River Radio Ministries buys Wooster stations

has entered into an agreement to purchase 104.5 WOKT-FM/960 WKVX-AM, located in Wooster, from WWST Corporation, owned by parent company Dix 1898 Inc., for just over \$3 million. It was announced Nov. 13.

The stations were the final media assets of the former Dix Communications, now Dix 1898. The company sold its newspaper holdings in 2017 including The Daily Record and had owned both stations since they were built in 1947.

River Radio will add the Wooster station to the four it already owns in Gahanna,



Chillicothe, Newark and Lancaster.

"We are excited to serve Wooster and the surrounding community the way we have served Central Ohio for the last 50 years," River Radio Ministries President/ CEO Bill Montgomery said. "We desire to continue building on a communityfocused foundation that the listeners and advertisers can embrace.'

Montgomery said the large signal coverage (52,000 watts) and the new FM transmitter that will be able to broadcast an adjacent (second channel) high-definition signal that can rebroadcast the AM format in FM quality to a larger geographic audience is exciting.

"We also look forward to using two newly remodeled recording studios for community programming and advertisers," he said.

The Wooster stations currently broadcast country (FM) and rock oldies (AM); an array of sports including high school, College of Wooster and Ohio State University; and all three Cleveland pro franchises.

"Wooster and the surrounding area have played a role in our business and family since 1898; it is a dynamic and thriving community," said Charles Dix, president of WWST Corporation and Dix 1898 Inc. "It has been an honor to serve listeners with news, sports and music, as well as help and support our advertisers.

Montgomery explained his company's desire to be part of the local community and its plans for a local staff to serve the community effectively.

"We will be a commer-

cial station, and we will need the necessary local staff to run it properly," he said. "We look forward to interviewing the existing staff, which has made the station so successful.

"We are a nonpolitical group and are excited to have what will be the equivalent of two stations with equal range and quality. It will take us some time just to evaluate what the stations are doing now. Our plans our not finalized, and we want to see what is working well and assess what is good for listeners, advertisers and the stations.'


River Radio plans to operate the stations commercially. River Radio is not owned by a church affiliation, but rather is inde-

Veterans Day service concludes with highway dedication

The men and women who served in the Vietnam War returned home to find a nation deeply divided over the conflict, and many people were ungrateful to them for their service.

In the years following the war, communities have found ways to recognize the sacrifices made by these veterans. One local Vietnam-era veteran, Jeff Sampsel, saw his two-year effort to earmark a segment of Old Lincoln Highway, from state Route 250 to state Route 302, in their honor come full circle on Saturday, Nov. 11 when the Wayne County commissioners dedicated the Wayne County Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway following a Veterans Day service at the fairgrounds.

"This project has been on my bucket list for a long time," Sampsel said. "I have never seen (a Vietnam Vet-

Sampsel said the memorial started taking shape after he contacted commissioner Sue Smail.

"I talked to many people about getting this project done," Sampsel said. "But Sue is the one who went forward and made it happen for me." Smail and commissioners Jon Hofstetter and Ron Amstutz attended the service and dedication ceremony.

"Throughout the history of our great nation, countless brave individuals have answered the call to serve our country in the armed forces including 32 from Wayne County who gave their lives fighting in the name of freedom in

Vietnam," Smail read from a proclamation. "As residents of Wayne County, we must never forget the bravery and courage of the men and women who fought with honor in Vietnam. Let us never forget their sacrifice and always hold their memory in our hearts."

While Sampsel is pleased with the memorial highway's tangible connec-

"I want to get the bridge we cross on Memorial Day during the parade leading up to the Wooster Cemetery named the Vietnam Veterans Bridge," he said. "But I have to go through the state to get that done."

Wooster native Joe Wickens helps preserve music history at Rock and Roll HOF

Joe Wickens can barely carry a tune and couldn't play the first note on a musical instrument.

But the Wooster native is responsible for ensuring 45,000 music artifacts are cataloged and preserved. To be fair, Wickens has always loved music, so he treasures his position as collections and exhibits manager at the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, located on the shores of Lake Erie in Cleveland.

