

## Bigfoot's out of the barn, Shreve readies for Swampfest

It's time to bring Bigfoot out of the barn.

They'll find a place in downtown Shreve during the village's annual Swampfest June 15-17.

This year's festival will feature a Loudonville woman speaking about Bigfoot, a presentation by The Lady Barn Consultant, bands on stage each evening, a car show, a frog-jumping contest, a goldfish race and an alcohol raffle. A fireworks display will close out the three-day event.

Swampfest committee member Amy Duda said the group tries to build on the event each year.

The Saturday car show, drawing more than 40 entrants from around the state, will feature an added element this year. Event organizer Kylee Fleming has scheduled local rock band CopOut to play during the event. The cars will be in place from 2-6 p.m., and prizes are up for grabs.

Last year's show resulted in a tie for best entry, so the cars were driven to the middle of the street, where drivers revved their engines and people clapped for their favorite entry, Fleming said.

Fleming said the show, sponsored by Shreve Auto Repair, is a chance to see a bunch of cool cars. Owners swap stories on how they got their cars and the history behind them.

Fleming said bringing people together is what Swampfest is all about. "It's a free event," she said.

The festival's theme was created with a nod to the Killbuck Marsh Wildlife Area, a 5,703-acre state wildlife area located 2 miles east of Shreve. Locals know it as Shreve swamps.

To celebrate the theme, Duda keeps adding to her collection.

She and fellow committee member D.G. Peterman made what has turned out to be the festival's centerpiece — Bigfoot — out of plywood, and Duda's daughterin-law Shannon Landin painted it. Duda said the bird sat on her porch for years before Landin painted it and it found a place at Swampfest.

Upon spotting the eagle for sale at the Ashland County Fair, Duda said, "Ah, that's one I can haul to Swampfest."





Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act, which established an official holiday to commemorate the end of slavery in the United States. The act became law, and the holiday was celebrated two days later.

In 2021 President Joe third official Juneteenth took place more than 2 1/2 holiday, here is an indepth look at what the day is all about.

#### **Origins of Juneteenth**

The origins of Juneteenth date back to June 19, 1865. Months after Confederate forces surrendered in the American Civil War, enslaved African Americans in Galveston, Texas were finally told they were free. Union soldiers arrived in Galveston and explained slavery had been abolished and the war was over. This liberation actually

vears after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Act, which freed enslaved people throughout the country.

Juneteenth began as a regional celebration that was observed locally each year before becoming a state holiday in Texas in 1980. Juneteenth was subsequently recognized as a holiday in a number of other states before Biden officially made the day a federal holiday in 2021.



federal businesses are closed for Juneteenth. Private businesses may opt to close or remain open. Some may issue a floating holiday to those who would like to observe Juneteenth.

Celebrations vary across the country. Some states host parades, and families and friends may gather to play games and enjoy food and other fun. Public readings or church services relevant to the holiday also may be part of Juneteenth celebrations.

#### Juneteenth food traditions

Juneteenth has its own traditions including some involving food. For example, many people enjoy a dish known as the Marcus Garvey salad. Marcus Garvey was a black activist who sought to unify and connect people of African descent worldwide. The dish is made with red, green and black beans to symbolize the Pan-African flag. Additional Juneteenth foods are red, which is no accident

Before slavery was abolished, many slaves ate foods that were white. green or brown. Eating brightly colored red foods was a rarity and a cause for excitement. The color red also was associated with the cultures of people who used to be enslaved. Red beverages, sauce-covered barbecue, red velvet cake, and many other red foods and beverages are now served on Juneteenth.

Juneteenth is now celebrated across the United States and can serve as a catalyst for discussions about American history.

## Knights of the highway: History of hobos in the area

No one really knows where the name hobo comes from. It could be from Hoe Boy, a transient agricultural worker. Perhaps it's short for homeward bound, a hobo's ultimate goal.

clear the distinction between them and tramps, vagrants and bums. A looking for work, while community.



