County receiving more disaster relief aid

the June 2022 derecho storms continues to be distributed throughout the regions hardest hit by the derecho along with other severe storms around that time

Ohio Emergency Management Agency executive director Sima Merick recently announced the third round of reimbursements of more than \$850,000 from the State Disaster Relief Program (SDRP) for areas statewide impacted by severe storms last year.

The SDRP is a reimbursement program that can be used in instances where storm damage amounts do not meet the threshold for federal assistance. The program is intended to provide supplemental state assistance to local governments and eligible non-profit orga-

Financial relief aid from nizations for costs associated with debris removal, emergency protective measures and permanent work.

In November, Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine authorized the use of the SDRP to help provide relief to several counties impacted by severe weather in February, May, June and July of 2022.

The SDRP is authorized for counties whose damages meet a countywide per capita indicator. DeWine's authorization allowing the use of the fund permits the Ohio EMA to request funding from the Ohio Controlling Board.

This storm was classified as a derecho with wind speeds estimated at 60 to 70 mph," Merick said. "The storm stretched across Ohio and was a primary cause for the sustained damage. The State Disaster

Fredericksburg Road closed as project begins

Ohio is known for its beautiful landscapes, thriving cities and charming small towns. It also is known for its extensive network of roads and highways that allow people to travel safely throughout the state.

They also require

constant maintenance and attention.

Fredericksburg Road County Road 501) in Franklin Township is receiving some of that attention through a safety improvement project requiring it to be closed for 21 days. The work will force the road's

closure just north of Moreland Road (County Road 77) to improve sight distance from the intersection. The project began June 26.

Brock Yoder, traffic safety supervisor, said the conditions at the intersection pose a risk to travelers.

"Fredericksburg Road

is a heavily traveled road for commercial trucks going to Holmes County,' he said. "Moreland Road has a lot of Amish buggies and bicycles, and that combination makes this intersection very dangerous. Lowering the hill crest to the north will be a great safety improvement.'

Yoder is grateful the project is finally underway.

'This intersection has been on my priority list for improvement," Yoder said. "We are thankful for the commissioners working with our office in conjunction with the Franklin Township trustees. Feikert Sand and Gravel, and Melway Paving to get this done before Fredericksburg Road gets repaved later this summer."

Ohio's roads are essential for commerce, transportation and tourism. However, they also can be dangerous if not properly maintained and improved.

Wayne County engineer Scott Miller knows the importance residents place on roads and roadway safety. When he discovers an unsafe area, he works to

acquire funding from the state to resolve the issue.

"This particular project is special because of the involvement of a company in the general area of the concern, and Feikert Sand and Gravel offered to assist the county in fixing a dangerous intersection," Miller said.

It is Miller's responsibility to determine which projects in the county take priority. He oversees 500 miles of road and 489 bridges and must decide which ones are in the greatest need of repair.

'Our office routinely identifies and develops plans to resolve safety issues and concerns every year based upon accident data, increased traffic and other factors," Miller said. "It is sometimes a very difficult balance to decide upon a safety improvement versus a road or bridge rebuild."

Investing in road repairs and maintenance and implementing safety measures in high-risk areas can reduce the number of accidents and fatalities on Ohio's roads.

"Unfortunately, due to

construction schedules, we were unable to avoid the closure over the Fourth of July holiday, but detour routes will be posted," Miller said. Rebuilt Miller Field blends baseball, past and present

Wooster's strong baseball tradition past and present came together for two special field dedications at the Miller Field complex, located at the corner of East Highland and Portage Road, on June 20.

And all indications are the Wooster Youth Baseball program will remain strong for many decades to come.

The former North Miller Field was renamed Jones Field, and South Miller Field was renamed Schaeffler Field. The Ralph R. and Grace B. Jones Foundation and Schaeffler Group USA Inc. both made \$100,000 donations to act as lead donors as \$470,000 was raised for the Miller Field capital improvement project.

'This project is the result of support from area businesses and local supporters with no government funding of any kind," Brian Ritchie, the WYB president from 2015-22, said to a crowd of around 100 people who gathered for the ceremony before Coach Pitch playoff games were held. "We've been really lucky to have some great

partners, like Schaeffler Group USA Inc. and The Ralph R. and Grace B. Jones Foundation, the Donald and Alice Noble Foundation and many, many others over the years, who've helped get us to

where we are. Thank you for the support that you've given us."

Current WYB President Tom Montelione and Ritchie also thanked a long list of current and former WYB board members for their roles in the project and pro-

It's important to note the entire complex will still be called Miller Field, in honor of the family that developed and donated the land in

"The thing about this place is that Miller Field is more of a community building event," Ritchie said. "Any time you come down here, you'll see parents, grandparents, cousins, siblings and neighbors, all coming to watch that little kid get his first hit or that really cool play that they make in the field for the first time.