"I love taking care of history that in some way means something personal to all of us," Wickens said.

Wickens' work begins when an artifact arrives. He lets it acclimate for 24 hours, especially instruments, to prevent warping. Next is accession, which involves establishing a catalog record of the item and documenting its condition including any marks and stickers.

He then photographs the item, utilizing a light box and a foot candle reader to gauge light exposure, and tags it with when and from where it was acquired. He then either stores it at 68 F with 50% relative humidity or passes it to the exhibit team. Sometimes he assists with exhibit installation or deinstallation.

A Wooster High School graduate, Wickens earned a B.A. in History at Baldwin-Wallace University, then his master's degree in museum studies at Cleveland State University. Soon after, he started at the RRHOF as a security representative, which he viewed as a stepping stone to a position where he could apply his education and interest in history and museums.

So he learned all he could about the organization, from the grounds to curating. After working his way up to security supervisor, he accepted a coordinator position in the curatorial department. Following two years in that role, he was promoted to the position he's held now for 2 1/2 years.

Wickens and his team of three handle an array of artifacts from rock and roll music's past. On a recent trip to the collections storage vault, he opened a cabinet, and inside was what might be mistaken for a haphazard stash of old Halloween costumes in anyone's basement. Wickens donned gloves and proceeded to pull out one

garment after another, identifying them: Jimi Hendrix's patchwork jacket, a gold lamé concoction worn by Beyonce, a purple tunic Anne Wilson wore in a Heart performance, George Harrison's gold suit from the premiere of "Yellow Submarine" and Elvis Presley's U.S. Army jacket.

"These items are valuable, beyond monetarily, and culturally significant," he said.

He slid open a drawer of what looked like a blueprint cabinet and retrieved the guitar Joe Walsh used to compose and record one of his biggest hits as a solo artist, "Rocky Mountain Way." In another drawer is a guitar repurposed by Jerry Garcia from a couch. From a battered leather case, Wickens removed a mandolin played by The Band's Levon Helm at Woodstock, and there's a five-necked guitar played by Cheap Trick's

Rick Nielsen.

Artifacts arrive in various ways. Sometimes the curators seek out specific pieces for a planned exhibit. Frequently, artists and collectors donate or loan items. Most often, fine art shippers transport the artifacts, but sometimes the owner personally delivers an item.

Wickens and his team often pick up or return artifacts, sometimes at artists' homes, recently traveling to New York City on behalf of David Bowie's estate. The widow of the Doobie Brothers' John Hartman donated his drum kit and requested it be picked up. After traveling through the hollers of West Virginia, Wickens and company arrived at the home to find the widow emotional.

"She wanted assurance that the drum kit would be well cared for," Wickens said. "It was very touching."

The RRHOF also loans and borrows items to/from other institutions. "We have great relationships with Graceland, Paisley Park and the Country Music Hall of Fame," Wickens said.

He also travels to preview exhibits, recently going to Los Angeles. "I enjoy the opportunity to talk about our collections since I work alone much of the day," Wickens said. He also appears frequently on Fox-8 TV's "Kickin' It With Kenny" feature.

Wickens' favorite artifact is a small piece of paper. Songwriter Doc Pomus contracted polio in childhood, leaving him wheelchair bound. At his wedding reception, he sat watching his wife dance with various friends and family. In that moment he grabbed a wedding invitation and scribbled a song onto it. "Save the Last Dance for Me" became a hit for the Drifters.

"I like artifacts that humanize artists. Knowing the inspiration for that song makes it land differently for me now," Wickens said. "Artifacts can fall flat without context and history."

The artifact he considers most important is the guitar John Lennon played during the Beatles' first appearance on the "Ed Sullivan Show" because the 1964 performance inspired many RRHOF inductees to begin playing music and because of the number of the show's viewers — over 70 million Americans, about 40% of the population at that time.

Through his work Wickens continually learns about music and its history. He also has gained a deeper appreciation for various artists and has met some, including Alice Cooper, Flavor Flav and Nancy Wilson. Steven Tyler and Dave Grohl each unexpectedly dropped in and stood in line to buy a ticket.

