Election officials work to ensure confidence

There is a long-standing misconception that Wayne County Board of Election employees only work on election day, but nothing could be farther from the truth. The dedicated bipartisan team works year round registering new voters, upgrading equipment, processing voter address changes and implementing new procedures to ensure election day runs smoothly and voters have confidence in the balloting process.

Republican Director Julie Leathers-Stahl and Democrat Deputy Director Bryon Bell work together to ensure every item on their checklist follows Ohio state mandates.

How is this accomplished?

To begin with, everything in the office to oversee the election is done in pairs that consist of a Republican

Employees at the Wayne County Board of Elections stay busy year round to ensure elections run smoothly. Recently, they upgraded the two cameras on the Vanover Street office building that monitor the only authorized ballot drop box in the county, operating 24 hours per day, seven days per week, 365

and a Democrat member.

The board of elections is one of the few places

allowed to hire employees based on political affiliation from each party to agree processes are followed. If there is not a member from each party present to handle the day-to-day activities. work at the office grinds to a halt.

'If we don't have Democrat and Republican in the office, we cannot even check the mail that day," Bell said. "It takes a representative from each party to check the mail. We rely on each other for checks and balances and to make sure everything is done legally."

Even entering the tallying room in the board of elections office takes a member of each party to open the door. "I have half of the entrance code. and my counterpart has the other half," Bell said. "When I enter half of the code, the lock will flash and prompt whomever I — and for a good reason. am with to enter the other

Bell said it takes a member half. Without both parts of the code, neither of us can enter.'

> The strict partisan guidelines also extend to each of the 41 polling locations in Wayne County. There is a bipartisan set of eyes on a ballot from the moment it is cast until it is brought to the tallying room and counted.

The secretary of state's office constantly reviews policy to see where changes should be made to ensure each election is secure.

The big issue for voters right now is the identification changes," Stahl said. "You must have a photo ID: an Ohio driver's license, Ohio ID card, passport, passport card or military ID. Previously, you could use utility bills, car registrations, a paycheck or another form of ID. Now you must have a photo ID."

Holder, election operations the community stepping up to volunteer." It takes a minimum of 268 volunteers for each

election. A poll worker is paid \$123 for working on election day and receives an additional \$30 for the mandatory three-hour training to be held March 16. Election workers set up and tear down the voting equipment, check in voters as they come in to vote and staff a polling place all day on election day.

The time commitment includes about an hour the afternoon or evening before the election to help set up the polling location. Election day hours are from 5 a.m. to around 8:30 p.m. or until the machines are packed up

Volunteers may stipulate where and how far they are willing to travel on the day of the election. "Some people are willing to work anywhere in Wayne County while others only wish to work 15 minutes from home or in their usual polling place," Holder said.

Anyone who is a reg-

istered voter in Wayne County may volunteer. Seventeen-year-olds who are residents of Wayne County also may work at the polls. Some employers may allow an employee to take a day off to volunteer.

Holder anticipates the upcoming primary will be a slower election day for the workers. Volunteers are encouraged to bring reading, crossword puzzles,

knitting, et cetera, to pass the time when there are no voters in the building. For those interested in participating as a volunteer in the next presidential election, this primary will be important practice.

Anyone wanting to find out more about volunteering is encouraged to call the board of elections at 330-287-5480 to sign up or email wayne@ohiosos.gov. The deadline to sign up to be a poll worker is March 3.

There also is a need for volunteers to be leaders at their polling places. "Each precinct has one leader," Holder said. "So that means that we need 67 leaders for every election.

"A lot of poll workers enjoy helping their neighbors and friends while working on election day. Many also appreciate the opportunity to be a part of history by implementing elections. Some of our volunteers like to meet new people and have developed lasting friendships with other volunteers."

Stahl said there could be confusion for out-ofstate individuals without a passport, like college students who can vote locally or absentee in their home

"Beginning April 7, individuals can apply for a free state ID," Stahl said. "But they are subject to Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicle guidelines."

Those with a religious objection to being photographed may sign an affidavit and cast a provisional ballot while the affidavit is verified.

Another change impacting voters is the application deadline for an absentee ballot. "It used to be the Saturday before the election; it is now the Tuesday before the election," Stahl said. "That was instituted to give people seven days to receive the ballot in the mail."

The hours the board will be open also have changed and will be closed the day before election day. Stahl said the office would be

IncludeAbility

Area nonprofit embraces accessibility, inclusion in schools

ccording to the IncludeAbility Awebsite, 1 billion people in the world live with a disability.

