COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Power Point Presentations on research article & Practicum activity (15-20 minutes each).
 - A. The research article presentation should summarize the article and briefly link it to your practicum.
 - B. The Practicum activity presentation should include:
 - a. Brief description of organization
 - b. Tasks involved in internship
 - c. Cite journal article/chapter most related to your activity from previous presentation.

2. Short, academically-oriented paper (5-10 pages) on your practicum; ideally would integrate the journal article presented with your practicum experience. Although this will be more difficult for those whose practicum is more practitioner- than research-oriented, remember that you are receiving academic credit for the course. Thus, it is important to be able to express how your experience fits in with the grander scheme of I/O or HF literature. **Paper is due upon completion of hours; in order to receive a grade (other than IP) this semester, please turn it in by May 11.**

3. Submit forms:

 - b. Practicum Certification Form (completed by supervisor at completion of hours)
 - c. Practicum Summary Form (due at completion of hours)
