Good thing, because she is the recipient of this year's Jack O'Donnell Award, given based on a person's contributions to the community through volunteerism, enthusiasm, and love for Wooster. A decade ago, Travis Mills looked for a way to get his name out there, along with the insurance company where he worked, so he connected with the Chamber's Young Professionals group. business in July 2019, Natasha Wood and her husband, Neil, have made continuous upgrades to the amusement center. They have fixed games, moved games around, painted, and installed new carpet. They have been hard at work renovating the park to restore it to its original glory while adding new attractions, both inside and out

Critchfield, a Woosterbased law firm with roots tracing back to the Civil War era, is this year's recipient of the Board of Directors Award. Pop Culture Convention coming to Wooster

The inaugural Operation: Fandom 2023 Pop Culture Convention will be held April 16 from 10 a.m.-6 p.m. at the Wayne County Fairgrounds Event Center, which is located at 199 Vanover Street.

The convention will feature toys, collectibles, trading cards, gaming and Cosplay. Dealers will set up approximately 100 tables in the 20,000-square foot event center

Headlining the Pop Culture Convention are three stars from the classic movie "The Sandlot," which is celebrating its 30th anniversary this year.

Coming to Wooster to meet fans, pose for photos and sign autographs will be Sandlot actors Tom Guiry (portrayed Smalls), Chauncey Leopardi (Squints) and Marty York (Yeah-Yeah).

Also appearing as special autograph guests will be Daniel Logan (Boba Fett) from the Star Wars universe, Ari Lehman (The first Jason from the original "Friday the 13th") and Jim Swearingen (Kenner Star Wars designer and The Toys That Made Us").

Convention organizer Josh Lehman owns and operates the Operation: Fandom and Blackbird Records stores located in Wooster. along with combo stores in Medina and Mansfield.

Lehman said that bringing

the Pop Culture Convention to Wooster has been a labor of love several years in the making. Once Lehman was able to finalize the contracts with the Sandlot stars to appear, everything fell into place.

"We've met a lot of these guys through having different store signings before," said Lehman, a 1994 Dalton graduate. "We've kept wanting to have the Sandlot guys in Ohio at some point, but when COVID-19 hit it just got delayed.

We kept thinking, 'People have to go to Columbus, Cleveland, or out of state for a big convention. Why don't we put one on here in Wooster in the event center on the fairgrounds?""

Lehman broke into the collectibles business when he coowned Grand Slam Collectibles in Orrville with his dad. Larry Lehman, who passed away in 2021.

The Pop Culture Convention is a major undertaking, with lots of space and something of interest for just about everyone.

"Just like with our stores, we aren't doing just one category,' Lehman said. "We kind of hit on everything from the toys, the cards, cosplay, autographs and the gaming.

Lehman will set up "Autograph Row" where fans can meet the stars in attendance and pay to get autographs. Fans can bring their own items to get autographed, or purchase things like bats, balls or pictures at the show to get signed.

The collectibles industry is as popular as ever coming off of the pandemic.

"As we get into our 40s and 50s or older, it's fun reminiscing about what we had - or missed - growing up," Lehman said. "We saw a huge need or upswing in the interest in that stuff during COVID.

"It was really important that we were open as much as we could. There were a lot of mental health issues and people wanted to come in and buy something and escape all that in Operation: Fandom and the record store, too."

Holding a pop culture convention is a way to expand on the popularity of Lehman's stores, while also giving a wide variety of vendors the chance to display their collections locally for sale or possible trades.

'We want to bring more fun and that kind of joy to the area,' Lehman said. "It takes people back to a simpler time, good memories with their parents or something with friends.

There's no better time to bring Smalls, Squints and Ya-Ya to Wooster. This year marks three decades since the release of the iconic coming of age sports movie about a group of boys growing up

'They played The Sandlot at egories and bringing it to Wooster, my junior prom in 1993," Lehman said. "We've been playing it all month long in our stores.

'People tie in good memories with some of the characters or movies they grew up with, like Star Wars and The Sandlot.'

The Sandlot is a true family movie, which anyone from kids to grandparents enjoy watching, Lehman said.

"Most boys at some point were ornery, got into things or lost things and we all know the trouble you can get in," he said. "The Sandlot really portrays that and it's a fun throwback (to the early 1960s) with great characters.

# **Amstutz presents the State of County Government**

In an overview of Wayne County and Wooster, Wayne County Commissioner Ron Amstutz said, "we have been riding a very high wave of economic success compared to the rest of our nation. Our county's method — the collaborative approach — of promoting its thriving economy was chosen decades ago.'

