Battig retiring after long career with city

Jeff Battig has dedicated his multi-decade career to supporting parks and recreation in Wooster. Going back to his childhood, his entire life within and outside of his job has revolved around sports and recreation.

Battig is now set to retire from his job as recreation manager with the city at the end of December.

'Sports have always been a huge part of my life," said Battig, a 1978 graduate of Wooster High. When I was young, I did football, track, baseball. Even as early as fourth grade, I got into biking. By age 13 I had my first good bike. By high school I also got into cross county and downhill skiing."

Battig's career started with four years in the Army in aviation with a focus on maintenance of helicopters. But as soon as Battig returned to his hometown, he jumped back into his passion of recreation as the Wooster YMCA youth director.

After a stint with the YMCA, Battig went back to work for the City of Wooster, where he also had worked part-time while in high school. His new role was recreation coordinator, overseeing all three aquatic facilities, the soccer and volleyball pro-

community programs. His the new bike trails around job was busy, at times hiring and overseeing as many as 45 seasonal staff for the pools.

About 10 years ago, Battig was promoted to recreation manager. A couple of his biggest successes include launching the Wayne Trails Committee and revamping the Wooster soccer program.

The Wayne Trails Committee was established by Battig and Mayor Bob Breneman in 2016 under the purview of the City of Wooster. The purpose of the committee is creating new bike trails, and Battig said the goals include bike trail connections across Wayne County. The committee also hosted a fundraiser that was a ride to Fredericksburg and resulted in enough donations that they were able to open a fund at the Wayne County Community Foundation. The existing committee is a group of about 20 members who continue to meet every other month.

Current Wayne Trails Committee co-chair Bill Buckwalter has worked with Battig many times over the years.

"I had the privilege of serving with Jeff for a number of different events and committees," said Buckwalter, a co-owner

Battig's other major area of success was around the soccer program in Wooster with the creation of 17 acres of soccer fields at Oldman and Burbank roads, a monumental task that took from the mid-1990s to 2010 to be completed.

"When I started, our games were all over the city," Battig said. "There were games at Schaeffler, one in a farmer's field and the rest scattered about the city. Then myself and the president of the Wooster Soccer Association said we needed a set location. We started expanding the soccer complex with the city, WSA and county."

Battig's dedication has been appreciated by the City of Wooster.

'Jeff has been a critical member of the management team for the last nine years and a great Wooster team member for his entire career. He has always brought a high level of energy and professionalism to the position and the department," city administrator Joel Montgomery

dedicated to exploring new partnerships and ways to be more efficient while still providing the best recreation services possible to the community. I have greatly enjoyed working with Jeff and wish him the best in his retirement."

Battig also somehow found time to work for six years as the assistant girls high school soccer coach at Wooster High and also served for 10 years as a soccer referee.

"There were countless soccer meetings when I was president for three years of the Wooster Soccer Association," said Mitch Sleek, a current member of the Wooster Parks and Recreation Commission, serving alongside Battig. "I don't think a month has passed for the past 18-plus years that Jeff and I haven't worked on something together. He has always kept things fun and kept us organized on everything I've worked on with him."

Looking forward, Battig plans to spend his retirement in his dad's woodshop and to do more biking and kayaking. He already has several trips planned with his wife.

Battig will be replaced by Ashley Hershberger, also a longtime employee of the department.

House History

Morgan home provides window into the past

Roger and Nancy Real may live in the home built by James Morgan in 1815, but they prefer to think of themselves more as caretakers of history who just happen to reside in one of Wayne County's more famous

The Morgan homestead is believed to be one of the earliest, if not the earliest, homes built in Franklin Township in Wayne County, and recently, the Reals joined Morgan's direct descendent Tom Morgan to present several tours of the home.

Roger Real served as the tour guide for several different parties that came through, taking guests room by room through the large Federal or Adam style house, which typically is rectangular with little décor on the outside of the home.

"The Adam style is a continuation of the Georgian style but far simpler," Real said.

In giving his presentation and

slide show of the home in the event, Tom Morgan said it has enlightened him to the plight of his ancestor.

"I've gotten to know this house from visits starting in 2001," Tom Morgan said. "With each visit I learn more and more, and it is enjoyable

to gain insight into the history. It's really fascinating knowing that this is a major part of this area's history. It's really interesting to stop and think about who might have walked the halls or sat in the parlor of this incredible home.'

The home features many of the typical styles, but Morgan altered the home by creating four great rooms rather than making them two rooms

While there are no known facts about the construction of the home, Real has delved deeply into the history as much as possible, and he said he believes the home wasn't built by a professional architect.

