The True King

Monarchies were, at one time, the most widespread form of government in the world. The mere mention of the term probably reminds you of Queen Elizabeth II, who is now the longest reigning monarch in British history; but other noteworthy (and sometimes notorious) rulers include Alexander the Great of Greece, Ivan the Terrible of Russia, and Louis XIV of France.

It's no secret that kings and queens wield great power – some are even elevated by their citizens to god-like status. However, behind all of the royal crowns, signets, and robes, they are mere humans. Like the rest of mankind, they were formed from the dust of the earth.

While only 44 monarchies remain throughout the globe, there is one kingdom that spans across all time and space. Sadly, most nations don't recognize its sovereignty, and they refuse to be influenced by its counter-cultural teachings and practices.

Nevertheless, its King is preeminent, and His decrees and promises are firmly established in the heavens (Psalm 119:89). That's because He is divine and His kingdom is not of this world. As Philippians 2:9-11 states, "...God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus Christ, every knee should bow, of those who are in heaven, and on earth, and under the earth, and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father."

If you have obeyed the gospel, then you are a royal subject of King Jesus, who reigns mightily from His throne in heaven. Although you may not feel like a person of great wealth, power, and influence, you have something much greater than all those things — salvation.

When the King returns, He won't be concerned about the kinds of cars and homes you've accumulated, the number of friends you have, or how many trophies you've won. The only thing that will matter is if you have submitted to His authority.
