Jan. 15 MLK service includes essay winners

The Wooster-Orrville NAACP is sponsoring a community celebration service honoring the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King on Monday, Jan. 15 at 7 p.m. at First Presbyterian Church, 621 College Ave., Wooster. The winners of the Dr. Martin Luther King Essay Contest for first grade through 12th grade will be introduced and presented with their awards at the service.

Dr. Ric S. Sheffield, the keynote speaker for this event, is a native of Knox County and professor emeritus at Kenyon College. Throughout his academic career, he has examined the history and experience of African Americans in rural Ohio, drawing on his growing up years in Mt. Vernon. His topic at the King event

will focus on rural diversity and building bridges among residents of different races and backgrounds. His recent book, "We Got By: A Black Family's Journey in the Heartland," examines his own family history in the context of mostly white rural Ohio.

Earlier in the day from 2-3 p.m., Sheffield will sign copies of his book, which also will be available for purchase, at The College of Wooster's Andrews/Gault Library in the CoRE's Cube, hosted by librarian Mark Gooch.

Other events on Jan. 15 include a Dr. Martin Luther King Day of Service at the Wayne County Public Library Children's Department from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Co-hosts are the Wooster-

Orrville NAACP and the Wayne Center for the Arts. Among the different activities offered, children will have the opportunity to decorate a quilt block for a blanket that will be donated to a local shelter.

The College of Wooster's Dr. Martin Luther King celebration will focus on "Reframing Justice" with events planned for Jan. 15, 16 and 18. Leading up to Jan. 15, college students are collecting items for care packages that will be distributed to local social service agencies. All these events commemorating the life and work of Dr. Martin Luther King are open to the public.

Dog license registration ends Jan. 31

The Ohio Revised Code requires dogs over 3 months old be licensed. Failure to comply with licensing regulations can result in fines of up to \$250 and imprisonment for not more than 30 days.

Auditor Jarra Underwood and Katelyn Lehman,

Wayne County dog warden and dog shelter director, have teamed up with the online platform Docupet to make getting a dog license easy.

"It is important that dog owners register their pets, and we have made it extremely convenient to purchase dog licenses," Diana Ogden of the Wayne

County Auditor's Office said. "Dog owners can visit <https://waynecounty.docupet.com> and register online or in person Monday through Friday at the Wayne County Auditor's Office at 428 W. Liberty St. If the dog shelter at 5694 Burbank Road is more convenient, it is open Tuesday through Saturday for licensing."

Beyond avoiding repercussions, there are several reasons why registering

for a dog license is essential. First, it helps establish proof of ownership that can help resolve any disputes or issues. Secondly, registered dogs have a better chance of being returned to their owners if they become lost.

While licensing may seem like a mundane task, the importance and peace of mind behind it cannot be overstated.

Marion, Hofstetter named to NEFCO Board of Directors

The Northeast Ohio Four County Regional Planning and Development Organization works with local governments, businesses and residents to create a comprehensive regional plan, and its mission is to improve the region's quality of life through collaboration.

Richard Regula, NEFCO General Policy Board chair, recently announced two local leaders — City of Wooster planning and zoning manager Vince Marion and Wayne County commissioner Jonathan Hofstetter — will serve as officers on the board of directors.

Marion will serve as chair, and Hofstetter will serve as first vice chair.

"I look forward to serving NEFCO and working with its members and staff to advance smart economic development and land-use planning," Marion said.

NEFCO was formed in 1974 as a council of governments serving Portage, Stark, Summit and Wayne counties to provide a forum to discuss the region's problems and develop strategies to tackle them.

"This is an excellent opportunity to work with Vince and other NEFCO board members to help maintain a thriving region for all of our residents," Hofstetter said. "One of the strengths of NEFCO is its ability to facilitate collaboration and coordination among different entities to foster economic growth and promote environmental stewardship."

NEFCO also is the designated water quality planning agency for the four-county region. It is partially funded through grants from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the U.S. EPA, among other sources. As a U.S. Department of Commerce

Economic Development Administration district, the agency coordinates planning within the member counties.

