ORHS hosting National Train Day on May 13

Saturday, May 13 is National Train Day, and Orrville Railroad Heritage Society will celebrate this country-wide annual event as it has from its 2008 beginning.

This year's event will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Orrville Union Depot and will include a local forger creating items for sale including knives, coat racks, bottle openers, home décor and more, as well as a model railroad flea market and toy train show that will be held around the depot grounds.

Inside the depot there will be "O" and "HO" scale layouts, and for the first time, ORHS will host the "Suitcase Guy." The Depot Gift Shop will honor coupons worth \$2 off a minimum purchase of \$10, and at the same time, ORHS will kick off its first Toys for Tots Drive with support from Norfolk Southern Corporation and the USMC Reserves

ORHS Rail Yard National Train Day activities also include Speeder Rides from 10 a.m. to noon based upon demand. Train rides in the open-air car #501 and the vintage Phanton window coach #208 will run at 1, 2 and 3 p.m. All rides are first come, first served.

ORHS will kick off its first Toys for Tots Drive with support from Norfolk Southern Corporation and the USMC Reserves.

Speeder Rides are \$5 per ticket (\$6 if paying with credit/debit card), adult or child. Train ride tickets are discounted on May 13 to \$10 for the open-air car #501 and \$15 for car #208 (additional fee for credit/debit card). Tickets for rides are only available at the rail vard located at 2174 S. Crownhill Road in Orrville

Plybon edges Mosley; care center levy fails

and stayed close all night, but Matt Plybon has earned the nod to become the next mayor of Orrville.

Plybon, going against Darrell Mosely II in the Republican primary on the May 2 ballot, edged his way to a win by just 22 votes (646-624). Plybon will now be unopposed on the November ballot and will replace longtime Orrville

The race started close Mayor Dave Handwerk.

"It is truly an honor to win the Orrville mayoral primary in a close race on May 2," Plybon wrote on Facebook on May 3. "A special thanks to Mr. Mosley and his team and supporters for a very competitive and passionate campaign. I am proud that he is a big part of our community with even better things to come.

"I am grateful for my

family, friends and community for your support. We live in a great city in a great nation in which every vote counts. I believe in the journey of respecting each other, building relationships and strengthening our resources for the foundation of making Orrville a better place."

Four Republicans who ran unopposed for Orrville City Council also will be unopposed in November: Paul Vance (council president), Kyle Shanklin (at-large), C.J. Handwerk (Ward 1) and Patricia Carr (Ward 3).

In the race for an atlarge council seat for an unexpired term ending Dec. 31, 2025, Democrat John C. Lorson and Republican Rees H. Davies both advanced with no opposition and will square off in November.

The proposed tax levy for the Wayne County Care Center went down to defeat by 931 votes in the unofficial results posted by the Wayne County Board of Elections (5,792 against, 4,861 for).



OhioMeansJobs provides opportunity for success

OhioMeansJobs' On-The-Job Training Program is designed to provide job training and hands-on experience to applicants seeking job-centric skills and knowledge.

Recently, area high school students visited the OhioMeansJobs Career Expo at Wayne College to explore opportunities.

According to Richard Owens, Wayne County job and family services director, more jobs are available than applicants, and companies are working hard to attract and retain top talent.

"Employers are hiring individuals that don't quite have the skill set they need, but if they are dedicated, show up and pass a drug screening, employers are them," Owens said. "They are also offering things like split shifts to accommodate work and life balance, and they are paying well above minimum wage."

Sandy Elliot of the Wayne County Schools Career Center echoed Owens.

"Companies are investing more in their employees, Elliot said. "They are spending more on training, and there is funding available for customized training and apprenticeship programs."

Bob Young, workforce program administrator for OhioMeansJobs, urges employers to take advantage of the federally funded OJT Program, which reimburses them up to \$13,000 to hire and train new employees.

