Veteran director recalls interviewing Titanic survivor

The Scotland Road production that recently closed at the Little Theatre of Tuscarawas County generated a great deal of renewed interest in the Titanic. Among those with real stories to tell was Rex Huffman, veteran theater director and former features editor for the Times Reporter, who actually interviewed a survivor of the famed ship.

"If I hadn't chosen journalism as my life's work, I never would have had such an opportunity," Huffman said. "I was a writer for 42 years and an editor for 20 of those, and that was one of my most memorable assignments.'

After graduating from Strasburg High School in 1969, Huffman majored in journalism and minored in political science and history at Kent State University. Just out of college, he applied for a job with the first paper in Tuscarawas County, The Evening Chronicle, based in Uhrichsville.

"I was accepted in that job and moved with the paper wherever it went," he said. "I never had to interview for another job.'

When the Chronicle was bought by the Times Reporter, Huffman took his job there as assistant to the state editor in charge of 40 correspondents. Until his retirement he served at different times as editor of many of the sections of the paper including Showcase, the Sunday Magazine, Arts and Leisure, Food, Seniors, and then as features editor.

The opportunity to

interview someone from the Titanic presented itself unexpectedly in 1998 when a member of the advertising department at the Times Reporter asked Huffman if he would be interested in talking to a survivor. She gave him the phone number.

'Of course I accepted right away," Huffman said, but this was such a unique situation that I began to second guess myself and almost turned it down. I wasn't sure whether I should intrude on this woman's life. When I realized that this was a oncein-a-lifetime opportunity, I called her, and we had a wonderful phone interview."

Huffman said the survivor, Eleanor Johnson, was in her 80s when they talked. She said all her information came from her mother Alina Vilhelmina Johnson because she was only 18 months old at the time of their rescue. Her mother refused to talk about it anywhere but at home because it was too painful for her.

Eleanor Johnson related the following story: She, her mother and 4-year-old brother Harold had traveled from the U.S. to Finland to visit Alina's dying father. They were scheduled to return to the U.S. on a smaller ship, but there was a coal strike, and all the available coal was given to the newer, larger ships. Thus, on April 14, 1912, the little family was transferred to the Titanic with a space in steerage. She did not remember how they were able to get to the boat deck. but they were among the last of the survivors to be put into

a lifeboat.

Shortly after the ship struck the iceberg, Alina and a cabin mate went out on deck and kicked around pieces of ice until an officer told them to get back to their room as the ship would be on its way quickly.

Soon they were taken on deck by a group of Swedes and tossed into the lifeboat. After being rescued by the RMS Carpathia, they arrived in New York City on April 18. Friends they had met on board died on the ship. When Eleanor Johnson's father in Illinois heard of the tragedy and the rescue, he is said to have fainted. Friends raised \$100 to send him to New York to meet his family.

Into her 80s Johnson remained active in Titanic-

related activities. Her family members were honored guests at the screening of the 1953 film, "Titanic," and the 1958 screening of "A Night to Remember.'

She was the only survivor Director James Cameron met with while filming the newer version of "Titanic" in 1997. After the movie's release, she had to change her phone number to an unlisted one after receiving so many phone calls every day.

In her 80s Johnson visited her son in Florida — the first time she had seen the Atlantic Ocean since 1912. She also joined other survivors on an expedition cruise to the site of the Titanic's wreck. Johnson died March 7, 1998, a few short months after Huffman's interview.

There is a strong connection between Huffman's interest in the Titanic as a child and his second career as a theater actor and director.

'We didn't live in a neighborhood full of children when I was growing up," he said, "so my mother encouraged me to watch quality movies on television and often took me to the theaters. I developed a love of story then. One of my best experiences was in fifth grade where my teacher Verna Brown introduced her students to acting. On Columbus Day we presented a radio play over the PA system for the whole school to hear. I played Christopher Columbus's father. Later, I was assigned the part of Squire Holly in a one-act play. It was my first experience with costumes and memorizing lines. My first audition netted me the part of the coroner in 'Night of Jan. 16.'

'A cousin told me the movie 'Titanic' was going to be on TV. As luck would have it, I was enjoying one of my weekend visits with grandparents and was able to talk them into letting me stay up after 11 o'clock to watch it. I was enthralled and could talk of nothing else the next day. That year was the 50th anniversary of the sinking of the ship, and I read the story in a copy of Weekly Reader at school. Now I couldn't get enough of the Titanic. After reading 'A Night to Remember,' I was completely hooked." In 1977 Huffman's the-

ater and writing interests began to coincide. While performing in "January Thaw" in Strasburg, he had to miss a week of rehearsals to cover the Miss America pageant in Atlantic City.

