# CLARIFICATION OF HIS POSITIONS CONNECTED WITH LAW FOR THE PARTY OR GOVERNMENT

- 1. Started as free attorney for Party and its individual members, 1927-1930.
- 2. Reichsleiter, head oflegal section of Party 1930-1942, dismissed by Hitler.
- 3. Beverien Minister of Justice Merch 1933-December 1934.
- 4. Herd of Union of National Socialist Jurists, 1928-1942, dismissed by Hitler.
- 5. Reich Commisser for Unification of Legal Administration throughout Reich
  - (May 1933-Dec. 1934).
- 6. Reich Minister without Portfolio--simply & title, no functions, 1934-1945.
- 7. Member of Reichsteg, 1930-"end".
- 8. Governor General of Poland, 1939-"end".
- 9. Smell jobs: (1) Member of Perty Department dealing with investigations (2-5).

## RELATIONS WITH VON EPP AND DUTIES AS MINISTER OF BAVARIA

Knew him only efter 1929: wes his chief, as Beverien Minister of Justice. Von Epp got him this job in 1933. Duties: Carrying out Reich laws and general security of legal life. Names as revolutionaries against legal system: Rochm, Ketzmann, Berckel, Straicher, and Wagner. (6-8)
