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Brown's Lake Bog guided hikes Sept. 11

The Nature Conservancy is offering two opportunities for a guided hike through Brown's Lake Bog south of Wooster on Saturday, Sept. 11 at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

The hikes are part of the 'Fall in Love with Ohio Hike Series" at The Nature Conservancy's open preserves throughout the state.

'Each time will have 19 spaces available, so plenty of room for the whole family to join in," said Angela Burke, conservation and volunteer coordinator at the Nature Conservancy Columbus office. "I will be pointing out some of the cool features and chatting about conservation in Ohio."

Brown's Lake Bog was acquired in 1966 and is one of the few high-quality bogs left in Ohio. This 100-acre preserve is owned and managed by The Nature Conservancy and designated as a National Natural Landmark and State Nature Preserve. The bog is believed to have been formed over 15,000 years ago and is one of only a handful of sites in Ohio that still exists with a naturally formed kettle lake. This preserve lies in

the Glaciated Allegheny Plateau region of Northeastern Ohio. The bog and lake are glacial remnants, and the knoll in the northeast corner and southern part of the property are glacially formed hills called kames.

Kettle lakes were formed by retreating glaciers or draining flood waters from blocks of ice sloughed off from the glaciers. These were then surrounded by sediment left by melt water streams. If water in a kettle becomes acidic due to decomposing organic plant matter, it becomes a kettle bog. Kettle bogs are closed ecosystems because they have no water source other than precipitation. These bogs are an important ecological niche for some symbiotic species of plants.

'As a carnivorous plant enthusiast, I've long enjoyed Brown's Bog for its unique plants," said Julia Wiesenberg, a member of Friends of Brown's Lake Bog. "It really is a special place. The Friends group was founded to support conservation and awareness about the bog, and I serve as coordinator between The Nature Conservancy, who owns and manages the property, and the Friends volunteers. It is designated as a National Natural Landmark and State Nature Preserve."

Cheryl Gordon also enjoys volunteering at the preserve.

"The Nature Conservancy calls me a site monitor," she said. "Basically, I just visit the bog regularly and report if there are any issues, like trees across the trail. I also pick up trash and do routine maintenance. I am fascinated by the changes in the bog from week to week. As the seasons change, there is always something new to see. The ferns along the boardwalk and the big, old oak trees on the kame are some of my favorites."

There is no charge to

visit the bog, which is open from dawn until dusk.


According to The Nature Conservancy Ohio website, Brown's Lake Bog Nature Preserve is one of the top-10 nature adventures in Ohio.

Turn south onto Elyria Road, follow it south for 3 miles and then turn west on Brown Road. Park on the south side of the road in the gravel parking lot area.

Lions' 'Bike for Sight' event Sept. 19 starting at Ride On

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


The Wooster Noon Lions will hold their annual benefit bicycle ride, "Bike For Sight," on Sunday, Sept. 19. There are four rides

Welcome back to the Wayne County Fair — 172nd edition Sept. 11-16

veryone's reason for visiting the EWayne County Fair is different. Some come for the entertainment that is found every night of the six-day festivities. Others come for the hundreds of projects taken on and shown by the county's youth in the 4-H program. And yet even more visitors only have one goal in mind by stopping by the fairgrounds throughout the nearly week-long event: to sample as many of the foods found along the midway as they can chow down.

Whatever the case may be as to why you choose to visit the fair this year, you'll be able to find everything that wasn't there in 2020 - thanks to last year's fair being canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Plans are for the 2021 fair — the 172nd this year — to go forward as planned Saturday, Sept. 11 through Thursday, Sept. 16, with several extra safety precautions in place to keep everyone as healthy as possible during their visit.

"We welcome everyone with open arms," fair secretary Matt Martin said. "If they feel comfortable wearing a mask or not wearing a mask, we welcome everyone. We do ask for people to be respectful of others and their decisions. If someone does not feel comfortable being here, that is a decision they as individuals must make. We will take the necessary precautions through sanitizing areas that are frequented, hand-washing sinks, having masks and hand sanitizer available for all

Martin said the Wayne Coun-

months planning a fair, and the 2021 event has been no different. If any mandates are put in place because of the pandemic, he said they will adjust accordingly.