"Without those other surrounding people, we wouldn't have as big of crowds as we do on a nightly basis. We really appreciate all the family members who support these young boys and girls that are out here playing on the fields."

Major improvements hadn't been made at Miller Field since the mid-1990s, which led to the WYB board kicking off what was announced as a \$1.5 million capital improvement project in 2017.

Although WYB hasn't been able to reach its fundraising goal, many of its capital improvement objectives have still been realized.

Ritchie detailed the many improvements to the crowd.

-Schaeffler and Jones Field were both repositioned as brandnew ball diamonds with modern drainage systems.

'We wanted to make sure that when we have Ohio weather in the spring, these coaches and these adults don't have to spend many hours looking at puddles and working on the fields," Ritchie said. "For those of you that have been volunteers here with brooms and shovels, you know what I'm talking about. This will help us get the fields playable much faster."

-Many safety issues also have heroism. been improved, ranging from going to all-dirt infields to eliminate the "Miller Field hop" off of the previous uneven grass infields to installing new dugouts and fences on Schaeffler, Jones and Denton Fuller fields.

"That's all cleaned up now to make sure that these kids have a safe environment to play at," Ritchie said. "Finally, we reshaped these diamonds so they're now all official-size fields, which means Wooster can now be a site that hosts official Little League tournaments or other sanctioned tournaments.

-Two new storage sheds were constructed.

The next phase of the project the WYB board is working on is to construct a new concession stand.

Miller family legacy

Among the dozens of people who were thanked by Ritchie and Montelione were Ralph "Pete" Miller, Mady (Miller) Noble and Jay Rumbaugh, who was married to the late Susie (Miller).

Arthur Miller, who donated the ball fields that are still used 65 years later, was the grandfather of Susie, Mady and Pete.

Without the Miller family, Wooster baseball wouldn't have been the same," Ritchie said. "We've had many generations who have learned the game here."

Arthur Miller donated the fields in honor of his late son William Franklin Miller, who died at age 35 in 1954 in an attempt to save a co-worker's life after a mining accident.

Mady Noble, a retired Wooster teacher, was 11 when her uncle Bill passed away. Older sister Susie was 14, and Pete was 4.

"I loved my uncle Bill very much," Noble said. "This is very special to be here (for the field dedications) because our grandfather Arthur Miller was very generous to donate this land. I think my grandpa and dad had broken hearts for the rest of their lives over what happened to Bill."

Out of the Miller family's tragedy rose a beloved baseball complex that has positively impacted thousands of kids and families for more than six decades.

That was something to cheer proudly for as the Miller family representatives, Schaeffler's Chris Shamie and Jones Foundation representative Doug Drushal, himself a Miller Field player in the 1960s, threw out first pitches.

"The COVID pandemic was tough for WYB, but we're back close to having 300 kids in the program from Coach Pitch through majors," Montelione said. "Thank you to all of our sponsors, donors, volunteers, players and their families. This is a special night for Wooster Youth Baseball."

CAW/M Summer Crisis Program starting on July 1

The Ohio Department of Development and Community Action Wayne/ Medina will help incomeeligible Ohioans stay cool during the hot summer months. The Home Energy **Assistance Summer Crisis** Program provides eligible Ohioans assistance paying an electric bill or assistance paying for central airconditioning repairs. The program will run from July 1 through Sept. 30.

To apply for the program, clients are required to schedule an appointment with Community Action Wavne/Medina. Appointments can be scheduled by calling 330-461-9333 or by visiting https://app.capappointments.com/.

Clients need to bring copies of the following documents to their appoint-

—Copies of their most recent energy bills.

-A list of all household members and proof of income for the last 30



days or 12 months for each member.

-Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.

-Proof of disability if applicable.

– Physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health if there isn't a household member over the age of 60.

The Summer Crisis Program assists low-income households with an older household member who can provide physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for their health, have a disconnect notice, have been shut off, are trying to establish new

service on their electric bill or require air-conditioning. Conditions can include such things as lung disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease or asthma.

Eligible households can receive up to \$500 if they are a customer of a regulated utility or \$800 if they are a customer of unregulated utilities such as electric cooperatives and municipal utilities. The assistance is applied to their utility bill, to purchase an air-conditioning unit or fan, or to pay for central air-conditioning repairs. Ohioans must have a gross income at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines to qualify for assistance. For a family of four, the annual income must be at or below \$52,500.

Also, Ohioans enrolled in the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Plus program who meet the above criteria may be eligible for assis-

PIPP payment, first PIPP payment, central air-conditioning repairs, or may receive an air-conditioning unit and/or fan.