Real's knowledge of the home and of that type of architecture helped paint a picture of a vibrant homestead two centuries ago, and Morgan picked a beautiful setting to call his home.

"Mr. Morgan picked a very simplistic style for his home, probably to build it as efficiently and cheaply as possible," Real said.

The College of Wooster did a dendrochronology on the hand-hewn beams downstairs. The beams were cut in 1812, and they would have had to dry for some time, thus the 1815 date is an estimate.

Over the years the Morgan homestead has been owned by several people. Samuel Mitchel owned the home in the late 1800s while the home exchanged hands from Isaac Johnson and J.VB. Taylor to John W. Fry in the early 1900s. In 1939 Charles J. Franks and his family purchased the home, and in 1945 Lloyd and Belle Plant called it home. Amy Smith purchased it in 1954, and while records are hazy, the home was purchased by Mike and Lillian Huizd in 1983.

According to Real, Lillian Huizd hated the house so much she refused to go inside when they visited, and they eventually let it become some-

what run-down.

formal parlor, great rooms and the kitchen, Real took patrons throughout the home, describing the unique construction and some of the different work that went into erecting the house.

deal about the homestead, he admits there are some mysteries surrounding the home that will probably never be told or learned. One of those is the fact there are no windows on the east side of the home.

'That is not a classical look,' Real said. "One thing I came up with was that they saved some money in not putting in windows there. Perhaps James Morgan just didn't have the money to put in windows that would have probably been shipped in from Pittsburgh. Also, in some places tax on the house was based on the number of windows. Of course, this is all supposition, and there are a number of unknown mysteries that went into the building of the home that we will probably never know."

Another question concerning the home was where did all the bricks come from to build the house. The addition of uniform floor boards would tend to lead one to believe Morgan didn't hand-hew each board. When were the first sawmill and brick kiln built in this area where he would have gotten the bricks and boards? Another unique fact is the home didn't have indoor plumbing until the 1950s.

the area traveling up the Cheat River From the six fireplaces to the in West Virginia and settled near Moreland, crossing the Allegheny River. Morgan was born in 1755 and was married in 1778. He had 10 children and chose to migrate to Ohio when that territory opened.

'It would have been a trip to While Mike Real knows a great endure," Morgan said of his ancestors. "We are talking pioneer days with log cabins and a very simplistic lifestyle. For him to build a house like this means he must have done well for himself, and with Wooster growing, he must have found some reason to settle here."

Real said the belief was Morgan was an educated man, believed to have served as one of the first Wavne County commissioners.

Real said the house was basically empty from the mid-1950s to the 1990s when it was owned by a couple that let it go into some disrepair. However, in the mid-1990s, David and Stephanie Livingston purchased the house, renovated it and turned it into a living history museum, bringing the Morgan House back to life. Later, Russ Burt, whose wife was a Morgan descendent, found out about the house. They made it their mission to really bring it back to its former glory. dividing some of the great rooms into two smaller rooms.

'There are very interesting stories to be told and many more that we will never know about this house," Real said. "We are caretakers of the home, and our goal is to History shows Morgan came to maintain its beauty and history."

Engineer's office employees turn to bike building

Wayne County Engineer's Office employees recently turned into Santa's helpers when they dedicated an afternoon to assembling 21 bikes to be given to children during the Shop with a Hero event on Dec. 11. Three of the bikes will be delivered to the domestic abuse treatment center, OneEighty.

Shop with a Hero is an annual collaboration on

December through the Fraternal Order of Police and Wayne County Children Services. Each year 100 area children are matched with a hero who treats them to breakfast and then participates in a motorcade to Walmart for a shopping spree.

The idea to build bikes for the event can be traced back to the Wayne County Fair.

TJ Shamp, Wayne County highway superintendent and fair board member, brought the idea to his department two years ago after recalling an Aaron Tippin performance

the second Saturday of December through the Fraternal Order of Police and Wayne County Children Services. Each year 100 at the fair in 2014 in which the singer built a bike on stage and donated it. He then challenged the fair board to do the same.

"It is just amazing to see the joy that these bikes bring to the kids," Shamp said. "They go to children all over Wayne County. We load them up in our trucks and deliver them alongside resource officers. The drivers get to see the reaction first-hand."

According to administrative assistant Pam Brown, the Wayne County Engineer's Office employees entirely funded the effort.

"All of our employees

donated to the bike fund," Brown said. "This year our staff donated a combined total of \$1,186."

Due to supply shortages, getting the bikes posed a challenge, but Brown was persistent and found other options.

