Interrogation of KALTENBRUNNER, Ernst By: Lt. Col. Brookhart, 8 October, 1945 p. m., Nuremberg

## PUBLICATIONS:

Referring to Dr. Werner Best's book on the German Police System, Kaltenbrunner was referred to p. 98, "Build-up of German Police as of Summer 1940". Kaltenbrunner, scarcely looking at the chart, stated that it certainly could not be accurate because Hoydrich would never have built such an organization nor would Himmler ever fellow Best's suggestions. (pp 3-4)Kaltenbrunner further stated he knew nothing of the RSHA at that time. (pp 3-4)

Ernst Kaltenbrunner, 8 October 1945, p. 18.

Referring to another chart, "The Building of the SS", Summer 194 Kaltenbrunner stated that there were several mistakes. For example, at that time the inspectors of the Security Police and the SD were not subordinated to the higher SS and police leaders. He answered on the basis of his experience with the Vienna police in 1940. (5) Kalten brunner further states that he does not regard the book as authoritative. (p6)

## ORGANIZATION OF THE RSHA:

III B 4: Kaltenbrunner stated that he never knew Ramain, listed as head of the section dealing with citizenship and naturalization. He could not remember ever having received reports from this section (p6). Kaltenbrunner stated that if any criminal acts were committed regarding the subjects of citizenship and naturalization such were done under authority of Ant IV and not III, Ant IV being an executive police institution. (p 7)

III B5: Headed by Steinfurther; dealt with subject of eccupied territories. Kaltenbrunner stated he had never received my reports from this section nor did he know Steinfurther, but that he believed that the function of the section as stated is a recet. (p7)

Int III: Kaltenbrunner denied the truth of a queted statement, "Behind the harmless title (Nationality), Ant III was responsible for all crimes committed against foreigners within Germany or German eccupied territory, that such mistreatments were based upon recommendations by the SD Referat, IIIB. The quetation assumes that the SD had executive powers which it never possessed. (pp8-9)

Kaltenbrunner took issue with another statement to the effect that Ant III B largely shared the responsibility for (1) the climination of certain National Groups and the (2) Germanization of others, on the ground that no date was indicated. He concedes that if the statement refers to 1958 to 1939, the compation of Poland and Czecheslevakia during the reign of Heydrich, such might be possible, but if it refers to the period of Kaltenbrunner's effice (after 1943) the author of the statement had confused the SD with the Gestape. (pp9-11)

III C: Kaltenbrunner acknowledges knowing Dr. Spangler and his Deputy, Kid pinsky. On several eccaions Kaltenbrunner requested Kielpinsky to furnish him information relating to the 20 July incident. As for Spangler he states that he did not know that he was heading this group; that he had known Spangler when he was working under Dr. Scibert, IIID. (pll)
Kaltenbrunner states that of these listed under III C A, he know only Kielpinsky. (pl2)

lll D: Economics. He knew Sieber was head of the organization but that he did not knew of his Deputy, May. Kaltenbrunner received economic reports from Seibert regarding conditions in the Reich.

111 Da: No information

111 D b: Colonial oconomics. On the chart no individual is listed as having been assigned to this position. Kaltenbrunner stated that Ohlendorf was in charge of this matter and that he, Kaltenbrunner, had nothing to do with choosing the office holders. (pl3)

by Dr. Zehlein. Kaltenbrumer stated that he knew nothing of this organization. He had no contacts with these sections in view of the fact that the reports received by him came from Ohlenderf who in turn had received his reports from Seibert. "I did not knew whose reports they were." (p14)

Ant IV: Kaltenbrunner stated that he disclaims any responsibility for the action of this office, and likewise is unable to verify the organizational set-up as reflected by the chart. (pl5) He knew Mueller, categorically denies that he had any authority over him. He denied knewing Buchstein, the adjutant (pl6). He acknewledges knewing Huppenkothen, where, he recommended to albert Bermann as one who might be used in the matter of arresting Hermann Georing in Obert Salzburg since he knew Georing well and was acquainted with the region. (pp 16-17)

1V C s: Authority for arrest under provisions for protective custody were handled by this office. He denies that he had any authority for making arrests under this division, that such could be ordered only by Himmler of the Sperct Pilice. (pp 17-18)
