The Chicago River Schools Network provides K-12 teachers with the training and personalized assistance they need to take their students on an adventure into the turbulent history, evolving ecology, and improving health of the Chicago River. Students investigate real world issues and create service learning projects that work to solve everyday problems facing the Chicago River. All the while, learning standards are met and students and teachers gain a deeper understanding of the place they call home.

how can the chicago river schools network help me?

- **Workshops** – We will train you in all aspects of the river and its watershed and how to integrate its study into your curriculum (CPDU, lane and graduate credit available).
- **Individualized Assistance** – We will come to your school and meet with you to help you develop your own personalized Chicago River program.
- **Loan Program** – We have water quality monitoring equipment, books, videos and CDs you can borrow to enhance your program.
- **Lessons and Curricula** – We have lessons appropriate for students from kindergarten through 12th grade.
- **Field Trip Help** – We will help you plan your field trip to the river and be there to help on the day of the trip.
- **Classroom River Program** – We will engage your students in an hour long program exploring the river.