The local nonprofit, founded by Wooster resident Julie Hartzler in May 2021, has a goal to go above and beyond the mandated laws and embrace accessibility and inclusion as a priority within the culture. Its mission is to make the world an accessible place where individuals with disabilities are empowered and included in all aspects of life.

'Fourteen years ago I had a daughter who was born with spina bifida," Hartzler said. "Through our life experiences and my experiences as a nurse, I became passionate about advocating for individuals with physical disabilities. I shared my dream to create a nonprofit organization to help address some of the barriers we've faced with my friend Jenny (Gerrick), and she was excited to join me in this adventure.'

Gerrick is the chief development officer of IncludeAbility.

The nonprofit's current focus is on a program to develop a standardized, inclusive emergency-preparedness plan for all the schools in Wayne County. Initially, they partnered with Wooster City Schools on a pilot program.

This program involved the purchase, installation and staff training for six Stryker evacuation chairs. IncludeAbility worked with the Wooster Fire Department and Wooster Police Department to decide on which equipment to purchase and where it should be installed in the multi-level school buildings. The chairs were purchased with funds from a Wayne County Community Foundation

An evacuation chair is an assistive device that allows individuals with mobility impairment to be safely and quickly evacuated from a multi-story building in the event of an emergency.

"Providing evacuation chairs takes an inclusive approach to ensure safe evacuation for individuals with physical disabilities so they are able to evacuate with their peers," Hartzler said.

The chairs were recently installed, and Stryker medical personnel were present for staff trainings at Cornerstone, Edgewood and Wooster High School. Students with disabilities also are being trained to know how to properly use the chairs.

'Our goal is that every staff member in the buildings will be trained on the evacuation chairs by the end of the year," Hartzler said. 'We want every student, staff or visitor to be able to be evacuated in the event of an emergency, whether they have a permanent or temporary disability."

There are two chairs in each of the three schools. They are installed in stairwells and can be easily transported and installed in new locations if needed. The chairs could be used in such emergency situations as a fire, power outage, tornado, active shooter or any instance that would require evacuation.

Once chairs are installed in all the Wayne County schools, IncludeAbility hopes to expand throughout the state.

Additionally, Hartzler said they plan to address housing and healthcare issues.

"We would love to see new houses being built have wheelchair access so that whether or not an individual purchasing the home needs the accessibility or you simply want to invite over a friend or family member that has a mobility disability, you can have them over with no barriers to access," she

The nonprofit is building an adaptive equipment library so individuals and organizations may sign out equipment for short-term use. The library will contain items such as hiking wheelchairs, beach wheelchairs, ramps and more.

We want to eliminate the financial burden and promote exercise and inclusive recreation within the community," Hartzler said.

IncludeAbility also is creating an evaluation form that will be on its website to allow the community to determine the accessibility of area hiking trails. There will be photos and information available so individuals can get a picture of how accessible an area is before venturing out.

Hartzler said, "As a parent with a child who has a disability, we do a lot of research before going to parks, vacations, restaurants, et cetera, to determine how accessible they are."

We would love to build our equipment library," Hartzler said. "We are looking for beach wheelchairs, ramps and grass mats. We also want to purchase evacuation chairs for additional school districts. Each chair costs roughly \$4,700."

Wooster Twp. Fire Department Pancake Day March 4

It's that time of year again - spring is just hinting at its arrival as the coffee starts brewing and the pancakes are ready to be flipped. On Saturday, March 4, it's the Wooster Township Fire Department annual Pancake Day.

For the fundraiser the fire department serves unlimited pancakes and sausage, applesauce and beverages and has the annual raffle. Dine-in, take-out and drivethru options will be offered, and signs will direct community members to the correct areas for either parking or drive-thru service.

The first Pancake Day was held in 1986.

"It started as a way to help offset the cost of needed equipment for the fire department without using tax dollars," Fire Chief Dallas Ter-

He said after that first year, recipes were tweaked and perfected, and the department now uses the same products and recipes that have been used since the second Pancake Day.

In 1986 about 600 people were served. The number of meals served grew to 2,725 in 2022, a record for the event. Approximately 10,000 pancakes were flipped last

The annual event is an all-day affair. Terrell said many people come to the event more than once during the day.

"Lots of people will join us for multiple meals throughout the day," he said. "Pancakes and sausage are great for breakfast, but breakfast food is great for supper too."

Every year a cash prize raffle is held along with the pancake meal.

"A lot of times people are very generous with their winnings and will even donate that back to us as another way for them to show their support and to help the cause," Terrell said.

This year the funds will be used to help build the Unmanned Aerial System (Drone) program.

