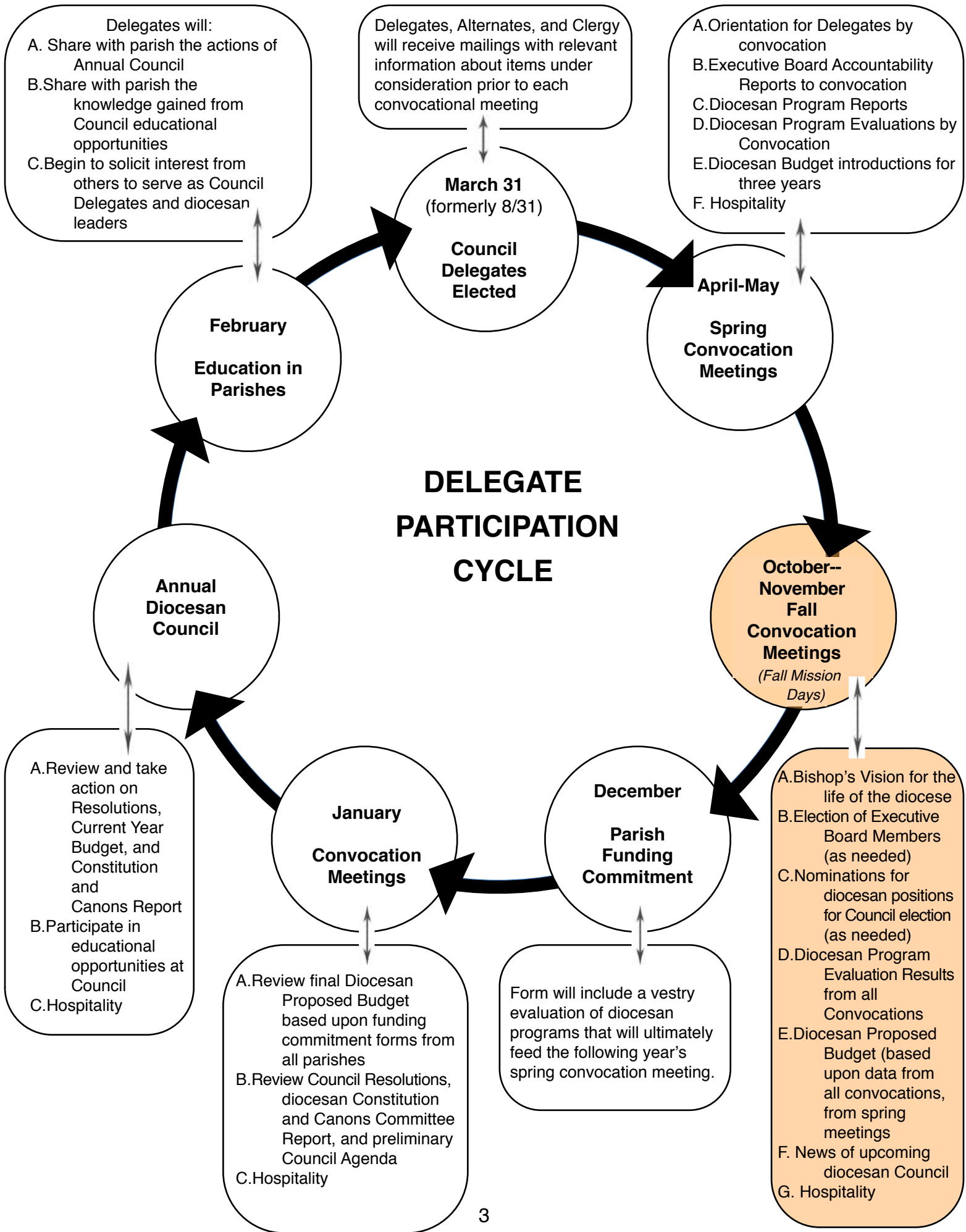

Where We Stand; Where We Hope to Be

I have the opportunity to provide you with a few snapshots of interest relative to our financial picture:

The year-end 2009 audit of the finances of the diocese was completed with no exceptions listed or actions outlined for corrective action. Good news! The audited operating reserve stands at a little over \$6,000.00. Not so good news! The operating reserve should be at least \$50,000 in the opinion of the finance committee.

The latest financial report we have reviewed prior to the printing and publication of this convocation meeting booklet is recorded as of July 31, 2010. I can say that our expenses were right on track with what we budgeted at that juncture of 7/12th of the year, and my expectation is that this will continue through the year. Our income,

particularly the timely payment of Voluntary Proportionate Giving pledges, is lagging by about 5%. This is not unusual for the summer months.

Contributions received to date are a little over 40% of what has been budgeted for the year. They have slowed down and are lagging behind. This is a matter of concern once again this year. As a diocese, we must still raise almost \$25,000.00 of the \$37,000.00 that we agreed at our last Annual Council we would raise from additional (non-pledged) contributions in order to have a chance at balancing our budget in 2010.