"We will do everything we can to help the employee and employer lessen the ready and willing to hire financial burden of train-

Sport of pickleball is seeing its popularity explode


Pickleball is a sport that has been gaining popularity in recent years. What was once a backyard game has become a serious sport with tournaments, leagues and professional players. This game is a combination of tennis, badminton and pingpong, played on a smaller court than tennis, making it more accessible for players of all ages and skill levels.

One person who has experienced firsthand the growth of the sport is Jeff Roberts. Roberts, who has been teaching pickleball at the Aspen Racquet Club in Wooster for almost four years, spent many years as an avid tennis player before getting bitten by the pickleball bug.

Roberts believes one of the main reasons pickleball has become so popular is due to the social aspect of the game.

"Pickleball can be played with two or four players; it is a great activity for couples or groups of friends to enjoy together," Roberts said. "It promotes social connectedness among players and is an excellent motivator for exercise."

The game was created in 1965 by three friends — Joel

Pritchard, Bill Bell and Barnev McCallum - in Bainbridge Island, Washington. The three were looking for a way to entertain their families during the summer months and decided to create a new game using equipment they had lying around: a badminton net, a Wiffle ball and paddles.

Since then pickleball has grown in popularity, particularly among older adults looking for a low-impact sport that is easy to learn and play. According to the Sports & Fitness Industry Association, there were an estimated 4.2 million pickleball players in the United States in 2020, up from just 2.5 million in 2015.

Over the past year, Roberts has seen participation in pickleball events and lessons at Aspen Racquet Club double. In January the club hosted its annual Pickleball Tournament, and 64 competitors from Wayne, Ashland, Medina and Holmes counties participated in the twoday event. With over 70% of those participating playing at an intermediate to advanced level, this year's competition was highly competitive.

With the sport's popularity rising and recognizing the need for dedicated pickleball courts, the Aspen Racquet Club has made investments. This includes the addition of new nets, paddles and balls.

'We recognized the growing popularity of pickleball and the need for dedicated facilities to support the sport," said Kent Smith, director of tennis at Aspen Racquet Club. "Our goal is to provide players with a firstclass facility and equipment that would enable them to enjoy the sport and improve their skills. We are thrilled to see the enthusiastic response from the community."

In addition to its increased adding new rules and variapopularity among older adults, there is a growing interest in younger generations. Younger players are experimenting with new equipment such as lightweight paddles and highperformance balls to make the game faster. Others are

The rise of pickleball is a testament to the appeal of a sport that is easy to learn and accessible to players of all ages and skill levels. It provides a sense of community and socialization. With its growing popularity and international recognition, the future of pickleball looks bright.

Carter was the captain of the USS Michigan from 1861-64. The home port of the USS Michigan was Erie, Pennsylvania. The ship sailed on all the Great Lakes except Lake Ontario. She was stationed at Sandusky Bay to guard Johnson's Island POW camp in September 1864 when Confederates attempted to free the 3,000 Confederate officers held there and capture the USS Michigan. Keyse refers to this as "The Second Battle of Lake Erie" and gives his presentation in the first person in uniform.

Keyse is a lifelong resiover 50 years of boating and sailing, mostly all over Lake Erie, and his military



How nurses cope with loss

Working in the health care field comes with some soaring highs and considerable lows. It can be exhilarating when medical intervention saves the life of another person. Yet treatment is not always successful. Doctors, nurses and other care providers have to come to grips with the fact that, over the course of their careers, they will likely have to confront the death of a patient.

Patients tend to rely on their nurses for both medical support and emotional support. The bonds that develop between nurse and patient can be quite strong. However, nurses need to develop coping mechanisms to handle loss, whether it occurs frequently or less often.

The Journal of Nursing, the American Society of Registered Nurses and Nurse Journal offer these suggestions.



Nurses who work in critical care and ICU wards should make an effort to recognize that death can strike patients at any moment. Critically injured patients or those with do not resuscitate orders could be on borrowed time, and recognizing that as a potential outcome can help nurses prepare for difficult moments.

Make time to properly grieve. Compassion draws many to nursing. Although nurses must compartmentalize while on the job, losing a close patient with whom you spent a lot of time can be devastating. Take the necessary time to mourn the loss so you can focus Prepare yourself. properly on other patients.

