DETERMINING INTERNATIONAL STUDENT STATUS

For the purpose of admission, Castleton University defines "international applicants" as foreign nationals who hold or intend to hold any temporary non-immigrant visa/status in the U.S.A. These applicants must complete the international student application. Note: Students who hold a non-immigrant visa/status and who attend U.S. high schools are considered international applicants.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications are accepted for either the fall or spring semester for undergraduate and Fall, Spring, or Summer for Graduate. Castleton's policy of "rolling admissions" means that we process applications throughout the year until we determine that we have filled our class for each semester. Castleton encourages students to apply early to allow sufficient time to process your application, get your visa, and arrange for transportation. Only completed applications will be reviewed for consideration. We reserve the right to close admission once the class is filled.

ADMISSION DEPOSIT

To reserve your place, accepted students must remit a non-refundable deposit of \$200 USD on or before May 1 for the fall semester and December 1 for the spring semester. After these dates, deposits will be accepted on a space-available basis. The deposit is credited toward the first semester's bill.

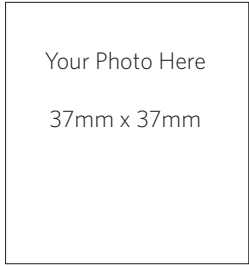
