

Fr. Tom's Corner

A TOTAL ECLIPSE A TOTAL EXPERIENCE

'And God said, "Let there be light....Genesis 1:3

Where were you on August 21st? At 10:20 in the morning?

Wherever you were, one of the greatest sights in the universe, the total eclipse of the sun was experienced by millions of people. God created this world with such precision that scientists knew the "exact" time of the eclipse would be 10:20 a.m. in Seattle. Many who came with their simple glasses, cereal box eclipse viewers were ready to see the spectacular two-minute show.

The Star Tribune commented that, "The stars came out in the middle of the day, zoo animals ran in agitated circles, crickets chirped, birds fell silent and a chilly darkness settled upon the land Monday as the U.S. witnessed its first full-blown, coast-to-coast solar eclipse since World War I." This is simply fantastic as we see the harmony of God's creation and how we are all connected.

Some people traveled thousands of miles to experience the eclipse. They brought binoculars, telescopes, etc. to see it. Many congregated at near by parks, hill tops, street corners, front yards or porches and looked up into space at the sun with their special glasses.

We all came with one purpose, to see and experience that God given scientific reality of the moon hiding the sun for a couple minutes! I was with Presbytera and Maria Sophia, my daughter, that day, waiting to see this anticipated event. Twenty minutes before the full eclipse, I noticed the temperature drop. The sunlight dimmed as if someone put sunglasses on me. We marveled at the grandeur and beauty of God's creation!

People reported becoming emotional and started crying, some said their breath was taken away and many felt this was the most significant spiritual experience of their life. This powerful experience simply enlarged our view of God's works.

Someone said, "within those few precious minutes, people have joined an exclusive club of the most spectacular occurrence you can see with the human eye. There are few events in life that leave a permanent, indelible impression of the total eclipse of the sun".

Many fought the traffic, crowds, financial costs, and other obstacles to join this "exclusive solar eclipse club"! Yet God is asking us, as we begin our new ecclesiastical year on September 1st, to fight the crowds to make the commitment and journey 356 days with Jesus in His club, His church, His home!

The Orthodox Church is not an 'exclusive', one event, one time solar eclipse club. Our church is all-inclusive to anyone who desires a life in Christ, not a moment with Christ, not an hour with Christ but a unique relationship with the Creator who offered this eclipse and any future eclipses!

Jesus is asking us to not be distracted by the busy thoughts, not be distracted by the cares of the world, not be distracted by complacency, or other excuses that keep us from traveling to church and come to worship.



Jesus invites us to His home, not to look up into 'outer' space for a two minute eclipse, but to faithfully travel into that sacred "inner" space of the heart to be touched by His infinite love. St. Paul reminds us, "to set our minds on the things of heaven, not earthly things". He again tells us in the epistle to the Hebrews to: "fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith".

We fixed our eyes on the sun and moon when watching the eclipse but our Holy Church asks us to fix our eyes on Jesus!! Our church wants to offer a permanent indelible impression of God's love, grace, and light in our life! The church wants to share the enthusiasm of this real experience of God's infinite power and love as she guides the eyes of our soul to the light of Christ!

Christ is the light of the world so that whoever believes in Him will 'never' walk in the path of darkness. Jesus never fails to shine from heaven with salvation in His beams. And "the Son is the radiance of God's glory". Heb. 1:3.

Our church never wants us to stop being amazed at the miracle of the eclipse and God's universe but wants us to commit to follow Jesus so we can come to meet and know the maker of His amazing creation.


The Lord wants to leave an indelible and permanent impression in our heart! Jesus is asking us to come to His place, His church, His home with an open heart and a desire to clearly see. He doesn't ask us to 'go' to church but asks us to come and worship the Author of all creation! Yes, and we get to do that!! It's a privilege!

May these words of the Liturgy inspire us as we fix our eyes on Jesus and as we ask God to: "Shine in our hearts, the pure light of His divine knowledge, and open the eyes of our mind that we may comprehend the message of His Gospels..

For You, Christ our God, are the illumination of our souls and bodies, and to You we offer up glory, together with Your Father, Who is without beginning, and Your all-holy, good, and life-creating Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

May we experience this spectacular, permanent, and indelible reality of peace and love that only comes from our Lord!

The Nativity of the Theotokos

The first major feastday of our church is the Nativity of the Theotokos. Many would find honoring the Theotokos a bit strange since Jesus is the center of our faith. And it is for this precise reason that Christ and the Church turns our attention to the Virgin Mary since the Theotokos always turns our attention back to her Son.


Christ chose her and she became the first example of a true human being, accepting Christ not only by saying yes, but allowing her body to cooperate with God for our salvation.

