1. DOCUMENTATION DIVISION LECTURES: The following lecture will conclude the series which has been presented at the Grand Hotel at 1930 Hours: Wednesday, this evening, - "THE CASE AGAINST A CRIMINAL ORGANIZATION, THE GESTAPO", by Lt. Whitney Harris.

2. TRAVELERS CHECKS: Lt. Hare, Room 115, is now able to take care of cashing Travelers Checks for O.C.C. personnel. There is only one stipulation. The checks must be endorsed in the presence of Lt. Hare. Checks previously endorsed cannot be accepted.

3. RCA COMMUNICATION SERVICE AVAILABLE: RCA Communications is open for direct radio communications to the United States for all personnel in this command. Private messages can be sent to the United States under the following conditions: (1) File the message in Room 115. (2) The most popular form of message is the Victory Letter (Vlt) which costs eighty-seven pfennig per word to any point in the United States except New York City, where the rate is only sixty-seven pfennig. (3) The price of the message is rounded to the next higher half mark. (4) The message is delivered overnight in the United States. (5) In certain urgent cases more rapid forms of radiograms can be used at higher rates. (6) The minimum number of words for a VLT is ten. (7) When counting words, all words in address and in the signature are included. Inform your correspondents they can communicate with you if you are registered in the Justice roster, by filing a message in any telegraph office and marking it via RCA. Address should include first name, last name, Justice, Nurnberg. Message will be delivered to your Division and thence to your office. (Hence the importance of your notifying the Administrative Division, Room 172, of all changes in your location.)

4. LOST: A blue-gold Parker 51" fountain pen, possibly near cafeteria, or somewhere in this building. Please return to Frances Campbell, Room 261.

5. MESSING FACILITIES: Persons living on Schlegel Strasse and vicinity should take their breakfast and evening meals at the 16 Schlegel Strasse Mess. (Residents of 4 Moericker Strasse and 4 Hebbel Strasse are within a short walking distance of the mess and are included in this group.) Persons living on Linden Strasse, Atlinger Strasse, and Park Strasse should take their breakfast and dinner meals at the 17 Atlinger Strasse mess.

It is the desire of this Office not to overtax the Grand Hotel facilities, and to provide good messes near the billets. Therefore, persons residing near the above mentioned messes should use the Grand Hotel only under extraordinary circumstances.

6. NURNBERG OPERA HOUSE: Wednesday, 24 October, 1930 Hrs - Movie "BLOND RANSOM" with Virginia Gray. Tickets not required.

OPERA HOUSE (Cont'd): Thursday, 25 October and Friday, 26 October - USO Show, "WOODEN SHOES". Tickets may be secured from Room 73.

Saturday, 27 October and Sunday, 28 October, 1930 Hrs - GFRS Show "RHYTHM RATIONS"; tickets may be secured from Room 73.

Sunday, 1400 Hrs - Concert - Music by Mozart and Schubert. Tickets available in Room 73.

7. SPECIAL SERVICES TRIPS: The following trips will be conducted on Sunday, 28 October. Kindly sign up for them in Room 172 as soon as possible, since accommodations are limited and a policy of first come first served will be followed.

a. MUNICH AND DACHAU: Leaving the Grand Hotel at 0930 Hrs, returning at approximately 2000 or 2100 Hrs. Travel in C&R cars. Accommodations for 20 people.

b. BAYREUTH: Leaving the Grand Hotel at 1300. Here will be a guide to conduct a tour of the city and places of interest, birthplace of Wagner, etc. Accommodations for 30 people.

c. POTTENSTEIN: Leaving the Grand Hotel at 1330. A pleasant drive through picturesque country, with a chance to ramble in the hills, visit the caves under the guidance of a native; sup as a guest of the Army unit here. Please wear suitable shoes.

8. FOOTBALL GAME: Sunday, 28 October. Bus leaving the Grand Hotel at 1345 for the Stadium where the undefeated 1st Division will settle with the 80th Division.