Hobos always made the latter three avoided work whenever possible. Tramps would travel from location to location but only true hobo would travel, to move to a more generous

Until World War II. hobos traveled by train not luxurious passenger trains but freight trains, which were free to use if you had the right stuff. And they needed a lot of the right

Hobos would target areas where trains were moving slowly or stopped to board, perhaps where trains stopped to take on coal and water or where trains were slowed by long, steep inclines. They also preferred areas located on a sharp curve. This not only slowed the train, but also hid their activity from the officials at the front and rear of the train.

Ideally, a hobo would find an empty box car to ride in. If not, they may have to ride in a boxcar full of goods, a potentially dangerous option if the cargo shifted during the trip. If those two options were not available, the unfortunate hobo would have to choose between riding atop, beneath or between the cars, none of which was desirable, especially on long trips.

Between train rides hobos would stay in established camps known as "jungles." In Wayne County there were at least two jungles in the Millbrook and Shreve area. Holmes County had several.

It was near Millbrook in 1928 that one young hobo was seriously injured jumping from a moving train. The train was scooping water from a trough. The vibration and water spray convinced the hobo the train was wrecking, and he jumped to escape the calamity. In doing so, his legs were crushed by the train's wheels. He was taken to Wooster Hospital, where he identified himself as Frank Young of New York City. He died two days later and is interned at Wooster Cemetery in an unmarked grave.

Death was not uncommon in the hobo community, and there were many ways to die. There were reports of hobo riders dying of exposure, locked in a refrigerated box car. And disease frequently took them as they had limited access to medical care.

There is at least one report of a hobo cemetery adjacent to the railroad just west of Shreve. Some of its inhabitants were moved to Shreve Cemetery when it was established, but some no doubt remain there.

Memories of hobos asking for food and shelter in Holmes and Wayne counties are plentiful. Often a kindhearted person would fix a meal for them and perhaps offer a night's stay in their barn. Other times they were met with anger and told to leave. Either way the hobo would mark the location with a secret symbol to advise future hobos of the situation.

Linda Glassford Frenette recalled, while living in Killbuck as a child, her mom would prepare a bag of food for any hobo who knocked on her door. In fact, on one occasion, one had shoes so worn his toes were sticking out, so her mom gave that hobo a pair of her husband's shoes.

Kathy Weiss Schmid recalled her father Darryl Weiss, former Holmes County sheriff, pointing out Tramp's Hollow every time they drove by it, located on state Route 241 just west of Kidron Road.

Jerry Coblentz's grandmother lived near what is now the Hard Hat Restaurant, located on Wooster's south end. The same hobo would return year after year, do a little gardening for her, and she would feed him. He was always grateful and very polite.

Becky Fry Schaaf recalled her grandpa and grandma Fry lived along state Route 585 in Wooster, near where Planet Fitness is today. "Once in a while when I was there, a hobo would stop by, and grandma would make him up a sandwich and anything that

would fit into his 'Poke' as she referred to it. Then they went on their way."

Jack Glessner remembered living in Sterling when a train stopped at the local slaughter house. A female hobo disembarked from the train and sought food at his family's home. Glessner's mother invited her in and fed her. After eating, the woman left, reboarded the train and continued her journey. Mrs. Glessner's motto was "You may be entertaining angels unaware," and if someone needed something and she could help, then that was what she was to do.

After WWII trains became faster. With dieselelectrics replacing steam engines, stops were far less frequent and train travel opportunities for hobos died off. But they are still out there, maybe not in the form of popular legend but still traveling from city to city in whatever way they can — hitchhiking, taking advantage of seasonal bus and airline fares, traveling to wherever opportunity awaits







## Golden Bears return to state firing on all cylinders

Never fear, the Waynedale baseball team is here — again.

There were some rough patches at times leading up to the Division III Massillon Regional, but the Golden Bears picked the ideal time to put together their two best games of the season.

