Education and Work History: Albert Pietzsch, son of Professor Tilhelm Pietzsch, attended the Realgymnasion at Swickau until 1393, and subsequently received practical training in state laboratories and workshops. From 1894-1898 he studied mechanical engineering. He was Assistant Professor at the Electrotechnical Institute of the Technische Tochschule at Dresden in 1899 and 1900.

From 1900 until 1908 he was imployed as engineer at the Chemische Fabrik Buckan at Amendorf near Malle, where he developed new electrotechnical procedures for the production of chlorine and potash lye. During World lar I he served as an officer.

In 1909, together with Dr. G. Aldolph, he founded the Electrochemische Torke, Dr. Adolph, Pietzsch & Co. in Höllriegelskreuth, near funich, acting aspresident and "anager (Vorstand und Betriebsfüger) of this firm, which, in 1928, as transformed into a stock commany with a capital Education and Tork History, contide: of RM 3,000,000, under the name of Elektrochemische Terke, Munchen, AG. The company, owned almost exclusively by Pietzsch, specialized in the production of hydrogen peroxide and its derivatives, as well as persulfates and other chemical products.

In 1925, PietzSch became one of the active supporters of Mitter, and in 1927 he joined the NSDAP. On 31 October 1927 he as appointed Moonomic Advisor to Mitter's Deputy (Mirtschaftsberater des Stellvertreters des Führers), and in 193h be became head of the newly established Compber of Industry and Commerce (Industrie und Mandelskammer) of Tunich. In 1936 he was appointed head of the Matienal Economic Chamber (Reichswirtschaftskammer.

In 1914, Pietzsch was given by Hitler the title of "Pioneer of Labor", and in view of his age he was relieved of his post as h ad of the National Reconomic Chamber. (He was 70 years old then). In recognition of his service he was made Monorary President of the National Monomic Chamber for life. He was also given the Adlerschild of the German Neich, with the inscription "To the Leader and Promotor of German Toomony" (Dem Führer und Wörderer der Deutschen irtschaft. This award is indicative of his influential position and excellent reputation in Mazi circles. In the regional level of the economic administration Pietgsch acted as hold (Leiter) of the Industrie and Handelskarner and of the Tirschaftskarner Bayern. After the reorganization of the regional chamber system into so called Gauwirtschaftskarnern (Gau Economic Chambers), Pietzsch temporarily remained head of the Gadwirtschaftskanner München-Oberbavern. Pietzsch's political influence enabled him to expand his business positions. He became Deputy Chairman of the Board of Directors (Stellvertretender Verstand des Aufsichtsrats of the Bavrischer Lloyd Schiffahrts AG., Regensburg (which is controlled by the Göring combine) and member of the Advisory Board (Beirat) of the Deutsche Reichsbahn, Berlin, committee. Agreember of the Executive Cornittee of the Association for Southeastern Europe (Prasidium der Stdosteuropa Cesellschaft) in Vienna, he tried to promote the expansion of German trade in this area.

Piotzsch also became member on the Board of Directors (Aufsichtsrat) of the Siemens Schuckert Terke AG, Berlin.

The most prominent financial connections of Pietzsch were those with the Deutsche Bank, where he served as a member of the Advisory Board (Beirat), until in Tay 1943, he was advanced to the position of a Deputy Chairman (Stellvertretender Versitzender) of this body. In this capacity he acted as 'second representative' of the MSDAP (zweiter Vertrauensmann der Partoi) in the administration of the Deutsche Bank.

Other positions held by Pietzsch, include those of Deputy Chairman of the Board of Directors (Stellvertretender Vorstand des Aufsichtsrats) of the Bavaria Filmkunst Gard., Munich, and of a member of the Board of Directors (Aufsichtsrat) of the Aktienbrauerei zur Löwenbräu, Tunich.

Survary: As owner of a mediumsized industrial enterprise, and member of the board of directors of several important banking and industrial combines, as head of the National Economic Chamber and by virtue of the influential positions which he held in the regional administration of German industry and commerce for more than a decade after the Nazis gained control, Pietzsch must be held responsible for economic policies and measures adopted by the German government during that period.
