

#### The Church of the Nativity

The mission of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity, as part of the family of God, is to proclaim and spread the word and work of God through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, by Eucharistic worship and by ministry to the world.

#### **Building our Youth Ministry**

We've done some significant building at Nativity over the past few years. Our historic buildings have been shored up for succeeding generations to find a home within these beautiful and prayer-soaked walls. Now it's time to focus on building the spiritual foundations. Our first building project is with our youth ministries.

Over the past few years the youth ministry at Nativity has gone through significant transition. We have such wonderful youth in our parish, and there has been a growing consensus that we could be doing so much more in our student ministries, Associate Rector Brad Landry wrote in a recent letter to parents and youth of the parish. Through Brad's visionary leadership, we are about to undertake a significant renovation of our ministry with youth and their families.

I am excited to share that the Vestry approved our engaging Youth Ministry Architects, a Nashville based consulting firm, to help us develop a building plan for this important facet of our life together. Representatives from Youth Ministry Architects will be with us on September 20-22. Youth Ministry Architects was founded by Mark DeVries, an icon in the world of youth ministry. His bestselling books include Family Based Youth Ministry and Sustainable Youth Ministry. Brad has direct experience with Mark's insightful and successful design work.

Youth Ministry Architects are the best at what they do: they will listen carefully to our students, parents, grandparents, Sunday school teachers, vestry, and staff in order to compile a thorough assessment of our youth ministries. They identify our assets and challenges in establishing a sustainable youth ministry at Nativity. Their assessment will also provide us with a detailed list of recommendations, along with a fourteen month timeline to implement these changes.

On Thursday afternoon and evening on September 20th, through Friday afternoon, September 21st, they will facilitate listening sessions with all of the "stakeholders" in our youth ministries. It is critical that all youth and their parents be present at one of these sessions.

I often get questions along the line of "Why doesn't the church do this..." My friends, you are the church. We are the church together. The vision must be cast, caught, and supported by all of us, or little will be accomplished. Someone once said, "If you don't know where you are going, any road will get you there." It is time for us to get on the road to a flourishing and sustainable youth ministry together.

#### What can you do?

Pray for this work.

If you are a youth, middle school or high school, attend one of the listening sessions.

If you are a parent, make sure your student gets to one of our sessions. This may mean a choice between God and something else.

If you are a parent, adjust your own schedule so you can be present. Make this a priority!

If you are a grandparent, encourage the youth in your family and their parents to attend (don't underestimate your authority as s wise elder!). Attend one of our grandparent sessions, just for you.

When the plan is developed, support it with your time, talent and resources.

Make certain the spiritual footings of your own life are being supported: attend a church school class beginning this Sunday and find a mid-week class. Be an example.

And Christ is made the sure foundation: of your life and of our ministry at Nativity.
