Advent Waiting: Walking in the Dark

Excerpts from Andy Anderson's Advent 2 Homily

In Advent, just as the days have a longer period of darkness, recent global events make the world seem relentlessly dark: fragile economies in Europe and at home, terrorism and world peace, global poverty; and a political climate that is ignoring the hard, tough choices needed to sustain life for all. The season of Advent we observe plays out against all of this; particularly against the backdrop of a materialist culture seducing us into affirming ourselves by what we buy or consume; that others will love us because of what we buy for them.

Advent responds by reminding us that a child is in the womb yet waiting to be born. This child first came into the midst of a world and time very much like our own 2000 years ago. And he wants to be born in our own time and day. His birth which dark Advent anticipates is a light in the darkness. The darkness cannot overcome this light. In Advent, even in the dark, we are people of hope. We yearn for and expect the light that has come into the world in the Child whose birth we will celebrate at Christmas.

But to get to that birth, we must pause and let John the Baptist do his work, listening to the words he hurls at us in the dark, "Prepare the way of the Lord. Make God's paths straight!" John wants to lead us out of the darkness of our lives and world. But John's message is hard. We'd prefer to hear about the wonderful baby to be born in a stable surrounded by animals. "But you are not ready for that story," John insists. The church won't let us get to the child in the manger without first dealing with this tough prophet. "Repent. Prepare the way of the Lord," he says. "Change your ways."

John the Baptist lets us know that before we can get to the God who meets us in the manger, we've got some work to do. Someone once said God may take us "Just as I am," but God never leaves us "just as we are." If we are going to grow in knowing God, we have some work to do. There are many things that get in the way of more and more people's knowing the kind of life God wants for all. It is not only the materialism that the culture around promotes, but our own self-absorption that keeps us from forgiving others and giving the most important things in our lives the time so badly needed. We are so busy. We don't know how to slow down and listen to the yearnings of our heart's desires; desires that are really God's desires for us. We are afraid of the darkness of our own lives, of our addictions or failures and loss, and so we become immobile, choosing not to move in the dark towards life.

In our nation there are obstacles to jobs, to education, to health care, to peace and safety and dignity that must be removed if we are serious about who this Babe of Bethlehem grew up be. John the Baptist gets us ready for the new life God wants to give us and to give the world in Christ Jesus. But first, in our personal lives and in the world, there is some rearranging that needs to take place, some tearing down and some building up.

It is dark out there, and to walk in the dark, we need a level, straight road. To walk in the dark towards the light of Christ's presence, we must reassess our values, the allocation of our resources and even our hopes. The wonderful news of Christmas first comes with a challenge: the birth does not come without the birth pains. New life does not come without the cost of changing the old. Advent calls for us to move around the pieces of our lives so we can walk through the dark. It means giving God some time to grow in trust and grace.

Advent calls also us to help others find a way in the dark. We will meet Jesus in our neighbors, and especially where he said we would find him: among the poor and struggling of this world. It begins with reconstruction in our own lives. But God wants more of us. The level way out of the dark calls us to consider the economy and its implications for all; to consider healthcare and responsible care for this fragile earth our island home; to consider education and jobs creation and immigration and poverty in our nation and in our global family.

What would a level path to God mean for all people? John the Baptist comes right in the beginning of dark Advent and tells us to make a straight road to God's love and mercy. John draws from words of comfort preached by the Prophet Isaiah when the people of Israel were in captivity and struggling to find a way home, a way to life. What words of comfort need to be proclaimed in the midst of these dark times we live in? Level the hills that get in the way, raise the valleys, rearrange the furniture!

How each one of us does this is matter of faithful discernment. It takes time. And we must always remember that like John the Baptist, we are not the light, but we point to one whose sandals we are not worthy to stoop down and untie. We point always to Christ, not our selves. Although the world is dark, Advent helps us to walk in the dark while we wait for the light. It is no idle hoping or waiting that we do. The world needs for us not to be afraid, to learn to walk in the dark, to make a level path. There is a child waiting to be born; new life to receive!
