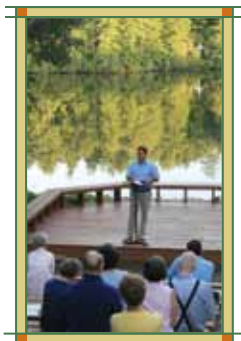

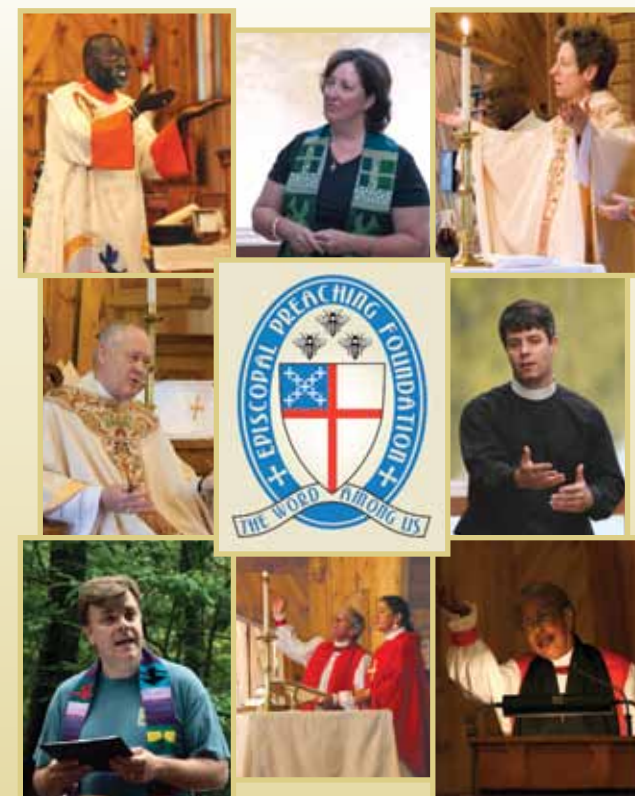

The Episcopal Preaching Foundation's annual Preaching Excellence Program, are where participants will present a favorite sermon for feedback, critique and discussion.

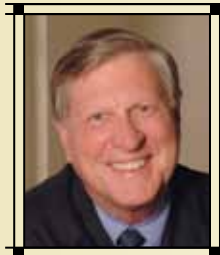
Conference Speakers

The Most Rev. **Katharine Jefferts Schori** was elected presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church in June 2006 and serves as chief pastor and primate to the Church's members in 16 countries and 110 dioceses. Ordained in 1994, she was a priest, university lecturer and hospice chaplain in Oregon before serving as bishop of Nevada from 2001-2006. A graduate of EPF's Preaching Excellence Program, she is the author of *Gospel in the Global Village* and *A Wing and a Prayer*.



The Rev. Dr. **William Willimon** has been the bishop of North Alabama for the United Methodist Church since 2004 and for 20 years served as dean of the Chapel and professor of Christian ministry at Duke University. He has authored 60 books, including *Worship as Pastoral Care* which was selected as one of the 10 most useful books for pastors by the Academy of Parish Clergy.

The Rev. Dr. **Thomas Long** is the Bandy Professor of Preaching at Emory University's Candler School of Theology in Atlanta. He is the author of 13 books including *Preaching and the Literary Forms of the Bible*, *Beyond the Worship Wars: Building Vital and Faithful Worship* and *The Witness of Preaching*.



Lauren Winner is the author of *Girl Meets God* and *Mudhouse Sabbath*. She was the former book editor for Beliefnet.com and currently serves as an assistant professor of Christian spirituality at Duke Divinity School in Durham, N.C.

The Rev. **Martin Smith** is senior associate rector at St. Columba's Episcopal Church in Washington, D.C., and the author of the books *A Season for the Spirit*, *The Word is Very Near You*, *Reconciliation and Compass and Stars*.
