

# Self-Assessment Survey for Readiness to Participate at College Pathways

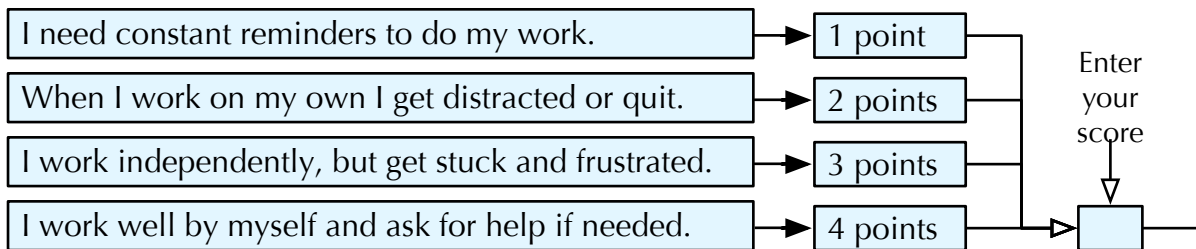

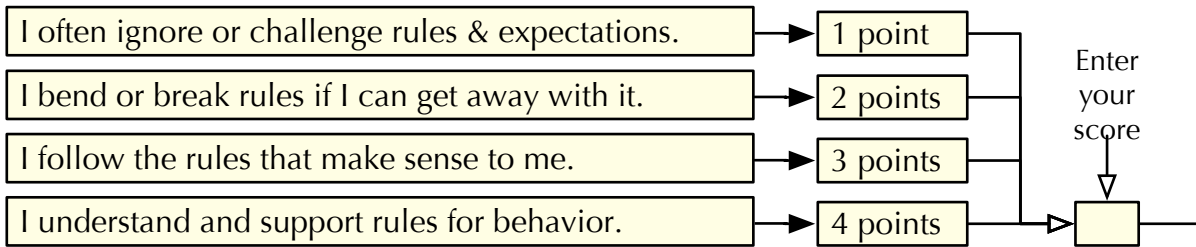

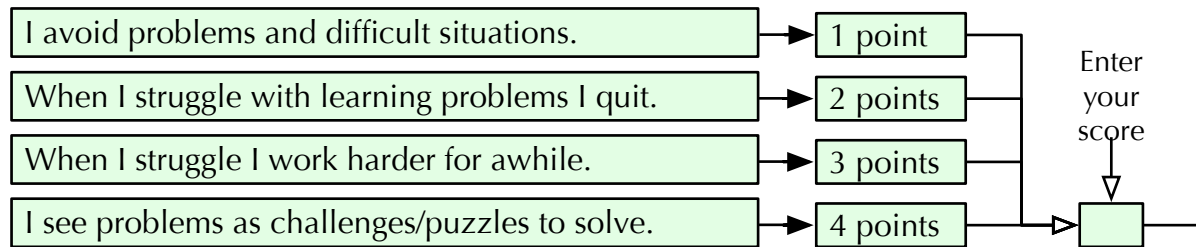