"I enjoy seeing an artist geek out over other artists," Wickens said. "They're fans just like anybody." Wickens knows he has a very cool gig, and his passion for his work is apparent.

"Everyone has a favorite band, song, album, singer, drummer, guitarist, bassist or keyboardist," he said. "Visiting the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame can be a very personal, intimate experience. Working on the team that facilitates those experiences and getting to handle the artifacts is truly awesome."

Breaking down Wayne County's 492 provisional ballots

Elections are the cornerstone of democracy. They provide an opportunity for citizens to have their voices heard and to participate in selecting their leaders and the passage of issues.

One of the ways the Wayne County Board of Elections ensures fair elections is by employing a fail-safe mechanism called provisional balloting to ensure every vote counts, even if there is an initial question of a voter's eligibility.

In the Nov. 7 general election, Wayne County Board of Elections Director Julie Leathers-Stahl reported 492 ballots were given provisional status.

"Provisional ballots cast on or before election day are sorted by precinct, and we make sure that all of the information is provided, like proper signatures," Stahl said. "Then we look at each ballot individually."

What are provisional ballots

"(Provisional ballots) are one way we maintain election integrity," Stahl said. "If a person moves Election Summary Report

change their address, we make sure that the ballot was cast at the correct location. Then we contact the county they moved from to see if they were registered there and if

into the county and forgets to they cast a ballot in that county."

Provisional ballots are held temporarily when an individual's eligibility to vote is in question for various reasons such as missing identification, discrepancies an registration records or even casting a vote outside their designated precinct. Instead of denying these individuals the opportunity to vote altogether, provisional ballots offer a temporary solution, allowing their votes to be counted provisionally until their eligibility is verified.

First, they ensure no eligible voters are kept from having the chance to participate in the polls. Secondly, provisional ballots are one of the many safeguards against potential voter fraud. By subjecting these ballots to a verification process, election authorities can meticulously examine each case and determine if the individual's vote should be counted as valid.

A mountain of work

"Realize that we have less than five days to verify ballots," said Bryon Bell, elections board deputy director. "If the address of a person is in question, we have to call or email the board in that county and verify they were registered. Keep in mind that boards of election from possibly all 88 counties are also calling us to

in registration records or even verify ballots that they received."

By addressing potential concerns after the election, provisional ballots help maintain the integrity and fairness of the electoral system.

"This mechanism also protects voter access to the ballot," Bell said. "If provisional ballots did not exist and there was a question about your eligibility, you would not be able to vote, which is something we do not do. Instead of turning a voter away, they may cast a provisional ballot, allowing us to research it and ensure it is countable. There is also a cure period that allows the voter to fulfill the requirement they failed to meet. That information is given to the four-person bipartisan board of directors for a ruling."

In addition to the 492 provisional ballots cast on Nov. 7, more than 300 absentee ballots were mailed out to voters, and to be counted, they must arrive back at the board office by Nov. 13.

The finalized tally must be completed by Nov. 27.

Dog ownership is a joy but comes with responsibilities. One of those responsibilities is ensuring proper licensure. In addition to being legally required, licensing provides an effective way to reunite lost dogs with their owners.

To help make dog licensing convenient, Wayne County Dog Warden and Dog Shelter Director Katelyn Lehman and auditor Jarra Underwood partnered with DocuPet to purchase dog tags online. Dog licenses may be purchased from Dec. 1 through Jan. 31.

"Without question lost dogs with clear identification are returned home much faster than those without tags," Lehman said. "DocuPet is taking it one step further and allowing dog owners to upload a current photo of their pet directly to the license program, which has also been very helpful. When we all

work together, we can keep dogs safe and happy and return them home as quickly as possible."

The standard tag includes the pet profile link, HomeSafe ID, and Docu-Pet's 24/7 HomeSafe hot-line number. The owner can personalize the tag with the pet's name and phone number for an additional fee.

Orrville's Snyder family answered the call to adopt

Editor's note: This is the second in a three-part series celebrating National Adoption Awareness Month, from the perspective of the adoptive parents.