Help the family. Nurses can comfort the family who has now lost a loved one, and advocate for anything they need. Put them in touch with the right services for the next steps in this difficult journey.

Talk to someone. Consult peers and talk about your feelings. It's likely others have gone through the same things as you. If speaking with coworkers is not enough, consider working with a therapist who can recommend further coping mechanisms. He or she also can recognize signs of burnout and when you might need to take a break.

Death is never easy. Coming to grips with patient loss is something nurses must do from time to time. With some ways to handle the situation, it may not get easier, but nurses can continue to do their jobs effectively.



AU launching engineering program

Ashland University is launching a new academic program — industrial and systems engineering — which will be housed in the Dauch College of Business and Economics. The bachelor's program has been in development for almost two years and is enrolling students for this fall after recently being approved by both the Higher Learning Commission and the Ohio Department of Higher Education.

'We are grateful to Bob and Jan Archer for helping us launch this new degree and to the faculty who moved the curriculum forward," AU President Carlos Campo said. "This new degree expands our academic offerings and gives us the opportunity to consider related degrees in the future as well."

"This is very exciting. We've never had an engineering degree at Ashland. We can now reach students that probably wouldn't even consider us in the past," said Dan Fox, dean of the College of Business and Economics and a member of the AU faculty since 2004. "Probably more important is the market really needs industrial and systems engineers."

The demand for industrial and systems engineers has been grow-



Hawthorn earns county Officer of the Year award

The Wayne County Children Services Board has a crucial role in ensuring the safety and well-being of children that face abuse, neglect or exploitation.

Each year the governmental agency, along with the Voices for Children Committee, recognizes a law-enforcement officer that has played a significant role in identifying and addressing child abuse and neglect cases. This year Kate Hawthorn, formerly of the Doylestown Police Department, was honored for her role in investigating a suspected abuse case.

"It was a long case, and there was a lot of work put into it," Hawthorn said. "I worked for several weeks conducting interviews. It was very tiring, but there was a child whose safety was impacted, so we needed to do it."

Hawthorn couldn't discuss any details of the ongoing case, only to say many red flags led to the investigation.

"(Cases like this) give me extra motivation," she said. "I have always been passionate about the protection of children. My (mom) was a principal; I have always been around children, so it gives me an extra spark when I see something like this going on."

Unfortunately for the Doylestown Police Department, Hawthorn resigned and will return to her home in England with plans to resume a career in law enforcement. However, she will leave the U.S. knowing she was instrumental in providing a brighter future for a child involved with the WCCSB.

Keynote speaker Anthony Bacon knows firsthand the opportunity individuals like Hawthorn, in conjunction with the WCCSB, can provide.

"I grew up in the system; children's services did a lot for me," Bacon said. "I spent 11 of my first 18 years in and out of the system."

Bacon entered the system for the first time at 2 years old after being left unattended by his mother and falling out of a second-story window.

"I don't remember much from these times," he said. "But by the time I was 4, I was back in the system. At 6, right back. My mother was addicted to drugs, and she let me do whatever I wanted."

With his mother in prison, Bacon was again back in the system.

Determining if nursing is the right vocation for you

Nursing is a popular career choice. With strong job security and the potential for growth, it is no wonder nursing draws such interest. In 2021, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics estimated there would be about 203,200 openings for registered nurses each year for the next decade. And employment of registered nurses is expected to grow by 6 percent between 2021 and 2031.

A strong job outlook and competitive pay (nurses earn median salaries of \$77,600 as of May 2021) appeals to any aspiring professional, but a career in nursing is about more than opportunity and compensation. Individuals considering nursing need to determine if the field might be the right fit for them. It's not always glamourous being a nurse. In fact, it can be quite challenging and



often stressful. However, the rewards tend to outshine the trials and tribulations.

The following are some components of nursing that can help individuals determine if the field is right for them.

