Subject: Board Approval, Waiver of Article 13 (Hours of Employment) from DMCTA Members at Sycamore Ridge School for the 208/2009 School year.

In July 2007, the Board approved a one-year After School Band Program pilot. This pilot program was highly successful as indicated by strong parent satisfaction on the Sycamore Ridge 2007/2008 parent survey. (See attachment)

Emily Disney, Principal, Sycamore Ridge and the Interim Superintendent are pleased to inform the Board that the waiver of Article 13 (Hours of Employment) in the teacher contract has been reviewed by the Sycamore Ridge DMCTA and more than 75% of the bargaining unit members continue to support the waiver. Therefore, Mrs. Disney is seeking Board approval to once again waive Article 13 (Hours of Employment) for the 2008/2009 school year. (See attachment)

Article 26 of the DMCTA Contract provides that an article of the DMCTA contract can be waived by the DMCTA membership at a local school site if more than 75% of the teachers at the site approve the waiver.

Due to the success of the After School Band Program as determined by parents and staff, other school sites in the District may wish to consider modifying their music program schedule to include an after school component.

Date: 6/4/08

During the 2007-2008 school year, Sycamore Ridge implemented a Board approved one year *After School Band Pilot Program*. Parent feedback data (see attached) shows overwhelming satisfaction and support for the after school band program and schedule.

Proposal:

The 2008-09 proposal is to continue the instructional band program with the 2007-08 parameters and teacher work hour adjustments as follows:

- Adjust the hours of employment for the music teacher to accommodate general music instruction within the instructional day, putting band after school.

- Suggested Music Teacher Work Hours:

8:45 – 3:45 Mon, Tues., Thurs., Fri.

(Allows for one hour of band instruction after the 2:30 dismissal)

8:45 – 2:00 Wednesday

(Allows for up to two hours for entire band rehearsal/instruction)

Once Principal receives final enrollment information to determine staffing, finalize the site master schedule to ensure teacher contract preparatory minutes can be met including other contractual obligations such as adjunct duty, recess duty and staff meeting communication.



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
Parameters:

2. Parental permission forms to be obtained from each student providing consent for participation in After School Band Instruction.
3. Emergency supervision provisions for any student not picked up after band instruction is as follows: A) Student makes phone call from office. B) Student to wait in office for pick up until the office closes at 4:00. C) School office staff to escort student/s to on campus Child Care with a copy of the Student Emergency Card.


This proposal of the DMCTA Contract Waiver has been reviewed by the Sycamore Ridge DMCTA Bargaining Unit and after ballot vote has exceeded over 75% support from the staff.

Subject: Report, District Special Education Preschool Program

The District's Special Education Preschool Program at Sycamore Ridge serves students with a wide range of needs between the ages of three to five years old. Students who reside in the Del Mar Union School District attendance boundary or reside in districts who are members of the North Coastal Consortium for Special Education are housed in four preschool classrooms.

Primary services for these students may be provided by a special day class (SDC) teacher or by a speech language pathologist (SLP). The majority of students who receive services in the SDC also receive services in the following service areas: speech and language, occupational therapy (OT), adaptive physical education (APE) and/or physical therapy (PT). A number of students, who receive speech and language as their primary service, may also receive services from OT, APE and/or PT.

Special education services are determined after a student is assessed in all areas of suspected disability and an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) is developed. The IEP reflects the student's present level of performance, individual needs and annual goals. A team of specialists that include, but are not limited to, a school psychologist, special day class teacher, speech and language pathologist, occupational therapist, and adaptive physical education teacher conducts the assessments. As needed, a physical therapist or low-incidence specialist may also be included in the assessment plan.

The majority of preschool students receive services from outside agencies such as Regional Center prior to being referred to the District for assessment. The assessment team leader plays a pivotal role in contacting those agencies, obtaining and reviewing all data on the student, making a home visit to the parents, observing the student and coordinating the assessment team's activities. The assessment team leader also attends all IEPs for identified students and coordinates all IEP paperwork.

Over the past four years, initial assessments have increased as follows:

These figures include only those students referred by agencies. A number of referrals are also received directly from parents.

As reported by the San Diego County Office of Education’s Hope Infant Family Support Program, which offers early intervention services to infants and toddlers with special needs, there has been a *significant* rise in the number of students who have autism, which will continue to impact special education preschool programs throughout the County. As reported by the California Department of Education’s Superintendent’s Autism Advisory Committee in November 2007, “*Between 1998 and 2002, the number of pupils with ASD [Autism Spectrum Disorder] receiving services in California nearly doubled, from 10,360 to 20,377. These numbers continue to climb. In 2004, there were 4,427 additional pupils diagnosed with autism, an increase of 18 percent. The California Department of Developmental Services data for California show for the quarter ending in June 2006, 3,717 three- and four-year olds were diagnosed with ASD. This growth is prompting the need for educational services to support these students.*”

The District’s Special Education Preschool Program is offered for four hours a day, four days a week for a total of 16 hours per week. Student composition of the four classes in the program includes 50 students with disabilities and approximately 12 typical peers. By including typical peers in the day classes, students with special needs can work with and learn from their typically learning, age appropriate peers. A sample day in the preschool program is provided in Appendix A.