The agency also acts as an information clearinghouse for socio-economic data and most types of planning.

Student-run Grass Roots Café a delicious eating experience

Among the array of area restaurants lies a hidden gem tucked away inside a school. The Grass Roots Café has long been operated by the culinary arts program of the Wayne County Schools Career Center.

The full-service restaurant offers an abundance of menu options at reasonable prices. For breakfast patrons might order a custom omelet or tailor their meal at the buffet. Lunchtime selections include salads, soups, sandwiches, pasta dishes, pizza and another buffet. Beverages include teas, coffees including cappuccinos and fruit smoothies. Guests also are enticed with a selection of dessert items.

All this is accomplished by the career center students, who work closely with professional chefs learning to plan and prepare menu items, create gourmet foods and baked goods and artistically

present them, and operate the restaurant.

Along the way they learn food safety, kitchen/workplace safety, knife skills, culinary and food service history, culinary math/measurements, cooking methods, baking and pastry arts fundamentals, and marketing.

Open from mid-January to mid-March, the restaurant's limited schedule allows for the students' extensive study of the art, as well as their regular curriculum. Students also provide catering and banquets throughout the academic year, both in-house and off-site.

It's a program where students like Hallie, a senior, get prepared for just about anything they might face in the future. "We each have many responsibilities, and I have learned a lot from working both in the front and the back of the house," she said.

Although Shirley Alexander of Wooster only recently dis-

covered the Grass Roots Café, it has become one of her favorite dining destinations. "The food is delicious," she said. "It's a lovely place, and the students do a wonderful job operating it."

Her companion Finis Buck of Wooster agreed. "Very impressive, and the prices are amazingly affordable," Buck said.

The restaurant also offers a take-and-bake option, with various frozen entrees ready for pick-up to be reheated or cooked at home. Also available are whole cakes and pies, baked and ready for at-home thawing.

Following the two-year program for high school juniors and seniors, graduates are poised for further education or for such chef roles as executive, garde manger, saucier, pastry or sous. Or they may apply their education to professions such as restaurant manager, host, line cook, baker, caterer or health inspector.

After graduation Hallie plans to major in dietetics at Ashland University, with the hope of becoming a registered dietitian at a hospital, while junior Gianna has different plans. "I will be furthering my culinary arts education, then hopefully soon be working in a restaurant."

The 19-25 students in the program come away with credentials such as certifications, internships and scholarships. Students also belong to SkillsUSA, a partnership of students, teachers and industry working to ensure America has a skilled workforce. The organization also provides students with opportunities for

competition, leadership and community service.

All this happens under the watchful eye of chef Peter Kerling, now in his sixth year as culinary arts instructor. "I decided in my first year of high school that I wanted to be a chef," Kerling said. "So I studied culinary arts at the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center while working at McDonald's and Pizza Hut."

After graduation Kerling, a Broadview Heights native, attended Pennsylvania Culinary, where he obtained his degree in culinary arts. Following an externship at a Fripp Island, South Carolina restaurant, he returned to Cleveland and landed a position at Hyde Park Prime Steakhouse. Having worked his way up to kitchen manager there, he went on to serve as sous chef at XO Prime Steaks in Cleveland's Warehouse District, where he helped rebrand the restaurant from modern American cuisine to a prime steakhouse. His next role was co-head chef at Osteria Italian Restaurant. Then he saw an ad for a culinary instructor in Smithville.

"I jumped at the opportunity," Kerling said. "After 22 years in the business, I realized that educating guests and training employees had become my passion."

Kerling also is responsible for the name of the restaurant. "In thinking about what I see from my students day one versus graduation versus their future careers," he said, "I realized that what we're providing is fertile soil for the development of strong foundational roots for successful careers."

Hence, the name was changed from Heritage Room to Grass Roots Café.

Lorraine, a senior, strives to

make sure customers get great service. "I always hope they leave happy and satisfied," she said.

Gianna also takes satisfaction in the results of her work. "In everything we do," she said, "we try to leave a good impression in terms of food, service and hospitality."

