Prayers for Your Life

Almighty and gracious Father, we give you thanks for the fruits of the earth in their season and for the labors of those who harvest them. Make us, we pray, faithful stewards of your great bounty, for the provision of our necessities and the relief of all who are in need, to the glory of your Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The Collect for Thanksgiving Day (BCP p. 246)

At some point over this Thanksgiving weekend, most sit down to share a special holiday meal that almost always begins with a prayer. Clergy experience reveals that many would prefer to defer the praying to the clergy who might be present at their board. This is not only true for holidays but just about anytime we “professional” *pray-ers* find ourselves the guest at a meal.

It seems that for many people the pressure is on to say exactly the right words needed for the occasion. This oratory search can bring anxiety and stress on the appointed leader. And so as we Episcopalians say, “When in doubt, go to the Prayer Book!” I often remind the host and hostess that they are the “ministers” of their household and so they are effectively the appointed prayer leaders! So, perhaps you and your family might find the above Collect for Thanksgiving Day from our Prayer Book just right for your holiday observance.

We clergy are often reminding the flock that all of us can pray. It just doesn't have to be that hard. For us Episcopalians, thanks be to God for our *Book of Common Prayer*! But I'll let you in on a secret: Sometimes even the professional *pray-ers* search with no little anxiety for the right words in those times we know the praying should be our offering.

I have found Episcopal writer and spiritual life journalist Anne Lamott's newest book insightful for all of us who seek to find the right words to pray. She makes it quite simple. This New York Times best-selling author has discovered three basic prayers that she believes essential for everyday living:

1. *Help!*
2. *Thanks!*
3. *Wow!*

Hence the title of her book, *Help! Thanks! Pray!* I hope you have discovered Anne Lamott's funny and perceptive writing about her faith journey through decades of trial and error. If not, I'm sure Cheryl in the Source Books and Gifts at Nativity can help you (her first book, *Travelling Mercies*, is a favorite. Lamott has coalesced everything she knows about prayer to these fundamental three prayers.

It seems that all of our prayers can fall into a version of one of these three. Are you praying these prayers? We can't get through this life without God's help and the help God sends us in each other. But then, we can't get through life without giving thanks for the good things, the blessings that we know and share from God. And then there is just the exaltation in the incredible beauty and grace in this world! This weekend you especially have many opportunities to pray the second and third prayers of Lamott's triad: Thanks! and Wow!

Maybe these can be the prayers you and your household pray around the table this Thanksgiving: Prayers for our lives made simple, because it just doesn't have to be that hard. We can all pray. Help! Thanks! Wow! Thanksgiving blessings to all.

Stewardship of Creation tip for November 21, 2012

Are you a good steward of the resources available to you, at home, at work and in our community? Be part of the solution to finding the best ways to protecting God's creation and showing respect and love to our world and a loving response in thanks for the many gifts we enjoy. Here are some ways that can help:

Your Community: You can share your environmental ideas and concerns with your friends and neighbors. Express your opinions to government leaders both locally and nationally. Your opinion matters!

Get Hooked on Sustainable Seafood: Protecting marine diversity means thinking about what you eat. And there is plenty to enjoy. For example, Alaskan wild-caught salmon is the best choice to eat, whereas farmed or Atlantic salmon is recommended to avoid or eat infrequently.

Don't Be a Guinea Pig: Thousands of untested chemicals are used in everyday household products, putting your family at risk. Take a stand by contacting manufacturers, buying organic and non-toxic products, and joining the call for toxics reform.

Ask For a Home Energy Audit: Contact your utility company or state department of energy about a comprehensive home energy audit. Many utilities and states perform these audits free of charge, and the energy-saving opportunities they reveal can save you money while reducing emissions.

Take a Credit for Savings: There may be tax credits for energy saving home investments, including solar panels, small wind turbines and geothermal heat pumps. You can learn more at www.energystar.gov.

Drive to Save Gas: You can reduce your car's emissions with some easy maintenance. A single misfiring sparkplug can reduce your mileage by 30%. Under-inflated tires can cost you 15%. 147 million gallons of gas are wasted each year from loose, missing or damaged gas caps!

Take Your Values to Work: Does your workplace have an "efficiency czar"? Ask about savings that can be achieved through changes in lighting, heating and cooling, etc. Businesses, schools and institutions can save significantly on energy. You can help.
