EGR's Accomplishments

Creative, energetic presence at General Convention.

- spearheaded effort to make MDGs the Church's No. 1 mission priority.
- Jam-packed U2charist set a missionary tone for Convention – 700 people. Incredible energy.

Growth of a grassroots network that is transforming the church for mission

- 130 diocesan contact people in 75 dioceses
- 4,000 people receiving bi-monthly e-newsletter
- More than 800 youth/young adults networked online on Facebook (social networking site)
- Spearheaded "U2charist movement" raising more than \$260,000 for MDGs. More than 100 U2charists held on four continents.
- EGR's website is the primary destination in the church for people looking for MDG resources.

Forging partnerships for creative mission

- Brings together wide variety of groups for creative mission and ministry opportunities.
- Provides keynote speakers, preachers, workshop leaders for diocesan conventions, provincial gatherings, clergy gatherings and more.
- Provides countless hours of personal consulting for individuals and congregations.

- We're a community where people across the theological/political spectrum of the church come together to work, pray & celebrate God's mission.

EGR's Mission

Continue to direct the Church's attention globally

Using the Millennium Development Goals as a structure for living out Christ's call to seek and serve him in "the least of these" (Matthew 25)

Make explicit the Christ center of the MDG movement in the Church

Draw people to this mission not as a secular agenda but as a way to fulfill Jesus' words "that all might have life and have it in abundance."
(John 10:10)

Herald a call to conversion at every level of our common life

Lift up the opportunity and need for confession, repentance and amendment of life. Let Christ change us so we can be part of God's mission of global reconciliation – individually and corporately.

EGR's Priorities for 2008

Communications/Resourcing

*EGR as resource center. Make the website and the rest of our internet presence (blog, listserv, Facebook, etc.) the best gathering place and two-way (uploading and downloading) resource for this mission it can be.

Education

*EGR as herald. Provide and resource preachers, teachers, speakers, authors and artists to spread this mission across the church.

Connection

*EGR as network and movement – continue to grow the churchwide network and nurture that network to grow not just in breadth but in depth. Facilitate new opportunities for connection and partnership in mission.