The Bears outscored regional opponents Independence and South Range by a combined 22-3 margin to earn a repeat trip to the State Baseball Tournament.

After Waynedale runruled South Range 14-1 in the regional final, it became the first team in Wayne County history to make back-to-back Final Four trips in baseball.

"It was a good time for the bats to come alive," Waynedale coach Lucas Daugherty said. "It's been a little bit of a battle this year to get going offensively, but our coaching staff had confidence that our guys could do it. We just needed to put it together and do it in a game. It was definitely good to see it all click in the regional semis and regional final."

The Golden Bears (22-9) will play Toledo Ottawa Hills (22-10) in a state semifinal at Canal Park in

Akron on June 9 at 4 p.m. Heath (22-8) will take on Cadiz Harrison Central (19-12) in the other semifinal at 7 p.m., with the winners advancing to the state championship game at 7 p.m. on June 10.

Most high school base-ball fans are well aware of Waynedale's dynamic duo of senior righthander Trey Barkman (6-1, 0.73 ERA, 85 Ks, 30 BB, 57.1 IP) and junior lefthander Otto Solorzano (9-4, 1.25, 110 Ks, 16 BB, 67 IP).

They were lights out as usual at the regional, with Barkman throwing a three-hitter with 11 strikeouts against Independence and

Solorzano following that up with a one-hitter and 10 punchouts in the five-inning mercy rule of South Range.

The Bears' offense was just as impressive, scoring six runs in the first inning in the semifinals and four to open the final.

Waynedale coaches enjoyed about as stressfree a regional as possible, thanks to the all-around sparking performances from everyone in the lineup.

Barkman and classmate Timmy Short ripped three hits apiece to lead a 15-hit attack in the regional final.

All of this came from a Waynedale team that had to rally from down two runs in its final at-bat to beat Beachwood 4-3 in a district semifinal and had to settle for a three-way tie for the Wayne County Athletic League title.

"I think it really was just confidence, having a game or two where our players did swing it well and they started to have success," Daugherty said when asked to explain the sudden offensive onslaught. "Guys gained confidence, and then they kind of built off each other's success.

"We had a couple of our guys at the top of the order get going, and hitting really can become a contagious thing."

Indeed, baseball fans have watched momentum carry over throughout the lineup at all levels. A couple players get hits, and the following hitters relax and follow suit.

Waynedale's batting order features a strong mix of seniors and underclassmen: The most used lineup is as follows: 1. senior shortstop Dylan Raber (.314 batting average), 2. sophomore catcher Tristan Franks (.385), 3. senior center fielder Connor Gatti (.333, team-high 34 runs), 4. senior third baseman Timmy Short (.360, team-

high 10 doubles, 19 RBI, 20 R), 5. senior pitcher-DH Barkman (.351, 6 2B, 2 3B, team-high 27 RBI, 22 R), 6. sophomore left fielder Jayden Schlabach (.377), 7. senior first baseman Gavin Spitler (.275), 8. sophomore second baseman Shane Coblentz, and 9. junior right fielder Tate Venables. Solorzano also gets slotted in as the DH at times.

Coblentz has emerged as a reliable third pitcher, going 5-1 with a 2.15 ERA, 63 Ks and 15 BBs in 42 IP.

"It's definitely been a group effort," Daugherty said. "We have a deep lineup that challenges opponents."

Returning starters from the 2022 title team that beat Milan Edison 2-1 are Barkman, Solorzano, Gatti, Raber and Short. Gatti had a walk-off RBI single in the eighth inning, and Solorzano notched the complete-game win with seven strikeouts. The Bears won the first baseball state title for a Wayne County team since 1966 when Northwestern won it.

Barkman usually pitches the semifinal game, and

## **BBB** issues warning about online car scheme

The Better Business Bureau in Canton is alerting consumers nationwide about an online scheme to con consumers into purchasing high-end cars.