The Grass Roots Café is located in the Wayne County Schools Career Center at 518 W. Prospect St., Smithville. Open for breakfast and lunch Wednesday through Friday from 9:15 a.m. to 1:15 p.m., the restaurant accepts cash and checks — no credit or debit cards. While not necessary for smaller parties, reservations for eight or more are suggested and may be made by calling 330-669-7000 ext. 6200 or via the event request form at <https://sites.google.com/wccsc.net/culinary-arts/wccsc/home?authuser=0>.

Kiel to present CLHS program on JFK assassination

On Saturday, Jan. 20, the County Line Historical Society of Wayne/Holmes will host Andy Kiel of Wooster for a program regarding his research on assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The program will take place at 1 p.m. at Shreve Presbyterian Church, 343 N. Market St., Shreve. The public is welcome, and admission is free.

Kiel is a graduate of Culver-Stockton College with a master's degree in U.S. history from the University of Akron. He taught in Wooster City Schools for 25 years, taught U.S. history at

University of Akron, taught International Baccalaureate Business and Economics at the American International School and served as director of the Tri-County International Baccalaureate program.

He has conducted research at the National Archives, the JFK Library, Lyndon B. Johnson Ranch, Dealey Plaza and Wright Patterson Air Force Museum. He completed his master's thesis on J. Edgar Hoover and published his book, "J. Edgar Hoover - The Father of the Cold War; How His Obsession with Communism Led to the

Warren Commission Cover Up and Escalation of the Vietnam War."

On the afternoon of JFK's murder, Hoover's agents were sent to Dallas and took control of the evidence from the Dallas police, and Hoover called Robert Kennedy and said he thought they had the man who killed his brother. Assistant Director William Sullivan and Warren Commission Chief Counsel J. Lee Rankin were both on record in reporting that Hoover and the FBI never formed a conclusion this quickly and this was highly unusual.

The Secret Service under the orders of Lyndon Johnson took control of the clothing of both JFK and Texas Gov. John Connally, who was wounded in the shooting; JFK's limo; and the X-rays and the autopsy itself. They also were responsible for the planning of the Texas trip — JFK and his wife were to stay at LBJ's ranch the night of the assassination.

Kiel leaves you to do your own research and draw your own conclusions regarding the circumstances and historical facts surrounding Kennedy's assassination.

Ohio House hunt and fish amendment passes committee

The Ohio House of Representatives Energy and Natural Resource Committee passed legislation to send a proposed constitutional amendment to voters that would enshrine Ohio's right to hunt and fish for

generations.

"Anti-hunting forces are pushing a radical agenda to ban fishing and hunting as we know it, and today Ohio took another step forward in fighting back," T. Roosevelt Action Executive

Director Luke Hilgemann said. "Hunters and anglers in Ohio want to protect their sporting heritage. This constitutional amendment is the best way to do it. T. Roosevelt Action will continue to advocate for our way of life

and protect these cherished outdoor traditions for the next generation.

"I thank chairman Kick for holding the vote today. T. Roosevelt Action will continue to work with House leadership to get a

floor vote scheduled as soon as possible."

HJR 5, which passed the committee 6-4, will now move to consideration for a floor vote by Ohio House of Representatives before moving to the Senate. Once

passed by the legislature, the measure would go in front of Ohio's voters during the 2024 election.

T. Roosevelt Action's efforts in Ohio follow

Volunteer guardians much-needed, rewarding opportunity

If you're looking for a way to give back in this new year, there is a great opportunity to do so by volunteering as a guardian through the Wayne County Volunteer Guardianship Association.

Sometimes people misconstrue this organization as being one concerned with guardianships for minors under the age of 18. However, the Volunteer Guardianship Association deals with guardians for adults who have been deemed incompetent.

Sometimes the definition

of incompetence includes adults with dementia, but it also includes individuals who have developmental delays or who have severe mental issues. There is a need for a volunteer guardian when a person who has been deemed incompetent does not have family or supportive others qualified to serve as a guardian. When that situation arises, the probate court can appoint a volunteer who has been background checked, screened and trained to step in and provide this service. All costs of the screening, training and application process are provided by the



organization.

