ROSENBERG was interrogated with regard to his knowledge of the arming of the Sudeten German Party, agitation by that party in Czechoslovakia, and the staging of fictitious incidents in Czechoslovakia. He was also interrogated regarding the staging of fictitious incidents in Poland just prior to the outbreak of the war. ROSENBERG stated that he had no information regarding either of the above matters nor did he know particularly who could furnish information thereon. He stated with respect to the Czechoslovakian situation that an official of the VDA would possibly know about it and with respect to the Polish situation that military or police authorities might know about it.
