### 5.2 Report, DMCTA Report:

David Skinner, DMCTA President and Carmel Del Mar 4<sup>th</sup> grade teacher, expressed gratitude on behalf of DMCTA teachers that all are back safe after the fires, but they realize they have lost a week. Teachers feel a bit more urgency than normal, but also feel prepared to deal with the lost week due to PLC. President Skinner continued that PLC helps teachers make the most effective use of their time, and teachers will do their absolute best to ensure that students perform to their highest ability in the limited time available.

Pres. Skinner also expressed deep thanks and appreciation for Joe Graciano, District Groundskeeper, who retires in December after 20 years with DMUSD. Teachers appreciate Mr. Graciano and wish to thank him for picking up the grounds and helping teachers with garden projects.

**5.3 Report DMSEF Report:**

DMSEF President Bob Gans was not present. Member McDowell reported that he appreciated attending the November 3, 2007, Foundation Strategic Planning meeting. As a result of their strategic planning, the Foundation will review some items in their board policies and realign some of their committees.

**5.4 Report, Board Report/ Comments:**

Member Easton thanked parents and staff for accommodating the changed parent conference week and wished all a happy Thanksgiving.

Member Lamborghini attended the November 9, 2007, Basic Aid School Districts Meeting along with Supt. Bishop and Member McDowell. This meeting allowed DMUSD to network with other school districts with same type of financing we have. This year, revenues in California are not coming in at the levels anticipated, and the legislature will have to do fancy footwork to keep money for education coming in for revenue limit school districts. DMUSD finances come primarily from local property tax revenues, but sometimes when state revenues are slow the Governor may look to basic aid school district property tax revenue for extra income. This group is ready to win that fight if an attack to basic aid money comes.

Member McDowell announced that tonight marks the one-year anniversary for both Member White and himself. He thanked the District Office staff for answering all his questions. He further thanked the Foundation parent contributors as well as the principals who have shown appreciation to those contributors.

Member White recognized Boy Scout Troop #782 - Jackson Baker, Michael Carlson, Scott Fitzmorris, Noah Berger, Adam Woodnutt, Michael Broussalian and Jeffrey Pecsar.

**5.5 Report, Superintendent's Report:**

Supt. Bishop congratulated Lisa Furnas, the outstanding District Office Administrative Assistant/Receptionist who produced entire Board packet this month. He also thanked Shirley Bales, Program Assistant, Curriculum & Inst., for Board minutes last month and again this month. Sherry Forte underwent surgery and is doing very well; her doctor may allow her back to work December 17.

Supt. Bishop announced that a press release today indicated the Sacramento legislative analyst projects a \$10B shortfall in state revenues next year. Gov. Schwarzenegger will soon announce what he will do about the shortfall. Four years ago, Gov. Davis faced a shortfall, tried to attack Basic Aid money, and was subsequently recalled.

Supt. Bishop visited Sage Canyon PTA yesterday and congratulated them for paperless Wednesday packets, saving 65,000 pieces of paper, about \$2,000, and countless trees this year. In the next six months, the District plans to take a more aggressive attitude to also become paperless and save money.

Supt. Bishop asked Board members if they could attend a meeting scheduled with Councilman Scott Peters this coming Monday, November 19, at 8:00 a.m., at Solana Pacific School.

## **7. CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION**

### **7.1 08/09 Spanish Immersion Location**

Asst. Supt., Curriculum & Inst., Janet Bernard addressed the Board on the history of the Spanish Immersion Program, the dynamics of the program, as well as feedback from the Sycamore Ridge PTA and staff. Supt. Bishop publicly thanked Mrs. Bernard for her work on the Spanish Immersion Program.

Member Lamborghini emphasized that any teachers hired for the Spanish Immersion Program would also be fully credentialed to teach in English and would be as highly qualified as current teachers in DMUSD schools.

President Easton clarified one item in the Presentation--the 07/08 DMUSD Goals and Objectives directed administration to develop a foreign language program, not particularly Spanish. It was not until September 2007 that the Board recommended Spanish as the language.

Member McDowell asked staff to furnish more information about the basis used to identify Sycamore Ridge as a potential foreign language immersion site. Mrs. Bernard answered that the original Action Plan intentionally did not identify a site since the district was still growing, and the September 2007 Board Meeting marked the first time Sycamore Ridge was identified. Member McDowell stated that at the September 2007 Board Meeting he had requested staff to look at Del Mar Heights and Del Mar Hills Academy as possible sites. Supt. Bishop responded that Principals and PTA Presidents at Del Mar Heights and Del Mar Hills Academy did not want a foreign language immersion program which may result in displacement of some students, although Del Mar Heights is working to explore another type of foreign language option which will be presented to the Board in December.