Brueck, volunteers love to teach 4-Hers at sewing camp

It's the joy on their faces. That's what keeps Marcia Brueck coming back each year to coordinate the Beginning Sewing Camp

for our 4-H program in Wayne County.

4-Hers model their garments on the last day of camp as she describes their across the room.

"The kids are just so special, and there is so much satisfaction in seeing how proud they are of what they've accomplished," said Brueck, who has been the camp's main instructor for most of the 20 years it's been in existence

Brueck is retired from our Ohio State University Wayne County Extension and currently serves as the Wayne County Junior Fair

Recently, she and nine volunteers helped seven 4-Hers complete the threeday camp at Fisher Auditorium on the OSU Wooster



She loves watching the campus. Each camper was paired with an experienced sewer who helped the 4-Her complete her Sew outfits during their walk Fun project from a list of recommended patterns. The campers could choose to make a skirt, shorts or lounging pants, all with an elastic waist.

Campers bring their materials and matching thread, then take home with them their finished project, a sewing kit provided by the camp and a pin cushion they make the first day.

The pin cushion helps them practice stitching straight and turning corners. They also learn how to hand stitch the cushion closed after stuffing it with wool provided by a local sheep producer. Brueck shared with the campers that the

lanolin in the wool keeps the pins smooth and shiny.

Before they sew the first stitch, Brueck instructs the group on sewing terminology, supplies and parts of the sewing machine. The campers get the feel of the sewing machine by sewing without thread on paper and following different lined

On day two she talks about fabric and pattern markings. "Then I turn them loose with their helpers," she said. "They go to work laying out their material with their patterns. They cut out their patterns and work on getting their garments constructed.'

Normally, the campers are age 13-14, but this year an older 4-Her decided to give sewing a try.

'That's the first time a 17-year-old was willing to come among the little ones and learn," Brueck said. She was so enthused about the experience, Brueck said, she got several hugs

The Sewing Camp was modeled after a similar one in a neighboring county, Brueck said. The first one took place at Dorothy Lackman's Sewing Center in Apple Creek before it moved to a larger room in Fisher Auditorium.

Brueck said she does not assign herself to a camper so she can be free to roam

and troubleshoot. During the pandemic she conducted the Sewing Camp over Zoom and provided videos of the teaching she normally does in the classroom. "We did the same topics we would have done if we had been face to face," she said.

While it's a busy three days of camp, sometimes the project member has some work to do at home when camp is over.

"We have had kids do the mini style show on the last day with hems pinned up because they weren't able to get it all done,' Brueck said.

Some campers have gone on to make sewing a career or a hobby.

And that adds to the joy for Brueck.

"I love to teach kids," she said. "I love to be able to perpetuate the skill of sewing. If one of those kids goes on to pursue sewing even as a hobby — it's worthwhile."

A few thoughts from the week in sports ...

The Cleveland Guardians will hit the midway point of the season this week, and I still can't figure out if they're contenders or pretenders in the AL Central.

Cleveland had a 37-40 record after dropping two of three games in a weekend series against the Brewers. The Guardians would be last in the AL East but were just 1.5 games behind the Central leading Twins heading into a three-game series at lowly Kansas City.

Hopes were high coming off a 2022 season in which Cleveland posted a 92-70 record, beat the Rays in the AL Wild Card Series and then fell in the ALDS Series 3-2 to the Yankees

Cleveland has been just good enough to give fans hopes they can return to the playoffs, but if you've followed the Guards closely, you know the season could go south in a hurry. There are lots of problems.

Ace Shane Bieber has been running out of gas late in games recently and is the subject of lots of rumors with the trade deadline on Aug. 1. How can Cleveland afford to trade Bieber, though, with No. 2 starter Triston McKenzie sidelined for the second time this year with an injury and inconsistent veterans and rookies making up the rest of a patchwork rotation?

I'm a big fan of Jose Ramirez (.293, 12 HR, 46 RBI) and Josh Naylor (.291, 10, 57), but after those two sluggers, the rest of the lineup has been average at best.

Offseason acquisition Josh Bell (.230, 7, 32) takes as big a cut as anyone in baseball and nearly hit a ball out of the stadium against the A's but has really lacked consistency.

The defense hasn't been as good, and the stolen base numbers are down from a

Entering the Royals series, Cleveland was last out of 30 MLB teams in home runs with just 50. The Guards did up their team batting average to .247 (17th).

to call up outfielder Oscar Gonzalez from AAA Columbus soon to help jumpstart the offense. He hit a walk-off home run in the 15th inning to beat the Rays in the Wild Card Series and even had a two-run single in the ninth to beat the Yankees in game four of the ALDS.