Training time constraints

There are different levels of nursing, each of which requires a different amount of training and certification. A certified nursing assistant must complete a program at a specific CNA vocational school, and such programs run between four and 10 months, on average. Licenced vocational nurses can expect to study for 12 to 18 months, and

must pass the NCLEX-PN licensing exam. Registered nurses will need two to four years of schooling and are expected to earn an associate's degree or bachelor's degree. Aspiring RNs also will need a passing grade on the NCLEX-RN licensing exam. Most nurses will have to complete clinicals to showcase skills in real life situations.

Flexibility

Nurses need to be adaptable and flexible. Shifts may not be consistent and the demands of the job may differ from day to day, even though there may be some overlap. If challenging new experiences come easy to you or if you have the flexibility to work different shifts rather than a set schedule, then nursing could be a good option.

range of industries need these types of engineers, from manufacturing to energy, healthcare, military, technology and transportation.

"Really, any organization that needs a process improvement. It's all about increasing efficiency and speed," Fox said.

Students who enroll in the program this fall as part of the first cohort will take core curriculum and prerequisite math and science courses, then engineering classes in future years, which is typical for engineering programs. Fox said Ashland is pursuing future internship partners, as well as accreditation from the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, which will be retroactive to all graduates of the program.

Ashland offers academic programs in supply-chain management, manufacturing management and business analytics, so the addition of industrial and systems

engineering is a natural fit. It also gives business students who are undecided on a major another option.

"Maybe (students) come here with an interest in supply chain, but then they really get interested in industrial engineering — or the other way around," Fox said.

I may have missed a photo of the whip-poor-will I recently spotted, but I did pick up a nice consolation prize by way of this shot of a palm warbler along a wooded trail near Orrville. The sparrow-sized bird was likely just passing through, as 98% of its species nests in the boreal forests of Canada after wintering along the Gulf Coast and all across the Caribbean.

Even with camera ready, you win some, lose some

For most of my adult life, I've carried a camera with me nearly every place I've gone. One of the points I've often emphasized while speaking about photography to different groups has been this: If you want to take great pictures, it helps to have a camera with you at all times.

That point has become relatively moot in the last decade or so as cellular phones have progressed in sophistication to the point that the camera in my smartphone is now actually more advanced and capable than my expensive, heavy and relatively delicate "good" camera. It also helps that the whole unit fits perfectly into my back pocket and weighs only a fraction of the big, digital SLR I used to have to lug along in a backpack if I was riding my bike, hiking or cross-country skiing.

Whatever the device, even if it's as close at hand as your own back pocket, you've still got to hope for the grace of a moment to make the shot; otherwise that incredible "thing" you're looking at is gone for good. I've got hundreds of missed moments to my credit. Fortunately, sometimes when a photo has proved impossible, a story will do nearly as well.

My most recent "missed moment" came as I was mashing my way around a



local mountain bike trail the other evening. With racing season just around the corner, I was doing my best to get some off-road miles in after work as daytime melted quickly toward darkness. Deciding upon one last lap before sundown, I was on the trail just as the creatures of the night began to awaken. Deer dodging is a well-honed self-preservation skill for most mountain bikers, and I'm ever on the lookout for the high-speed shadows to come bursting through the brush.

On this particular evening, however, I should have been looking out for something much closer to the ground as I avoided a T-bone crash with a rapidly traveling skunk by no more than 2 feet. Luckily for me, the skunk was coming rather than going, so by the time it squared its squirting end around in my direction, I was already out of range.

My next encounter, just a few seconds later, proved to be even more exciting and instantly became one of those moments I've missed with the camera that will be visible forever if only in my mind's eye. I found myself face to face with my very first whip-poor-will.

A day sleeper, the whippoor-will forages by night, catching flying insects in its gaping, oversized mouth. Much more frequently heard than seen, the whippoor-will's call has inspired poetry, song and legend for centuries. The male cries its own name repeatedly (sometimes seemingly endlessly) throughout the summer night, both to attract a mate and to defend its territory. To call the whip-poor-will a ground nester is a stretch as the adult bird, its eggs and later its young chicks are so thoroughly camouflaged all are nearly impossible to spot. The eggs are simply laid on the ground.