Amstutz gives a significant slice of the credit to the Wayne Economic Development Council (WEDC) for its contribution to its success. But, one area where Amstutz sees an opportunity is in the agricultural sector.

"We have been leaking prime farmland," he said. "In the past five years, we have lost 20,000 acres to development.'

Amstutz acknowledged that there is tension between farmland preservation and the need to accommodate residential and commercial growth by providing areas where they each can flourish

"This is a work in progress," he said. "We have to see how the market adapts."

One of the tools the county is employing to preserve farmland is the use of

going before the voters of Wayne County.

Amstutz, who delivered the 2023 State of County Government address during a meeting of the Wooster Rotary, focused much of his presentation on the commissioner's priority projects and roles.

He outlined the work that the commissioners conduct with the 13 other

Amstutz also outlined the offices, departments, and agencies that report to the commissioners. They include:

Amstutz discussed the formation of a Transportation Improvement District (TID), including an example of successfully attracting grant funding to connect Daisy Way to Old Airport Road in Wooster.

Another way county government helps to strengthen the county is through the recently formed Wayne County Land Reutilization Corporation (WCLRC), with Commissioner Sue Smail serving as President and Commissioner Jon Hofstetter as a board member.

said Wayne County is on a remarkable roll. 'Out of 543 micropoli-

tan areas nationwide, we are number seven," he said. "That is something to celebrate."

While rankings are named by the largest city in the county, Amstutz clarified that the statistics used by Policom to measure and rank micropolitan areas are taken from the entire county.

Financially, county government revenues have been performing well.

"The county sales tax rate, at three-quarters of one percent, is one of the lowest in the state. Only four or five other counties have a tax rate that low," he said.

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# JFS offers new hire, employee retention programs

By Dan Starcher The Wayne County Department of Job and Family Services, in conjunction with OhioMeans-Jobs, offers two programs to local employers to help them hire qualified employees as well as retain experienced workers.

"We are doing two things," said Workforce Program Administrator Bob Young. "First, we are helping employers build a workforce. Secondly, we are helping them further enhance existing workers' skills. This is a win-win situation for the worker and the employee."

Young and his co-workers have two programs at their disposal to help strengthen the local workforce.

#### The OJT program

The On-the-Job Training (OJT) program is a federally funded program that reimburses employers up

new employees.

"We will do everything we can to help the employee and employer lessen the financial burden of training in order to become employed," Young said. "It provides workers with a handsome salary and a credential that can be taken anywhere upon completion. It is a college alternative.'

The goal of the OJT program is to place participants into in-demand occupations that will ultimately enhance their marketability for long-term employment. The program has a number of benefits for employers as well. They include:

-The employer maintains hiring decisions.

-Hands-on training directed by the employer to meet their specific needs.

-An investment of up to \$13,000 per eligible employee.

-Minimal paperwork; fast turnaround time

-Monthly reimburse up to \$13,000 to hire and train to 50 percent of the trainees'

Getting the OJT program implemented consists of only four steps. They are: 1. Register your busi-

completes the training, a business can expect to see increases in productivity, quality, efficiency, retention, and growth, while an employee can expect to earn a higher wage.

The IWT program

Training (IWT) program or phone at 330-264-5060. allows employers to retain experienced and valuable workers.

According to Employment Specialist Mallorie Crank, there are ways to help an individual with virtually any career path they choose.

"We can help with reimbursements for long-time employees," she said. "We also help long-time employees enhance their skills through training.'

According to Crank, this is beneficial to businesses that prefer to develop their workforce and promote from within.

Together, these programs offer extraordinary opportunities to those looking to embark on a career and to those that have valuable experience.

# WEDC focusing in on new strategies, partnerships

According to Lynn Moomaw, who has been an advisory council and Board member of the Wayne Economic Development Council (WEDC), "Many people when they think of economic development, they think first of manufacturing.

"But here in Wayne County," Moomaw continued, "it's an agriculture, food processing, health care and manufacturing balance. I think it's because of that balance that we've thrived for years."

The community likely has many preconceptions about what economic development is. Chances are, economic development is more collaborative and requires more long-term planning than most realize.

For this reason, Maribeth Burns, WEDC President, has spent 2023 reinvesting in relationships. Burns has already met with 90 Wayne County-based businesses and organizations to listen and learn, and to share about WEDC's newly launched strategic plan.