'It is easier to plan for a full fair and adjust, rather than wait to plan it all at the last minute," Martin said. "I believe this goes back to the mind-set of agriculture and community. We have several people tell us every year that they do not even go to their own county fair because they would rather come to ours."

Because of the fair's year off in 2020 (except for the showing and judging of 4-H and junior fair projects), the board has added a variety of new and renewed activities for visitors in 2021.

During this year's event for the first time, the fair will partner with the Tree City Quilters' Guild in Wooster and the Wayne County Veterans' Association, with items to be entered in the home economics department to honor local veterans. An entire category dedicated to veterans, "Honoring Our Patriots' Service," will present a visual thank you during the fair to these service men and women.

There also have been two buildings added to the grounds: the Wayne County Fair Event Center, which will house the rabbits and poultry and two show arenas, and the Farmers National Bank Livestock Facility, which will be the location for the hogs.

Plans are to hold a ribbon-cutting ceremony for a new flagpole, a 9/11 remembrance ceremony, bringing back the free local entertainment tent, expanding the church service into two separate services ty Fair board typically spends 16 and offering a new 4-H show called four tickets.

'We are known as Ohio's foremost agricultural fair," Martin said. "Our roots run deep with pride in our community and rich agricultural heritage. We remain one of the cheapest fairs in Ohio and at the same time offering everyone who walks through our gates a full day of fun and entertainment at whatever their budget is. Relationships are very important to us, and we value each and every one of them. Our fair is the truest form and representation of what community is.'

The entertainment schedule for grandstand shows includes the following: Sept. 11, OSTPA truck/ tractor/semi pull; Sept. 12, country/rock band Parmalee; Sept. 13, American contemporary Christian singer, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist Crowder; Sept. 14, longtime country/rock group the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band; and Sept. 15, the Buckeye Rodeo before concluding with the annual Demolition Derby. Ticket information is available at www.waynecountyfairohio.com.

Those planning the 2021 Wayne County Fair are excited to see everyone again at the fair and are hopeful fairgoers are ready to come back to visit what they missed in 2020.

"We are excited to welcome everyone back this year to reconnect with each other and pick right up where we left off two years ago," Martin said. "We are grateful that we can provide the venue to do just that. We have something here for everyone. From the horse pulls to the Demolition Derby, from cotton candy to the chicken barbecue, young and old, we will all come together for six fun days. Some will come as strangers but then will leave as friends. That's what our fair does.

Admission to the fair is \$4 with children 6 and under free. Tuesday is Veterans Day with all veterans admitted free with ID. Wednesday is Senior Citizen Day with those 65 and older admitted free.

Ride prices include the following: mega pass (all-week rides), \$50; unlimited ride passes Saturday through Sunday, \$18 from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.; Monday, \$13 from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.; Tuesday (Kids Day), \$13 from noon to 10 p.m.: Wednesday (Stroller Day) with kiddie rides. \$10 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. while all rides are \$18 from 4-10 p.m.; and Thursday, \$18 from 4-10 p.m.

Ride prices are \$1 per ticker or 12 for \$10, with major rides taking

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Veterans will get quilts at Sept. 16 fair ceremony

A Wayne County Fair ceremony will honor more than 50 local veterans by giving them handmade quilts through a first-time partnership between the fair board, the Tree City Quilters' Guild in Wooster and the Wayne County Veterans Services.

The honorees, chosen by veterans services, include fair board secretary Matt Martin and fair directors Don Reichert and Tom White.

"We're grateful for their work with the guild on this project and grateful for their service as veterans," said Jeri Fickes, a guild member who helped coordinate the veteran recognition. "None of them think they're worthy because it's who they are as veterans, full of humility and full of valor."

Quilts collected for the ceremony on Thursday, Sept. 16 at 2 p.m. include



43 made by guild members and four made as entries in the fair's new home economics department category called Honoring Our Patriots' Service.

All the quilts will be on display in the Grange Rotunda throughout the fair.