I was only lucky enough to catch my fleeting glimpse because the dark brown bird seemed to be momentarily "dust bathing" in the loose, sandy clay of the trail. One moment of me and the bird was on its way to tell its own story in the growing glow of the rising moon.

I looked at their Facebook page with wonder. It was as if I were teleported back 28 years to when I was a young mother with two little ones of my own; only this time there were three children

Evelyn and Violet were dressed in matching pink ensembles with halos of blonde hair. In between those little dolls sat my nephew's lovely 30-something wife Dani. In her arms lay her precious newborn son Augustus. Dani looked radiant, but I'm sure she was exhausted after wrestling those babies into their duds. Dani is what I was many years ago: a stay-athome mother. And she is greatly outnumbered with three kids under the age

Many years ago I decided I wanted to be a full-time mom. I was a late bloomer, having already taught high school for 13 years. and I wanted to raise my own babies. I remember turning in my resignation letter to the superintendent tearfully. With one baby on each knee, one at nearly 2 vears old and the other newborn, I knew that with no family nearby to help me, I needed to be present for my own children.

I was lucky to be able to do it, but many of my working friends assured me it was much easier to leave party planning, arranging of plumbers, raking leaves and picking weeds. I had Easter egg hunts for 75

each morning than to stay home with two toddlers. In truth those were the happiest days of my life. Now my niece Dani has made the same choice.

Recently, I was discussing my someday retirement with my sister, who was a principal for 40 years. She was quick to remind me I spent over 10 years at home with my kids as if I were leading a life of leisure. Instead, I was raising my children while also serving as perpetual room mother, directing plays for the fifth- and sixth-graders each fall at their elementary school, being the transportation engineer, running a daunting calendar of appointments for each child, and making sure they made each soccer or baseball practice, music or ballet lesson

I learned early on when my preemie son had colic for five straight months that this was indeed the hardest job on Earth. Meanwhile, I was scrubbing the floor of my triple garage and cleaning my husband's car for Father's Day. And let's not talk about the base-

When my children grew up enough to not need so much care, I went back to work. I began teaching full-time for OSU in the communications department. It was a relief to eat my lunch without also overseeing children doing their homework or cutting someone's meat.

I couldn't believe the quiet of this new life: No "SpongeBob SquarePants" blared on the TV as I tried to write. No guitar was echoing from the basement. I was heartbroken my boy's rock band was silent when he went off to music school. And then my daughter left, and there was complete silence.

So this message is for all those mothers out there who are home with children, perhaps unappreciated by the world for their hard work and toil.

I want you to remember the noses you've cleaned and the bottoms you've wiped, the knees you've bandaged, and the nights without sleep while doing the hardest job on Earth: being a mom. I want you to be proud of the hard work you've done, often daunting and perhaps without support. And I assure you the world may not remember what you've done, but you will. And if you're lucky, your kids will too — some day.

I wish I could tell Dani in some meaningful way she will never forget what it felt like to nurse her baby in the middle of the night, or how sweet those first sloppy kisses were, or how happy she will be when her children make those first clumsy Mother's Day cards in preschool. But she will remember — every bit of it. I know she will — just like I do and you too.

Because being a mom matters. It really matters.

Supernatural thrills just seemed right for the time

For those of a certain age, these words still cast a spell: "A séance has been held in the great house at Collinwood, a séance which has suspended time and space and sent one girl on a frightening and uncertain journey into the past, back to the year 1795."

There was something deliciously scary lurking in the very marrow of that expository sentence, a backbone-tingling, hair-raising frisson of anticipatory dread that made "Dark Shadows" so special.

I was 11 years old when the so-called "Gothic soap opera" made its debut, old enough to have left Santa Claus behind but still not ready to dismiss the possibility of witches and vampires. Having friends over to share the experience made it even better, and those sleepovers forged a bond that lasted for a long time. Then we moved from the capital city to a small town, and it was time to make new friends, which is how I got to know Ghoulardi.