Recently, BBB has received a BBB Scam Tracker submission, a complaint and numerous inquiry calls related to Woolie Auto Sales and Trucking. Consumers claim they found online ads for classic cars for purchase. Once deciding to proceed with the purchase, it was explained the final transactions and shipping would be handled through Peter Hartley or David and Peter Watson of Woolie Auto Sales and Trucking, an auto broker.

The consumers were instructed to register at the company's website at woolieautosalestrucking. com to receive purchase agreements to sign through DocuSign and get their wiring instructions for payment. After payments were made, the consumers



allege all correspondence ceased. The losses range from \$10,000-\$22,000, and no vehicles were received.

Upon investigation BBB found the company was using pre-existing ads from the internet to con consumers into reaching out about the vehicles. BBB found an article online at citroenvie.com where a consumer said he found his car ad from 2020 up for sale again on an internet bot site. The bot takes ads posted previously online and posts them again with new prices and contact information, even if the car has been sold. When the consumer contacted the seller, correspondence led to Woolie Auto Sales and Trucking.

A YP.com listing for Woolie Auto Sales and Trucking has provided "proof" to consumers of the company's legitimacy. The link for the listing used in the email correspondence appears to be the only way to find the listing, as a search for the company and city with YP.com does not show any listing. The listing also shows 16 fivestar ratings dating back to September 2014. BBB is working with YP.com to remove the listing.

Additionally, the post office returned mail sent to the Fayetteville, West Virginia address listed on the website as "Returned to Sender, Attempted — Not Known, Unable to Forward." This address is the actual address for Woolie Trucking, a legitimate business registered with the West Virginia SOS since 2018. Whois. com shows woolieautosalestrucking.com was regis-

tered for only one year on thousands of dollars. March 17, 2023.

BBB contacted the real Woolie Trucking company and discussed the scheme. They have posted a warning on Facebook alerting consumers of the scheme and ensuring they do not sell or transport cars. See the post at www.facebook. com/WoolieTrucking.

To avoid online car sale scams, the BBB recommends the following tips:

-Watch out for prices that are too good to be true. It is probably a scam. Scammers know used cars are in high demand and will tempt shoppers with great deals.

See the car before you buy it. Always make an in-person inspection and take a test drive before you purchase a vehicle.

-Do not give in to threats or pressure. Resist the urge to act immediately. Always take time to consider a purchase, especially if it is a vehicle that costs

—Do not wire funds for a car. Scammers often ask for wired funds because they are hard to track, and there is no way to get your money back. It is best to make large purchases by check or credit card.

—Do not believe everything you see. Scammers are great at mimicking official seals, fonts and other details. Just because a website or email looks official does not mean it is. For example, if a business displays a BBB Accredited Business seal, you can verify its legitimacy by going to www.BBB.org and looking up the company yourself.

If you believe you have been a victim of this type of scheme, BBB recommends you file a complaint with the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center at www. ic3.gov. Also, file a report with your local police department and BBB Scam Tracker.

## In praise of our community

#### Letter to the Editor,

Awake to the beauty of the countryside and to a sense of community in the natural world all about us as, in proper order, appear the purple violets, the wild blue phlox, the trilliums, the wild geranium, the refreshing shades of purple, lavender, and white blooms of the Dane's rockets all along the roadsides, creek sides,



spilling over into wooded areas, the soft shades of a jaded whiteness of the locusts now in full bloom throughout the woods all over the countryside, the phoebe, the clear call of the Bob white, the chipmunk awake from winter sleep. Yes, a steep sense of community.

Awake, too, to another sense of community that is here as we help one another. Recently, with the passing of my wife, our family experienced it firsthand — friends dropping what they were doing and giving of themselves to bring solace in a time of sorrow, sharing the grief. This singing of hymns runs as a thread of gold back through the centuries with Christians in song in the catacombs under the city of Rome, with songs echoing through the halls of the monastery of Mar Saba in the wilderness of Judea, and only in 1862 did John Mason Neale translate many of these Greek hymns that lie in the Greek service books over 1,100 years, among them "The Day of Resurrection."

