## Diocesan Highlights

In each month's Red Door, we focus on one aspect of our Diocese of Southern Ohio's activities or ministries.

**This month we are excited to announce the opening of a new exhibit at the Cincinnati Art Museum.** Four rare Tiffany stained glass windows have been added to an already impressive collection of Tiffany blown glass vases housed on the second floor of the museum.

The windows, in need of repair and conservation, were sold to the museum by the former **St. Michael's and All Angels Church in Avondale, Ohio.** Proceeds supported the founding of a community ministry that is now housed at the Avondale facility. This urban center operates a community garden and kitchen, as well as a hoop house that provides fish and fresh produce for local businesses and residents.

The exhibit is open Tuesdays thru Sundays from 11am until 5pm. Admission is free (parking is \$4.00). The Cincinnati Art Museum is located at 953 Eden Park Drive, in Cincinnati. Visit [www.cincinnatiartmuseum.org](http://www.cincinnatiartmuseum.org)