For one Orrville family, a little girl named Ella changed their lives. Tim and Christine Snyder were already the parents of biological children Brennen, Sophia and Cole when they felt a tug on their hearts to adopt a child.

The Bible verse from Jeremiah 29:11 cried out to them: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans

to give you a hope and a future." They listened to this call and contacted an adoption agency in Medina, and that call led them to Ella. Ella's adoption is what is considered an open adoption, meaning the birth parents and the adoptive parents know the identity of one another and the option is there to maintain contact.

Ella was adopted at birth. "Ella was placed in our custody at birth," Christine Snyder said. "She was in the NICU at birth due to the side effects of addiction."

The name Ella is an amalgamation of her birth parents' names, a name Christine and Tim came up

with to honor her parents. Their three biological children accepted Ella without question.

"Our other children were amazing with Ella and immediately accepted her as their sister," Christine Snyder said. "I have to remind myself sometimes that I did not physically give birth to Ella. She has made our family complete."

But adoption is not without moments of loss, as even a child adopted at birth can experience loss, trauma and anxiety. Ella has exhibited some of that anxiety.

"We have seen some separation anxiety in her

even though we have had her in our care since birth," Snyder said. "It is difficult to determine the source of the anxieties; however, we feel as though the in-utero trauma and just overall trauma from the adoption presents as anxiety.

"We are discussing adoption with her in appropriate terms. Ella knows that she grew in her birth mother's tummy but that she also grew in our hearts."

Christine and Tim Snyder know that as Ella grows up, there will be more questions, and they plan to answer those questions as openly and honestly as they can.

While adoption is not always easy and brings some trials along with the joys, Christine Snyder has some advice for prospective adoptive parents.

"If anyone is considering adoption, I would tell them to listen to the nudge that is being placed in their heart," she said. "It is important to be prepared in knowing that you are entering a world of brokenness and trauma. You are also entering the world of paperwork.



When Emily Nulph moved from her Maryland home to be closer to family in Orrville, she found she had lost her support system of friends and fellow breast cancer survivors.

And while having family around was great, she said, "You need the love and care of people who understand you."

She grew more and more depressed.

Then in what seemed like divine intervention, Nulph and her husband found a MOCA House calendar in her doctor's office, and the calendar included art. MOCA House is a drop-in peer recovery program offered at no cost at NAMI Wayne and Holmes Counties.

Six years later Nulph is a MOCA House regular. There, she said, she found her support system. "We express ourselves," she said, "and we get our feelings out."

Nulph has created a number of canvases, but it was the contemporary "Red/Blue Swirl" that was chosen as one of 30 pieces for NAMI of Wayne & Holmes Counties' Expressions of Hope Art Auction.

biennial event, which also included a silent auction, benefit MOCA House's recovery program, according to Jen Grim, agency director.

"Around our art table, no one needs any previous art experience or training," original volunteer art instructors Tom Wood and Connie Barnard wrote in the auction catalog. "It is not about the final creation as much as it is about transformation and expression. It is about relationships, creating, sharing, learning and supporting each other.'

Nulph would agree. "When you get the brush in your hand," she said, "it's like you escape from your problems and your everyday life. No matter how you put it on the canvas, you get joy inwardly. You escape to another world."

The art slated for auction was created by MOCA House participants, supporters and instructors. Fast bidding kept auctioneer Junior Miller of Kaufman Realty & Auctions busy while attendees also could purchase holiday artwork, MOCA House greeting

Proceeds from the fourth cards, matted watercolors, photography and canvases, and MOCA House artwork tumblers. In total there were 30 pieces in the silent auction, 30 pieces in the live auction, over 60 artists represented and over 125 in attendance.

MOCA — Motivating, Optimistic, Caring and Accepting — House, which started in 2010 in a College Avenue house, is a drop-in, peer-run program designed to build skills, friendships and confidence.

NEW roundtable talks budgeting

The Orrville Area Chamber of Commerce's Networking Empowers Women hosted a roundtable on Nov. 9 at Cobblestone Hotel & Suites in Orrville. Loni Weaver of Edward Jones presented on the Power of Budgeting.