## Strawberries always in season but best time is now

Strawberries are in season. Sure, they can be seen in the grocery year round, but these sweet, juicy berries come from local gardens from May to July. Americans eat 3.4 pounds of strawberries every year.

The name strawberry has been debated for eons. Many people believe it was derived from the fact that straw is often laid down beneath the plants to protect the roots that grow close to



the top of the soil as well as the delicate berries. The more popular explanation is the word strawberry comes from the idea the berries are strewn among the plants and strewnberries became strawberries. That sounds better than scatterberries.

This name was derived from the Latin word for fragrant. Strawberries are actually in the rose family, and considering the beautiful color and taste, they also are linked to loving relationships.

Put chocolate, roses and strawberries together and the romance is bound to begin. Native Americans called them heart-shaped berries. Legends around the world associate strawberries with love and flirtation.

Eight medium-sized whole strawberries provide more than 100% of vitamin C needed daily. This vitamin requires the berries are handled carefully. Cutting or juicing them will reduce the vitamin content.

Strawberries are low in calories. One cup of unsweetened berries has only 55 calories. They are fat free and are recommended to prevent heart disease and cancer. Folic acid, potassium and fiber are found in abundance in strawberries. Flavonoids and phytonutrients abound in strawberries. Without extra sugar they are a very healthy food.

Ancient Roman physicians used strawberries to treat everything from fever

to depression. Fresh juice from mashed-up berries has a cooling effect on patients with fevers. Crushed berries and water have been used as a body purifier for ages.

Strawberry juice or mash combined with honey will even reduce inflammation or sunburn when rubbed thoroughly onto the skin. Rinse off with warm water and lemon juice to feel cool relief.

They are the first fruit to ripen in the spring. Botanists do not regard them as true berries or fruit because their seeds are on the outside of the fruit. In fact, there are over 200 seeds on each strawberry. This is probably why random strawberry plants pop up in the most unusual places because the birds move these seeds around easily.

The flavor of the berries depends upon the weather, the variety and the stage of ripeness when picked. Strawberries that are picked when three-fourths red will develop full color and flavor in a few days when kept at 70 F. Berries that are only half red will seldom have the same quality as a mature



## State track completes super sports season at Dalton

A few thoughts from the week in sports ...

Simply put, the 2022-23 school year was a great time for the Dalton Bulldogs.

In last week's Bargain Hunter, I featured Dalton senior Bryce Johnson and sophomore Brady Hignight. They are believed to be the first Wayne County Athletic League athletes to play on league champion and regional teams in football, basketball and baseball in the same school year.

When senior shortstop Jack Steiner was named WCAL Baseball Player of the Year, it gave Dalton a sweep of the top individual awards in those sports. Quentin Lehman was the top honoree in football, a rarity for a lineman, and Braylon Wenger was the Basketball POTY.

At the OHSAA State Track and Field Meet held June 2-3 in Columbus, the Dalton thinclads added some final heroics highlighted by a Division III



state championship for the girls 4x100 relay team.

Dalton's team of junior Courtney Weaver, senior Lauren Clos, junior Macy Seeman and senior Brianna Chenevey ran to a first-place finish in 49.00 in Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium to edge Liberty Center (49.77).

Chenevey also earned state runner-up medals in the 100 (12.18) and 200 (24.88) races. She finished her high school career with six All-Ohio medals.

Two other Dalton athletes deserving special recognition are senior Quentin Lehman and junior Colin Pearson. The duo also were members of the WCAL and regional-qualifying football and basketball teams and quali-

fied for the state track meet.

Lehman placed 16th in the discus (135-06) after having a regional toss of 165-05.

