

The mission of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity, as part of the family of God, is to proclaim and spread the word and work of God through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, by Eucharistic worship and by ministry to the world.

Rebuilding the Church

On Sunday, September 26, we celebrate St. Francis Day at Nativity. We celebrate God's love and care for all creation bringing our beloved pets with us to church at 8:45 and for the pet blessing at 10:00. Last year, we started a great tradition of holding the Heifer Market Art Fair at 10:00 in the Parish Hall. This vital ministry that our children have led for over 20 years now has resulted in Nativity's reaching out to families across the globe, providing the means of sustainable livelihood through Heifer International's provision of cows, goats, sheep, chickens, and other livestock that produce recurring income and food for the most vulnerable.

Over 800 years ago Francis knelt in the small church of San Damien outside of Assisi and heard Christ tell him in his prayers, "Francis, rebuild my church." Although the church of San Damien was in dire need of physical repair, Francis heard these words as a deeper call to rebuild the church through people's lives and hearts. San Damien was repaired and Francis began his work in the church calling people to a deeper awareness of God's love and mercy. The Kingdom of God increased through a spiritually renewed and rebuilt church.

We began rebuilding Nativity in 2008 after a most generous capital campaign. But we not only began rebuilding and restoring our beloved church buildings, the spiritual foundations of our lives are being rebuilt in significant ways. We see a renewed offering of hearts and lives to Christ. On Sundays and Wednesdays, the halls of Nativity are alive with energy. The classrooms are bustling and the pews full.

A renewed sense of life and ministry at Nativity calls us to be a part of Sunday and midweek worship, Church School classes and weekly Bible Studies, EFM, centering prayer and reunion groups. Outreach and pastoral care, Wednesday night suppers and monthly fellowship groups, choirs and beautiful music enable us to be the people God has created us to be: faithful stewards of our time, talent and resources. We are becoming larger instruments of God's peace, as Francis' prayer bids.

Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Where there is hatred, let us sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is discord, union; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. Grant that we may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

St. Francis rebuilt his life and subsequently the church on the strong foundation of Christ Jesus. Francis learned that our lives are meant to be vessels of God's love, even as Christ's life was poured out for the sake of the world on the cross. There is much to be rebuilt in our lives and in our nation, even the world. he rebuilding we do at Nativity calls us to be a part of God's Kingdom's increasing in the world. As we become instruments and servants of Christ's peace in all that we do, God is building an unshakeable foundation. So, let us continue building...





JUST DO IT – AGENTS OF GRACE is Nativity's effort to help our parishioners reach out to be "doers of the word". The intent of the program is to bring the needs of our community before the people of Nativity so that

those who wish to help are afforded an opportunity. It is a communication program that will help put feet to our faith, so to speak. The needs will be communicated to the parish via email, the Nativity website, and the Steeple.

AGENTS OF GRACE ARE Volunteers— you and me, the people of Nativity. Volunteer needs may be short term, one time only, or ongoing.

CAN YOU HELP – Watch for occasional emails and Steeple articles from Just Do It. When you receive an email and see something you can help with, just hit reply and an Arch Agent (volunteer coordinator) will follow-up with you. If you read about something you can do send an email to Just Do It. If you do not use email you may telephone the Arch Agent on call.

HERE ARE OUR VERY FIRST VOLUNTEER ASSISTANCE REQUESTS:

READING AND MATH BUDDIES – Ridgecrest School – located just off Drake Avenue near the Arsenal. There are 435 students in grades K-5 with 89% of the student population receiving free/reduced meals each day. Reading buddies are needed for grades 1-5 and math buddies for grades 3-5. You may choose your days, time, age child and subject (reading, math, or both). Usually volunteers work with students for about 30 minutes per week. Volunteer training will be provided. You could be the volunteer that makes a difference in a child's life. Reading is the foundation of education!!

<u>Library Assistant</u> – Ridgecrest School –The student population is one in which a book given to a child at school might be the first book that child has ever known. Check books in and out of the school library. One hour shifts, Monday – Friday from 8:00 -1:00. Volunteers may work one hour or more per week.

<u>Habit at for Humanity – Volunteers</u> needed to make repairs on houses that are being renovated for Habitat - all activities from nailing to mopping. Up to 10 volunteers needed on Tuesdays and/or Thursdays from 8:00 to 2:00. You may choose to work one time, or as many times as possible. Also need a group of 5 or more volunteers on Saturdays from 8:00 – 2:00. See something in this article you can do?

The Episcopal Church is joining other religious denominations and groups in calling for a national day of prayer and action for the Gulf of Mexico on Sunday, October 3rd. Called "Seeking God's Grace for the Gulf: A Day of Worship, Reflection and Healing," the effort is led by the National Council of Churches Eco-Justice Working Group.