His first acting experience at Little Theatre was as Sitting Bull in "Annie Get Your Gun." It was during that show he met his future wife Karen, who shared his interest in the Titanic. Together they attended exhibits and programs around the country including the Broadway musical where they discov-

Following graduation, Law plans to attend Walsh University to obtain a teaching degree, with hopes of teaching second-grade English. She is the daughter of Denver Law



Communication boards installed at Tuscora Park

Two new communication boards installed at Tuscora Park were unveiled recently by Lacey Herbert-Stephen and her 5-year-old son Cash Stephen, who is nonverbal. The boards feature photos and drawings to help people who are nonverbal.

The signs are printed in English on one side and Spanish on the other. They

are located near the playground by the main parking lot and by the merry-goround.

'Cash and I frequent the park a lot. And we had started to notice that he was having meltdowns and not able to really communicate to me what it was he needed or what he wanted to do next," Herbert-Stephen said.

Herbert-Stephen learned about communication boards placed at other parks. They used generic photos and drawings, but she wanted to make one that was specific to Tuscora Park.

"I went ahead and started brainstorming about making one," Herbert-Stephen said. "Cash uses a talking device, a tablet. He points at the button that he wants, and it speaks for him. I thought it'd be so cool if we had something like that here because

I knew some other parents who didn't even bring their kids to the park because of the communication barrier and it being so much.'

Herbert-Stephen began putting the boards together, and she met with members of the Tuscora Park board who agreed the communication boards would be a welcome addition to the park if funding could be found.

After contacting Chris Call, owner of Lightning Signs in New Philadelphia, he offered to reduce the price of completing the signs and split the costs of funding with Herbert-Stephen. Had he not been willing to help, the cost of the two signs would have probably been around \$5,000.

"It's very expensive. And it's a lot of material, a lot of time. It took me about 2 1/2 months to get all the pictures I wanted on there," Herbert-Stephen said. "After I got the pictures I wanted including going and taking some of the pictures at the park, I wanted it to be relatable. I wanted the kids to be able to say, 'I want to go to the ducks.' It's all pictures of the park; it's all specific to the park."

Assisting with the project were Farrah Raines and Shelby Montgomery, who helped determine which

activity and other selections would be most important to have on the board. Jenny Miller of Lightning Signs created the layout of the boards.

Future plans are to help people who are nonverbal with making other selections.

"We're also going to be doing ones for the food stand so that they can go up and pick what they want and point to the food they want," Herbert-Stephen said. "This was the first step."

Herbert-Stephen is pleased with the way the board design turned out.

"It is beautiful, and if you look, there's an arrow at the bottom that explains that the Spanish version is on the other side," Herbert-Stephen said. "We wanted to make sure that we got the English and Spanish versions so that we could (include) everybody — all ages, all adults, all ethnicities — and try to make sure that the park is a welcoming place for the nonverbal community as well.

The boards will allow families that include people who are nonverbal the opportunity to enjoy their visits.

They prepare about a 100 pounds of fish for each Friday. The mothers from Tuscarawas Central Catholic furnish the desserts, which can be purchased separately from the meal. The profits remain with TCC.

Jail reentry program equips inmates to be successful upon release

nyone meeting Jenna Kanter 1 for the first time might be well advised to buckle up. A talk with Kanter is a high-speed ride as the reentry coordinator for the Tuscarawas County Jail gives a verbal tour of the many services she helps provide to inmates reentering the community.

"I'm passionate about my job and very passionate about this field," the 24-year-old Kanter said.

That passion is on display, not only when she talks about the jail program, but also in the growth Kanter has brought to the program in just two years on the job.

Kanter holds a dual Bachelor/ Master of Arts in Forensic Psychology from John Jay College of Criminal Justice through City University of New York. Upon graduation Kanter set her sights on returning to her hometown to serve the inmate population in Tuscarawas County.

The help she provides con-

nects inmates to a wealth of area resources while they are still incarcerated so that upon release they are better equipped to successfully reenter the community, which can reduce the rate of recidivism or reoffending and being returned to jail.

"There are basically three layers of reentry: mental health, substance use and basic needs," Kanter said.