We are invited to become like the Virgin Mary. She is the first human being to accept Jesus. She is the first person who bore Jesus. She is the one that the Bible tells us that "every generation will call her blessed! And she is the one who points us back to Christ. She encourages us to become "Christophori" Christ bearers.

Remembering the Virgins birth is a necessary component of our faith: The image of the Virgin Mary, the Virgin Mother, stands [as] the image of infinite humility and purity, filled with beauty and strength; the image of love and the victory of love. The Virgin Mary, the All-Pure Mother demands nothing and receives everything. She pursues nothing and possesses all.

In the image of the Virgin Mary, we find compassion, tenderheartedness, care, trust, humility. We call her Our Lady and the Queen of Heaven and Earth, and yet she calls herself "the handmaid of the Lord." .. Christ said, 'Do not be anxious. Seek first the Kingdom of God' (see Mt 6:33). Beholding this woman - Virgin Mother, Intercessor - we begin to sense, to know not with our mind, but with our heart, what it means to seek the Kingdom, to find it, and to live by it.

Elevation of the Holy Cross

Thursday, September 14th Orthros 8:00am Divine Liturgy 9:00am

Reflections on the Holy Cross.

We Christians place the Cross in our Church, in our homes, in our cars. We continually make the sign of the Cross, and wear a Cross around our neck, because the Cross is not a decoration but has become a symbol of love, joy, hope, power and victory.

The Cross reminds us of God's love. "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son that whoever believes in him will not perish but will have eternal life." (John 3:16) What greater love is there than to lay down your life for others?

The Cross reminds us of joy, the joy of paradise, the Kingdom. We start the liturgy with 'blessed is the kingdom. Many hymns of our church recall how Adam and Eve were sent out of paradise because of a tree. They ate fruit from the forbidden tree. And yet it is also a tree that has opened the doors of paradise once again for all believers, the tree of the Cross.

The Cross reminds us of hope, a hope that is greater than the darkest despair. When Jesus was crucified, his disciples and followers all despaired. They had abandoned Jesus, yet, after the resurrection, they understood the Cross in a new way. It was no longer a symbol of despair, but it was now a sign of hope for all people, a hope for new life.

The Cross is a symbol of power. Often in the world, it seems that evil conquers good and that sin is stronger than virtue. Yet the Cross reminds us that sin will not have the last say. Evil will not last forever. The Cross reminds us of the resurrection. Evil and suffering appear to win, but then comes the resurrection. The chaos of today will not last. God will have the last say.

Finally, the Cross is a symbol of victory. Through the death of Jesus on the Cross, the greatest evil, death itself, was destroyed. Before the Cross, the devil thought that death was his greatest weapon. All who died would enter his dark kingdom. And yet, when Jesus entered Hades, the devil trembled.

The Cross, which had been a tool of evil, became a power of death for hell itself! One of the morning hymns describes the devil trembling when he sees Christ himself enter into Hades and cries out, "My spirit trembles, and now I must cast out Adam and his posterity. A tree brought them to my realm, but now the tree of the Cross brings them back again to paradise."



THOUGHTS ON GRIEF

A big question that faces all of us is what should we do with our losses? Is there a way for that which is lost to be found? Can sadness turn to gladness, or mourning lead to dancing? When "weeping lasts for a night time," does joy truly come in the morning?

The truth is not whether we have experienced loss, we all do, but rather how we live our losses. Have we learned to be strong and hide them, or pretend they aren't real? Are we cautious or scared to share them with others? Is there an inner voice convincing ourselves that our losses are little compared with other people's losses?

You see, we can never get to joy if we dare not cry, if we do not have the courage to weep, if we don't take the opportunity to experience the pain.

Many have learned to just ignore it or we have been told that being strong means not crying. We are told to get over it, move on, and, for many, following that recipe breeds bitterness or resentment hardening our heart for the rest of our life!

I believe that Christ gives us the grace to reach out beyond our fears and embrace the reality of our losses. The invitation is to bear one another's burden with love and compassion. If you have a friend who is in pain or who has lost someone, can you just listen and say, "I love you and will be with you, I want to hear how hard it is. I don't know what to say to you, I don't know what to do about it, but I do want to be with you, and walk with you. I am not afraid."?

We encourage everyone who has experienced a loss to come to the Cloud of Witness where we learn that it's better to mourn our losses than to deny them. Where we dare to feel our losses and grieve them. Where we name the pain and say, "Yes, we feel real pain, real fear, real loss; and we are going to embrace it and offer that as a gift to those willing to walk with us in that reality."