"This is a relatively new program to our department and the fire service," Terrell said. "Our goal is to raise \$21,000 to purchase the needed equipment to ensure that we can have a drone available whenever one is needed to assist with an

emergency."

It takes approximately 70 volunteers to make the fundraiser work.

'Firefighters and their families, past Ruritan members, school kids doing volunteer work, and faithful community members all come together to make this a successful fundraiser," Ter-

The Wooster Township Fire Department was formed in 1940.

'The department is an integral part of the community and endeavors to protect life and property of the citizens," Terrell said. "The department provides fire-suppression operations, advanced life-support services and water-rescue operations to the community. In addition, the department provides fire-prevention education to schools and community groups and fire-inspection services to businesses.'

The department consists of eight full-time and approximately 35 volunteers who serve as firefighters and emergency medical technicians or paramedics.


Applications are being accepted until March 15 for the 30th annual Roy Bates Scholarship Award.

Eight high school seniors from Wayne County will receive a Bates Foundation one-time scholarship of \$2,500 and will become a finalist for the Bates Player of the Year Award, which will be announced in May.

The Bates Foundation, which is a component of the Wayne County Community Foundation, will reach \$450,000 this year in scholarship money awarded to Wayne County student-athletes over three decades.

Roy Bates died at age 88 in 2004 after a life that saw him work as a teacher, coach, broadcaster, referee, athlete and more

Since then HFH settled in three locations for spans of time, the last one being the building on Akron Road. The two-time All-North Coast Athletic Conference selection holds Wooster's career records for total offense (10,614 yards), passing completions (770), passing attempts (1,270), passing yards (10,083) and passing touchdowns (78). He ranks second at Wooster in total plays (1,575), average yards per play (6.7), 300-yard games (11), completion percentage (60.6%), and passing efficiency points (143.34).

As a senior Renteria completed 174-of-301 passes for 2,233 yards and 18 touchdowns. He rushed for a co-team-leading seven touchdowns and finished the year with 159 yards on

first Wooster quarterback with four 2,000-yard passing seasons and was one of three active players in Div. III in 2022 with over 10,000 career passing yards.

The four-time NCAC Athlete of the Week earned

68 carries. He became the his first 2022 honor after completing 27-of-43 passes for 396 yards and three touchdowns against Hiram College. His other top game came against Kenyon College, an afternoon in which the environmental studies alumnus tallied 464 yards of

total offense and six touchdowns.

Renteria threw for a school-record 3,237 yards in 2021, a season in which he completed 223-of-353 passes. His 29 passing touchdowns that year are the second-most in program history, and for the year Wooster boasted Div. III's seventh-ranked passing offense. He ranked fifth individually in Div. III in passing yards per game (323.7), 11th in total yards, 17th in passing touchdowns and 24th in points responsible for (198). The NCAC's only 3,000-yard passer in 2021 earned two D3football.com Team of the Week awards and was one of two repeat NCAC Athlete of the Week selections.

A lizard craze in younger days leaves a lasting scar

For a moment, when I was in the fifth grade, pet iguanas were all the rage. The local hardware store found itself inundated with requests for infrared heat lamp bulbs as every boy on my block set about fabricating his own iguana containment structure of plywood and chicken wire. Live mealworms became the hottest commodity on the streets, and sawdust bedding was at an all-time premium.

Iguana mania swept through my town like a raging, green wildfire, and I was every bit prepared to strike my own match and join the conflagration. Not only did I carry a burning desire to house a lizard of my own, but also I had the financial wherewithal compliments of my newspaper route — to make the purchase outright. I also knew how to build stuff and could easily construct my own cage, complete with I'd spent stomping my various iguana-friendly fea-



tures and accessories, in the time it would take my mailorder reptile to arrive.

The only thing that stood between me and lizard Nirvana was a smallish, middleaged woman with a strong desire to maintain order in her household. Mom caught on to my plan after I'd innocently asked for a stamp and an envelope while holding the order form I'd cut from the back page of Boy's Life magazine. And with that the iguana wildfire was extinguished in a single puff.

"No lizards will enter this house as long as I'm living here!" Mother proclaimed dramatically. "They carry ticks, and ticks burrow under your skin and suck your blood!"

Despite the endless days way through weed-covered

fields in pursuit of field mice, crawling through the thick of the forest in hunts for everything from chipmunks to raccoon kits, and slogging through the muck of wetland and wallow chasing frogs, snakes and turtles, I had never seen a single tick.