Wearing his trademark lab coat, sporting a fright

wig and Fu Manchu whiskers, he was a Friday night favorite long before I joined the faithful, but I was immediately amused by his catch phrases — "Ova Dey" and Turn Blue" among them and enjoyed his off-the-cuff riffing as he spoke streamof-consciousness rants.

The movies he hosted weren't really what you'd call classics of the horror genre, but that wasn't the point. You tuned in for the vibe, the craziness, the chance he might say something scandalous.

But by the time "Dark Shadows" premiered, Ernie Anderson had left the stage, which meant young, impressionable imaginations were waiting for something new, something daring, something unlike anything that had ever aired on afternoon network TV.



It was the era of the Super Ball and Thing banks, Hot Wheels cars, and Sting Ray bikes, a time when music and movies and novels and, well, everything else was wired for unpredictable tomorrows.

And into that landscape of pop culture renaissance suddenly appeared a half-hour television show that, after a fitful start, exploded into a nationwide sensation, filling a void not many of us realized had been waiting for just that kind of thrill ride

What happened, to give it a name, was Barnabas Collins.

It's rather difficult to explain just how massive a star Jonathan Frid became once his misanthropic vampire had made his debut, but in a time when the Monkees were in the Top Forty and "Star Trek" was creating its own buzz, Barnabas took a back seat to no one.

But it wasn't simply a

Shadows" featured the powerful Collins clan, a crazy-quilt assemblage of blueblood snobs, greedy in the worst sense of the word, a family bent on dominating every aspect of life in Collinsport. Having Barnabas suddenly show up with his rakish style and debonair ways — not to mention his penchant for biting people in the neck — created an unsettling dynamic in the mansion in the fog in the night.

Victoria Winters was the governess who had become unstuck in time, and it was through her adventures that most of the action progressed, but along with her we got to know Angelique, Josette, the Reverend Trask, Ben Stokes, Nathan Forbes, Peter Bradford and Willie Loomis, Barnabas' faithful Igor-like right-hand man.

"Dark Shadows" quickly became must-see-TV long before such a phenomenon existed, but with its popularity, at least in the world of the Catholic grade school

one-vampire show. "Dark I attended, there came a Shadows" featured the vicious backlash.

Seemed as if all that manifestation of the dark arts — séances and witches and vampires and the like — created a collective outrage among the church elders, who quickly decided "Dark Shadows" could not be viewed by any child enrolled in the school.

This made it even more mandatory, truly appointment television.

The one thing you didn't want to do was tell a lot of preteens something was bad for them and, even worse, banning it, labeling it sinful and filing it under the harsh category of "condemned."

So, of course, we gathered every afternoon en masse at a house in the neighborhood with a very nice console color TV set, a home with an understanding mom and lots of room for us to spread out and enjoy the thrills of "Dark Shadows," creating lots of memories.

In the years that have passed since the show's demise, I've begun collect-

ing VCR tapes dating from its inception, and naturally, being older and somewhat wiser, certain flaws have become apparent. Flubbed dialog abounds, overhead microphones appear suddenly, props fall over, offstage sounds intrude and, when you get right down to it, the supernatural happenings are a bit hokey.

And let's not even begin examining the acting itself, which, because "Dark Shadows" means so much to me, I'll charitably call well intentioned and more than serviceable for its time, though it's still difficult to get past the awful Grayson Hall as Julia Hoffman.

My advice is to treasure the scary good times and the memories they evoke, even as Barnabas Collins butchers some of his lines.

Protecting trees and plants in sub-freezing temps

Our temperatures are hitting a wide range of highs and lows that have been causing some level of concern.

Warmer weather encouraged rapid progression of our landscape plants, fruit trees and other plant species, which has given us a spectacular show of spring blooms and flowers. The plants responded to the above-average number of growing degree days that accumulated and began flowering, budding, pushing shoot growth and beginning progress through developmental stages and reproductive processes. The flowers and buds are the most important part of the plant when we consider fruit production. They also are the most delicate and vulnerable part of the plant.