The workshop explored the importance of creating and maintaining a budget, examined the differences between needs and wants, and explained how to set goals for spending, savings and debt repayment.

"Only 20% of people say they have had financial education," Weaver said. "Knowledge leads to confidence, and confidence creates resilience."

Weaver said there are two debt-management strategies she recommends: avalanche and snowball methods.

"Avalanche method has you pay off your highest interest rate first," Weaver said, "while the snowball method has you pay off the

smallest balance first while paying the minimum payment on other debts. For these methods to work, you must commit to them."

Weaver encouraged attendees to set financial goals, whether they are short-term (a few months to a year), medium-term (two to five years) or long-term (more than five years).

"Financial goals are personal goals you set for yourself about how you will save and spend money," Weaver said.

Weaver shared strategies for saving such as making a habit to save, using automatic savings and limit spending. Key takeaways were to use a budgeting strategy to manage your spending, saving and debt repayment. Weaver suggests speaking to someone you can trust like family, a friend or a financial adviser for support and to always keep learning by reviewing financial education.



Previewing the H.S. girls basketball teams in the area

The high school girls basketball season will begin Nov. 22.

Here are season previews for each school in The Wayne Bargain Hunter's coverage area:

Waynedale

While Smithville certainly will have something to say about it this year, and Chippewa has had a lot to say about it in the past, Waynedale's girls basketball team has emerged over the past three seasons as the class of the Wayne County Athletic League, and the numbers make that difficult to dispute.

While the current seniors have been part of the program, the Golden Bears have posted a 75-7 overall record, 40-2 in the WCAL with two outright and one shared championship, and have gone 14-3 in the post-season. That mark includes back-to-back trips to the final four in 2020-21 and 2021-22.



The team last year finished 22-4 overall and 12-2 in the WCAL, which left the Golden Bears tied atop the standings with Chippewa and Smithville, then made it to the district finals.

"Our experience will be a huge strength for us this season," sixth-year coach Rick Geiser said. "Our senior leadership has been tremendous and will ultimately determine how steadily we improve as a team. All of our players are willing to work really hard and sacrifice for the benefit of what's best for the team."

Waynedale looks to have its cupboards well stocked heading into the 2023-24 season and should be able to give a loaded Smithville team all it can handle in the pursuit of a fourth consecu-

tive league championship.

Back in the fold is a talented and experienced group led by senior guard Alyssa Geiser. A first-team All-WCAL performer a year ago, the 5-foot-7 senior guard has her name firmly etched in program history.

She averaged 11 points as a junior, was named first-team All-Northeast Ohio Inland District and first-team All-WCAL, and earned an All-Ohio special mention. Geiser is the only current Golden Bear to have appeared in multiple state tournament games.

Adessa Miller, a 5-7 senior guard, earned first-team Inland honors last season, was a second-team All-WCAL pick and earned an All-Ohio special mention after averaging nearly 13 points. Senior guard McK-enna Baney returns after earning second-team All-WCAL honors a year ago. Baney received an Inland honorable mention.

Also back is senior for-

ward Cheyanne Chupp, who like Geiser, Baney and Mast, appeared in the team's 2022 state semifinal game. Senior guard Tiana Mast and sophomore guard Kylie Geiser round out the returning group of letter winners.

Newcomers looking to make some noise this year include sophomore forward Brooke Compston and sophomore guard Jorja Persinger.

"We need to continue growing in our ability to always do the little details that make teams better," Rick Geiser said. "As we grow in our consistency, we will grow as a team."

Practices for another OHSAA girls basketball season are underway, and opening night for regularseason games is Nov. 22.

A quintet of area girls will enter the season with a huge amount of added confidence and experience after playing in several high-level AAU tournaments this summer.

Triway's Caitlin Titler and Aaliyah Wirth, Smithville's Cam Wickens, Waynedale's McKenna Baney, and Northwestern's Caydence Scale were a part of the Buckeye Blast Neon 2024 team, which compiled a 49-9 record over the last two summers.

Buckeye Blast Neon, which was coached by Sid Cline and Mike Baus, also included Lexington's Cora Palmer, Streetsboro's Ella Kassan, Lake's Paige Marshall and Marlington's Chelsea Evanich.