"Entries in the Honoring Our Patriots' Service category will not only present a visually awe-inspiring thank you during our fair, but will go on to remind our veterans that we have not forgotten their love of family,

home and America," reads a description of the project on the fair's website.

Included with the display will be information about Honoring Our Patriots' Service, which the guild modeled after a similar project at Stark County Fair. That project, called Operation Fostering Freedom, provides fair entrants the opportunity to enter patriotic quilts, afghans and lap throws in any of 14 categories for judging and rib-create a themed quilt or a

bons. The red, white and Quilt of Valor to give to the blue entries are then gifted to veterans.

Both projects were inspired by the Quilts of Valor Foundation, which was started by a mother whose son was serving in Iraq. The foundation's mission is "to cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing quilts of valor." As of July 31, the foundation had given 278,847 hand- or machine-stitched quilts as a way to say "thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation," according to its website.

Fickes said some of the quilts provided by guild members were originally made for its quilt show scheduled for April 2020. The show was canceled due to COVID, but its theme was "America The Beautiful" and entrants could foundation.


A quilter for 30 years, Fickes has donated two quilts to the foundation and another to a veteran friend. She created two quilts for the Honoring Our Patriots' Service project.

"I find quilts very com-forting," she said. "Just knowing that they can be comforting to other people means a lot to me."

She hopes the new quilt category at the fair will attract more entries as it becomes better known.

The ceremony to present the quilts will take place in the entertainment tent and include a presentation of the flags by the Triple Nickel honor guard and welcoming remarks by White. 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Ohio's largest flag to fly over fair starting 9/11

When the Wayne County Fair officially opens Sept. 11, it will boast the largest flag and flagpole in Ohio, thanks to the Wooster Rotary Club.

Following the fair's 9 a.m. opening ceremony and ribbon cutting, the club will present to fair directors a 30-by-60-foot flag to hang from a pole 140 feet tall outside the fair's Events Center.

"It's huge." fair director Tom White said. "You'll 30 and most everywhere

in Wooster. That's how big it is."

The flag is one of about six in the state that size, he said.

As for the flagpole, "Ours is the tallest," said Justin Starlin, the club's immediate past president who co-chaired the Rotary-Wooster Community Flagpole/Flag Project. "It's pretty impressive."

The project was com-

pletely funded by the club, Starlin said, to honor its 100th anniversary this year.

'We're just so very proud to have the flag here," fair secretary Matt Martin said. "This is a landmark that the Wayne County Fair and Wooster will be known for. It represents another great partnership between the fair and the service organizations around Wayne County, especially the Rotary Club.

Fair directors will dedicate the flag/flagpole following the opening ceremony.

While the Wooster Rotary Club financed the project, Starlin said, it is seeking support from businesses and the community to pay for the ongoing operation and maintenance of the flagpole. "This is the most important component to the ongoing success and longevity of the project," he said.

With these funds the flagpole will be properly maintained and replacement flags will be purchased on a consistent basis," said Sandra Hull, who co-chaired the

project with club presidentelect Greg Long.

Long said the flag will be visible to thousands of visitors, passersby and residents daily.

The project is part of the club's dedication to honoring veterans and current servicemen and women, he said. Twelve years ago Wooster Rotary established the Parade of Flags program in which club members assisted by local community groups place a 3-by-5-foot flag in the front yards of residents who subscribe to the program. The flags are picked up again after the holiday. The program has more than 2,000 subscriptions.

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Fair brings a favorite exhibit out of retirement

The 2021 Wayne County Fair will reunite a man and his steam engine and bring a favorite exhibit out of retirement.

Dave Tschantz, who's had a longtime love affair with the 1923 Russell steam engine, originally owned by Wayne Mutual Insurance Co., will be back on board as its engineer on the fair's opening day. Now under the ownership of the Wayne County Fair board, the historic steam engine will be on display at the Buckeye Agricultural Museum and Education Center on Lincoln Way across from the fairgrounds.

"It's a lot of fun for me to be back with it again," said Tschantz, who operated the H. Lester Lee engine from 1984-2001 for parades, local festivals and the Wayne County Fair. It's familiar whistle, along with the chuffing and popping sounds, attracted fairgoers.