"We needed to get different sizes of bikes," Brown said. "The FOP knew how many of each size to get, but getting them from the stores didn't work out this year, but I was able to find them online and get them shipped for free."














Antibiotic stewardship in calves, part 1 of 3

You've likely heard of Beef Quality Assurance, but what about Veal Quality Assurance? Essentially, it is the same type of certification for the well-being and proper handling of yeal calves.

However, a new addition to the certification training is antibiotic stewardship — a concept translatable to almost every livestock operation out there. The goal of the program is for farm personnel to correctly identify calves for treatment using a treatment protocol written by the herd veterinarian, thus improving responsible use of antibiotics. Drs. Jessica Pempek and Greg Habing put together a three-part training, of which I'll summarize each with their own article.

Part 1 of the Antibiotic Stewardship in Calves is titled "Antibiotic Use and Resistance." Before we jump into details, do you know the specifics on different types of medication? What do antibiotics treat? If you answered viral, fungal, protozoal or parasitic infections, unfortunately, you'd be wrong. An antibiotic is a medicine that inhibits the growth of or kills bacteria. Antibiotics are not to be used to treat any other type of infection

How about vaccines? They're a hot topic right now in human medicine, but their purpose is the same in livestock. They introduce a viral or bacterial pathogen in an inert form to prime the immune system to attack it, should the animal be exposed to the pathogen in real time later. Vaccines can be a modified-live form, killed form or conjugate form and cause the body to recognize and make antibodies against that specific disease-causing organism. Vaccines prevent disease, not cure it.

Lastly, what do you know about non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs or NSAIDs? These drugs are the parallels to our ibuprofen or acetaminophen. These drugs do not prevent disease or cure infections but instead reduce fever or

inflammation that may be associated with an infection. Examples include flunixin meglumine, phenylbutazone or meloxicam.

Now, back to antibiotics. It's important to remember not all bacteria are bad. There are very good bacteria that live in the digestive tract of calves and mature cows (the rumen wouldn't function without them). The bad bacteria are referred to as pathogens, and these bacteria cause the naval infections, pinkeye, and some pneumonia and diarrhea cases we see in calves.

When using antibiotics, the medication does not pick and choose which bacteria it kills other than using its mode of action (way of prohibiting bacterial growth). That means good bacteria along with pathogens are impacted when administering an antibiotic. Bacteria in the digestive tract unfortunately may take a hit too. This will likely cause a disruption to the gut microbiome and digestion efficiency. and those good microbes will need to be repopulated again.

Overusing antibiotics or misusing them can lead to antibiotic resistance or resistance by the bacteria to the antibiotic. Widespread resistance can eventually lead to bacterial populations unable to be controlled by medication for both livestock and humans. We, as humans, can be infected by the same or similar pathogens as livestock because we share segments of the gene pool (we're all in the mammalian family). Therefore, antibiotic resistance not only affects livestock producers, but the laypeople as well.

Overusing or misusing antibiotics causes resistance by selecting for the bacteria that are not killed or inhibited by the medicine. For example, let's say there is a 5-day-old calf presenting with diar-

rhea. For this age of calf, the causative pathogens may be E. coli, clostridia, cryptosporidium, rotavirus or coronavirus. While waiting for the fecal culture results, you treat with an antibiotic. Fast forward after you've already given several doses of antibiotic — the culture is negative for bacteria and you're dealing with a viral infection. Unfortunately, the antibiotics have already gotten to work. They've negatively impacted the good bacteria in the gut, and if there are any pathogenic bacteria in the system, they have killed off the susceptible ones but left the resistant bacteria alone.

The "lone rangers" will now have full access to replicate and pass on their resistant genes, potentially causing an issue down the line, especially if the same protocol is followed every time there is a sick calf.

Stopping antibiotic resistance starts with judicial antibiotic use. This means using the proper medication for the issue at hand. Having a veterinary-clientpatient working relationship is essential to knowing when and when not to use an antibiotic. Discuss a treatment protocol with your vet. Using antibiotic alternatives also may reduce the chance of resistance. Minor infections may be handled simply using palliative care (giving an NSAID if the animal is in considerable pain, keeping a wound clean, providing fresh and dry bedding, et cetera). Lastly, preventing disease before it occurs eliminates the need to use antibiotics entirely. Farm cleanliness, sick animal quarantine and worker hygiene can all contribute to reduced disease transfer.

Stopping antibiotic resistance can start with anyone. Talk to your vet about antibiotic use on your farm and stay tuned for part 2.