The Wayne County Volunteer Guardianship Association was started in 2012 as a not-for-profit program that provides guardian of the person services to individuals who are residents of Wayne County and who are living in or in need of residential care. The WCVGA is governed by a board of directors that carries out its mission to provide guardianship services to the most vulnerable

adults in Wayne County.

What does a guardian do?

—A guardian visits the person for whom they serve as guardian, known as the ward.

—A guardian attends the ward's plan of care at the residential care center.

—A guardian helps determine services and care the ward might need.

—A guardian also is responsible for filing a few annual forms with the court to update the court on the ward's care.

—As a volunteer, the

guardian does not handle any of the ward's money.

Kelli Beckler, who is the incoming president of the WCVGA, became involved with the organization as a volunteer guardian at its inception in 2012.

"I am passionate about the development of the WCVGA because throughout my career in long-term residential nursing home care, I have seen firsthand the need for volunteer guardians on various occasions for the residents who do not have support persons," Beckler said.

Beckler was instrumental

in developing the organization's popular Iron Chef Fundraiser, which began in 2012 and ended during the pandemic. A new fundraising event is in the planning stages.

If you are someone who can ensure an adult who is elderly or suffering with mental illness or who has developmental disabilities has a caring, ethical and responsible advocate, call the WCVGA at 330-465-2444. OSU's Inwood gets grant for ag project

Shoshanah Inwood with the Ohio State University-OARDC in Wooster was awarded \$119,837 for the project, Whole Farm Planning for the 21st Century: Integrating Childcare, Healthcare and Health Insurance into Farm Planning Curriculum.

Using a train-the-trainer model, this project develops two farmer-ready whole farm curriculum modules on the topics of child care, healthcare and health insurance; trains a cohort of 10 educators to deliver curriculum; and trains 210 educators through webinars, conferences and online library, Inwood said.

Inwood's project has been named the 2023 Paula Ford Professional Development Program Proposal of the Year. From 1991-97, Dr. Ford served as the program coordinator for the Southern Region SARE program. She was the NCR-SARE professional development program coordinator at Kansas State University for 11 years (1999-2009) and supported sustainable agriculture and SARE for more than 20 years.

To honor Ford's contributions to NCR-SARE, the administrative council created the Paula Ford Professional Development Program Proposal of the Year award. Each year one professional development program-funded project in the North Central Region is given this special designation. The region selects the

project that best exemplifies Ford's contributions and passion for evaluation, professional development and/or science-based research.

This grant was awarded as part of NCR-SARE's 2023 Professional Development Program, which emphasizes training agricultural educators in extension, the Natural Resources Conservation Service, private and not-for-profit sectors, using farmers as educators, and addressing emerging issues in the farm community. NCR-SARE administers each of its grant programs, each with specific priorities, audiences and timelines. The focus for each of the NCR-SARE grant programs is on research and education.

Funding considerations are made based on how well the applicant articulates the nature of the research and education components of their sustainable agriculture grant proposals.

Holleran arrives in Wooster following nearly eight years at Penn State, where her tenure included 4 1/2 years as deputy athletic director for 31 sports programs, over 800 student-athletes and 325 employees. Among her chief duties, Holleran oversaw strategic plan implementation within the department and aligned it with Penn State's overall strategic plan. Additionally, Holleran developed onboarding and offboarding procedures for all department employees and was an integral part of creating Name Image Likeness education, policies and procedures.

"I am thrilled and grateful to become a part of the (Wooster) community,"

Holleran said. "I would like to express my sincere gratitude to President McCall and the entire search committee for extending this incredible opportunity to me. My experience as a Div. III student-athlete has instilled in me a profound appreciation for the value of a liberal arts education and the educational benefits that come from participating in athletics.

"It is an honor to join an institution with such a remarkable academic reputation and a strong history of successfully graduat-

ing student-athletes while excelling in sports."