Related services, such as speech/language, OT, APE and/or PT, are either provided in the special day class or in a separate classroom. The teacher-student ratio may vary from 1:1 to small group instructional settings. These services typically range from 30 minutes a week to two hours per week. In addition to the students served in the special day class, 53 students have a primary service of speech and language. These students do not receive services in the special day class program, as they typically attend private preschool.

Teachers and service providers are responsible for initial assessments and initial IEP meetings, annual IEP reviews, triennial reviews, administrative placements

and transition meetings for students transitioning from preschool to kindergarten. They are also responsible for providing an instructional program and the services delineated on each student's IEP.

Approximately 25 of the students enrolled in the preschool program receive four hours a week of additional service in the Preschool Extended Day Program, which is overseen by the District's Autism Behavior Specialist. This program is offered after school for two hours a day on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, and on Friday mornings for four hours. Services provided to students in a 1:1 setting focus on the acquisition of skills needed for learning, such as appropriate behavioral skills and compliance with rules. Services provided to students in a small group setting focus on social skills, social communication and, as appropriate, kindergarten readiness skills. A monthly clinic meeting is held with parents, the autism behavior specialist, special day class teacher and, as appropriate, related service providers and home therapist(s), to review the student progress. These meetings address any concerns expressed by the parents or special education staff and serve as a vehicle for coordinating home therapies with the student's school program.

Parent workshops are offered once a month during the school year. Based on a parent needs survey, workshops have been offered in social stories, picture exchange systems, behavior management, sensory integration and play skills development. In conjunction with the occupational therapist and adaptive physical education teacher, a workshop is also offered on fine and gross motor skills.

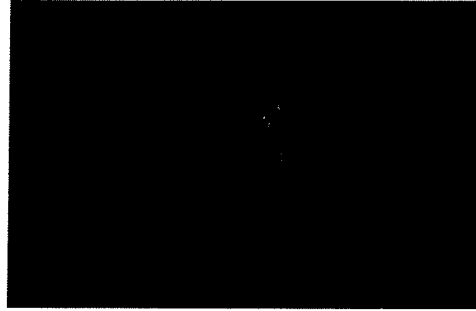
Each year in August, the District offers a two-week program that focuses on the social development of students. This program is offered four hours a week and focuses on social skills and behavior.

The Del Mar Union School District has an exemplary preschool program that offers a wide variety of services and placements to meet the needs of all students served within the program.

Students stay with primary SDC teacher and work in small and large groups. In addition, related services are provided in the special education day class, concurrently with another related service provider (e.g. OT and APE), or 1:1 or in a small group setting

- Students working on fine motor/self help skills using utensils, drinking from a cup, table manners (cleaning up, staying seated, "please")



Subject: Board Approval, Agreement Renewal for Lynn Carlson, Coordinator for the DMUSD Preschool Assessment Team

Lynn Carlson retired from employment with the Del Mar Union School District in June 2007. She served the District in the capacity of a Speech and Language Pathologist and Special Education team leader for many years. As part of her responsibilities, Lynn coordinated intake procedures for preschool children. Due to her experience with this particular area of responsibility, Lynn developed a significant and unique array of skills that were particularly effective in working with preschool children and their parents. Lynn's retirement left a substantial void in this critical area of District and program responsibility.

For the 2007-2008 school year, Lynn served as the assessment team leader for the DMUSD Preschool Assessment Team. Her original contract was for 320 hours and was approved by the Board on July 25, 2007. Due to the unexpected increase in student referrals, the Board approved an additional 300 hours at the April 2, 2008 special Board meeting.

The need for Lynn's post-retirement services for the 2008-2009 school year is estimated to involve up to 900 hours. This is based on the increase in preschool referrals from 37 in the 2006-2007 school year to 54 in the 2007-2008 school year. This is an increase of approximately 45%.

The proposed rate of compensation for these services is \$25 per hour which is the contractual rate that is paid to certificated staff for duties that do not involve workshops, facilitation training or working directly with students.

FISCAL IMPACT: Revenue: Restricted General Fund- Special Education
Expenditure: 2008/2009 budget for other contracts not to exceed \$22,500
Fund Balance: No change in fund balance in the Restricted General Fund.

RECOMMENDED: The Interim Superintendent recommends approval of the contract renewal for Lynn Carlson as a Coordinator for the DMUSD Preschool Assessment.