Tschantz was by its side long enough, he said, that younger married couples would stop and tell him they remembered it as a child, and they'd bring their own children to see it.

Tschantz also met his wife, Ann, at the fair while operating the 10-ton steam engine.

With the help of museum staff, Tschantz converted the engine so it now runs on compressed air instead of steam.

In 2001 a similar engine

in a steam-powered tractor exploded at the Medina County Fair, killing four people and wounding dozens more. The accident left some uncertainty about the safety of using steam engines.

Tschantz brought the Russell steam engine to

the fair that year but didn't operate it. Instead, he placed lights in the interior boilers so people could see inside. Over the weekend fairgoers had a lot of questions about the Medina County Fair accident, he said.

Then the Sept. 11 ter-

rorist attacks happened on Monday. "After that, no one wanted to know about the steam engine," he said.

Wayne Mutual Insurance, where Tschantz once worked, went the extra mile and had the steam engine inspected every year even though it decided to no longer operate it. A state law passed after the Medina accident requiring state inspections and operators to be licensed, he said.

Company President Ralph Gresser purchased the steam engine in 1983 from his father-in-law, H. Lester Lee of Cross Creek, Pennsylvania. He had it restored in 1984, and Tschantz became its engineer.

"The (Gresser) family does like to keep up with what's happening with the engine," Tschantz said. "They always ask if (the fair board) is taking good care of it, and my answer is always yes."

During this year's fair, the steam engine will be moved outside the museum in order to run a 1916 Ohio Bellevue stationary wire-tie baler, according to one of the museum's curators and fair board member Ron Grosjean. Some of the characteristic sounds may not be as prominent, he said, but when Tschantz blows the engine's brass whistle, "then it will sound real."

Museum staff plan to one day mount the air compressor on a wagon designed to look like an old water wagon that would have been used by a threshing crew to haul water from field to field. For now, the engine will be a stationary exhibit.

Tschantz, vice president and general counsel at Christian Healthcare Ministries, is grateful for his association with the steam engine.

"It's a thrill to watch it run," he said.

volunteers work with county extension personnel to provide educational services to their community. Volunteers also must give 50 hours of work to the community.

They decided to stay and raise their family in Wooster. Gerhart works at Rexroth and, along with his wife, is an adviser for Smithville Simmer 'N' Sew 4-H Club. He also has served on the Wayne County Fair Rabbit and Poultry Committee and helped with the design and planning of the Wayne County Fair Events Center.

When fair board seats opened, Gerhart said, "Someone said to me, 'You're around here a lot. You ought to apply."

As a fair board member, Gerhart said he looks forward to networking with people. "It's a good organization, and I want to help it grow and make it better."

Ten teens have been selected to serve on the 2021 Wayne County Fair royal court. 

History of fair's famed barbecue chicken now framed

People have been known to stand in long lines for the barbecue chicken served at the Wayne County Fair, but few have known its origin, even the Shreve Business and Community Association that serves it.

That will change now that Nina Miller of Shreve has donated a framed history of the chicken along with a flyer featuring instructions on how to make it to the Wayne County Fair board. The mounted history will be on display in the fair, and then it will hang in the Wooster History Gallery at the Buckeye Agricultural Museum and Education Center, 877 W. Old Lincoln Way, across from the fairgrounds.

"I've been talking about doing this for a few years,"



93-year-old Miller said. "So many people don't know where the chicken recipe came from."

Miller said she and her late husband Harold "Hank" Miller first tasted the chicken during a visit to the Ohio State Fair in the 1960s. "We liked it so well we got the recipe," she said.

Harold Miller thought it would be a good moneymaker for the Shreve Business-

men's Association, which later changed its name to Shreve Business and Community Association.

The group first sold the chicken during a July 4 softball tournament that was expected to draw a large crowd. Members set up a grill behind the Shreve Elementary School. "The ladies made side dishes and homemade pies and cakes to add to the meal, and it was served from the school cafeteria," the history reads. "It was a big hit!"

Later, Harold Miller got approval from the fair board to serve the chicken at the fair, and Shreve restaurant owner Henry Schlabach, Jr. agreed to cook it.