ABB Neon schedule that included playing in college

exposure tournaments in Cincinnati, Columbus and Pittsburgh was highlighted by winning their division for the second straight year in The Run for the Roses in Louisville, Kentucky July 5-8. Neon won the silver championship this summer and captured the platinum title in 2023.

"The Run for the Roses is the largest high school girls basketball tournament in the United States," said Cline, an assistant coach at Smithville and former head coach at Waynedale for nine seasons and Northwestern for five. "More than 2,000 college coaches attended, and there were 2,800 teams, representing six different countries. They used 100 full courts in the Louisville Convention Center. It's actually covered by ESPN."

Buckeye Blast Neon's season went from April through July and once again culminated with an exclamation point in Kentucky.

"Last year the high-

light was we played the No. 1-ranked team out of Kansas and beat them by 26 points," Cline said. "These girls were just dialed in.

"This year we also beat some really good teams including Carolina Express in the championship. It was pretty special to walk into the Kentucky Convention Center this July and see the team's banner hanging from the rafters as 2022 platinum champions."

Buckeye Blast Neon also had a memorable win over a Pennsylvania team to win an AAU tournament in Pittsburgh this past summer.

'As I was talking to the Pennsylvania coach, he told me before the game that all of his players were either in the state semifinals or state finals," Cline said. "We beat them by 20-plus."

Cline and Baus used an up-tempo strategy to outrun, outscore and outwork nearly all opponents.



How to help make turkey terrific

Sweet potatoes may be stars; cornbread dressing a contender. Dinner rolls are divine and green bean casserole a go-to.

But Thanksgiving dinner isn't complete without turkey.

Even in households that don't eat meat, plant-based turkey alternatives find their way onto the dinner table in a nod to Thanksgiving tradition. Given the emphasis placed on the main course each Thanksgiving, cooking a turkey can be intimidating.

These turkey-cooking tips can calm anyone's nerves and result in a mouthwatering main course:

Allow ample time for thawing

Some people may not be able to buy a fresh turkey, and millions of individuals purchase frozen turkeys each year. The Food Network says it can take 24 hours per every five pounds to thaw a turkey. Therefore, if you have a 15-pounder, allow for three days for thawing. Always thaw a turkey in a refrigerator.

Get the right size bird

The general rule of thumb is 1 pound (uncooked) to 11/2 pounds




of turkey per person if you're buying a whole turkey. Rather than purchasing the largest turkey you can find for a large crowd, consider two smaller turkeys or one turkey and one breast to make cooking more even. Smaller birds are more tender as well.

Adjust the temperature

The food and cooking resource TheKitchn advises preheating an oven to 450 F, then dropping the temperature to 350 F after putting the turkey into the oven. Cook, on average, 13 minutes per each pound of turkey. The turkey is done when it registers a minimum temperature of 165 F in the thickest part of the thigh.

To brine or not to brine?

Many food fanatics swear by brining turkey to achieve more moist and flavorful meat. However, a wet brine may not lead to the crispiest skin possible. Good Housekeeping suggests trying a dry

brine instead. This involves rubbing salt all over the raw turkey, placing the bird into a large plastic bag, and refrigerating overnight or

up to two days before cooking; otherwise, purchase a kosher turkey, which already has been salted from the inside out.

Avoid stuffing the bird

Rather than stuffing the turkey and cooking everything en masse, prepare the stuffing mixture separate from the turkey. This reduces the risk of contamination from the turkey's raw juices and helps to achieve a crispy coating on the stuffing guests will enjoy.

Make an aromatic roasting rack

Turkeys typically are placed on a metal rack for cooking so the juices do not cause the turkey to stick to the pan. However, you also can cut onions and lay them with a bed of whole celery stalks and carrots to elevate the roast. This creates extra flavor in the bird and the vegetables also can be served or mixed into the stuffing.



Jimbo's jackpot: Buyout reaches new level of absurdity

A few thoughts from the week in sports ...