Member White shared additional research she conducted regarding a French Immersion "school within a school" in Maryland. Member White stated there are very real challenges to be addressed for a "school within a school" concept, but Sycamore Ridge Principal Emily Disney is very gifted and can meet the challenge. She commented that DMUSD is behind other school districts in the county which already have foreign language immersion programs. Member White apologized to Sycamore Ridge parents who first heard about this program by reading it in the paper, and she also apologized that Principal Disney did not have more time to speak to parents about this.

Principal Disney thanked the Sycamore Ridge community for attending; she knows this is an important issue, and she apologized for not having adequate communication. Principal Disney recommended that the administration look at conducting Kindergarten screening this year to begin the Spanish Immersion Program next year with first graders. Principal Disney recommended that DMUSD continue to be very proactive in communicating with parents, and that a comprehensive plan be supported unanimously by the Board, the District, central administration and by the parent community.

President Easton stated that the communication process was flawed and not respectful of staff, parents, or the community. She advocated not making a decision tonight, but allowing more time for community dialogue. Staff was directed to notify the Board when those meetings will take place.

The Board directed staff to gather more parent input to come back for a decision in December. The Board further directed staff to look at all siblings being part of the program to help build community, the possibility of implementing the program in first grade, and to address the eligibility and screening issue to identify students who would be highly successful.

#### **7.4 Board Approval for Art Teachers to Attend the Project Zero Classroom Institute at the Harvard School of Education**

Staff confirmed these costs covered expenses and did not include teacher salaries.

## **8. ADMINISTRATION AND POLICY**

### **8.1 Board Approval to Hold the Regular Board Meeting and 2007 Organizational Meeting on December 12, 2007**

*On motion by Member White, seconded by Member Easton, the Board voted 4-0 to hold the Regular Board Meeting and 2007 Organizational Meeting on December 12, 2007. Ayes: Members Easton, Lamborghini, McDowell, White. Noes: -0-.*

### **8.2 1<sup>st</sup> Reading of Proposed Board Meeting Dates and Locations for 2007**

The Board directed Asst. Supt., Business Services, Dena Whittington, to check on the possibility of moving the June meeting on the 2008/09 Budget up one week.

### **8.3 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading and Approval of new Board Bylaw 9400, Board Self-Evaluation**

As the entirety of the Bylaw was not included in the packet, the Board directed staff to return this as an Item on the December Agenda.

### **8.4 Emergency Preparedness for October 22<sup>nd</sup> Firestorm**

The Board directed staff to keep the Board informed of current staff emergency contact information, updated regularly, and that this information be provided immediately when a new Board Member is sworn in. The Board directed staff to keep the district emergency contact list updated on a regular basis and disseminated to administration and other key staff as updated. Asst. Supt. Whittington informed the Board that the additional cost of adding parent cell phone emergency contact numbers to the All Call System will return at a future Board Meeting. The Board expressed appreciation for Exec. Assistant Sherry Forte coming into the office and calling Board members during the recent fire emergency, but stated that information would be appropriate to come from Supt. Bishop, if possible, or else down the administrative chain or from the Board level.

### **8.5 Board Discussion, Teacher Recognition / Staff Recognition**

Supt. Bishop presented a proposal for recognizing an employee of the year (certificated and classified) from each school site. He responded to the Board that there was no specific DMUSD Teacher of the Year Board Policy. President Easton recommended one classified employee of the year from the District Office and one from childcare in addition to one classified employee from each site.

Supt. Bishop will work with DMCTA Pres. Skinner on a meaningful token, not necessarily a pin, to represent years of service to DMUSD. This token will be used for years of service for all employees, classified, certificated, and administrative.

**8.6 Approval J13A Affidavit of Governing Board Members that emergency conditions caused DMUSD school closure from October 22-26, 2007**

**8.7 Calendar for 07/08 Action Teams**

Asst. Supt. Bernard has begun soliciting members for the 07/08 Action Teams on Health, Wellness and Physical Education and Securing Permanent Funding for Enrichment. She will post a request for Action Team members on the DMUSD website. Asst. Supt. Whittington will be heavily involved in the Permanent Funding action team. Mrs. Bernard informed the Board that she will also initiate the committee that volunteered to work on the mission statement.

**8.8 Board Bylaw 9124 - Attorney**

Supt. Bishop wished the Minutes to note that Board Bylaw 9000 series is almost complete.

Member White believes Board members should be able to use their own discretion to consult legal counsel. She will follow up on BB 9124 to bring this item back to a future board meeting.

