Well school is back in full swing and college football season is about to kickoff in a few days. Whether it was doing VBS in New Orleans or going 5,000+ miles away to Romania, it certainly was a busy summer. For the last few weeks we've been going through a study called *Down, Dirty, Depressed, Despair* centered around the life of Job. Our students, though young, are not exempt from pain and suffering. In fact, they deal with disappointment in differing ways than adults. Things such as divorce, family instability, financial woes, bad relationships, lack of popularity, poor grades, and failed expectations can help spiral a student into depression before you know it. Often what we as adults would consider as a small thing, can be humongous and devastating in a student's life. Suicidal thoughts/attempts, cutting, and seeking temporal releases like alcohol and drugs are common among teenagers. Often they try and cope with disappointment by using other people and start relationships they shouldn't be in, compromising their purity for acceptance. In this series we have been tackling the tough circumstances, tests, and trials of Job and we have been asking hard questions of God such as; why God would let Job endure this, why doesn't God cease evil in the world, why me, why doesn't God save us each time we're in trouble, does God cause hard times, and what is the true purpose of pain? Through this study we have come to understand that our God is a GREAT BIG GOD and far beyond what we can hope to comprehend, however we have also seen God's immense compassion for His children. Please continue to pray for our students and young adults, they need it now more than ever! Our group is eagerly looking forward to the new building's completion and know it will open new doors of ministry for us including room to grow.

We have several events geared towards attracting new students this month. First a college football kickoff night on Thursday night, September 1st where our students are encouraged to invite a friend, wear their favorite college team gear, and enjoy some good food while watching the games. Second, on Friday night into Saturday morning September 16th-17th our students will first join Smith's Station Baptist Church for a combined 5th Quarter after the Central vs. Smith's Station game with food, worship, and a speaker followed by a Lock-In for our folks back here at the church. ## A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

When you receive this issue of *Connections*, I will be in Thailand, the citadel of Buddhism, with a Christian population of little more than 1%.

This is a beautiful country that attracts many tourists, but most of them, at least the ones from western countries, don't come for the scenery or the shopping, but for more sordid reasons. While most Americans have an image of human trafficking and drugs at the mention of Thailand, we should remember that people in other countries have their own image of America. What do most people in the world have on which to judge us? Television, music, and movies. Since those sources don't really reflect the true heartland of America, it would be easy for people to assume that most Americans are decadent and perverted.

I know first-hand what the rest of the world sees and hears from America. From our television programs they learn that crime and immorality is a way of life. Morals are relative and love is doing whatever you want that makes you happy. You can't watch a comedy without a prominent homosexual character. Most families portrayed on television are single families where the parents are idiots and the kids run the house with their sarcasm. "Reality" programs on television cause people to believe that Americans are stupid cut-throats, conniving, envious, and deceitful.

The world learns from American music, particularly rock and rap, that every woman is a sex object and foul language is the way we speak. It's even worse in our music videos. Even much of country music portrays the same image, with a lot of sex, lost love and broken hearts.

Practically every American movie they watch is filled with sexual innuendos or explicit scenes and graphic violence. It's no wonder that they see the "Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous" or "Jerry Springer" and think we're all like them. What are they to think when Hollywood celebrities spend more money on a pair of jeans than most families in the world make in a year? Those whose only knowledge of America comes from our entertainment exports regard us as materially prosperous but culturally decadent, technologically sophisticated but morally depraved. As one Muslim sheikh wrote, "What America appeals to is everything that is low and disgusting in human nature."

Of course, people who have the view of America that I have described are getting only one side of the story, but it's still a real problem. Even Christians in other nations who read about the compromise of the church in America regarding such issues as abortion, divorce, homosexuality and same-sex marriage, and so on, are wondering if we have forsaken biblical faith, values, virtues, and morals for the sins of the flesh.

It's up to us to demonstrate to the world that there are millions of godly Americans who don't fit into the category that our entertainment industry depicts. If our American churches were truly New Testament churches, boldly proclaiming the true gospel of Jesus Christ and uncompromisingly living by biblical principles, maybe the world would see us differently. We need to give a clear and loud voice to our faith. We need a national revival to sweep across our nation. We need a great movement of God that makes the news media take notice, as in the days of the Great Awakening in our history. We need it and the world needs to see it. The way things are going in our country, we're headed for revival, riot, or ruin, and I call on members of Lakewood to take the lead in the right direction. Don't wait on someone else. Revival, righteousness, morality, purity, and integrity should be our choice.