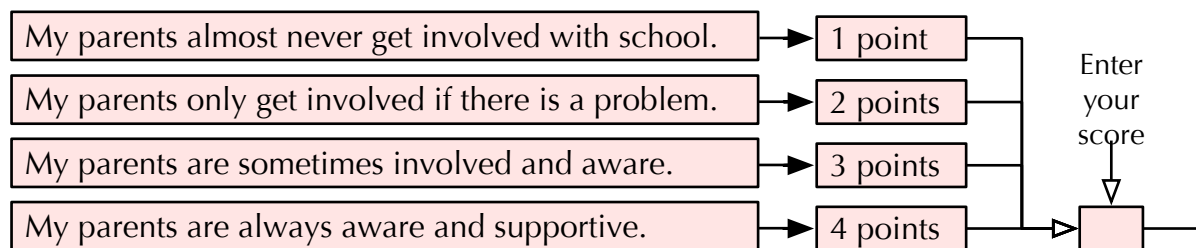

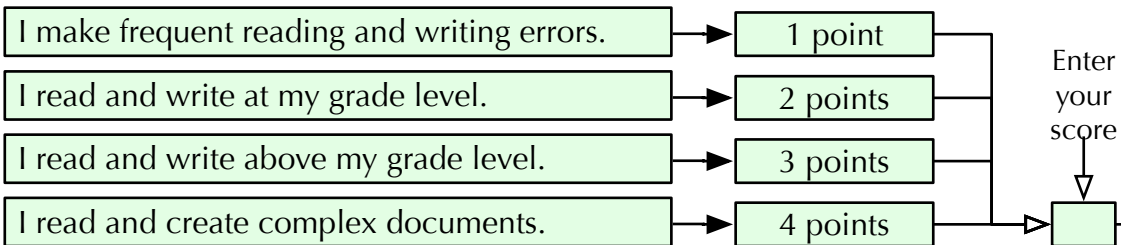

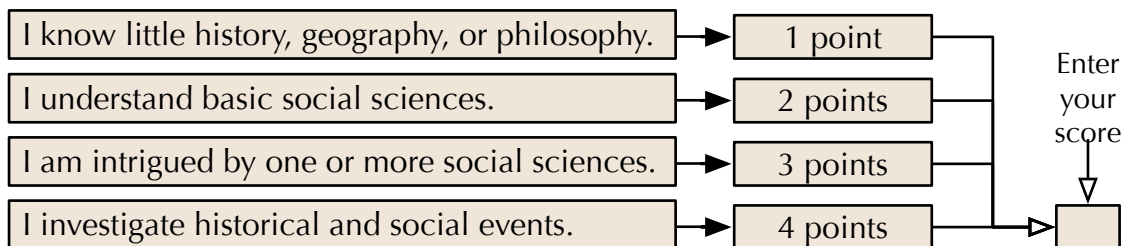

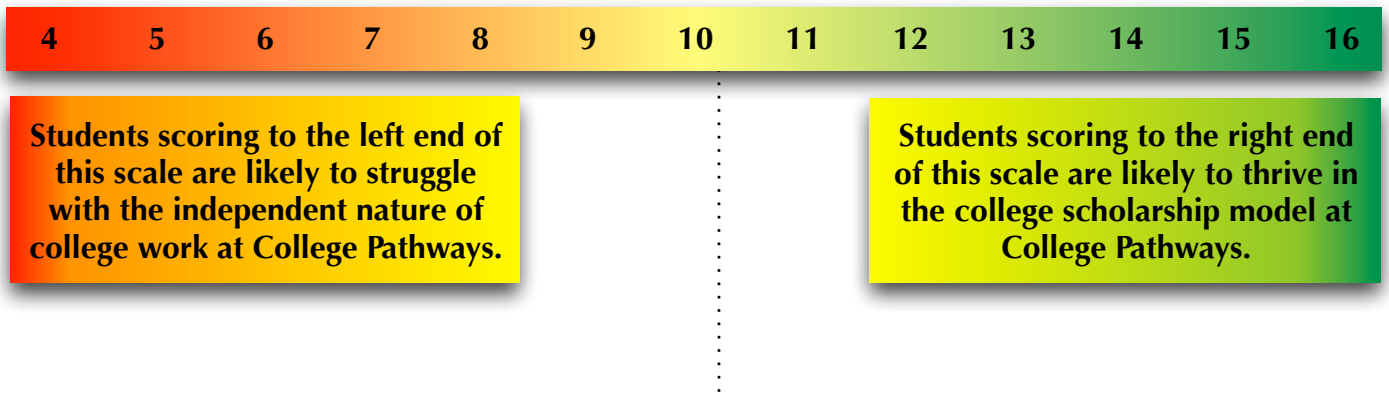

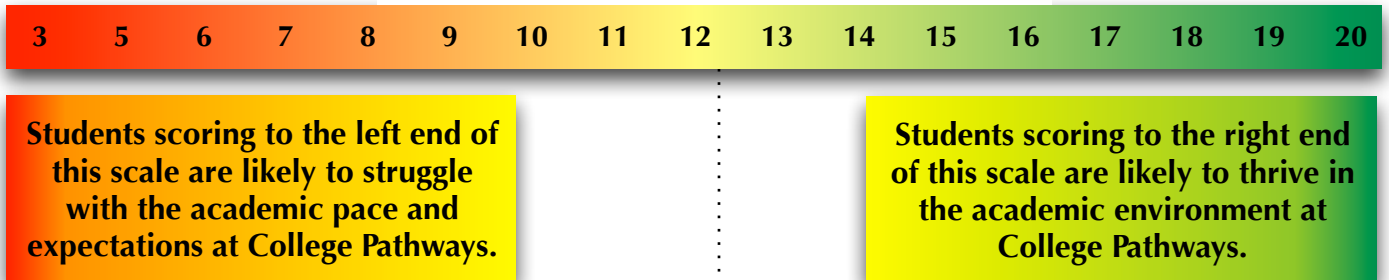
### Overall Readiness Projection