The finance committee of the executive board has chosen to meet on a monthly basis. There are a few new concerns about the diocesan budget. We adopted a

budget with a deficit of over \$10,000.00 at Council. We were aware of this. We have recently been informed by a parish that it will be unable to pay its remaining pledge in the amount of \$14,000.00. Now our potential deficit could be in excess of \$24,000.00. As noted earlier, our operating reserve is a little over \$6,000, so the deficit could be \$18,000.00 or more.

The finance committee is requesting that the diocesan staff as well as the program and ministry units of the entire diocese be mindful of not spending funds unless absolutely necessary. The finance committee will also be recommending that the three open positions in the diocesan office not be filled until 2011, following the next Council-adopted budget.

The **Finance Committee** prepares the draft diocesan budget, reviews monthly financial reports, receives ministry funding requests, and reviews financial matters to come before the whole board.

The **Long Range Plan Follow-Up Committee** reviews the Long Range Plan and monitors progress on its implementation. Committee members present reports to the whole board, and at the convocation meetings regarding the status of items in the Long Range Plan.

The **Mission Committee** combines the work of the former Program Grants and Outreach committees. Outreach Grant and St. Nicholas Day Grant applications are reviewed and recipients presented to the whole board. This committee also monitors ministries that receive diocesan funding.

The **Personnel and Property Committee** oversees Evans House staff, property, and related policies; reviews COLA recommendations for diocesan staff and clergy compensation.

Appendix H Continued

CANON 27 (Effective January 1, 2011)

Sec. 1 Those provisions of Title IV of the Canons of the General Convention which are applicable to this diocese are hereby incorporated as part of this Canon. To the extent, if any, that any of the provisions of this Canon are in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of Title IV of the Canons of the General Convention, the provisions of Title IV of the Canons of the General Convention shall govern.

Sec. 2 Disciplinary Board:

(a) The Disciplinary Board shall consist of seven persons, four (4) of whom are members of the clergy and three (3) of whom are members of the laity.

The clergy members of the Disciplinary Board must be canonically and geographically resident within the Diocese of Southwestern Virginia. The lay members of the Disciplinary Board shall be adult communicants in good standing of this church, and geographically resident in this diocese.

(b) The members of the Disciplinary Board shall be elected by Council in the following manner:

i. At the January 2011 meeting of the Council, the Council shall elect four (4) clergy members and three (3) lay members of the Disciplinary Board for a term beginning July 1, 2011. The four (4) clergy members will be nominated and elected for initial staggered terms expiring at the conclusion of the Council meetings in January 2012, January 2013, January 2014 and January 2015, respectively.

The three (3) lay members will be nominated and elected for initial, staggered terms expiring at the conclusion of the Council meetings in January 2012, January 2013 and January 2014, respectively.

ii. At the January 2012 meeting of the Council, and at each annual Council meeting thereafter, the Council shall elect one (1) clergy member and one (1) lay member to the Disciplinary Board, each for a term of three (3) years, to replace the members whose terms are expiring. The term of members elected at the January 2012 meeting of the Council, and by any Council thereafter, shall commence on the first (1st) business day following election.

iii. Members of the Disciplinary Board may succeed themselves once and may be reelected (and succeed themselves once again) after a hiatus of at least two (2) years.

iv. Members of the Standing Committee shall be eligible to serve on the Disciplinary Board.

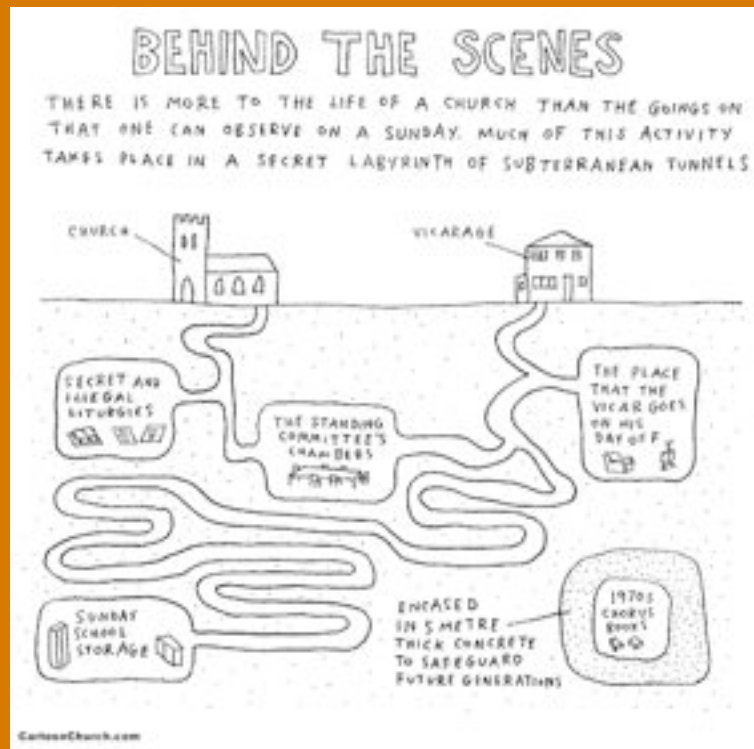