Mom was unflinching in her edict. The closest I was going to get to an iguana was at my best friend Chris' house, where his older brother David, master of all things weird and wild, housed a 3-foot-long specimen in a cage in the corner of his bedroom. We marveled over the beast as the rarest of all creatures — a living descendent of the dinosaur — complete with a coiled tongue capable of zapping unwitting crickets from a foot away and a scaly tail that could draw a welt on the arm of a young boy like the crack of a bull

'My mom said I can't have an iguana because they



have ticks," I said as Chris and I watched David handle the beast during a feeding. "Heck, I don't even know

what a tick looks like."

With that the elder boy picked up a set of tweezers lying beside the cage, care-

fully tugged at a small black lump on the side of his lizard and held the catch momentarily in front of our awestruck faces, then he flicked it at us with an evil hiss. "It looks just

There's no telling where that tick actually landed, but the psychological damage had been done. I fled the house feeling every itch I'd ever experienced while simultaneously vividly visualizing the insect burrowing under my skin to begin its blood feast.

My dreams of reptile husbandry were done. If life with lizards meant risking a tick, then I was out. Period! But while iguanas were gone from my life for good, the terror of ticks would somehow find a way, decades later, to seek me out for further torment. More on that next time around.

Seamus or Miles or Colin? I voted for Auggie after playwright August Wilson. She finally settled on Stanley Poochie, a name that melted my heart. And then the flood of photos started arriving: Stanley in his new hoodies, Stanley in her arms staring at her with pure adoration, Stanley watching TV, yes, on the arm of her chair. Henny Penny and Roo, her other kids, were looking off into the distance with despair. I felt powerless to help my other grands, but they are improving.

I am at the age where many of my friends have grandchildren. As I oooh over Ouin or make adorable coos over Ruby, adorable as they are, I'm not the least bit jealous. I have Henry and Nessa, Stanley Poochie and Rudy, my son's dog, to babysit and exchange photos of.

I will admit I am in the single dog club now. I've tripped over enough leashes to last a lifetime, especially the time I fell and nearly broke my face. I've walked two or three dogs at a time for most of my life, even in snowy weather, and, yes, nearly killed myself a few times when I wiped out on the ice. Plus, the vet, food and grooming bills are killing me. But I do know that despite the pledge I've taken to avoid looking at dogs online or elsewhere. there are moments when I take a walk on the wild side to see what's out there on the internet. It's a dangerous business, especially in the winter when I so love to cuddle.

Ah, I miss those puppy cuddles, and the smell of puppy breath just melts my heart. Thank heaven February is almost over.



We are working on our projects on our own time but have scheduled lunch meetings so we can hear how everyone is progressing. At our first update, we learned some are still in the research stage and others have begun to complete activities.

Extension agriculture and natural resource educator Frank Becker got an early start on his entomology project when he organized a field trip for our office staff to the United Titanium Bug Zoo at the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in December.

As the former integrated pest management coordinator for OSU Extension, Becker knows a thing or two about bugs, but the guided tour of the Bug Zoo, he said, allowed him to experience entomology from a different perspective.

In his role of scouting crop fields for farmers, he decides which bugs to kill and which ones to protect. Learning about insects such as the hissing cockroach and glittering fireflies at the Bug Zoo made him think about how to utilize entomology to interact with the public and educate people about

how insects function and the many careers in this field.

He will need a pinned insect collection as part of his project.

'I'm waiting for warmer weather so I can bump into a lot of cool insects," he said. "I think this project will help me take a closer look at my environment."

Office assistant Noah Klenovich is an experienced photographer who has exhibited and sold his work, but his advanced photography project is teaching him a different skill set that involves composing subjects and manipulating light for a photograph.

'I've taken a picture of a dragonfly perched on a flower, but I didn't compose it," he explained. "The dragonfly just sat there, and I got the photo using the natural light outside."

4-H program assistant Diane Johnson is planning a field trip for her knot tying project, but she won't have far to travel. She plans to visit her husband's workshop and learn about his expertise with knots and the different cordages (ropes) he uses

Office associate Leah Fedorchak wants to expand her cake-decorating skills by trying different tips to create floral designs. Staff assured her we are willing to taste her creations any

A new Mrs. Claus outfit is in the design stages for Darcy Becker, program coordinator for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education. She plans to wear the costume when she accompanies her husband during his appearances as a professional

For my project I've chosen OSU-themed fabrics to sew a quilted wall hanging. When it's all done, I'm hoping the title of the project rings true: You Can Quilt!

Rare fifth-year seniors help Scots to top of NCAC

A few thoughts from the week in sports ...

Good things come to those who wait.

Add "work hard" and "never give up" to that Bible verse and it helps explain how The College of Wooster was able to pull off a thrilling 75-74 win over Wabash College on Feb. 18.

