are threatened with disconnection, have been disconnected from their utility service, transferring services, establishing new services, have a PIPP default with a disconnection notice at or below 25% fuel, may also be eligible for the HEAP Winter Crisis Program, which started Nov. 1.

Ohioans can visit energyhelp. ohio.gov to apply online, download a copy of the application, or find contact information for a local energy assistance provider. Individuals will need to have copies of the following documents to include with their application:

-Most recent utility bills.

-A list of all household members (including birth dates and Social Security numbers).

-Proof of income for the past 30 days for all household members (12 months for certain income types).

-Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.

-Proof of disability if applicable.

HEAP benefits are applied to an individual's energy bill after Jan. 1. If you need immediate assistance with your energy bills, contact your local energy assistance provider. For residents of Harrison, Carroll and Tuscarawas counties, visit www. harcatus.org/heap for your location Community Services Office. A list of providers can be found at energyhelp.ohio.gov.

Applications for the HEAP Winter Crisis program must be received by March 31, 2024. The last day to apply for the regular HEAP benefit is May 31, 2024. For more information on the programs, visit energyhelp.ohio.gov or call your local energy assistance





He served at the county







Kent students awarded scholarships from Intel

Two students in the College of Applied and Technical Studies at Kent State Tuscarawas received the Intel Semiconductor Scholarship for Women from the Intel Corporation.

Eggnog is a beverage Fact Site and Tastemade:

-Eggnog likely originated in the medieval period and was known as "posset," a hot, milk-based drink made of spices and wine. Even though posset could be a cocktail, it also was used as a remedy for colds and flu for its soothing properties.

-Milk, eggs and sherry used in the early recipes were difficult to come by, so when eggnog first appeared, it was a drink only the wealthy could enjoy. That changed when eggnog was popularized in the American colonies, where dairy products and liquor were more readily available.

—Etymologists believe

eggnog stems from the word "noggin," which refers to small wooden mugs often used to serve strong ale, known by the slang word 'nog.'

-In the medieval period, it was risky to drink milk straight because it wasn't pasteurized. Eggnog contained alcohol so that it would kill off any harmful bacteria in the milk.

-A typical homemade version of eggnog has roughly one egg per serving. However, commercial eggnog is regulated by the FDA and can only contain 1% of the product's final weight in egg yolk solids. That stems from fear of raw egg and salmonella.

President George Washington apparently enjoyed serving eggnog at Christmas and even had his own special recipe, according to the Old Farmer's Almanac.

-There is no right or wrong alcohol to use when preparing eggnog. Distilled spirits like rum, sherry, cognac and whiskey all have produced suitable eggnogs.

—Puerto Rican coquito is a traditional drink that is very similar to eggnog.

-Individuals concerned about eggs or milk in eggnog can enjoy a vegan rec-

ipe made from nut milk EGGNOG instead. Commercially produced vegan eggnog offerings are now more widely available.

One of the more notable flavors in eggnog comes from the use of nutmeg. Nutmeg is a fragrant spice made from grinding the seed of the nutmeg tree.

Now that you've learned about eggnog, whip up a batch of George Washington's original recipe this holiday season.

1 quart cream

1 quart milk

1 dozen tablespoons

sugar

1 pint brandy

1/2 pint rye whiskey

1/2 pint Jamaican rum

1/4 pint sherry

Eggs (Washington forgot to include the number of eggs, so home chefs can improvise or use six, which seems to be the standard in traditional recipes)

Mix liquor first and then separate yolks and whites of eggs. Add sugar to beaten yolks and mix well. Add milk and cream, slowly beating. Beat whites of eggs until stiff and fold slowly into mixture. Let sit in a cool place for several days. Taste frequently.

Today's recipe makers may want to set the eggnog in the refrigerator as the

'cool place" of choice. (George Washington's original interpretation.)



As a kid I thought Yorkshire pudding was a dessert

When I was a kid, being American and from rural Ohio at that, I thought Yorkshire pudding was a dessert, like chocolate or banana pudding.

The first inkling this might not be the case came from reading one of the books by Yorkshire veterinarian James Alfred Wight, writing as James Herriot. They're still some of my favorite books, and as a sidebar to one of the stories, Herriot speaks of his wife Helen having roast beef and Yorkshire pudding waiting for him after a tough day of delivering calves. "The pudding, with the soul of the meat in it," he said. That was enough

to send me off researching. The first time I tried the pudding was with a plain pot roast and gravy, which was good but not the real deal. I used the recipe Herriot offered with the story, and my youth and inexperience produced something I knew couldn't be right.

It was much later when my family began having a splurged beef rib roast for Christmas dinner every other year or so that I began to grasp what Yorkshire

pudding was supposed to

I tried several versions of the recipe from numerous sources, searching for just the right thing. Finally, the ever-reliable Martha Stewart shared a foolproof route to perfection every time, with big, puffed, eggy pudding sporting both crunchy and soft bits to both hold and soak up the sauce or gravy.

If you haven't tried to make Yorkshire pudding, let me give you a shove in the right direction. Next to the beef, it's my absolute favorite part of the meal. The bonus is the pudding's ability to play cheaper filler. As British moms promised their children, "Them that eats the most pudding gets the most meat," knowing a smaller cut of beef could be stretched nicely if everyone piled on the amazing pudding and

seems to be something that melted lard. When the battakes a little practice, and I'm unsure why. It isn't at all difficult, but it really was several years of trying before I got it right.

I find you have to really beat the batter very well, incorporating as much air into the egg and milk mixture as possible. Though most recipes suggest having all the ingredients at room temperature, Martha has us put the batter into the fridge for a day before baking time to get really

When it's time to bake the pudding, you can use either a square or rectangular baking pan, cake pans, or a popover pan. Whichever you choose, the pan must be heated well on a burner, then a little fat added to the bottom of the pan before pouring in the batter. The fat should ideally be from the roasting pan, but you also can use vegetable or olive oil or

ter goes in, it should sizzle.

Once in the oven, the pudding will puff up well above the edges of the pan, with the outer edges getting a lovely dark crispness while the center remains soft and moist.

Once the pudding cools a bit, tear it into serving blobs and serve it around your roast beef or in a bowl on the side. This is not the time for gravy from a jar. Take the time to make a beautiful brown sauce using the browned bits from the roasting pan.

Roast beef and Yorkshire pudding for Christmas feels like going to Scrooge's nephew's house and stuffing yourself before playing a game of The Minister's Cat.

YORKSHIRE PUD-

- 2 cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 6 large eggs 2 1/2 cups milk

Meat drippings or other

Add the flour and salt to a large mixing bowl, whisking to combine. Make a well in the flour and add the eggs. Whisk the eggs into the flour until you have a paste. Slowly whisk in 1/2 cup of the milk until a thick batter begins to form, then gradually add the remaining 2 cups milk. Give it all a good whisking, then transfer to a covered pitcher. You can make the batter a day ahead and refrigerate until ready to cook.

Preheat oven to 425 F. Using whatever pan you choose (the pan in which the beef was roasted is ideal), heat the pan until hot and add a few tablespoons of fat, give the batter another good mixing, and then add to the pan. Place the pan in the hot oven and bake for 25 minutes, until crisp and golden.

But here's another top a.m., but I have got to keep going while I have the momentum. I toss an old sweater I never really liked and another I can just tell by looking is going to accentuate the spread.