If you follow the Cleveland Browns, how many times this season have you complained about Deshaun Watson's fully guaranteed \$230 million contract over five years?

I'll admit it's been more than a handful of times for me, and I'm definitely not alone in that statistic.

Whether it's grumbling after hearing Watson's going to sit out another game, watching poor play, discussing legal troubles, or worst news yet, finding out he's out for the season due to a shoulder injury on Wednesday, that huge contract puts him under a much closer microscope.

Give Watson a lot of credit for his second-half performance against the Ravens, though, overcoming a slow start and gimpy ankle to help lead a 33-31, come-from-behind win on the road against the Ravens this past Sunday. However, with Watson now ruled out the entire season looks questionable.

Babe Ruth was the first pro athlete to reach \$50,000 for a season, getting paid \$52,000 in 1922, according to the Society for American Baseball Research. When someone complained to the Sultan of Swat in 1930 about making \$80,000 and getting paid more than President Herbert Hoover, Ruth famously quipped, "Why not? I had a better year than he did."

Another Yankees great, Joe DiMaggio became the first \$100,000 man in 1949.

The first \$1 million a year player was Nolan Ryan in 1980.

According to Forbes. com, eight athletes made \$100 million this past year, with international soccer stars Cristiano Ronaldo (\$136 million), Lionel Messi (\$130 million) and Kylian Mbappe (\$120 million) leading the way, followed by NBA superstar LeBron James (\$119.5 million).

Former Texas A&M football coach Jimbo Fisher set a different kind of sports record this week: largest contract buyout in college



football history.

Before the 2021 season, Fisher's contract was extended to 2031, and his annual salary was raised to \$9 million.

After being fired on Nov. 12 with a 45-25 overall record leading the Aggies, including 6-4 this season, Fisher is still owed \$76.8 million. And he'll get every penny of it because he had a guaranteed contract. It breaks down to \$26,301 per day until 2031 — not to work.

The buyout will be paid with donor dollars from the school's 12th Man Foundation and athletic department funds. (Read in a sarcastic voice: Texas oil money is really being put to good use.)

What could you buy with that kind of money?

I was talking to a friend about Jimbo's "jackpot," and he told me The College of Wooster's reported expenses for the entire 2021-22 academic year as listed in the alumni magazine were \$83.44 million. OK, so Jimbo could just about foot the bill to run a small college for a whole year.

If Jimbo likes to collect sports memorabilia like I do, he could buy one of each of the best sports cards ever and still have plenty of cash left over.

According to ESPN.com, the 1952 Topps Mickey

Mantle baseball card sold for \$12.6 million in 2022; the famed Honus Wagner 1909 T206 baseball card sold for \$7.25 million in 2022; and gem mint 10 rookie cards for Pele, Tom Brady, Patrick Mahomes, LeBron James and Wayne Gretzky sold between 2021-22 for a combined \$17.68 million. That combined sports card bill would only be \$37.5 million.

Or maybe Jimbo wants a new place to live? The 780-acre private island complete with an 18-hole golf course, air strip and mock old west town owned by telecommunications billionaire Craig McCaw in British Columbia was listed for \$75 million recently.

Browns town

Why can't the Browns ever have nice things?

Cleveland's 33-31, come-from-behind win over the Ravens on Dustin Hopkins' 40-yard field goal as time expired was a result of a complete team effort and tenacity.

Optimism was about as high as we've seen it for Browns football since 1999. Then came the news about Watson being lost for the season.

The AFC North still looks to be a complete dogfight, but the Browns will have to rally behind PJ Walker or whoever winds up at quarterback down the stretch.

The Ravens lead the division at 7-3. The Browns will host the Steelers in a huge matchup of 6-3 teams

this Sunday. The Bengals are lurking right behind at 5-4. being the last remaining area team in the high school playoffs. The Bulldogs (11-1)

Despite losing several key players to injuries, the Browns have a chance to win any game because of their defense.

If the Browns eventually become a playoff team – and that's a big "if" – I'll look back to Jerome Ford's 12-yard run on the drive that set up Hopkins' gamewinning field goal as the rallying point. —Stephen Vogt was a surprise choice to be named the Cleveland Guardians' new manager. Just one year removed from his playing days, the 39-year-old Vogt has no previous managerial experience. However, Vogt has received high praise for his baseball knowledge, personality and ability to connect with other players.