Nina Miller said her husband recruited some of the employees from the truck-

ing company to help build the pavilion where the chicken dinners are served during the fair.

The first year the association sold 750 halves of the barbecue chicken at the fair, according to Miller's history. That number has grown to

10,000 halves each year.

Fairgoers can purchase the chicken alone or in a meal that includes green beans, apple sauce, a roll and drink.

Nina Miller said when she and her husband bought the chicken at the Ohio State Fair,

it came with a slice of cranberry sauce, a dill pickle, a pickled egg, a bag of potato chips and ice cream.

Marty Hershberger, longtime chair of the barbecue for the association, said he remembers cooking the chicken at the school before the pavilion was constructed.

The sale of the chicken at the fair nets about \$20,000, which helps support Shreve Migration Sensation, Shreve Swampfest, Wounded Warrior Project, streetscape work and purchases at the Wayne County Junior Fair Livestock Sale.

Hershberger said in past interviews the recipe for the chicken — a mixture of water, butter, vinegar, salt and Worcestershire sauce sprayed on the meat — has never been a secret, but the cooking methods have been honed over the years to make it a consistent, well-liked product.

The framed history includes a plaque that reads "In memory of Harold 'Hank' Miller."







Local women continuing long WC Fair tradition

When Linda Prochazka looks through the eye of a needle and counts her stitches, she has the Wayne County Fair in mind.

Priscilla Sprang plants a garden and gathers recipes thinking the same.

Each has been doing this for over 50 years, honoring long-standing family traditions of showing animals and entering projects in the fair. After having to sit out last year's senior fair, which was canceled due to COVID, Prochazka of West Salem and Sprang of Shreve are back in action for the 2021 Wayne County Fair Sept. 11-16.

"I sew all winter," Prochazka said. "My projects have no rhyme or reason. If I see something that trips my trigger, I say, 'Oh, I could make that.'" Then it winds up as an entry in the fair's Home Economics Building.

Sewing for others is what she likes best. "I find a little person, usually at my church," and make that child an outfit, she said. To her delight, grandchildren are among the little people who benefit from her love of sewing, as do

Ouilts, christening gowns and doll clothes are among Prochazka's other favorite things to sew. The doll she dresses is her own, and she's "got a wardrobe that will put yours to shame," she tells this reporter.

Her favorite award is a Best of Show ribbon she won on a cross-stitched piece featuring a tree design that took almost 68,000 stitches. Prochazka entered it in the fair in memory of her sister LuAnn McCullough. "It's one of my most treasured possessions," she said.

Prochazka started showparticipants in the fair's ing livestock (hogs, sheep Shepherds Lead Class. and shorthorn cattle) and

sewing projects at the fair when she was a 10-year-old 4-Her. Her dad also made open class entries for her and her siblings.

"It's part of what we did," she said. "I remember we came to the fair, and that was life, though my mom missed the fair the year I was born — just wasn't good planning," Prochazka said. Her birthday is Sept. 10. "And I never had a birthday party because we were always at the fair."

That changed in adulthood. Family and friends celebrated her 40th birthday with her in the sheep

"Bottom line, I love the Wayne County Fair," Prochazka said. "It's in my blood."

Sprang said her family's involvement dates back several generations. A ribbon she found among family heirlooms was dated 1922.

Sprang was raised on a Jersey dairy farm, and her own family has continued to own Jersey cows over the years. She's now watching grandchildren carry on the tradition of showing them

her, "You ought to enter that banana cake you make in the fair"

She continued to add new flavors, and for a long time, Sprang saved late in the evening.

said, when someone told the cakes (only one slice is needed for judging) and served them to her family and other tired and hungry Jersey exhibitors after the breed's show concluded

Sprang also enters flowers from her garden as arrangements and individual specimen classes. Most of her antique entries belong to her mother.

She and Prochazka have remained active in the 4-H junior fair program over the years. Both have served on the Wayne County Food and Fashion Board, Wayne County 4-H Advisory Committee, and as 4-H advisers.

Prochazka, a former Wayne County Junior Fair queen, is a member of the Ohio 4-H Master Clothing Educators program.

