Your Affiant, Tina Dyroff, has been employed with the Oklahoma City Police Department since 1988. I am currently assigned to Special Projects, as investigator.

On 10-25-11, at approximately 1528 hours, Principal Brian Staples, Douglas High School, received a phone call from one of the assistance principal's that Mrs. Jackson was ill and needed EMSA to come to her class room.

Mr. Staples and Mrs. Douglas went to the class room and observed Mrs. Jackson to be on the floor and not coherent. EMSA personnel arrived and were attending to her medical needs. Mrs. Jackson told Mr. Staples that she was possibly having a diabetic problem. Mr. Staples knew Mrs. Jackson was taking some type of medication for a different medical purpose.

Mr. Staples along with Angie Reed, Emsa, where looking in Mrs. Jackson's purse for any medication she might be on, and they observed several prescription bottles inside Mrs. Jackson's purse. One of the prescription bottles had unknown crystalline residue substance inside the container.


Angie Reed continued looking for additional medication when she located a plastic bag in the coin compartment of the purse that contained crystalline substance. Mr. Staples also observed the plastic bag and was given the bag from Mrs. Reed.

Mr. Staples immediately called for Officer D. Reed #1311, this being the Campus Resource officer assigned to Douglas High School.

Officer Reed took custody of the plastic bag and conducted a field test on the substance with it showing a positive reaction for methamphetamine. Officer Reed later weighed the bag with it showing .37 grams and then booked the evidence into the OCPD Forensic Locker under seal number 27342, along with a prescription bottle with unknown crystalline residue inside the container.

Mrs. Jackson was taken to the hospital by EMSA and was later released.


Due to the above described events, Your Affiant believes Chrisssea Jackson is in Violation of Oklahoma State Statute 63-2.401.B1, one (1) count of Possession of CDS (Methamphetamine), and Oklahoma State Statute 63-2.401.f Possession of CDS within 1000' of a school zone. Your Affiant is requesting a warrant be issued for the above defendant.