The three are intertwined, according to Kanter. "If someone has a substance-use issue and no housing established for when they leave here, the only thing they know is couch surfing, and that puts them right back with the people they used with.'

The river and the life jacket

Kanter said the success of the program relies on the willingness of the inmate to change.

"I always give this analogy to the inmates," Kanter said. "Here at the jail, I'm connecting them with a variety of services. That's putting the life jacket on them

that connects them with resources and support. They have to get to the other side of the river, where that life of recovery is. If you take the life jacket off, you're going to drown and end up back in jail or overdosing or who knows what could happen in that river? So the idea is to keep that life jacket so you can get to the other side."

Services offered

According to Kanter, connecting inmates to community resources quickly is important. "Reentry has to be rapid because most people are here for as little as a couple of days or weeks.'

Tele-counseling is one of the more important services, Kanter said. "We work with OhioGuidestone and SpringVale for mental health and substance-abuse counseling while they are here. Again, the goal is for them to continuing using those services once they're released."

Any service that includes mental health and substance-abuse treatment is critical. According to Kanter, the majority of crimes for which people are sentenced to the Tuscarawas County Jail are drug-related, either directly or indirectly.

A Medication Assisted Treatment Program also is used inside the jail using a medication that blocks the craving for alcohol and opioids. "Not many inmates are opting into that, but they are aware of it and can take that step when they're ready," Kanter said. Kanter said all of the services

are offered on a "when you're ready" basis. No one is forced to participate in anything or given special privileges for doing so.

Kanter also connects inmates with medical insurance through the State of Ohio, food stamps and employment opportunities through Employment GPS, a service of Goodwill Industries, and Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities.

'I can also connect people with housing, and the No. 1 resource for emergency housing is the homeless shelter, mainly because of the lack of affordable housing that can be accessed quickly in Tuscarawas County."

Life 101

Kanter created a program she calls Life 101. For now the program is focused on financial literacy, bringing in counselors from the DoverPhila Federal Credit Union to conduct a three-week class twice a year.

"That's key for some of these folks because they've never

or fix their credit or do similar things," Kanter said. "I definitely want to add more lessons on topics like applying for a job, writing a resume and other life skills."

Kanter also established Resource Mondays at the jail. "Every Monday I teach the inmates about a different resource, like housing, transportation, food or clothing," Kanter said.

Kanter is thankful for community groups and individuals who voluntarily provide support inside

Different churches come in, AA comes in and Kathy Bazaar provides one-on-one peer support for addiction recovery. We also utilize SMART Recovery, a curriculum-based substanceuse treatment program that has been super successful and that the inmates really enjoy," Kanter said.

As the crisis intervention team coordinator for the county, Kanter trains first responders how to intervene in a crisis situation.

"The idea is to help divert people who are in a crisis out of the criminal justice system into where they need to be, and the first responders on the front line have the ability to divert people themselves," Kanter said.

Kanter has created business cards first responders can share with people they encounter in the midst of a crisis. The card includes a phone number, a QR code that can link people to local resources and the local substanceuse Hope Line number.

On the horizon

Kanter was excited to learn the iail has secured funding to bring in a staff clinician.

"The clinician will provide assessments for substance use and mental health so that we get a good foundation of where this person is and what they need,"

known how to control their money Kanter said. "I want the community to know that these are programs and resources that are eventually going to help our community. A decrease in crime is a decrease in individuals coming in here and costing taxpayers money. And if we can help them get back on their feet successfully, they will no longer need public assistance."

> Kanter said she feels like it's a punch in the gut when inmates do return. "You're rooting for these people and telling them they can do it, just stay connected, and you feel so motivated for them. It's definitely painful for me when they come back. It's like gosh, I wish you had the same belief in yourself that I do."

> Kanter credits Sheriff Orvis Campbell and Capt. Ken Engstrom for what she calls phenomenal leadership.


> Campbell said, "I feel like I've hit a home run. We interviewed a lot of applicants, and a lot of them checked all the right boxes in terms of experience. But when Jenna came in, she just blew everybody away, including people from the ADAMHS Board. She's perfect for this position because you have to have the ability to hang tough and stay on mission, and man, nothing seems to get her down. She just keeps going and going and going.'

> Kanter recalled the interview and the job offer. "I just spewed my passion about working with inmates," she said. "A couple of weeks later, he called and said, 'Out of all the people we interviewed, you are the least experienced but the most passionate, and for that, I'd like to offer you the position."