In the end, love will be the one great memory I keep

Over the past five years, I have spent a lot of time thinking about my mother's mind. She suffers from vascular dementia, which is an affliction caused by reduced blood flow.

I remember all too well the gradual emergence of Mom's dementia. Physicians blamed the mental changes on aging, but her falls seemed to be a contributor. In fact, with Cou-



madin on board, her entire upper face was purple after one fall. Mom was ashamed about that accident, but the stroke that took her from her home years before had stolen her ability to walk, even when using a walker, or merely transferring from a wheelchair to the bed. Although her injuries frightened both her and us, we began to see evidence of memory loss during that time.

The pandemic was another game-changer for Mom. Her family couldn't be with her for over a year. I once read about orphans during WWII who died despite the nourishment and care they received. What they lacked was loving touch. During our weekly visits through Plexiglas, I began to hear questions from Mom: "Who are you?" When I finally got into the nursing home, she clung to me like someone drowning. Now, years later, she says I am the "nice woman who decorates her room," denying her "baby" could be an "old woman" like me.

The hurt involved in dealing with a dementia patient is life-altering. After almost four years of weekly FaceTime calls from Mom, last Saturday I was relieved when the nursing home's I-Pad battery died, and we were unable to visit. I told myself she was sleeping.

Perhaps that is why I relished Sandeep Jauhar's touching memoir, "My Father's Brain: Life in the Shadow of Alzheimer's." Jauhar, a cardiologist, tells the story of his failing parents: his mother to Parkinson's but mostly his father's battle with Alzheimer's. As a physician himself, he gives in-depth but digestible medical information about his father's demise between storytelling. His

despite the nourishment and care they received. What they lacked was loving touch. During our weekly visits through Plexiglas, I began to hear questions from Mom: "Who are you?" When I dad, a Ph.D. scientist, transforms from a world traveler to a man who loses his way home from CVS, just a mile away. In Jauhar I found a kindred spirit, a fellow traveler in the sad, confusing landscape of dementia.

As Î read the book, I realized once again that my mother is end stage. She is having great difficulty swallowing and often sleeps continuously even while being fed. She has lost a great deal of weight. Her tongue and mouth are almost always in motion, like an infant's. Or as Jauhar says, "At stage seven, the final stage, patients need assistance with virtually every aspect of daily living."

Mom has been bedbound for many years. She is oblivious to her diaper being changed or company coming into her room. In other words I have been losing her for a long time. Dr. Day at Washington University in St. Louis told Jauhar, "(With dementia), eventually the whole brain is affected. Patients generally can't speak." Which Mom seldom does. If she does speak, she often makes no sense at all.

What I admired most about Jauhar's book though was his fierce love for his father coupled with the explanations he gives as a somewhat baffled physician. In addition is the perception of the author as a son, a son whose perfectionist father suddenly cannot remember the difference

between a brake and a gas pedal but still insists he can drive. Although his father no longer remembers the tools of his livelihood, he can surprisingly recall his wife when she was young or his childhood nickname for his younger boy. The heartbreak is palpable, and the author allows us into that pain and helplessness with heartbreaking gallantry.

Last week a new palliative care nurse called my sister. He asked if she realized how bad her mother was doing. My sister wrote me a tearful text. "What more could we do?" she asked. And that is the hardest part — the part Jauhar expresses so eloquently in his intense discussions with his siblings — for with this disease, even when you are doing all you can, it never seems like enough. And then Jauhar's father dies.

The author says, "As he drifted away and people began to wail, I experienced a strange remembrance. That sunny March morning as I gripped his lifeless body, for some reason I saw him running beside me. I was pedaling furiously down the rutted path, flying over sticks and weeds as my father kept pace to make sure I did not fall. I know it didn't happen this way: I can't imagine that it did. But it is my memory now. I'll keep it."

That is how Jauhar remembers his father — with great love, the same way I will remember my sweet mother.