Fifth-year College of Wooster seniors Turner Kurt and Naiee Hardaway. along with third-year head coach Doug Cline, were each rewarded for their perseverance in the most emotional way possible on Feb. 18.

The game, the regularseason North Coast Athletic Conference title and rights to host the league tournament were all on the line when Kurt released a 3-ball just before time expired.

March Madness came early to Timken Gym when Kurt's left-wing jumper touched nothing but net and Scots' fans stormed the court.

'Give all the glory to God," said Kurt, a 6-foot-8 forward who led the Scots with 16 points. "I've always praised him my whole life, and he gave me this opportunity.

"Second, I want to praise my teammates. We worked hard for this win. They put me in position, coach drew up the play, I hit the shot and we got the win. We're outright conference champions, and I couldn't be happier.'

A total team effort and never-say-die attitude enabled the Scots to pull out one of the most incredible wins in the storied history of Timken Gym. It was fitting the team's two elder statesmen came up huge in more, but the last two years



the biggest moment of the team's season to date.

Wooster blew a 13-point lead with 7:08 left and saw Wabash actually go up 74-72 on Josh Whack's layup with 2.4 seconds left.

Wooster had to go the length of the floor but caught a huge break when junior JJ Cline's long baseball pass was tipped out of bounds. Wooster got to set up the game-winning play with 2.1 seconds left from its own baseline. Hardaway (nine points) set a screen for Kurt, Jamir Billings inbounded it to Kurt and, after a pump fake and step to the right, "Big Shot" Kurt delivered.

"I'm just so happy for the guys," coach Cline said. "That could have been a heartbreaking loss for us because we led the whole game, but you play to the end and we did that.

Hardaway is just the second player to spend five years in the Wooster program, Cline said, joining Brandon Johnson (2006-10), who received an extra year of eligibility due to an injury.

Kurt played his first two seasons at Div. II Edinboro before transferring to Wooster, along with 6-8 junior Nick Everett.

"Turner and Najee helped to restore our program," Cline said. "With COVID-19 we basically never had seniors for those two years. Najee was more of a role player as a sopho-

he's been a significant contributor. Turner played his first two years at Edinboro, but he's also been a leader here, and those two guys have shown the younger guys how to be a Wooster basketball player."

Kurt and Hardaway both said it was a "no-brainer" to come back for a fifth season of college basketball in 2022-23.

"I wanted four years of college basketball," said Kurt, who's averaging 10.7 points a game and leads the team with 5.5 rebounds per contest. "I had that extra year, and I took it. I love all my teammates, and I love playing in this program."

Hardaway said the win over Wabash ranked right up there with the NCAC Tournament title victory at Wittenberg in 2020 for his most memorable at Wooster.

"This was a lot of fun," said Hardaway, who leads the Scots with 12.7 points a game. "My brother Turner hit a huge shot to get the win on Senior Night, and it couldn't be more picture perfect.

"After last year I was coming back from the jump. We knew if we got this same group twice, we could make something special happen, but it's not over. We've still got the conference tournament and the NCAA Tournament, so we've gotta keep going.

After playing for four years and working for 24 vears as an assistant under hall of famer Steve Moore, Cline took over as head coach for the 2020-21 season, only to have the COVID pandemic limit the Scots to playing just seven games. Last year Wooster went 19-9 (13-5) and had a

Div. III record streak of 18 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances snapped.

Longtime followers of the program felt especially good to see Cline earn his first regular-season NCAC title and take a big step toward qualifying for the NCAA tourney.

However, Cline was deflecting any kudos to oth-

"It feels really good, but it just feels good because I know how much time and sweat coach Moore put into this program, and myself and (retired assistant) coach (Bruce) Martin," Cline said. "Coach Moore still helps us out every day, and I'm more proud that we're able to do these things for him."

The stakes will get even higher when the Scots host the NCAC Tournament, hoping to earn an NCAA Div. III Tournament bid. The Scots beat Oberlin 92-77 in a Tuesday night quarterfinal and will host the semifinals Friday. Wooster meets Denison in one semi, with Wabash and DePauw in the other. The title game is Saturday, with the winner getting the automatic Div. III national tournament berth.

Parting shots

It also was a fantastic finish in the Wayne County Athletic League boys basketball race. Dalton's 76-70 win over Norwayne enabled the Bulldogs to force a three-way tie for the championship, with Smithville also sharing a piece of it.

It was the first WCAL three-way tie for boys basketball since 1975 when Dalton, Norwayne and Rittman shared the prize. The Bulldogs earned a piece of their fourth straight WCAL title, which hasn't been done in more than 60 years when Northwestern accomplished the feat.

Best wishes to the area teams in the postseason.


