MEMORANDUM TO GENERAL DOMOVANS

Baron Guenther von Haniel, a German national, fermerly demociled at the Heinhausen near Munich, and the sen of a fermer German Ambassader to Yashington. Haniel joined the SS in 1935, but according to his eva story succeeded in leaving the SS again in 1940 or 1941.

Hamiel claims to have participated in the attempt of July 20, 1944 to everthrow the Hitler regime. As a result he was persecuted by the Gestape.

Late in the summer of 1944, Haniel escaped into Switzerland. Late in 1944 Haniel centacted American representatives in Switzerland and stated that he wished to do everything in his power to contribute to the everthrow of Hatienal Socialism. He said he was willing to take any personal risk and to be prepared to go to Germany if by doing so he could help the Allied cause. Therewhen in March 1945, he proceeded from Switzerland to Munich under an assumed name. His mission was to astablish centact with Bayarian anti-masi resistance groups, also to centact certain efficials in the Gestape, when Haniel believed had turned against Hitler and therefore might be of help to the Allies.

After a short stay at Munich, Haniel fall into a Gestape trup, was arrested and threatened with execution.

Later on he was released and managed to return to Switzerland.

After this, Hamiel entered Munich with the American treeps and worked elessly with American intelligence efficers. He centributed materially in the capture and arrest of a number of preminent Mazis in the Munich area.