"It's been a great learning experience and an opportunity to sit down and ask, what issues have you been having and how can we help? For instance, with staffing issues, can we help them market open positions?" Burns said. "It's a really a good opportunity to meet people and see in person what our diversified economy looks like," she added. "We've met with a lot of businesses who didn't know what we do." Burns and WEDC's Mar-

keting and Development Coordinator, Traci Carmony, work together to provide resources to businesses. While these resources are customized to unique business needs, they do see some common issues. For instance, when one company does something unique to attract employees, they can share those successes. They often help with wage or benefits comparison information.

Plus, Burns and Carmony will identify trends and use them to inform a future business roundtable designed to help solve problems. And they can help businesses think about longer-term planning as well as incentives for expansion.

"One thing that always sticks in my mind is how long-term investment and long-term planning is so important," said Moomaw, who also serves as Director of Operations at the Wayne County Schools Career Center. "I remember being at a WEDC planning meeting when we got the news that Rubbermaid was leaving.

And now all these years later because of the partnerships in Wayne County, Gojo has filled that space. That longterm commitment is important."

Burns is also acutely aware that WEDC needs to focus on issues like quality of life and housing for businesses to retain their workforce.

One of the key strategies in the updated WEDC strategic plan is to advance a focused set of key issues that drive Wayne County's competitiveness. A top issue in this strategy is access to housing.

"We plan to complete a county-wide housing assessment. We know there are pockets of Wayne County that are more urgent. With changing demographics, we need a comprehensive assessment," said Burns.

Further, the timing is right

Adam Briggs believes that WEDC truly fills a niche in the way that they are able to collaborate, facilitate, and unify across organizations and jurisdictions.

"Through my experience over the years, I've watched WEDC bring parties together to accomplish a common goal and be the entity that crosses multiple sectors- multiple cities, counties, townships, and state government," said Briggs.

"Maribeth has brought a high level of leadership experience and she's done an outstanding job."

#### Looking forward

WEDC continues to support community projects like the Shreve Community Reinvestment Area (CRA).

"When the Shreve Community Development Corporation looked at incentives for business and home development in our area, the WEDC helped us identify the use of a CRA," said Chuck Visocky, a Shreve business owner who is also involved in Shreve's development corporation. "A CRA allows investment into homes and businesses minimizing tax impact on the improvement for a period of time. Creating an easier path to invest in Shreve is one strategy that we are using to refresh our quaint community."

"The legislation to establish the CRA was approved by Village Council in late November. The application was sent to the State of Ohio and should receive final approval by the end of April – depending on their review timing," said Carmony.

With 66% of WEDC investors with the private sector and 33% of the budget coming from public dollars, more work is needed to reach the campaign target of \$3.7 million to be able to fund crucial economic development programs for Wayne County for the next 4 years. 



# The significance of some of Easter's many symbols

Easter Sunday, on April 9 this year, is a day when Christians across the globe celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. There are approximately 2.4 billion Christians across the globe, which accounts for nearly one-third of the global population.

Though certain Christians groups do not celebrate Easter, many consider it the holiest day of the year. Given that significance, it's no surprise Easter is steeped in symbolism. The following are some of the many symbols of Easter and what they represent to faithful Christians across the globe.

.In Lovin

#### Eggs

Eggs might now be more instantly associated with Easter egg hunts for children, but the American Bible Society notes that eggs are symbolic of more than just fun for kids. Eggs represent the new life that's symbolic of spring, which is when Easter occurs in the northern hemisphere. Christians view eggs as a reminder of the resurrection of Jesus. Interestingly, though colored eggs are often seen as a fun Easter activity for kids, the ABS notes that the tradition dates back to the early days of Christianity, when redcolored eggs were used to

represent the resurrection. **Crucifix** 


The crucifix, which is a distinct representation of a cross with Jesus Christ on it, is symbolic of the crucifixion and subsequent resurrection of Jesus. The ABS notes that the resurrection of Jesus symbolizes his victory over the power of sin and death.

#### The Lamb

Jesus is referred to in the Bible as the "Lamb of God" (Revelation 5:6-14), so the lamb is another important Easter symbol for Christians. In addition, in John (1:29), Jesus is referred to by John the Baptist as the "Lamb of God who takes

# away the sin of the world." **Easter Bunny**

Another symbol, like Easter eggs, that people could be forgiven for mistaking as purely secular, the Easter Bunny is not entirely separate from the spiritual meaning of the holiday. 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Easter is celebrated across the globe. Those celebrations feature many significant religious symbols that have withstood the test of time.

