

## SURVEY ON INTERCOUNTRY ADOPTION FOR ADOPTIVE PARENTS

A Survey of the Congressional Coalition on Adoption Institute In Collaboration with the Center for Adoption Policy, Christian Alliance for Orphans, Equality for Adopted Children, Joint Council, and National Council for Adoption.

#### **RESULTS AS OF 3-1-2012**

The following 42 question survey was created and circulated in early February, 2012, prior to an off-the-record meeting hosted by the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to discuss intercountry adoption with officials from the Department of State and Homeland Security and various stakeholders from the adoption community, including The Congressional Coalition on Adoption Institute (CCAI), on February 16, 2012. Survey results received by February 14 were made available to the Committee staff prior to that meeting, but the survey remained open until March 1. These are the consolidated final results from 2938 U.S. adoptive parents as of that date.


CCAI administered the online survey and collected the results, but the survey was created and circulated in partnership with several organizations, including the Center for Adoption Policy, Christian Alliance for Orphans, Equality for Adopted Children, Joint Council, and National Council for Adoption.

The intent of the survey is to inform policy makers on adoptive families' experiences when interacting with U.S. government officials during the intercountry adoption process. Information collected from this survey may be used to help identify areas of possible improvement within the current process. This survey is not a scientific poll. The original survey contained comments from thousands of respondents. For the purpose of space, those hundreds of pages of comments are not included here.


























#### 14. How were the updates referenced in question 13 most commonly provided?

### 15. How often did you receive updates about the status of intercountry adoption, generally, in the country from which you were adopting?




























### 28. If your case received an RFE, were you told specifically what additional evidence was needed to reply to the RFE?


### 29. Was the information or further evidence needed something you had been informed up front would be part of the evidence processed?


#### 30. Did you hire an attorney to assist you with responding to the RFE?


## 31. Approximately how much money did it cost for to respond to the RFE (including costs for the attorney, any field investigation work, and travel-related expense)?




#### 33. Were documents that you provided the Consulate/Embassy or USCIS ever lost?


### 35. Did the Consulate/Embassy require that its officials interview the birth mother/parents in your case?


#### 36. How many times was the birth mother/parent interviewed?


### 37. Did the birth mother/parent report that she/he felt intimidated and/or confused during the interview?


## 38. Would you like to see a formal system in place to report commendable or unprofessional behavior on the part of an individual Consular officer to the Department of State?


### 39. Would you like to see a formal system in place to report commendable or unprofessional behavior on the part of an individual officer to USCIS?