> Based on the success of the program, Campbell said the jail has received funding to turn some unused space into a reentry class room and counseling room.





Opposing celebrations: love and sacrifice

I am fascinated by the fact Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are both occurring Feb. 14 this year. In my mind two such opposite celebrations happening at the same time should create havoc in the minds of everyone. 

Keeping older drivers safe

Dear Savvy Senior,

What safety tips can you recommend for older drivers? My 86-year-old mother, who still drives herself, had a fender bender last month, and I worry about her safety.

Back Seat Daughter Dear Back Seat,

With more and more older Americans driving well into their 70s, 80s and beyond, there are a variety of things your mom can do to help maintain and even improve her driving skills. Here are some recommendations by driving rehabilitation specialists that work with older drivers:

—Get an eye exam: Because about 90% of the information necessary to drive is received through our eyes, this is a good first step in ensuring your mom's driving safety. So get your mom's eyes checked every year to be sure her vision and eyewear is up to par.

—Get a physical or wellness exam: As people age, it's also very important to monitor changes in overall health as it relates to driving. Medical conditions like arthritis, dementia, diabetes, Parkinson's disease, sleep apnea and stroke can all affect driving.

In addition, many seniors also take multiple medications or combinations of medications that can make them drowsy or lightheaded, which can impair judgment or affect reflexes or alertness necessary for safe driving. So an annual physical or wellness examination and medication review also is a smart way to verify your mom's driving safety.

-Take a refresher course: AARP and the American Automobile Association both have older driver improvement courses that can help your mom brush up her driving skills and understand how to adjust for slower reflexes, weaker vision and other age-related physical changes that can affect driving. Taking a class also may earn her a discount on her auto insurance. To locate a class, contact your local AAA (www.AAA.com) or



AARP (www.AARPdriversafety.org, 888-227-7669). Most courses cost around \$20-\$30 and can be taken online.

— Make some adjustments: Adjusting when and where your mom drives are another way to help keep her safe and behind the wheel longer. Some simple adjustments include not driving after dark or during rush hour traffic, avoiding major highways or other busy roads, and not driving in poor weather conditions.

— Evaluate her driving: To stay on top of your mom's driving abilities, you should take a ride with her from time to time, watching for problem areas. For example, does she drive at inappropriate speeds, tailgate or drift between lanes? Does she have difficulty seeing, backing up or changing lanes? Does she react slowly, get confused easily or make poor driving decisions?

For more evaluation tips, AAA offers a senior driver self-rating assessment exercise (Drivers 65 Plus) you or she can access at www.Exchange.AAA. com/safety/senior-driversafety-mobility.

If your mom needs a more thorough evaluation, you can turn to a driver rehabilitation specialist who's trained to evaluate older drivers and offer suggestions and adaptations to help keep her safe. But be aware this type of assessment can run anywhere from \$100-\$500 or more. To locate a professional in your area, visit www. ADED.net or www.AOTA. org - search driving practitioner directory.

When it gets to the point that your mom's driving isn't safe anymore and she needs to quit, you may need to help her create a list of names and phone numbers of family, friends and local transportation services she can call on for a ride.

To find out what transportation services are available in your mom's area, call the Eldercare Locator at 800-677-1116, which will direct you to her area agency on aging for assistance.



All applicants shall file with the Civil Service Commission, an application for examination no later than Wednesday, March 6th, 2024 at 4:00 P.M. Applications are available in the Mayor's/Safety Director's Office at Dover City Hall or you may obtain an application from the City of Dover website. A \$20.00 fee for testing shall be paid at the time the employment application is filed with the Civil Service Commission. Those applicants who cannot afford to pay the \$20.00 testing fee may sign a poverty affidavit and submit it along with the employment application to the Civil Service Commission.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR EXAMINATION AND/OR APPOINTMENT:

4. An applicant, at the time of appointment, must be a valid licensed driver with no more than two (2) two-point moving violations or their equivalent within the three (3) preceding years. Conviction of one or more six-point moving violations, any felony traffic violation, or their equivalent, in the previous five (5) years shall all be grounds for disqualification from eligibility. 5. Applicant shall possess a Certificate/Letter awarded to them by the Executive Director of the Ohio Peace Officers Training Council, attesting to his or her satisfactory completion of an approved State of Ohio Basic Peace Officer Training Program by the time of appointment. 


