

The mission of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity, as part of the family of God, is to proclaim and spread the word and work of God through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, by Eucharistic worship and by ministry to the world.

Church Building Continues....

Every September, Nativity buzzes with renewed excitement and energy. People are coming and going on Sundays, and during the week with Bible Studies for all ages (we even have a Bible Study for girls in the 1st-4th grades this fall!), Reunion groups, Education for Ministry Classes, choir rehearsals, and in meetings to make plans for the November Nativity Bazaar or to knit prayer shawls or to pray and work for God's mission through Nativity. We have returned from summer vacations and diversions. The pews and classrooms are full. We renew our commitment to be faithful stewards of God's blessings of our time, talent and resources.

The InReach Ministry Fair we held this past Sunday saw more people connecting to our ministries of pastoral care, worship and community that make us inwardly strong. We <u>are inwardly strong</u> so we can be *outwardly focused*! So on October 21, we will have our OutReach Ministry Fair, giving us all opportunities to be involved in ministries that reach beyond 208 Eustis Avenue and into the world with Christ's healing and love.

We renew our commitment to a regular diet of those things that feed our soul. But we don't just return to classes, programs, and ministries. We return with open hearts to God's love and call to ministry through Nativity. Our faith journeys reveal a pattern of returning to God because our attention to God's grace is often diverted for many reasons. Yet God is forming us as people who rely on his grace and love alone. In these trying days in our country and in the world, God calls us to deeper levels of trust in God's purposes and presence with us. And so we build the Kingdom of God in our lives and in the world through Nativity. We build to transform lives.

This is the most important building we do. This is why it is critical that all parents and youth meet with our Youth Ministry Architects consultants this week. What are you doing to build God's Kingdom in your own life, and hence, in the world?

A week from Sunday on September 30, we will celebrate St. Francis Day at our 8:45 a.m. service. St. Francis' most important work was not in blessing animals and connecting to creation, but in building Christ's church. He literally rebuilt church buildings as we have done at Nativity. But he especially built the church into a strong and sustainable temple of the Holy Spirit by changing people's lives and setting hearts afire with God's love in Christ. His prayer, which we will pray together on September 30, clearly models the building we are all asked to do in and through our lives; in and through Nativity.

Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Where there is hatred, let us sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is discord, union; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. Grant that we may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.

Let's continue building together!

The Rt. Rev. Santosh K. Marray, bishop assisting in the Episcopal Diocese of East Carolina, has accepted a call to become assistant bishop in the Diocese of Alabama beginning at the end of this month. As assistant bishop, he will support the Rt. Rev. Kee Sloan, Alabama's, diocesan bishop, by sharing the annual parish visitation schedule. Along with Episcopal visitation in the Diocese of East Carolina, Marray is responsible for the Department of Mission and Congregational Development, especially in small congregations. He will continue to assist in that area in our diocese especially, congregational development in small congregations.

"We are pleased and excited to welcome Santosh to the Carpenter House staff and our diocesan family," said Sloan. "We look forward to the special gifts he will bring to the ministry of our diocese. He is a genuine and loving man, and I am confident that he and his wife Nalini will fit in well with us."

During more than 30 years of ordained ministry, he has served the people of six dioceses (Guyana, Bahamas, Florida, Seychelles, and East Carolina) spanning three provinces of the Anglican Communion (West Indies, The Episcopal Church and Indian Ocean).
