COUNT 1: MANSLAUGHTER--FIRST DEGREE ~ 21 O.S. § 711, a FELONY
COUNT 2: OVERTAKING A BICYCLE ~ 47 O.S. § 11-1208B, a MISDEMEANOR

STATE OF OKLAHOMA, COUNTY OF WASHITA:

I, Angela C. Marsee, the undersigned District Attorney of said County, in the name and by the authority of the State of Oklahoma, give information that in said County of Washita and in the State of Oklahoma, SARAH K. MORRIS did then and there unlawfully, willfully, knowingly and wrongfully commit the crime(s) of:

COUNT 1: MANSLAUGHTER--FIRST DEGREE ~ a FELONY, on or about the 30th day of July, 2015, by unlawfully, willfully, intentionally and feloniously, without a premeditated design to effect death, did cause and effect the death of one Patrick J. Wanninkof while the said defendant was unlawfully engaged in a misdemeanor in manner and form as follows, to-wit: Overtaking a Bicycle, 47 O.S. 11-1208A that said defendant was then and there driving a Chevrolet SS automobile bearing Oklahoma license 256KXA at State Highway 152 .5 miles west of N/S 2070 County Road in Washita County, State of Oklahoma, the same being a public highway, while driving failed to leave a safe distance between the motor vehicle and the bicycle of at least three (3) feet and failing to devote her full time and attention to her driving because she was looking at her cellular telephone, said defendant did then and there drive and propel the same into and against one Patrick J. Wanninkof who was at the time operating a bicycle, then and there and thereby inflicting upon the body of said Patrick J. Wanninkof, as a direct and proximate result of the unlawful acts of said defendant as aforesaid, certain mortal wounds, from which mortal wounds the said Patrick J. Wanninkof did then and there languish and die.

This crime is punishable by imprisonment for not less than 4 years.

COUNT 2: OVERTAKING A BICYCLE ~ a MISDEMEANOR, on or about the 30th day of July, 2015, by unlawfully, willfully without premeditated design to effect serious physical injury to another, by Overtaking a Bicycle, the said defendant was then and there driving a Chevrolet SS automobile bearing Oklahoma license 156KXA at State Highway 152 .5 miles west of N/S 2070 County Road in Washita County, State of Oklahoma, the same being a public highway, while driving did fail to leave a safe distance between the motor vehicle and the bicycle of at least three (3) feet and failing to devote her full time and attention to her driving because she was looking at her cellular telephone, said defendant did then and there drive and propel the same into and against one Bridget L. Anderson, who was at the time operating a bicycle, then and there and thereby inflicting serious physical injury to Bridget L. Anderson, as a direct and proximate result of the unlawful acts of said defendant.

This crime is punishable by a Fine of up to \$500.00