Prior to becoming deputy athletic director at Penn State, Holleran provided executive leadership and oversight of human resources, compliance, risk management and conduct within athletics as senior associate athletic director.

Academics is Holleran's true passion, as it enables her to combine her love for education and leadership. She led the University of Minnesota's McNamara Academic Center for Student-Athletes for more than five years. As director, Holleran and her team developed a comprehensive academic support unit that provided academic counseling, student development and career advising to 750 student-athletes across 25 NCAA Div. I sports.

Under Holleran's leadership, academic success and graduation rates increased across the board. She developed a consistent set of

policies to effectively govern all unit operations with a primary focus on integrity, consistency, fairness and accountability, and the Academic Progress Rates scores improved to the best numbers in program history.

At Beloit, Holleran was a three-sport standout, earning four All-Midwest Conference honors as a center fielder, three all-conference laurels in basketball and was an all-state selection in soccer. Holleran was inducted into Beloit's Athletics Hall of Honor in 1997.

Citrus albedo is better than you may have thought

Urban legend has it as bitter and thus not good. That white stuff has a name — albedo — and believe it or not, it is an extremely healthy thing to eat.

Albedo is a very rich source of pectin. Pectin is primarily a helpful aid for GI function and blood sugar control. Pectin is a

soluble fiber. It also fights against the bad LDL cholesterol in the blood.

The white strings, separation membranes and core of the citrus fruit help the body absorb vitamin C easily. Thus, vitamin C from an actual citrus fruit is more efficiently absorbed from the fruit than juice.

The pithy albedo also counteracts the aging process of many cells. It is like a face-lift from the underside of the skin. Albedo freshness and radiance makes the skin glow.

The high fiber content of the white stuff aids in the feeling of fullness after eating citrus. Albedo also is rich in antioxidant power, useful for blood circulation. Research connects it

with antiseptic and anti-inflammatory effects to fight respiratory infections.

An easy way to peel an orange is to rinse it off first and then start with a sharp knife to cut the top and bottom of the peeling off. Score the rind, being careful not to cut into the actual

fruit. Using your fingers or a spoon, tear the scored rind away from the juicy fruit. Separate or cut with a knife.

Save time and gain the true benefits of the orange by leaving the white stuff on the orange. When splitting open a peeled orange, snatch the fuzzy albedo

post from the center and pop it into your mouth. If chewing on orange slices, include the albedo with each bite.

Purchasing citrus sections in a jar from the grocery store may seem like a luxury, but you are paying a lot of money for fewer health benefits. Studies reveal orange albedo is almost tasteless. Lemon pith is slightly sweet, but grapefruit pith is the most bitter.

Citrus fruits are not only a tasty treat, but also they support good health. You can have your orange and your albedo too.

its successful campaign in Florida to get the right to fish and hunt on the ballot in 2024. Nationwide, the organization is taking a proactive stance on engaging hunters and anglers about threats to their rights and urging them to enshrine those rights in their state constitutions.

pating in outdoor hunting activities in 2022.

—Hunting contributes \$1.3 billion annually to Ohio's economy and supports 15,500 jobs.

—American hunters contribute nearly \$9.4 million daily, adding more than \$3.4 billion annually for conservation.

—The amendment will provide legal protection against anti-hunting legislation and litigation in states previously lacking such safeguards.

—The amendment will protect those who rely on

hunting and fishing for sustenance, particularly the less fortunate, from unnecessary restrictions.

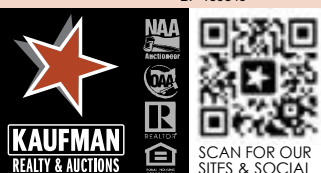

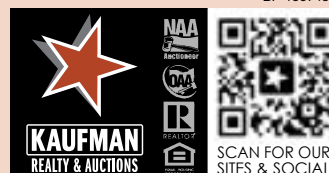

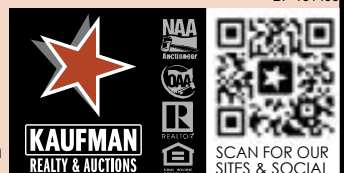
