SCHELLENBURGS statement regarding DANISH EPRISALS

Owing to complaints by DOENITZ concerning the centinual increase of Resistance activities in Dermark, and sabotage which was directed mainly a minst the German Kriegsmarine, HITLER ordered a conference to discuss measures to be taken, and the following were present: -

FIRELER
KALTENBRUNNER
Dr. BEST, the Reichs Plenipotentiary for Denmark
Bovensiepen, The Wehrmachts C. in C. for Denmark
PANKE, HSSPf.
A number of officers, possi ly RIBBENTROF.

FITLER's orders to HMELLER were that sharper police measures were to be instituted, and reprisals made for every sabotage incident perpetrated. If Germans lost their lives, executions were to take place. HIMMLER in turn gave directions to PANKE and KALTERBRUNGER on these lines. KALTER-BRUNNER in turn ordered WUELLER and SKORZENY to talk the matter over with BOVENSIEPEN. SKORZENY intended to send a few of his trained sabotage experts to Denmark but SCHELLENBERG is unaware wheth r he actually did so. SC ELLENBERG recollects that SKORZENY made one trip only to Denmark, with the object possibly of entering into discussions with his chief colleague in Copenhagen, SCHWEDT. This latter individual was later replaced by one ISSEL. SCHELLENBERG claims that he last saw KALTENBRUS DER in Berlin about 16th or 17th April, 1945. On that occasion KALTENBRUNLER was accompanied by SCHWEDT and SCHELLENBERG therefore assumes that KALTENBRUNNER must have discussed matters affecting Dermark with this man. SCHELLENBERG believes that it was DOENSTZ who demanded the shooting of hostages for every sabotage incident which took place in Denmark against wharves and ships. At any rate BEST; the Reichs Plenipotentiary for Dermark, was very averse to these measures. KALTENBRUNGER evidently spoke at length with HITLER concerning Resistance in Demark and BEST's uncompromising attitude. On one occasion KALTENERUNNER told SC ELLENSERG that MITLES had "seen through" Dr. BEST, and had referred to him in a derogatory manner, saying that his name ought to be Dr. BEAST, not BEST. In april 1945 Dr. SEST complained bitterly to SCHELLENSERS about the attitude adopted towards him by HALTINGRUNNER and MUELLER of Amt IV. SCHELLENBERG also assumes that KALTENBRUNGER must have been responsible for counter-measures in Dermark. since he told SCHELLENBERG that he was about to send NAUJOCKS to Dermark on a mission. Both SKORZENY and NAUJOCKS co-operated closely with P VENCIEIEN. Individual reports were passed to MUELL R by the latter. On one occasion FITLER demanded a report on the situation in Demank and this was drawn up by SK RZENY. . SCHELLENBERG believes that KALTENBRUNNER must have discussed the contents of this report with FEGELEIN to the effect that HITLES was not satisfied with the report and required photographs depicting the various incidents. SKORZENY was ordered by SCHELLENBERG to discuss the matter with KALTERBRUNNER and in due course the same report, with photographs, was submitted to KALTENBRUNGER, who is believed by ELLENGERG to have laid it before HITLER.

SCHELLENBERG recalls a detail concerning a shooting incident in which a lane was involved. BOVENSIEPEN had apparently placed a police car, bearing a police number, at the disposal of one of his henckmen. During the course of the shooting incident the number of the car was noted by the Canish Criminal Police and a report was submitted to BOVENSIEPEN complaining that one of his cars had been used in the incident. SCHELLENBERG does not know the outcome of the affair. SCHELL-ENBERG definitely recalls that NAUJOCKS reported to him personally to say that he was being sent by KALTENBEUNNER on a mission to Dermark. CCHELLENBERG referred him to SKORZENY who he said was handling the matter.
