

# Imagination and Poetry at the Ball Park and in Church

Next week's school bells signal the end of summer. With August's dog days bearing down on us, I realized certain summer rituals hadn't been enacted. So last night, my wife Tippy, our son Case, and I found ourselves at Joe Davis Stadium rooting for the Huntsville Stars, drawn by the lure of the game and its poetry and imagination. Cheering on our *Boys of Summer*, the ball park evokes strong memories of good times past from little league to the Braves winning the Series; memories of true American sports heroes like Joe Di-Maggio and Jackie Robinson, Hank Aaron and Mickey Mantle, Tom Glavine and John Smoltz.

For baseball purists, there is no need for the gimmicks offered at the ball park to keep folks interested. No need for Kraft Single Two-for-One Ticket Tuesdays or Thirsty Thursdays; no need for the chicken dance or the umpteen races and other cutesy stunts pulled between innings. Who wants pizza or buffalo chicken sandwiches and 31 flavors of ice cream or fruit smoothies when peanuts, cold Budweiser, hot dogs, Cracker Jacks, and Coke are all one needs to sustain a ballgame appetite!

Thinking about all the gimmicks at the ball park clouding the majesty of the game reminded me of an interfaith colleague from Anderson, South Carolina. He was the pastor of a growing, and I mean really growing, mega-type church. He was proud of the increasing numbers. He shared stories of how their 27 member rock band blew the people out of the water and how his big screen multi-media player would flash sentimental images and music just at the right point in his sermons to grab people's attention and bring them to their knees at the altar call, as he liked to put it.

As Christmas was approaching, he excitedly told me about his plans on the Sunday before Christmas to descend into the congregation on a guide wire, dressed as Santa Claus, and kneel at the live Manger scene, really showing people what Christmas was all about! I asked what he would do for Christmas Eve or Christmas Day itself and he said, "Oh we don't come to church then, we've already celebrated."

Poetry and imagination, beauty and holiness, history and tradition are offered in the Episcopal Church. No gimmicks and stunts are needed to draw us in and keep us interested. I guess you could call us Episcopalians "worship purists." For sure, our altar call puts us on our knees, but without the emotional gimmicks. As move forward to the altar rail, sharing in the Communion of Christ's body and blood, we receive the only food needed to sustain our lives.

Majestic music that has inspired through the centuries echoes forth within the prayer-soaked walls of our beautiful and hallowed church. The prayers and preaching and sights and sounds, evoke our senses and imagination. Along with worship, Bible studies and book classes that engage our minds, outreach efforts that engage our hearts, and fellow-ship opportunities that help us know Christ's presence among us, keep us coming back.

With school bells ringing next week, it's time for us Episcopal *purists* to come back together and enact the rituals and follow the schedules that sustain our lives and, through us, sustain the world. Come out regularly to this place of poetry and imagination, beauty and holiness.

# Gazpacho

#### Ingredients:

- 2 large tomatoes
- 1 medium cucumber, pealed and chopped
- 1 green or red pepper, seeded and chopped
- 1 medium onion
- 1-2 cloves garlic
- 3-4 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 5 tablespoons of water (add more or less according to the consistency you prefer)
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

#### **Directions:**

Place ingredients into a blender and blend until smooth. Pour the puree through a sieve & refrigerate until chilled. Serves four.

#### Garnish:

Just before serving sprinkle with additional chopped cucumber, tomato, and green pepper.

# GreenScaping -

Reminders: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Rebuy Article 2 - Reuse

#### Waste

- Take apart nonreturnable wood pallets to reuse the wood (e.g., edging around plant beds) or chip it for use on site for mulch.
- Chip woody waste and tree clippings into mulch for use on-site.
- Donate healthy plants to local nonprofit organizations when reconfiguring or removing trees and shrubs from your landscape.
- Reuse or increase the use and efficiency of existing sites before cutting into new sites.
   Reuse soils within the work site; create mounds or berms to serve as wind breaks or to add visual interest.

#### Water

Use gray water, reclaimed water, or collected rainwater for irrigation and equipment wash downs.

# Article 3 - Recycle

## Waste


- Recycle bedding trays and plant containers from annuals and other greenery
- Triple rinse and recycle plastic commercial containers.
- Recycle used oil and tires from your vehicles and equipment.
- Provide recycling receptacles next to trash receptacles.
- Send green waste and food waste that cannot be composted on site to a local composting facility.

Reclaim land - turn waste land into usable property and a valuable asset.

Recycle gray water for irrigation and equipment wash downs.
