Affidavit for Search Warrant

BEFORE THE UNDERSIGNED JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT, Bruce Funderburk, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

That I am a Lieutenant with the Nichols Hills Police Department, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma. I have over twenty five years of combined experience as a police officer with that agency and have investigated violent crimes such as domestic assaults, home invasions, homicide, etc. I have probable cause to believe that the following property constitutes evidence of a crime:

~~Firearms~~ ^(DLO), knives, weapons, blunt force instruments such as hatchets, axes, cutting instruments, and cutting tools, and any other objects that may contain blood, hairs, fibers, fingerprints, palm prints, footprints, fingernails, shoe prints, shoes, clothing, garments, dirt, dust, soil, paint, paint chips, glass, and plastic containers, and/or items containing traces of any of the preceding articles and/or blood stained objects, any writings or documents in any storage media whatsoever relevant to demonic possession of an individual, and articles of personal property tending to establish the identity of the person or persons in control or possession of the place or vehicle, including, but not limited to, utility company receipts, rent receipts, cancelled mail envelopes, vehicle registrations, credit card receipts, repair bills, photographs, keys, and articles of clothing at the property of Stephen P. Wolf, and Mary Lynn Wolf, at 1715 Elmhurst Avenue, Nichols Hills, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, that is relevant to the cause and manner of injury and death to Thomas Stephen Wolf, which constitutes evidence that a crime was committed, and that the person in possession thereof participated in the commission of the above mentioned offense, to wit: Homicide.


I further state that the above described property may be found and is now being kept, possessed and/or concealed in the following described location in Oklahoma County, and upon or within a certain house, building, premises, vehicles, curtilage thereof and the appurtenances thereto belonging, described as follows;

1715 Elmhurst Avenue, in Nichols Hills, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma.

As probable cause for believing said property may be found at the location aforesaid, I allege and state as follows:

On Monday, November 16, 2009, at approximately 0430 hours I, Lieutenant Bruce Funderburk, was contacted by Nichols Hills Assistant Chief of Police Leslie Arnold who told me that there had been a homicide at 1715 Elmhurst in Nichols Hills. Assistant Chief Arnold advised me that a nine year old boy was deceased and his father had been found in the act of killing him by officers responding to a 911 call. I responded to the Nichols Hills Police Department where I was contacted by Officer Michael Puckett. Officer Puckett advised me that at he had been dispatched by communication to a 911 call at 1717 Elmhurst. Officer Puckett advised that the resident at 1717 Elmhurst, Mrs. Douglas Woodson, had called because there was someone banging on her front door and ringing the door bell. Communications Officer Laura Baxter advised that the 911 call was received at 0353 hours. Officer Puckett advised me that he had arrived within seconds of receiving the call and had observed the front door to 1715 Elmhurst

standing open and heard screams coming from that address. Officer Puckett advised that as he approached 1715 Elmhurst a female subject later identified as Mary Lynn Wolf was inside the residence coming toward to door screaming "He's killing my son." Officer Puckett advised me that he rushed into the residence and observed a male subject later identified as Stephen P. Wolf, on his knees moving his hands and arms leaning against a cabinet in the kitchen straddling a child, later identified as Thomas Stephen Wolf. Officer Puckett advised that he ordered Mr. Wolf to stop at which time Mr. Wolf said, "The Devil is in him". Officer Puckett advised that he ordered Mr. Wolf to raise his hands and Mr. Wolf rolled off of the child onto his left side and lay on the ground on his stomach. Officer Puckett advised that at that time he could see a knife protruding from the left side of the child's head and a second knife protruding from the child's chest. Officer Puckett advised that the child moved at which time Mr. Wolf jumped back on the child yelling, "He's not dead. The devil is still in him". Officer Puckett advised that he struck Mr. Wolf in the side of the head knocking him off of the child. Officer Puckett advised that he observed that Mr. Wolf had removed the knife from the child's chest and it was lying on the ground where Mr. Wolf was reaching for it with his left hand. Officer Puckett advised that he again struck Mr. Wolf and grabbed the knife throwing it a short way down a hallway adjacent to the kitchen. Officer Puckett advised that Officer Craig Vowel arrived at that time and assisted in placing Mr. Wolf in custody. Officer Puckett advised that Nichols Hills Fire Department personnel arrived at that time followed shortly by EMSA personnel. Officer Puckett advised that he was told by EMSA personnel that the child was deceased.