**8.9 Board Policy/Administrative Regulation 5141: Health Care and Emergencies**

The Board asked about a policy addressing the use of AED devices on staff or adult volunteers. Mrs. Snider believed this policy also applies to adults but will research further. This Item will be brought back in December for a second reading.

**8.10 Reminder of Upcoming Events** (Presented for information only.)

The Board suggested that upcoming districtwide events be labeled "districtwide." Board also questioned whether the date and location changes for 6<sup>th</sup> grade camp needed Board approval. Since the Board approved 6<sup>th</sup> grade camp last spring, it was not necessary for further board approval at this time. The Board directed that future board discussions about 6<sup>th</sup> grade camp include health issues.

**9. OPERATIONS AND FACILITIES**

**9.1 Facilities Report** (Presented for information only.)

Dir. of HR/Facilities Rodger Smith informed the Board that he hoped to have a resolution by the end of the calendar year regarding Torrey Hills windows reimbursement from contractors.

Dir. Smith further informed the Board that according to the project manager, the City of San Diego Ocean Air Park is scheduled to begin in late January or early February with completion in January of 2009. Mr. Smith has asked the project manager to inform DMUSD if it is possible to construct playgrounds first, but there is no job site meeting yet on phases of construction. This might be an appropriate item to address with Councilman Scott Peterson next Monday, November 19.

9.2 **Update: Shores Escrow** (Presented for information only.)  
Supt. Bishop was pleased to write this Board Item, and hopeful that the next deposit of \$1.45M will come in January. Friends of Del Mar Parks recently invited all Board Members to an event at L'Auberge, which Member McDowell attended.

9.3 **Board Approval, Notice of Completion for Shade America, Inc., for Construction of the Shade Structure at Ocean Air School**  
The Board questioned whether this was an item for a Regular Board Meeting or for a CFD Meeting. Mr. Smith will inquire of legal counsel to see if it would be appropriate to have items such as this in a Regular Board Meeting or a CFD Meeting.

*Upon motion by Member Lamborghini, seconded by Member McDowell, the Board voted 4-0 to approve the Notice of Completion for Shade America. Ayes: Members Easton, Lamborghini, McDowell, White. Noes: -0-.*

## 10. BUSINESS AND FINANCE

10.3 **Recommendation Regarding the Fee Charged for the Use of Fields by Profit vs. Non-profit Organizations** (First Reading)  
The Board questioned if this regulation gives DMUSD an option to charge those organizations which require extra cleaning after an event. Mr. Smith will research the issue of clean-up, perhaps an extra fee, perhaps more trash cans.

10.5 **2006/2007 Monthly Budget Update** (Presented for information only.)  
The Board will schedule a time on Wednesday, December 5 for a Special Board Meeting on the 07-08 First Interim Report.

## 11. PERSONNEL

11.2 **Revised Job Description, Director of Pupil Services**  
The Board questioned staff about the percentage of time of spent on special ed vs. pupil services and if Mrs. Snider felt the job should be split into two positions. Mrs. Snider responded that the percentage varies from day to day and during enrollment season. Most school districts are larger before they have one position for special ed and one for pupil services. Dir. Snider but does not believe the workload is overwhelming for one director.

Member White reminded the Board of the first Personnel Committee meeting November 15, and one item on the agenda is to look at how DMUSD is staffed compared to other districts.

The Board pointed out two minor corrections, page 79, 3<sup>rd</sup> bullet, the word "and" is left out; the last bullet should read "periods of time."

*On motion by Member Lamborghini, seconded by Member White, the Board voted 4-0 to approve the Revised Job Description for Director of Pupil Services, as amended. Ayes: Members Easton, Lamborghini, McDowell, White. Noes: -0-.*

### 11.3 **Technology Leadership Staffing Options**

The Board discussed staffing options as DMUSD restructures the Director of Technology position and the possibility of splitting that job into two positions--a Director of Instructional Technology plus a Director of Information Systems Technology, such as Santee School District has. The Board questioned the costs involved and inquired as to the enrollment size Santee had when it initiated those two positions. The Board wished to see how the curricular technology position might support the needs of the Curriculum & Instruction Dept. detailed in Item 11.4 as well. The Board requested job descriptions for those two possible positions. Member White will take these proposed positions to the Personnel Committee.

### 11.4 **Expansion Position, Coordinator of Categorical Programs/ELL/GATE/Grant Writer**

Member White requested that this job description also be presented to the Personnel Committee, and that the Board hold off on these new positions until after feedback from the Committee.

President Easton asked Member White to have the Personnel Committee work on this quickly to return to the Board in December.
