- 1. PICK-UP POINT: All persons calling for transportation from the Motor Pool will meet the car in the courtyard of the Court House at a point established in the northeast corner of the courtyard and destabled by a sign reading "Pick up Point". The buses will continue to take and descharge passengers outside, on the street, by the East Gate as in the pass, because they are too large to enter into the courtyard.
- 2. OFFICE HOURS: Personnel of this organization are reminded that the regular office hours are from 0000 to 1770, with the held hour for hush, Monday through Saturday. This means that all offices will be open Saturday afternoon until 1730. In no instance will a division, branch or section be entirely closed on Saturday afternoon. Persons may be excused individually by the chiefs of their sections, and if so, any time which they take out on Saturday will be deducted from the overtime represented by the eight hours of Saturday. Time reports for all civilians, covering each week, will be submitted to the Administrative Divis in in Room 172 not later than Muscay nor earlier than Muscay following the week reported upon. These time report forms are being prepared and will be issued to the various offices.
- 3. <u>VOLUNTEER TYPIST POOL</u>: In spite of the assistance of a German typist force as previously announced in this Eulletin, the volunteer typist pool will be continued for a few days, in order to take care of material that cannot be handled by the Germans. Volunteers will please contact the Administrative Division, Telephone 61172.
- 4. COURT HOUSE CAMETERIA: In order to better accommodate the employees of the Office of U.S. Thies of Counsel, the cafeteria in the Court House will open at 1130 rather than at 1200. With this additional half hour, it is believed that the lunch periods of employees of each undividual office can be staggered in such a way as to provide adequate coverage in each office at all times during the official office hours from 0900 to 1750. All employees of the same office should not take their lunch period simultaneously, leaving no one to enswer telephones or transact business which may arise during the noon period.
- 5. MESSENCER SERVICE: The messenger service will be continued as in the past and it is contemplated that it will be completely reorganized shortly to take care of the considerable amount of change new being undergone by this organization. Meanwhile, all sections and offices which now have messengers attached to their staffs are unged to send those messengers round times daily to Room 9 where a general chearing station is being established. It is felt that these four special trips to the clearing station, plus the six daily rounds of the regular messenger, will insure continuous delivery of messages within the Court House.
