The Church of the Nativity

March 7, 2012

The mission of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity, as part of the family of God, is to proclaim and spread the word and work of God through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, by Eucharistic worship and by ministry to the world.

Taking Nativity into the Workplace

On Tuesday, we did something different this Lent. Nativity went to the workplace. Instead of inviting people to the church for our Tuesday Noonday preaching service, Nativity went west, to Cummings Research Park, right into the heart of one of Huntsville's major business centers. Many of our folks work out that way and so it is difficult for them to get into town in the middle of the day. So we made our way to them and to others who might not find it so easy to get to us.

Tuesday wasn't only for our folks—we invited the workforce out that way, many of us bringing our work colleagues. I invited two non-Nativity friends from the gym who work on the Arsenal and they both showed! We took the church out there into the world for the world to have greater access to what we have discovered is life giving and a well of hope for us. Many of us travelled from downtown and other parts of Huntsville to be the church out there, outside of and away from our familiar place of being church at 208 Eustis Avenue. Offering hospitality in a foreign land we might say! Many have never even been out to Cummings Research Park, which in many ways, serves as another hub of our city. It was good for us to go. It was good this Lent to take the church beyond our corner of Eustis and Greene. It was good to be reminded that there are others who are looking for good news.

Lent is a time to think outside of the box, to do things differently, to get out of our spiritual ruts so that God can forge new paths of grace; so that faith can be strengthened in new and broader ways. But the things we do in Lent aren't meant to be isolated and singular, Lent's work is like the work of spring from which it gets its name: we prepare the ground and soil of our lives, we plant seeds and fertilize and weed and mulch for the new growth that God gives.

The Church does not exist for our sakes, but for the sake of the world for which Christ died and rose again. Archbishop of Canterbury William Temple said the church only exists for those who do not yet belong to it. And so Christian ministry and hospitality ultimately must go out there: into the workplace, the marketplace, the schoolyard, and into the depths of life in its hardest places. We are called to take Nativity into our workplace and beyond each and every day, wherever that may be for us.

Our faith is not just something that is practiced on Sunday or when we attend events at Nativity. Our faith is to be lived and shared with the world each and every day. Each day, you are inviting others to know faith or not know faith by the way you live your life. Faith is revealed in the decisions you make regarding business matters, your school work, your community service, employment relations, and in all the ways we deal with others. How you spend your money, how you organize your time, what priorities you choose, how you vote, the jokes you tell, all point to the faith within that flows out from the center of your heart and life. Nativity is always in the workplace whether we realize it or not.

This Lent, may we pay attention to and do those things that will help our faith grow in the workplace. May we grow in Christ's love that came to us, right into the depths of our lives, to give us life and peace at a terrible price and an immense glory. God's love in Christ has reached beyond eternity to meet you just where you are. May this love enlarge your heart to find others who do not yet belong to the church, and who God is calling you to love and serve.

- It takes about \$26,000 each WEEK to orchestrate the ministries of the church
- Most of our expenses are relatively fixed (e.g., personnel, building and grounds, our covenant with the Diocese and Sewanee) and account for the vast majority of our budget
- Outlays for education, programming, and outreach are "squeezed" when revenues fall below expectations

The Vestry has high hopes for improving our support for youth and children, seniors, outreach, historic preservation, and our covenant with the Diocese. However, with our current pledges, they are unable to do so and will be forced to fund these programs at a level that is below what was requested. We know that you do not want to see these (and possibly other) programs cut or under-funded, but the reality is that we will have no choice if more people do not generously make and keep a pledge to the church.

How has Nativity touched your life? Maybe it is through our many worship services in our historic buildings. Maybe is it through a sacrament of baptism, confirmation, marriage, or burial for a member of your family. Maybe it is through one of the many fine educational offerings at Nativity for you and/or your children. Or, maybe it is through the sharing of joy, recovery, or grief through our pastoral care services. In whatever way you have been touched through the many ministries of Nativity, please thank the more than 415 families who have committed to supporting the continuation of these ministries through gifts of their financial resources.

Stewardship of Creation Article March 7, 2012

In the <u>immortal words of Mr. McGuire</u> from *The Graduate*: "I just want to say one word to you. Just one word. . . . Are you listening? . . . Plastics."

Educate Yourself on Plastic Recycling

It is easy to mistake the "chasing arrows" symbol as a sign that a material is recyclable, but you might be shocked to learn that it only denotes products that are plastic. Not all plastic is easily recyclable; moreover, a lot of plastic ends up in the landfill, or worse — en route to the Great Pacific Garbage Patch. We encourage you to read up on the fate of everyday plastics; you may find it is more complicated than you once thought. Know when to reduce, when to recycle, and when to reuse.

A misconception: Our choice is limited to recycling or wasting.

Source reduction is preferable for many types of plastic and isn't difficult. Opportunities include using refillable containers, buying in bulk, buying things that don't need much packaging, and buying things in recyclable and recycled packages.

Strategies to Reduce the Environmental Impact of Plastics

1. Reduce the use

Source reduction: Retailers and consumers can select products that use little or no packaging. When you are making choices about the products you buy, select packaging materials that are recycled into new packaging - **such as glass and paper**. If people refuse plastic as a packaging material, the industry will decrease production for that purpose, and the associated problems such as energy use, pollution, and adverse health effects will diminish.

2. Reuse containers

Since refillable containers can be reused, **container reuse** can lead to a substantial reduction in the demand for disposable plastic, and reduced use of materials and energy, with the consequent reduced environmental impacts.

For an interesting and eye-opening up-date on what happens to a lot of the plastic items we use, go on-line to watch the recent "CBS Sunday Morning" segment (originally aired Sunday, March 4th) entitled "Rubbish."

A Challenge: The most efficient and cost-effective solution to the harm plastic does to human health and the environment is to refuse wasteful single-use plastic. Try removing one type of disposable plastic from your life every week, starting with grocery bags and water bottles. From there be mindful about the plastics you allow into your life. If all of us cut our plastic use
