

"From Our Past"...

Selections by Sue Clement

I hope you enjoy these photos of past Epiphany observances at St Stephen's Episcopal Church. The photo of the Epiphany Pageant of 1956 clearly shows the over-the-altar window, which is now enclosed in the wall. The photo of the Epiphany Pageant in the 1980s has some faces you might recognize, in no particular order: Jay Gable as the priest; Sean Runge as Joseph; Andrew Clement as Narrator; in the row



holding candles—Julie Clement, Kelly Gable, Tricia Dreier?; Wendy Winslow. You probably recognize some that I don't. Up until about the 1990s the pageant was followed by the serving of cake in the parish hall. There were two cakes—a boys cake and a girls cake. In each cake was baked a ring, and the boy and girl who got the pieces with the rings were crowned King and Queen of Epiphany. The pageant was usually held close to January 6, the Feast of the Epiphany. We do have in the Archives some photos of past kings and queens which may appear in a future "From Our Past".


HABITAT SEEKS TO EMPOWER MOTIVATED PEOPLE

The local Habitat affiliate is currently seeking applicants for homes to be built later this year and into 2014. The application process starts with a pre-screening to determine if the household meets basic criteria for the program. The deadline to apply is March 15 at noon.

Basic qualifications include, residence in the Habitat service area for the past year or more, meeting income guidelines, having the ability to pay a no-interest home loan, and the willingness to partner with Habitat. Partnership includes completing 500 hours of sweat equity and home-ownership education.

Homes are sold to qualifying families at the cost to build and with no-interest loans. Habitat families participate in the construction process to help keep costs down, to gain skills and foster a sense of pride in ownership. Their mortgage payments in turn help Habitat build future homes.

Epiphany is one of my favorite seasons of the Church Year. Lost between the dazzling headlights of Christmas and the sober journey of Lent, Epiphany explores the mystery of God in Christ.

In literature, epiphanies are those moments of sudden insight in which deeper truth is discerned and hidden patterns are revealed. As we search for God in religion and life, we invariably learn new things about ourselves—awareness of God walking hand in hand with awareness of who we are in our depths. Epiphany unwraps the mystery of incarnation, and in so doing, we experience firsthand how and why love of God is linked to love of neighbor. We can't love or understand others until we love and understand ourselves. Love and compassion are rooted in awareness, what is called mindfulness in Eastern spirituality and Western psychology.

Mindfulness is at the heart of much current thinking in the areas of spirituality and prayer, counseling and therapy, exercise and health, stewardship of sustainable resources and the environment. On a journey of faith we learn how interconnected we are to others—individuals only finding meaning in community, all forms of life rooted in earth and cosmos. Health and wellness in mind, heart, soul and body begins with becoming aware of the energies we carry within, ways of thinking and feeling rooted in fear, anxiety and anger or trust, openness and joy. Are the beliefs we affirm through creed and communion on Sunday morning translated into intentional behaviors and actions of inclusion and reconciliation? Faith is a journey that requires faith, a daily discipline of self-examination and forgiveness, death and rebirth, generosity of spirit and mutual affection. Are we practicing a religion of denominational identity or a faith that requires transformation on a daily basis?

I see two parallel paths for our journey in 2013. The first is growing the Body of Christ in numbers but also in wisdom, love and grace. The second is a daily practice of mindfulness and compassion leading to new visions of mission and ministry in parish and neighborhood.

It's not unusual for programs in Church and world to begin with one charter, and over time, that original mission turns into something else. Providing education for all members of our parish is part of our obligation, and joy, as an Episcopal parish. And if we are to grow our parish with new families, couples and singles, then that growth begins with Sunday morning worship.

After much conversation and prayer, priest and vestry recently voted to return Church School to Sunday morning. In order to carve out a time and space for the education and worship of children, youth and parents, priest and vestry also voted to return to a previous schedule of two Sunday worship times at 8 and 10:30 am. One worship service undoubtedly increased energy and deepened a sense of shared community life. We hope that will continue with two services, especially with the return of Church School families to Sunday morning.

With two services, time is now opened up for Adult Formation. Beginning in a few weeks, we will offer a 9:15 Lectionary Study that will make room for seasonal educational offerings. We invite 8 o'clock worshippers to gather for informal coffee or go out for brunch after worship. Starting time for Church School, whether at 10 or 10:30 am, is still being worked on. We will need your help and ideas as we make this change. And we are open to exploring new configurations of time, worship and education for our parish community.

We give thanks for the wonderful leadership and creativity of Tracy Goodman and many others in their work of learning and hospitality on Wednesday night. I give thanks for their love and devotion as we re-connect the education of children and youth to our Sunday morning worship and fellowship.

On the parallel path of mindfulness and compassion, I invite all of us to think and pray about the mission and ministry of our parish. The Ven. Betsy Bennett and other deacons nationwide are doing wonderful work, not only in the area of environmental stewardship, but also in raising new awareness of poverty in neighborhood, country and world. At every Church meeting we are asked to devote time to discussion and prayer about the values and social structures of our world that produce inequity and widen the gap between haves and have-nots.

For that is what worship and education is all about. We come as individuals to Sunday morning worship, become one community through sacrament, discernment of spiritual gifts, lifelong formation and fellowship, then move out into the world in engaged community service. Awareness and mindfulness of who we are and why we are here moves naturally into compassion—compassion not only for family and friends, but a sense of true identification and belonging to those we might consider "others" in our country and world. In God's new kingdom consciousness, there are no "others," only children of God placed here on earth to alleviate suffering, right injustices and welcome all to the abundant banquet table of God.