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

# Strict new requirement for voter ID to begin on April 4

Ohio's election laws have been changed under House Bill 458, signed Jan. 6 by Gov. Mike DeWine.

These changes will begin Tuesday, April 4, which is the first day of early voting for the May 2 special election.

The Ohio secretary of state issued Directive 2023-03 on Feb. 7, instructing Ohio's 88 county boards of elections to immediately begin implementing the reforms required under HB 458. This directive guarantees the changes made by HB 458 are uniformly implemented across all county boards of elections throughout the entirety of the early voting period and on election day.

Notable changes beginning in the May 2 election and contained within the early voting period include the following:

-Requiring unexpired photo identification for voting at the polls and during early voting. The new law removes certain types of previously acceptable IDs (utility bills, bank statements, government checks, paychecks, et cetera) and adds new forms of photo ID that are acceptable.

The following will now be the only types of ID a voter may use to vote at the polls and during early voting at the BOE office: an Ohio driver's license or state ID card (a free state ID card can be obtained from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles beginning April 7) or interim ID form issued by the BMV, U.S. passport or passport card, or a U.S. military ID card, Ohio National Guard ID card or U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs ID card.

-Extending voting hours the week before election day and eliminating early voting the day before election day.

—Moving the absentee ballot request deadline back to ensure voters get their ballot in time to return it to the board of elections by the deadline.

— Allowing any 17-year-old to serve as a poll worker.

Only persons with a physical disability may vote in their vehicle or at the door of their polling place with the assistance of a bipartisan team of election officials. Election officials must not challenge a voter's attestation he/she has a disability.

# **Clark is switching schools — and switching sports**

West Holmes graduate Noah Clark realized this spring that home is where his heart is.

And, that football is his true love when it comes to athletics.

With those factors in mind, Clark was thrilled to announce on March 27 that he's transferring from Marietta College, where he was a pitcher on the baseball team, to The College of Wooster to play football.

The Fighting Scots graduated four-year starter Mateo Renteria and Clark will compete to take over right away as the quarterback. The 5-foot-11, 190-pounder will have four years of eligibility.

"I just really missed the culture of playing on a football team," Clark said. "It's completely different.

"Pitching is fun, but I missed playing quarterback. It's going to be awesome playing for The College of Wooster. (Head) Coach (Frank) Colaprete and (assis-

Although Clark said he enjoyed being a part of the Marietta baseball team, he also missed his family.

"I was dealing with some arm issues from going about a year straight throwing the baseball without stopping and I missed being at home and seeing my family," said

Clark, a 2022 West Holmes graduate, who was a firstteam All-Ohio quarterback after leading the best team in school history to a 14-1 record and the Div. III Final Four in 2021. "I've always been a rival of Wooster so it's gonna be kind of different wearing it on my chest. But being able to come back home, play in front of my family, friends and people who have supported me my entire life, is just gonna mean everything to me."

Colaprete and Dennis recruited Clark while he was in high school, but understood when he chose to pursue baseball.

Clark was the Ohio Cardinal Conference co-Pitcher of the Year in 2022 after going 7-4 with a 0.64 ERA, 80 strikeouts and 33 walks in 65<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> innings pitched. At this point, Clark is just planning to play football at Wooster.

'After baseball practice one day, I called up coach Dennis and asked if there would still be an opportunity

Clark's skillset is comparable to Gary Muntean, who passed for 8,295 career yards from 2014-17 and ranks second behind Renteria (10,083) in the Scots' all-time record book, Colaprete said.

"Noah reminds me of Gary, both having strong baseball backgrounds, Colaprete said. "Noah has a strong arm, he's accurate and knows how to read coverages. We've had a winning tradition here, but Noah has the potential to put us over the top to be a championship team.

Despite the extremely high praise for Clark, Colaprete insisted it will truly be an open competition for the quarterback job.

"Nothing has been promised to Noah and I'm sure he wouldn't want it any other way," Colaprete said. "We're excited to see what happens."

You might not know this, but bananas can be eaten at any stage of ripeness. There are 5 degrees of development for this fruit. Perfectly unblemished yellow bananas are sought after but each phase of a ripening banana has its redeeming properties

The underripe, green bananas are hard and have a very distinctive flavor; they are a great source of prebiotics needed for digestive health. Barely ripe bananas are high in fiber and lower in sugar than the following stages. A ripe banana is golden yellow with a few brown spots; it provides high antioxidant levels with