Pearson earned a spot on the podium after teaming with sophomores Sam Tomlinson and Cameron Gazboda and junior Kamoa Hevia to place eighth in the 4x200 relay in 1:31.34.

"It was an incredible year for our track and field team and even beyond that for Dalton teams," Bulldogs track coach Seth Sullivan said. "Brianna made it to state for the third year and has five school records: 100, 200, 400, 4x1 and 4x2.

"She'll run track at Ashland with Lauren Clos, who was also on the relays. For our boys 4x2 team to make the podium with two sophomores and two juniors is huge and gives us a lot to look forward to. Quentin set our school record in the district, and we were really happy to see him qualify for state even though he didn't

in 2023, preceded by 35-17, 25-13 and 4-4 (COVID year) under Craddock.


Multiple sources I spoke with said it was not Craddock's decision to leave. He wasn't quoted in a vague press release put out by The COW.



## If they can take away our AM radios, what's next?

Ironically, I heard the news as I drove home from work.

Seems a number of car manufacturers including Audi, BMW and Volvo have decided to eliminate AM radios from their new models, mostly electric vehicles, commonly known as EVs.

Their reasoning varies, but most reports cite static interference from the newfangled engines as the biggest culprit, though others refer vaguely to as-yet-tobe-offered streaming services, which, of course, will add yet another expense to consumers' growing lists.

I don't think it really matters as to the why; the fact is yet another important aspect of everyday life is being taken away, and as EVs become more and more commonplace, all one can do is remember how it used to be, when cars and their AM radios were a perfect marriage, right up there with mashed potatoes and gravy, stars and stripes, hot



dogs and stadium mustard and, of course, Simon and Garfunkel, not to mention Lennon and McCartney.

Phasing them out — AM radios, not the Beatles won't be a big deal to most folks, the young ones who grew up with their brains attached to computers and their eyes never far from their phones.

This is the way of the world ... always has been.

As Dylan once observed. "Your old road is rapidly agin'," to which he added this cautionary warning, an admonition to be heeded:

"Please get out of the

if you can't lend your hand,

for the times they a-changin'."

Bob's in his 80s now,

and we're lucky to have him still around and vital, but I have a feeling his freewheeling days are long behind and that it's been a while since he set off on a long drive.

What's the farthest distance you ever drove by yourself at one time?

Mine's a rather pedestrian 600 miles from the Virginia coast to my Ohio hometown, a journey that would have been virtually impossible without the AM radio in my gold 1969 Chevy Impala.

I had planned to leave my girlfriend's house early that summer Sunday afternoon, but, well, when you're young and you think you're in love, real life slips away and you lose track of

The sun was setting directly in front of me, blinding me as I hurtled west, but before long, it was dark and the interstate was pretty quiet and all I had for companionship was the AM radio.

And that was more than underground rock stations. enough; actually, it was a blessing.

I stopped once for gas in Breezewood, that strange Pennsylvania crossroads town famous for its truck stops, diners and the four or five turnpikes that collide there, as if drawn by unseen magnets. After that, it was bugs hitting the windshield and the sound of tires rolling as the miles disappeared and I got the news and listened to songs that to this day still remind me of being voung and so alive.

By the time I pulled into town, I still had a few minutes to report to the school where I'd begin my summer job as a playground counselor, put in charge of a dozen or two impressionable minds, a prospect that in retrospect still fills me with dread/wonder.

That fall, after I'd landed a part-time gig as a sportswriter covering high school football games played in stadiums carved out of cornfields, I invested a small sum into something called an FM converter. It was a black plastic device that, if you had even a little bit of experience hooking up stereo systems, enabled you to listen to the other bandwidth, the one with denied life's very air.

How things have come full circle. Back then AM was the major artery with an FM tributary. Now it's headed for irrelevance.

