

Olympian Dreams

The London Olympics have gotten off to a rousing start with dreams of gold becoming a reality by Olympians on Team USA. The Women's Gymnastic Team and Michael Phelps and other swimmers, Missy Franklin and Matt Greves, have brought home the gold while the world watched. With NBC's thousands of hours of coverage as well as breaking news on all fronts, how could we have failed to notice? But you might have missed the news on other USA gold medalists, skeet shooters Vincent Hancock and Kimberly Rhode as well as cyclist Kristen Armstrong. And we will miss the stories of hundreds of other athletes whose dreams have been just as strong throughout their lives. All of the athletes have their personal stories of years of hard work and discipline. They are all dreamers and they are all winners.

The Olympics Games are about hopes and dreams. As much as I am drawn to the coverage of the competition, I am drawn to the personal stories of the athletes. They are real people who have worked hard and overcome many obstacles to get where they are. Listening to the stories of Olympic champions, I am moved and inspired by their discipline and perseverance, but most of all by their hopes and dreams of doing something well, of offering their best to something.

Hearing their stories, we see that these dreams just didn't appear out of "nowhere". There is a common thread. Most athletes have had parents and coaches who saw the potential at an early age. Without a parent's dreaming and nurture, most of these young people wouldn't have caught the vision themselves and now be competing in the Olympics.

Knowing the potential and possibilities of life, parents dream dreams about their children having rewarding and productive lives. Parents dream dreams with the hope that their children will catch the vision, and ultimately, pick up the ball and run or jump in the pool on their own. For us at Nativity, the foundational dream for life is the dream of faith. A dream that we and our children know God's love and share it, loving our neighbor as ourselves. Our own stories then become stories of inspiration and healing and life for the world to know.

Our dreams, our own and the dreams of those who mentor, love and support us, are important to the faith we hope to live each and every day. Our own dreams start with God's dream and vision of a world filled with blessing for all. God's dream for all became incarnate, became flesh and real, in Jesus of Nazareth. And now God dreams that what was accomplished in Christ Jesus for all, would be known, lived and shared by those who follow him.

How are we making this dream a reality in our own lives? In the lives of our children? God promises blessing and love in abundance. Our inclusion in this dream means discipline and especially our showing up. Swimmers have to show up at the pool; runners at the track; basketball players on the courts; Christians at church and at those things the church does.

My deepest dream and desire as a priest, as the Rector of Nativity, is that all of us could know the incarnate reality of God's dream for us in Christ: from the oldest to the youngest. It will not happen without discipline and a commitment to showing up. I worry about those families who don't make their participation in this community of God's life and blessing a priority for themselves and their children. Even in the summer. I worry about many adults who only show up when it's convenient or when they need something. They could have so much more! They could have a sustaining faith, the knowledge of a love that holds them throughout life.

So let us dream the dream of God. Let us be disciplined and show up! We all have a story to share about our lives. For we are all dreamers. And we can all be a blessing in Christ.

Hands of Francis Seven Weeks of Summer Snacks a BIG success

Seven weeks went by very quickly at the Oscar Mason Library. Thanks to a generous grant of \$1890.00 from the Episcopal Diocese of Alabama, and a little help from the Outreach Contingency Fund, your Outreach Committee was able to provide a daily snack to the children who attended the Summer Programs offered at the Oscar Mason Library. The Oscar Mason Library Community (a/k/a Sparkman Homes), a Huntsville Housing Authority development, lies within the 35805 zip code of North Alabama. This area is traditionally one of the most economically depressed areas in North Alabama. Huntsville City data in 2010 showed that 36.4% of households in the 35805 area were below the level of poverty (state wide statistic is 17.4%.) In addition, 21% of these households were below the 50% level of the poverty in 2010 (state wide only 10.1%.) Many of the single parents in the community depend on the summer programs to act as an "ad hoc" day care when school is out for the summer. An average of 200 children from preschool to middle school age attended age specific educational enrichment programs between June 4th and July 20th. Each child was provided with a snack each day that consisted of a juice box, granola bar, peanut butter and crackers, and a piece of fresh fruit. (fruit cups were offered for those children who were too young to handle whole fruit).



Yuki Lewis, Branch Manager of the Oscar Mason Library along with a small staff and community volunteers facilitated the daily programs. Nativity outreach volunteers, Lawren and Joe Cooper, Deborah Baker and Ernie Meinecke, and Lee Hicklen took turns purchasing and delivering the items every Monday morning. For many of these children, this "snack" was the only meal they received until their parent(s) returned home in the evenings.

Jonathan Daniels Annual Pilgrimage, Saturday, August 11, 11:00 a.m.

in Hayneville at the Lowndes County Courthouse Square (Lafayette and Washington St.)

Mark your calendars now to attend and be ready to travel. Look for information in July 18th newsletter from Nativity's Reconciliation Ministry regarding transportation from Huntsville.

This year's homilist will be Carolyn Maull McKinstry, author of While the World Watched: A Birmingham Bombing Survivor Comes of Age During the Civil Rights Movement. Carolyn will share her experience and insights during the pilgrimage that is sponsored by The Commission on Race Relations and the Diocese of Alabama.

Jonathan Daniels was an Episcopal seminarian who answered the call of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. to help register African-American voters in Alabama. He was shot and killed on Aug. 20 1965, while shielding then 16-year-old Ruby Sales from a shotgun blast as she attempted to enter a store to buy something to drink. Daniels was added to the Episcopal Church Calendar of Saints and Martyrs in 1994 to be remembered each Aug. 14.

The pilgrimage begins at 11:00 a.m., on Saturday, Aug. 11, 2012 at the Courthouse Square in Hayneville. The procession will go to the old county jail where Daniels and Sales were among those detained for a week and then will move to the old Cash Grocery Store where Daniels was killed. The pilgrimage will end at the Courthouse where a service of Holy Communion will take place in the courtroom and McKinstry will speak.

August 12th the youth are doing Lemonade in the Shade! This is after the 10:00am service and it's super easy. Let's greet some folks after church, y'all!