Sprang said her best memories of the fair as a child are staying overnight in the barn with her Jersey cow projects.

"It's been the camaraderie that goes along with the fair as well as the lifelong friendships. You know friendships are important," Sprang said to Prochazka. "Look how far we go back."

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20 years later: From the perspective of teachers

Educators are paid to have the answers. Not in every subject area or with every evolving curricular map, but within a specialty area, students ask ... teachers respond. Sometimes those answers are finite, and sometimes they lead to the beauty of a reciprocal process that often makes teaching the best gig on the planet. That is until words/answers are



too difficult to come by or too painful to express.

Twenty years after the horrific events of Sept. 11, 2001, what still resonates with me most about work-

ing at Wooster High School that day has as much to do with the days that followed as watching the events unfold on our classroom television. That is until the principal came over the PA system ordering teachers to turn their televisions off for the remainder of the day.

On Wednesday morning, Sept. 12, never have I walked into the building less prepared for what was

to come, with no answers to the questions I assumed would be asked or a real sense for what students might be thinking or experiencing or feeling. It was a day, as were the many to follow, of uncertainty, and that is not a very comfortable world in which to live when students need us to be more certain than not.

For whatever reason, I remember Jordan Gliem, a student in my English I class, asking me if I thought we were going to go to war. Reflecting on President Bush's address from the Oval Office the night before, I paraphrased the part of his speech when he talked about there not being a distinction between those who attacked us and the nations that may harbor them. That sounded to me like a "yes," but I did not feel it would do any good or offer any comfort to speculate. "War" is a heavy word that must be used cautiously, so I responded to the student in the simplest way I knew: "I just don't know.

Education often puts us in situations that are distinctly unique to the profession, and in this case, it meant we were going to need to show our vulnerabilities right along with the thousand-plus 13- to 18-year-olds who share our home.

It was a vulnerability that was not unique to me or my classroom.

"(Sept. 12) was awful. I remember not wanting to leave my family to come to work. The look on the kids' faces said it all," Spanish teacher Miriam Stokes said. "No one knew what to say to each other. Kids and adults were crying."

"I remember hoping in the days that followed that somehow people would have survived the buildings collapsing and would be rescued," special education teacher Paul White said. "At this point, all we really wanted was the hope that people would be saved. That's why I spent a lot of time watching CNN, late at night after the boys were in bed."

After the emotionally draining days at work, most simply wanted to be around their families.

"For comfort, I wanted to be in the presence of my husband's parents that evening. My father-in-law had served in Europe during WWII, and I knew he would have perspective and bring comfort," family and consumer science teacher Marlene Boyer said.

She also recalls, in an attempt to help soothe the family, doing one of the many life skills she does best, both at home and in her classroom: making brownies. "They were a complete flop," Boyer said. "In my distracted state of mind, I must have left something out of the recipe" — a recipe she said she had made a hundred times.

Pregnant with her third child, Spanish teacher Chris Matthew recalls the contrast between the life and hope she was carrying with the images she was seeing on television. "Seeing all of the pictures on the chain-link fence of all the missing people who were in the towers was so awful, and the loss of human life was so huge and terrible images that will stay with me for the rest of my life," she said.

Making sense of the day is still difficult for some.

"I tell my students every year that it is tough to convey what the events that transpired meant to our country. I guess I feel in the classroom the same thing that people that lived during Pearl Harbor felt ... words will never do justice

to the gravity of the event," history teacher Mike Sullivan said.

Amidst the uncertainty and confusion, what also became abundantly clear as the days and weeks and months wore on, through discussions with students and colleagues, is we had awakened in a world that was drastically different than pre-9/11, and that feeling began to envelope the entire building.

But as scary and as tragic as that realization may have been, there also was a growing acceptance of togetherness that was assuredly felt within all occupational buildings, offices, businesses and homes: a community.

Twenty years later, I like to think that for all the questions I failed to answer in the days after 9/11, that students who may now be saying, "I was in Mr. Hiner's room when I heard ..." remember that the one blessing of 9/11 may very well be an educator's most important lesson: School communities work best when we seek understanding to the complex questions together.

Next week: 20 years later from the perspective of students.




