PAIN RELIEVER (No Aspirin)

Acetaminophen generic (same as **Tylenol brand name) Infant drops, liquid, children's chewable

COUGH/COLD/ALLERGY/ANTIHISTAMINES/DECONGESTANTS

Generic or same as: **Robitussin DM,
Infant drops, liquid and children's chewable

ANTI-NAUSEA/ANTI-GAS

Generic: *Phosphorated carbohydrate solution*,
(same as brand name **Emetrol) Infant drops

Generic: *Simethicone* (same as brand name
**Mylicon) Infant drops

CREAMS/OINTMENTS

Triple antibiotic cream/ointment (any brand name/generic)

1% *Tolnaftate* (same as **Tinactin)

1% *Hydrocortisone* cream/ointment (any brand name/generic)

VITAMINS (any generic brands)

Infant drops, children's chewable and pre-natal

TOOTHBRUSHES (no toothpaste)

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Due to shipping weight, only these listed over-the-counter medications can be sent. Medicines must have at least 1-year valid expiration date.

FOR VALUE ALWAYS BUY GENERIC WHEN AVAILABLE.

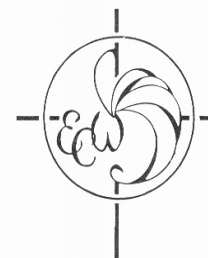

The Rt. Rev. Duncan M. Gray III

As Bishop of Mississippi, Duncan Montgomery Gray III has led the diocese into an ever-deepening understanding of a vision of "One Church in Mission: Inviting, Transforming, Reconciling." He has challenged the diocese to a deeper faithfulness with a series of teachings and program initiatives that encourage "out-of-the-box thinking" to affect the mission imperatives of the church of Jesus Christ. He has a particular interest in development of different models of leadership to address the challenges of the church in a post-modern era.

Gray has served as two-time deputy to the triennial General Convention for the Episcopal Church, USA. He was a member of the Joint Committee for the Nomination of the Presiding Bishop and is currently a member of the Board of Directors for the College of Bishops. Gray was a four-time Synod deputy and serves on the Episcopal Church's Court of Review. He was a participant in and served on the board for the diocesan Honduras Medical Mission and has added a Medical Mission to Panama during his episcopate.

Gray was elected bishop coadjutor of the Diocese of Mississippi in February of 2000 and was consecrated in June 2000. He received his B.A. from the University of Mississippi, Masters of Divinity from Virginia Theological Seminary and Doctor of Ministry from the University of the South. Gray was ordained to the diaconate in 1975 and to the priesthood in 1976. From 1985 until his consecration as bishop, Gray was rector of St. Peter's, Oxford,

Bishop Gray and his wife, the former Kathryn Ellen Whittlesey, have two sons, Duncan IV (wife, Amber) and Peter (wife, Giulianianna), a foster daughter, Tabitha Agany, and two granddaughters, Harper Elizabeth and Sadie Alan Gray.
