Dr. Carmen Gregori is a full-time lecturer in the Dpt. of Filologia Anglesa i Alemanya since 1991, and a member of IULMA (Instituto Universitario de Lenguas Modernas) since 2005. She has experience teaching English at all levels and has also taught Spanish as a Foreign Language both in Spain and abroad (Iowa University, Middlebury College, USA). She completed an MA at the University of Nottingham in English Language and Linguistics and has been a research visitor in several universities (Nottingham University, Birmingham University, Iowa University, Cambridge University) as well as taken courses at University College London, and Reading University. She has been the Erasmus Coordinator for English Studies from 2003-2011 and the General Erasmus Coordinator for Humanities from 2006-2011. Among her current research interests are multimodal discourse analysis, grammar, corpus linguistics and ICT in the classroom and in other social contexts. Her work on Digital storytelling dates back to 2007 and from then onwards she has worked extensively in the field contributing to its expansion with several talks and publications, as well as with practical workshops. As a member of the Scientific committee of the journal "English Profile" (Cambridge University Press), and a member of the Universitat de Valencia's Committee for Modern Languages (5 members) part of her research always focuses on the impact that new technologies may have on teaching and learning of languages in relation to the CEFR and the competences learner should achieve.