But before AM radio is relegated to the dustbin of obsolescence, I think it's important to point out there's been some pushback, particularly among those folks who live in rural areas of America, places that rely on the local airwaves to keep them informed, especially in times of weather warnings and other emergencies

A good AM signal can travel for hundreds of miles, especially at night, whereas its FM brethren rarely reach beyond the county line.

And who hasn't sat in the car, listening to a ballgame, unwilling to leave the playby-play for fear of missing the play that decides it all?

Without AM radio I'd have been denied so much, most of it music. I cannot imagine my driving life without CKLW, "The Big 8" as it was known, that powerhouse station out of the Motor City. To cite just a single example, being a teenager without having "American Pie" blasting out of the car radio is like being

I had a friend back then who used to keep a ledger of the AM stations he could pull in evenings, using his father's sophisticated stereo setup that he was strictly prohibited from even looking at, let alone employ in that kind of tomfoolery. Yet he persisted, and I relished the moments when he'd tell one of us that last night he'd picked up a station out of New Orleans, an hour devoted to jazz.

Yes, I understand everything changes, and I'm not one of those get-offmy-lawn old guys who'll never adjust to the way things are, but I'm also smart enough to know that if they succeed in taking AM radios out of EVs, someone's going to have to explain why, exactly and persuasively, an institution that has offered so much for so long has, all of a sudden, gone quiet in a cloud of static.

## **Animal projects help 4-Hers**

The Wayne County Fair is months away, but 4-Hers are well into the season of raising and caring for their animals, which will fill the pens, stalls and show rings.

A total of 2,762 animals have been enrolled by Wayne County 4-H members.

Learning how to be responsible for another being takes practice, and 4-H members who experience animal projects practice those skills daily. They have deadlines to meet. clinics to attend, skillathons to complete and daily care of the animal.

They had to enroll in their projects by April 1. By June 1 they had to upload photos of their animals with identifying information on 4-H online. The 4-H online system manages all aspects of the 4-H program including membership, events, projects, activities and communications

Junior fair livestock committees plan clinics for project members so they can learn how to best care for their animals, understand what they need to bring to the fair, and see demonstrations and learn from fair judges on how to best present their animal in the show ring.

At the fair members compete in showmanship classes where they are judged on how well they handle their animal and what they learned about it. In market show classes, the focus is on the animal. The



like bone structure, muscle, mobility and overall quality of the animal for its species.

All 4-Hers with an animal project must attend a Quality Assurance session. The Quality Assurance program teaches 4-H youth how to use best practices that support the production of quality and safe animal products for consumers. It also teaches responsible animal handling, care and welfare, not only for farm animal production, but also with companion and performance animals.

In addition to Quality Assurance, animal project members also must participate in a skillathon, an educational session where volunteer facilitators conduct a learning station for youth to gain or demonstrate their knowledge and skills learned by doing their livestock projects. Skillathons enhance learning through hands-on activities and demonstrated skills. They are not just a test, but also enhance critical thinking, problemsolving and communication skills.

As an example, last year's activities included identifying feed samples and participating in an interview with a volunteer judge judge is looking for things about the members' projects

to help build interviewing and communication skills.

The Wayne County 4-H program will hold two skillathon sessions on June 15 and 19 from 6:30-9 p.m. at the fair's event center. Nearly 80 volunteers will help with the event.

Animal projects aren't just for 4-H members who live in rural areas. Anyone can learn how to care for just about any animal, in just about any location small ones like rabbits or ducks, mid-size like goats, larger like steers or horses, or even more unique animals.

Members strive for top placings, not only in the show ring, but also for their overall achievement in their project area through the Outstanding Exhibitor Awards program. This program was developed to recognize youth who go above and beyond in their species, both in and out of the show ring. Final scores include points for an educational poster, Outstanding Exhibitor Exam, project record book, showmanship placing and breed or market class placing.

Generous award sponsors are a big part of this program.

It's an investment that helps our youth learn about the livestock industry and develop responsibility, decision-making and patience.