Regarding the cold temperatures, do what you can to protect your plants during prolonged near or sub-freezing temperatures. When we have clear skies, we have ample opportunity for extended periods at or below freezing. Being in the 20s for six to eight hours can result in a killing freeze. These kinds of weather events can have major implications on Ohio's agricultural and horticultural the ground around these



So what can be done to protect your plants? The challenge here is when our forecasted lows are below 32 F. This is not just a light frost but rather a freeze. There are a few steps you can take to try to protect the plants, and some of these steps can be better utilized on a small scale while others are better utilized on a larger scale.

On a smaller scale, simple actions like covering the plants with a sheet or some kind of fabric can help insulate them. This helps trap some of the warmer air from the ground around the plant and keeps the plant from being directly exposed to the colder air. It also may be of interest to protect the crown of the plant.

This freeze may be severe enough to damage the foliage, but you can take steps to protect the crown and the roots by mulching with straw, leaves or wood mulch around the plant to keep the warmer air from vital parts of the plant. Basically, anything you can do to insulate the plant, conserve the heat in the ground and shield it from the cold air will be beneficial to the plant and give it a better shot at making it through the night.

Adding a strand of Christmas lights (not LED) under the sheets covering your plants can help add a little extra heat to keep the ambient temperature a little warmer. Make sure the lights are not touching the covering material and keep the covering material off of the plants. If the covering material is sitting directly on the foliage, that is defeating the purpose of having it there in the first place. Use stakes to keep the sheets or other covering materials just above the foliage. This will prevent the cold temperatures from being conducted onto the plants.

Watering the soil also can keep the immediate area around the plant a few degrees warmer. A wet soil is going to hold heat better than a dry soil. Even a few degrees can make a big difference. With single plants or with small enough shrubs or tree seedlings, an overturned bucket serves the same purpose as the sheets

or coverings. Just remember as soon as the sun comes up the next morning, you will want to remove whatever coverings you have to allow the plant to be exposed to the sunlight and begin to warm back up.

On a larger scale, orchard growers and those with small fruit have big challenges. They are dealing with a lot of plants and trees over a big area.

Some orchards use frost fans to try and protect the crop. Frost fans work by utilizing warmer/drier air from the inversion layer to create air movement at the fruiting/flowering height in orchards on still cold nights — preventing damage to flowers, soft tissue and fruit.

Some orchards utilize water sprinkler systems to actually create a layer of ice on the trees. The key to using water is to continually use it to form clear ice. Clear ice means an endothermic reaction is taking place and the warmth of the plant is being trapped inside it. If the ice starts to become cloudy, the plant is losing heat, and damage can occur.

Spraying water must continue the entire time the freeze event is taking place, and the sprays must keep going from before there is a freeze event that would damage the fruit until the ice is completely melted from the tree after the event. If the water stops spraying on the clear ice, it goes from being endothermic to exothermic, and the heat loss and ice will damage the fruit.

In some cases burn barrels and smudge pots are placed around an orchard to add heat in the hopes of keeping the temperatures at or above freezing. Unfortunately, it can take roughly 30-50 heaters per acre to effectively protect the trees. In some cases, if you are working with just a few trees, a strategically placed burn barrel can do the trick. Keep in mind that if you decide to use any type of heater, you need to be extremely cautious.

Minimizing damage and losses requires knowledge of weather conditions and how to mitigate weather extremes. Just as important is having a knowledge of plant hardiness. Some plants will do just fine with this cold weather. Others may appear to be killed off but may regrow from the roots or the crown, even though the foliage appears

The important thing here is to not be over-reactive. Give the plants time to recover. Plants can be remarkably resilient. If you see signs of frost damage, do not prune off the affected parts or dig up the plant immediately. Wait until the weather warms up to see whether new leaves sprout. You may see healthy new growth at the base of the plant, at which point you can prune out the damaged

Hoping for the best and doing nothing will not result in any positive outcomes, so take this opportunity to at least cover the plants you can and give them a fighting chance to make it through the cold.






